Fallen officers remembered

The annual National Police Week and Peace Officers' Memorial Day was held in Laurel Monday, May 15, at the Laurel First United Methodist Church with the Jones County Sheriff's Department and the Laurel Police Department coming together for the

The ceremony gives local officers and members of the community an opportunity to pause and honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice - to lose their life in the line of duty.

Major Jamie Tedford with the Jones County Sheriff's Department welcomed everyone and FUMC pastor Reverend Mark Anderson gave an opening prayer, followed by the presentation of colors by the LPD Color Guard. The National Anthem was sung by Emily

Taylor.

Jones County Board of Supervisors President Jerome Wyatt read a proclamation declaring Monday, May 15, Peace Officer's Memorial Day in Jones County.

A table of honor was set up next to the podium and Sheriff Alex Hodge explained its significates. "The table, with its place setting, is a way of symbolizing the fact that members of our profession are missing from this event. The table is set for one, though the number is many. The chair is empty. They can no longer join us. The tablecloth is white - symbolizing the purity of their intentions to serve their communities. The candle is lit – symbolizing their spirit to serve. The glass inverted - they cannot drink nor toast



South Jones' Brown caps off season with state title

To the outside eye, Brooklyn Brown doesn't look like your run-of-the-mill athlete. She's small in stature and only a soon-to-be ninth grader at South Jones. All that doubt dissipates quickly though when you get Brown in her natural element—a track.

"I've coached for 31 years and several people who were Division I athletes and state champions," South Jones track coach Roger Satcher said. "None of them are going to outwork Brooklyn."

"I hope she inspires other people to say, 'You know what, if you work, you can make it."

Brown just recently capped off an incredible 2017 season with a storybook ending, a Class 5A State championship in the 3200 meter run with a time of 12.24 seconds. It came a year after she finished third in the same event as a seventh grader. All the blood, sweat and tears, they were definitely worth it.

"It's really nice since I worked so hard for it," Brown said. "It took me two years to get there. For most people it takes them until their senior year. I was pretty sure I was going to get it this year. I was glad I did. Everybody is so proud of me, especially all of my friends that helped me get here."

"She did a lot of things strategy-wise that last year she couldn't do," Satcher added. "Last year, she got trapped. This year, nobody could trap her. She's learning a lot about running. She's getting more competitive. The sky's the limit."

Hard to beat that ending. Or is it? Aside from winning more state championships in the coming years, Brown

hopes to break the state record in the 3200 meters, which is 10.36 seconds. Brown will begin summer training very soon with that figure in mind.

"We're going to work on her first mile time this summer," Satcher said. "We're going to make that time competitive for a championship. If we can get that, then we're going to cut a lot of time off her two-mile, which is going to put her in position to get that lofty goal. But we're going to have a lot of goals in-between."

All of them are attainable, too. If the last few weeks of track season showed us anything, it's that you can never count out Brooklyn Brown.

"If you love sports, you gotta love Brooklyn Brown," Satcher concluded with a big smile. "She is always out there giving it 100%."

with us this day. A slice of lemon is on the bread plate to remind us of their bitter fate. The single red rose displayed in the vase is to remind us of their families and loved ones. The salt upon the plate is symbolic of their tears. The blue ribbon tied so prominently on the vase reminds us of the "Thin Blue Line" which stands strong before those who would destroy law and order in our great nation. Many of us served with these peace officers and called them "partner." We relied upon them; depended upon their might and their aid. We called them "brothers." We called them "sisters." They watch over us still – and we honor them today."

Following the table of honor description, the sound of bagpipes echoed through the church as Matthew Beall performed "Amazing Grace."

Jones County native and Mississippi Highway Patrol Trooper Lt. Trea Staples was the keynote speaker. Last year in the early hours of February 20, following a six-hour standoff, Staples was seriously wounded when MHP and MBN SWAT teams entered a home in Tishomingo County where an individual was holding his wife and 10-year old daughter hostage. Two other fellow troopers were injured that day including another Laurel native Bubba Holifield. Sadly MBN Special Agent Lee Tartt was killed. The suspect was also killed.

Staples recalled the events of that day and the days and weeks that followed. The gunshot wound Staples received severed a main artery in his leg. He said he could feel life draining away from him. By the time he got to a hospital in nearby Iuka he was convinced he was dying. "I was praying, not for myself, but for my family; my wife and children, and my mother and father."

"Here lately I have heard the term hero used way too loosely and way too often," exclaimed Staples. "Before I go any further I

want to clarify what the definition of a hero is. A hero is a person who is admired or idolized for courage, outstanding achievements, or other qualities. Synonyms for a hero include a person of courage, a brave person, lion-heart, knight and my favorite, warrior."

"The fallen we are here to honor today are just that, they are heroes," said Staples. "These heroes went out and fought for us. They fought to ensure our freedoms and our rights. And, they fought for our peace of

"Today and this week is about fallen police officers, but they're not the only heroes," said Staples. "There are firefighters, EMS, and nurses." Two of Staples former nurses surprised him and drove to Laurel from Corinth for the ceremony.

In talking about the fallen, Staples said, "If we could turn back the clock and bring them back, and give them the option of doing what they did knowing the outcome, or not doing it, I can guarantee you that they would all do the exact same thing."

Following Staples address, Kevin Price sang "I Bowed on My Knees and Cried Holy." But, before he began singing he told how Officer Kim Stewart with the LPD encouraged him to go to the hospital when he saw him in a convenience store. Price said he didn't realize how sick he was and credits Stewart's encouragement to saving his life.

Each person assembled for the ceremony proceeded to place a red carnation in the unfinished memorial wreath. After the wreath was completed, the sound of a bugle echoed from the balcony of the church as Kirk Royal played TAPS.

The ceremony concluded with LPD Chief Tyrone Stewart giving a closing prayer.

Following the ceremony, a procession escorted by the Jones County Sheriff's Department and Laurel Police Department traveled to the grave site of Deputy Randy Chancellor, who was killed by a drunk driver while on duty in 2001, at Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery for a Wreath Laying Ceremony, conducted by Dr. Cary Kimbrell.





A report containing detailed information on how the susceptibility determinations were made has been furnished to our public water system and is available for viewing upon request. The wells for the Whistler Water Association have received lower to higher susceptibility ranking

We routinely monitor for contaminants in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table below lists all of the drink ing water confaminants that were detected during the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2016. In cases where monitoring wasn't required in 2016, the table reflects the most recent results. We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a monthly basis. 

SJH Bravettes receive **State Championship Rings**


