Trickle-down effect of testing water quality in Aitkin County



Starting in June, crews from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency will be sampling fish from area lakes, streams and rivers as part of the effort to monitor the health of local bodies of water. Using electrofishing equipment, crews will be able to determine abundance, density, and variety of fish species present, causing no permanent harm to fish.

The Upper Mississippi River - Brainerd watershed, which includes parts of Aitkin, Crow Wing, Cass, Morrison and Todd counties, includes 212 lakes that are larger than 10 acres, and 2,149 river miles — sources of economy, recreation and tourism for the area.

County's waters are important to those who live, work and vacation here, it trickles down — literally — to the Gulf of Mexico, where the water eventually ends up, a resource for millions of people along the way.

In an effort to ensure water leaving Aitkin County is just While the health of Aitkin as clean, if not cleaner, than

when it arrived here, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), along with the Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD), the Aitkin County SWCD and Central Lakes College are teaming up to monitor bodies of water to identify areas where land use changes are necessary and

resources need protecting.

This spring, teams will be collecting water samples from 25 locations within the watershed — studying water clarity, oxygen, nutrient and bacteria levels in area lakes, streams and rivers. MPCA crews will also be sampling fish using electrofishing equipment from June-September, and collecting invertebrate samples from August-October.

"This intensive monitoring and assessment approach is being used in the state's 80 major watersheds on a rotating 10-year cycle," said Chad Anderson, aquatic biologist with the MPCA's Baxter office. "We want to make sure Minnesota continues to have fishable, swimmable waters."

This is the second year of the four-year process. Once all the data is gathered and analyzed, a full picture of the health of Aitkin County's waterways, and the watershed as a whole, will come together. Then, numerous partners including local SWCDs and the MPCA will create an improvement plan and take actions designed to restore and protect each county's water quality.

"We'll address the un-

healthy areas and bring them back to state standard," said Janet Smude, district technician for the Aitkin County SWCD. "It's also our goal to provide people with the resources they need to help improve the water quality." A recent study by the

MPCA shows the upper Mississippi River, which starts at Lake Itasca in northern Minnesota, is nearly pristine. It becomes more polluted — by development, farm runoff and pollution from cities — as it flows south. By the time the river reaches Minneapolis, it no longer meets standards set by the Clean Water Act for aquatic

life and human use. "This is a big challenge, but we can make a difference, right here at the local level," said Smude.

This project, funded by the Clean Water and Land Legacy Amendment, was created to preserve Minnesota's drinking water sources, as well as protect, enhance and restore wetlands, prairies, forests, fish, game and wildlife habitat. World War II Veteran in the Army Air Forces, died on Wednesday, May 18, at his home in Heartwood at The Arbor in Crosby, Minnesota, where he has been a resident since December 2016. He recently resided in Ironton. Minnesota.

A Memorial Mass was held 10:00 a.m. on Friday, May 26,

2017 at St. Joseph Church in Crosby, MN

with military honors given by the Myrin-James American Legion Post 443 of Ironton. Burial was at the Minnesota State Veterans Cemetery in Little Falls at 1:00 p.m. on Friday.

He was born in Milwaukee, WI to George Emil and Viola (Rohwetter). He grew up in Sherburne, Minnesota, living with his grandparents Bertha and Herman Braun for a short time and attended Sherburne Grade School. During his earlier years, his main hobby was building and flying RC (radio controlled) model airplanes beginning at the age of eight. When he was in the third grade, he moved to Fairmont, Minnesota, where his dad had a Chrysler/Plymouth dealership. He later worked for the ship yards in Duluth, Minnesota. In 1943, at the age of 17, he went into what was then the Army Air Forces doing his basic in Biloxi, MS and then Truax field for radio school and Chanute AFB for radar control. He spent his tour of duty during WWII in the Azores which was a refueling stop for planes going to Europe and he spent 15 months in the Kwajalein Islands doing ground to air communications. In 1946 after spending time in both theaters of war, he was honorably discharged and spent one year at UMD, Duluth.

After being discharged from the military, he worked for Singer selling sewing machines and married Ruby Victoria Franson. They lived in Duluth, MN and rented an apartment for \$27.50/month which included heat and janitor service. Later they bought a house in

Keith George Braun, 91, a Hermantown. At that time, Keith worked for Arrowhead Bearing in Duluth. Then he worked for several years at Minnesota Bearing in Duluth and became a salesman. The family later moved to Minneapolis in the St. Louis Park area where he was a salesman. Then they moved to Sioux Falls, SD and worked for and later bought into a business called Malloy Bearing and Supply. Being the salesman he was, he later moved to Industrial Supply (which later became Dalton Gear) in Minneapolis and worked there for 11 years. At the age of 66, he retired from the Knott Company of Minneapolis. He and the family had a home in St Louis Park, Wayzata, and New Hope, MN and he also owned a lake home in Pine City, MN. After retiring they moved solely to the lake home and sold the New Hope home.

Council considered the ongoing coal vault filling and sidewalk project located just off Main Street in Crosby next to property owned by Linda Mclaughlin. easier. The council agreed to allow the work to start. The cost share estimate came in at \$184,000 for street, sidewalk, curb and gutter for the project. That could be split 50% cost to the city and 50% accessed to the residents along the Third Street project area.

Martin said, "they need to notice that your going to have a public hearing to discuss preliminary assessment associated with cost sharing of Third Street. All those property owners, through the process that Lisa [Sova] is aware of, they would show up. We would say what we're doing and identify what the costs are based on. We actually have bid costs, so they are a bit more solid than early on."

Mayor Hunter brought up two construction related concerns to the Engineer Phil Martin's attention. There was fire hydrant that needed some fill around it and a garage that had the footing crack when a slab was removed. These two issues will be brought back to the council by Martin after he has a discussion with the contractor.

The council approved hiring a DNR certified beaver trapper to remove them from Serpent Lake Creek area in effort of stopping them from damming up the creek.

Two property owners from Lakeshore Drive, Ron Hetrick and Dale Frolic sat and spoke with the council. Hatrick indicated the ongoing problem on Lakeshore Drive involved four property owners. The problem is the road pavement is in bad condition since it sits under water. The drain doesn't drain into sod that is higher than the road. Mavor Hunter relayed the problems a representative from Anderson Brothers expressed after looking at the road: two stumps need to be removed, the road was in bad condition from being underwater and he felt there needed to be a

holding pond added. Dale Frolic indicated he would donate a portion of his property for a holding pond. The council approved having City Engineer Phil Martin look into recommendations and

cost for correcting the problems with Lakeshore Drive.

Martin then spoke about the water supply lines that come from south of the campground at the Crosby Memorial Park. Martin said it wouldn't be part of the Third Street project. The council approved having Martin get bids for the campground project to replace the sewer lines and attaching them to the new Third Street lines. The project should be started after Labor Day.

City Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova talked about the recy-

cling bins and cardboard recycling funding and amounts for 2018. She said since Ironton is going to go with curbside recycling. Crow Wing County has committed \$41,400 in funding for the City of Crosby for next year. The cost to empty the bins is \$315 each time and \$40 per month for the cardboard. Sova made the council aware that if they exceed the \$41,400 that would be the city's responsibility. Sova also said she would alert the council once the limit was being reached.



on location if possible, and when it is not, he uses his own reference for photos and sketches.






