Information and Safety Tips from Sheffield Utilities for Public Awareness Program (Alabama Act 94-487 and Office of Pipeline Safety Part 192.616)

#### What is Natural Gas?

Natural gas is made up of hydrocarbon gases, primarily methane, naturally occurring in rock formations deep below the earth's surface. The natural gas is withdrawn and transported to homes and businesses through an underground system of pipes.

#### Why use Natural Gas?

Natural gas is a fuel of choice because it is:

- 1. Efficient
- 2. Clean-burning (emits few pollutants)
- 3. Plentiful
- 4. Safe

#### Who uses Natural Gas?

- Residential users use natural gas in their homes to fuel furnaces, pool/spa heaters, gas lights, stoves, generators and space heaters.
- Commercial users use natural gas in businesses such as restaurants, hotels, and hospitals.
- Industrial users use natural gas for heating processes and as a fuel for the generation of steam.
- Electric utilities use natural gas to generate electricity.
- Natural gas pipeline companies use natural gas as a fuel to run compressor units.

#### **Natural Gas Safety Precautions**

Natural gas is colorless, odorless, lighter than air, and non-toxic. Breathing natural gas is not harmful as long as there is an adequate supply of fresh air to breathe along with it. Natural gas by itself will not burn, but with the proper mixture of gas and air combined with an ignition source, combustion can occur.

An odorant that smells like rotten eggs is added to natural gas so that it can be detected. The odor is a warning that natural gas may be present and, if ignited, could result in personal injury or property damage. If the smell of gas is present inside your home or business (no matter how faint or strong),

#### Do Not:

- 1. Smoke or strike a match.
- 2. Operate an electric switch or appliance control.
- 3. Pull any plugs from outlets.
- 4. Use a flashlight or lighter.
- 5. Use a telephone or cell phone in the building.

If you SMELL A FAINT ODOR of natural gas INSIDE YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, check to see if any appliances have been left on accidentally or if a pilot light has been extinguished, which would cause the odor (rotten eggs). If the odor persists, TAKE NO CHANCES, get out of the house immediately, and then call us from a nearby phone or neighbor. If a STRONG OR PERSISTENT ODOR OF GAS is present IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, OR IF YOU HEAR A HISSING SOUND of escaping natural gas, follow this procedure:

- 1. Get everyone out of the building immediately.
- 2. Leave the door open.
- 3. Use a neighbor's phone or cellular phone outside the building to call us.

4. If you SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, call us. Leaks from natural gas pipelines are extremely rare, however it is important that you know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area. A strong odor, hissing sound, or dirt blowing up from a hole are signs of a leak. Move away from and upwind of the suspected leak before calling us. Do not light matches, smoke, use a cell phone or attempt to start any motor vehicles in the area of a possible gas leak

### Call Before You Dig

Whether you are building a home, installing a sprinkler system, or just planting a tree, we want you to be safe. No matter the size of the project, before you dig, grade, or excavate, the law requires you to call for all underground utilities to be located. Ask the Attorney is sponsored by local attorneys, McCutcheon & Hamner, PC, as a service to the residents of NW Alabama.

My ex-husband ordered was at our divorce hearing to pay child support in the amount of \$350.00 every two weeks for our two children and to keep them on his insurance. He hasn't done either one. The children are on All Kids and Medicaid health insurance. He is over \$10,000 past due on child support. He is not working right now and hasn't paid child support in several months. he in contempt? I've been told no. He never helps with the kids. He can see them anytime he wants to, but he chooses not to see them much at all. He

never helps out with buying their clothes or anything they need. I've been told that there is nothing I can do. Would you please advise me on what rights I have?

Susan, Russellville, AL

Your children deserve better and it must be very frustrating to see this happening.

You have raised a number of issues and they are, unfortunately, more common than they should be.

First, the fact is that the children are covered medically and that is great. If they were not eligible for publicly funded programs and you purchased commercial health insurance you could potentially make your ex-husband

pay you back for the cost you incur.

I say potentially because he is not paying anything now.

Back when I did divorce work I always advised my clients to turn their case over to DHR after the divorce became final. It costs little and they are aggressive. They have so many cases that they can not be as fast as a privately paid lawyer, but good lawyers are expensive.

To answer your question as to whether or not he is in contempt of court would require more information than I have but I will give you the legal analysis that the courts typically use:

• If the father is working and not paying he is in contempt. His bills and living expenses are not a factor, child support comes first.

• If, on the other hand, the father is injured or disabled to the extent that he can not work then he can not be held in contempt.

• If the father is voluntarily not working, he can be held in contempt.

• If the father is voluntarily under employed, i.e., a dentist choosing to work in a car wash, he can be held in contempt.

All of these must be proven in court. I hope I have given the information that you need to answer your question.






And remember, there's absolutely no correlation between the cost of a wedding and the success of the relationship!

#### **MIDLIFE ADJUSTMENTS?**

Dear Dave,

My husband and I are in our 50s, and we have just \$12,000 to pay off before we're debt-free. We've paid off almost \$70,000 in debt in the last two years. We would like to buy a house soon, but we know we also need an emergency fund. It would take us almost a year to build up an emergency fund, so should



we make adjustments to the Baby Steps since we're getting older?

Dear Dawn,

No! It shouldn't take you two a year to build up an emergency fund considering the rate at which you've been paying off debt. You need a fully funded emergency fund or three to six months of expenses set aside before vou start saving for a down payment on a home.

## **Medicare Minute** Medicare Part A Part 1

On a Medicare card Part A will have the word "Hospital" beside it. Because of that Medicare Part A is most commonly known as the inpatient or hospitalization part of Medicare. This means when a Medicare beneficiary is admitted into the hospital most of the services that are received are filed under Medicare Part A. This sounds simple but sometimes it's not.

Medicare Part A has a deductible of \$1,316 per benefit period. Notice two things here. First is the deductible of \$1,316. If you are admitted into the hospital and had Original Medicare only, you would owe the first \$1,316 of your stay. This deductible covers hospital services, including semiprivate rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies.

The second thing to notice is the term "benefit period". This tells you the deductible is not an annual deductible but could hit you more than once in a calendar year. A "benefit period" begins when you are admitted into a hospital or skilled nursing facility and ends when you haven't received any inpatient care for 60 consecutive days. If you are admitted as an inpatient after the 60 days of no inpatient care a new benefit period begins, meaning another \$1,316 deductible. Also if you are confined to the hospital for 60 consecutive days your deductible will cover you but on the 61st day you will begin paying a coinsurance.

The good news is for most Medicare beneficiaries Part A is free. Free meaning you don't pay for it. The reason for this is while you are working you pay 1.45% of your pay check into Medicare. If you did that for 40 quarters you're entitled to Part A for free. Next week will discuss the other benefits of Medicare Part A.



ew Orleans mayor, Mitch Landrieu, madé the point that New Orleans was among America's largest slave markets. His point that the statues of Robert E. Lee, Jefferson Davis, and P.G.T. Beauregard erected soon after the Civil War were part of an organized effort to rewrite history and hide the truth about the war and the Confederacy will be debated for many years to come. #### WE'VE ALL SEEN SOME

pretty big headlines over the years about major virus attacks but I do not recall one that got more media attention than a recent ransomware virus named Wannacry.

For those of you living under

a rock, WannaCry is a virus that encrypts all the personal data on your hard drive.

Pictures, documents, music, patient medical records, are all scrambled behind a ultra

secure password which makes you Wannacry. Hah, get it? Yeah, I think it's goofy, too.

It asks users to pay a \$300 ransom. The ransom note claims that the payment amount will be doubled after three days. If payment is not made after seven

days, it claims the encrypted files will be deleted. I've seen many cases of other ransomware locally but have not heard of any local clients that were attacked by Wannacry.

At first, many people thought Wannacry was spread by opening an attachment that comes with some enticing email. That's mainly how previous ransomware was spread. This virus is different in that it sits out there watching for unpatched computers and can enter a computer without user interaction. Once it infects one computer, it can spread to others in the same network.

Another interesting thing that sets this virus apart is that the hackers were idiots. Another "good guy" hacker discovered and implemented a "kill switch" in the virus that vastly reduced the potential for damage. The hackers were also a bit idiotic about how to collect their booty. It's complicated to explain in this short column but suffice it to say that they can't collect their ransom money without revealing themselves. Oops.

Microsoft released patches for this kind of virus last March. Patches were not issued for

discontinued operating systems such as Windows XP and Vista but, in an unprecedented move, Microsoft released patches for XP and Vista. Even so, the majority of infected systems were Windows 7. The viral pandemic peaked in mid-May. The spread of the infection has since waned to a trickle.

Should you be worried? Well, yeah. Experts suspect this is the first of a new class of advanced ransom viruses that do not require the end user do something goofy first such as opening an email attachment. The people who design the next one may not be idiots. You can protect yourself by doing what you're supposed to do: backup your important data. But this ransomware requires an additional step. This virus (and others like it) not only encrypt the data on your hard drive but encrypt all devices attached

to your computer. So if you backup to an external hard drive, you need to disconnect it when not in use. Better yet, use an online backup service so your data is always separated from your computer.

In addition to good backups, you need to NOT ignore those pesky Windows update requests. Windows 10 makes it hard to not update your system but earlier operating systems such as Windows 7 give you the option to ignore updates. Don't do that or you'll wannacry, too.







of history and reverence Unfortunately, there appears to be a lack of knowledge or accurate remembrance about Robert E. Lee.

Although his cause was not roundly supported, for almost a century and a half Lee was respected for his intellect, leadership, and personal convictions, a reputation that belies the common Confederate leaders. It was an honest respect borne of many who were historically astute. Recent generations, keenly adept at analyzing everything from morning TV talk shows and reality TV, to modern pop artist outfits and top social media circles, in their historical wisdom, have just dismissed Lee as a cowardly, slave-owning, bigot.

We know Lee was a reluctant secessionist, horrified at the thought of dismantling the country. He knew secession meant revolution. Yet, Lee knew he had to follow his home state of Virginia. I wonder how many of the cloned malcontents cheering the removal of his statue in person or on social media know that Lee was offered significant command in the Union Army first? And that he would have accepted had Virginia not already seceded?

No, Lee did not consider the races to be completely equal. However, that was the prevailing mentality of the time. That includes those backing the Union who erroneously get credit for a level of acceptability that simply was not there. Lincoln, the great emancipator, also did not place blacks and whites on equal levels. He was in favor of freeing the slaves, but returning them to their places of origin.

described once slavery as a moral and political evil. There are also wide-ranging assessments of whether Lee personally owned slaves, whether they were actually inherited from his wife's family, and that he freed them all well before the war's end.

Some of that knowledge minimize pervasive mob mentality we seem to have against anyone associated with the old South. I wonder what percentage of those wanting Lee's statue down even know the date range of the Civil War -- or of any major American war for that matter?

We will address the dangerous mob mentality further next week.

It is noteworthy that Landrieu's grandstanding does nothing to remove his city as a top U.S. slave market. New Orleans is a center of modern-day feculence and, despite federal greater efforts since 2012, is still a hub of America's human sextrafficking enterprise. What is Landrieu doing about that issue to get some cheers and win a few votes?

## What Types of **Social Security Disability Benefits** are Available?

There are two commonly available types of Social Security disability benefits available to individuals: Disability Insurance Benefits (DIB) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI).

Disability Insurance Benefits

DIB is available to individuals who have paid 'premiums" into the system 20 of the past 40 fiscal quarters. In other words, you would have had to work five of the past 10 years (not necessarily in a row) and had the Social Security deduction taken from your paycheck and paid over to Social Security.

Disability Insurance Benefits consist of a monthly monetary benefit based on what you have paid into the system. DIB also typically includes Medicare, which pays for your medical treatment and sometimes a monthly monetary benefit for your

Supplemental Security Income

Supplemental Security Income on the other hand is needs based. You cannot exceed certain benchmarks relating to personal property, real property and household income among others in order to qualify.

It is analogous to the requirements for eligibility to collect food stamps and other social services. You do not need to have paid any of the "premiums" that DIB requires.

SSI also consists of a monthly monetary benefit, but it is a fixed amount determined by the Supplemental Security Administration and is not based on the amount of money you have paid into

Supplemental Security Income has Medicaid attached, which usually pays for both your medical treatment and medications. Unfortunately it does not include a monthly monetary benefit for your

The medical requirements are the same for both types of disability; they differ only in the technical requirements for eligibility outlined above.

Sometimes individuals may draw both types, while others may have their SSI canceled out solely due to the amount of the monthly DIB monetary benefit they draw rather than any of the external factors discussed.







## **Patience Really Is A Virtue!**

Are you a patient person? I am... sometimes. I am not when I am really hungry. My family says when I get hungry I get a little "edgy." I even have a tee-shirt that says, "I am sorry for what I said when I was hungry." I need to do better in this area!

I am not patient when I have to wait in lines. I get the feeling that I have a "gift" for choosing the wrong lines at Wal-Mart. It seems I can pretty well count on a "price check" issue with the customer in front of me, which makes my Type-A personality traits pop up. I need some work here too!

Oh, I desire to be a patient person, but at certain times I find it challenging. Nevertheless, patience really is a wonderful virtue to possess. The following is validation of this fact.

Back in the 1960s a psychologist by the name of Walter Mischel conducted an experiment on preschoolers meeting on the campus of Stanford University. His objective was to determine if the trait of patience (or delayed gratification) had any bearing on their success in life.

The first test was relatively simple. The children were told they could have a treat, which was a marshmallow, immediately. Then they were given a second option. If they would wait for the experimenter to run an errand, they could have two marshmallows

Some of the kids wasted no time in grabbing and downing the initial offering. Others decided to hold out for the double offer. However, their struggle was obvious. The next twenty minutes appeared to be an eternity for them. They covered their eyes to avoid seeing the temptation before them. They rested their heads on their arms. Some talked to themselves, others sang and a couple even tried to sleep to pass the time away. Eventually though, they gained great pleasure from receiving two

The experiment did not end here. There was a follow-up study on these same kids when they became teenagers. Those who had held out for the two marshmallows when four-year-olds were found to be more socially competent, self-assertive and more capable to cope with life's frustrations. The one-marshmallow kids were more stubborn, indecisive and stressed.

The conclusion is obvious. Developing patience is important! In fact, the Bible says that having patience is an identifying fruit of Christianity (Galatians 5:22). It really is a virtue (2 Peter 1:6). And- - we probably all need to do better in this area.

Thus, let us begin cultivating our patience- - right now!

#### Who Should Get The Pneumonia Shot?

I often get asked by patients whether they should receive a pneumonia vaccination. The pneumonia vaccines prevent developing help pneumonia a common bacterial cause, Streptoccoccus pneumoniae. Even if a patient still contracts pneumonia from this germ, it can help prevent complications from the pneumonia, such as requiring support ventilation. Pneumonia vaccination is usually given to two groups of adults. First, those 65 and older are eligible for this vaccination, as we know that in senior individuals, the body's defenses begin to weaken and make it easier to catch pneumonia. Second, it is offered to adults younger than 65 who have certain medical conditions that make it easier to develop pneumonia. This diabetes, heart includes asthma, COPD, disease, tobacco use and cancer, among others. If you believe you may be eligible for pneumonia vaccination, discuss this with your primary care provider.

### Please Discuss Thalassemia

A few weeks ago, I had published an article on some of the different causes of anemia. Shortly thereafter, a reader called my office asking for me to discuss a cause of anemia that wasn't mentioned in my article, a disease called thalassemia. Whenever talking about a complicated subject like anemia, it is impossible to include every aspect of the subject within the confines of the space allowed. Therefore, several illnesses that cause anemia. like thalassemia, were left out. This week, I will give a brief overview of this disease.

I mentioned in the previous anemia article that hemoglobin is the protein on our blood cells that is responsible for carrying the oxygen in our blood and releasing it to our different tissues. This hemoglobin protein is actually

a complicated substance that is made up of four chains of smaller substances. Two of the chains are called alpha and the other two chains are called beta. In our DNA, there are genes that are responsible for making the alpha and beta chains. If the gene for an alpha or beta chain is missing or defective, problems begin to happen. If one or more alpha chains is either missing or defective, the condition is called alpha thalassemia. If the same happens to one or more beta chains, the condition is called beta thalassemia. What happens to the hemoglobin in thalassemia depends on what chain is involved, how many chains are involved, and whether the chain is defective or completely missing. The end result is that the hemoglobin can become unstable or not functioning the way it should. Therefore, the blood cells do not carry oxygen the way that it should, with varying degrees of severity. Fetuses with more severe forms often do not survive to birth. Those with the less severe form still deal with many medical problems. One complication is anemia which can lead to severe light-headedness Another complication is that patients can build up too much iron in their bodies, which can get into different organs like the heart and liver and damage them. Many patients also deal with bone structure problems, enlarged spleen and increased risk of infection. Treatment involves blood transfusions, treatment of iron overload whenever present and, in appropriate situations, bone marrow transplant. ## **Tigerland Title Time**

Fifty-five years ago Deshler High School's track team under head coach Buddy Moore, captured the school's first track State Championship. A near capacity crowd gathered at Deshler Stadium in 1962 to watch the Tigers, Coffee, Sheffield, Decatur, Butler, Cullman, Athens and

Russellville compete for the powerful Tennessee Valley Conference Championship.

But the night belonged to Deshler's strong team. Tommy Christopher scored 12 of the Tigers 40 points to lead his team to the championship. Christopher set a new TVC pole vault record in the event, soaring over the 13-foot barrier. He also captured first place in the high jump with a leap of 5'8".

Moore knew at the time that his '62 team was a special group. Moore said: "our success was attributed to our strength in almost every event." "We also had two good relay teams, especially our mile relay team." The Tigers qualified 12 team members in the sectionals to compete for the state title meet in Auburn.

Deshler and Tallassee battled back and forth throughout the meet for the top spot. Although Christopher scored 12 of his team's 29 total points, the state title came down to the final event—the mile relay. Moore said "John Allen Gamble, who was on our mile relay team, had pulled a groin muscle and couldn't run." "We put Jack Underwood in his place, along with Rayford Basden, Charlie Maner and Jerry Carroll."

They won the event by two points to give us the State Championship over Tallassee. Other Tigers attributed to the title: Don Jeffries finished fourth in the shot put and third in the discus throw. Jerry Carroll won the 440-yard dash. Tommy Christopher set a new state pole vault record of 12-feet, finished first in the high jump and second in the high hurdles.

It was a joyful time in Deshler Tigerland. Two years later, Moore would lead the Tigers to their second state track championship. Track doesn't hold the excitement in schools these days, but 55-years ago, it was one of the premier sporting events of its time.

clubs will be competing in the internationallytelevised tournament for a \$30,000 prize package. This includes a new Ranger Z175 boat with a 90-horsepower Evinrude outboard and entry into the 2017 Forrest Wood Cup, the world championship of bass fishing.
The winning team will

then compete against each other Saturday in a oneday fish-off on neighboring Wilson Lake. The two anglers will weigh in prior to the final weigh in of the BFL All-American in Florence. The team member with the largest one-day stringer will advance to the world championship of bass fishing, the 2017 Forrest Wood Cup, and a chance to win \$300,000.

"This is going to be an interesting tournament," said FLW Tour pro Bradley Dortch of Atmore, Alabama, who won a Costa FLW Series tournament on Wheeler Lake in 2016. "We didn't have much of a winter, so I'm pretty sure that the fish have all spawned by now. The fish at Wheeler Lake are already moving to their summertime patterns. The teams in this tournament are going to have to get out more toward the ledges.

"There are always fish to be caught shallow," Dortch continued. "I just don't know if you can win the tournament fishing that way. The winners are going to find a big group of females that spawned early and have already moved out."

Dortch said popular baits amongst competitors fishing deep would be football-head jigs, Carolina rigs, swimbaits and big crankbaits like the Jenko CD20. He said shallowwater anglers will likely be seen throwing buzzbaits, spinnerbaits, squarebill crankbaits and frogs.

"I'm not a huge fan of umbrella rigs, but I'd also have one of those tied on," Dortch said. "I wouldn't say both anglers should be throwing it, but one of us would be. Especially if I

were fishing out deep."

Dortch predicted that the three-day winning total of the event on Wheeler Lake would be right around 50 pounds.

Anglers will take off from Wheeler State Park at 4401 McLean Drive in Rogersville, Alabama at 6:30am CDT. Wednesday and Thursday's weigh-in will be held at the State Park beginning at 2:30pm. Friday's weigh-in will be held at McFarland Park at 200 Jim Spain Drive in Florence at 3pm prior to the day two weigh-in of the BFL All-American championship at Pickwick Lake.

The winning team will compete Saturday in a oneday fish-off on Wilson Lake. The two anglers will weigh in at 3:25pm prior to the final weigh in of the BFL All-American championship at Pickwick Lake. All takeoffs and weigh-ins are free and open to the public.

During 2016, the Hawk Pride Water System was selected to be part of a nationwide group of systems to be tested for "unregulated" contaminant monitoring (designated UCMR3). 26 unregulated

26 were detected in our system: chromium.0013mg/l; chromium-6-.0014mg/l; and strontium-.120mg/l. The complete results of these tests are on file at our treatment plant. Call (256)627-0691 if you have questions.

Required information: Some people may be more vulnerable (than the general population) to contaminants in drinking water. Total Coliform: The Total Coliform Rule requires water systems to meet a stricter limit for coliform bacteria. Coliform bacteria are usually harmless, but their presence in water can be an indication of diseasecausing bacteria. When coliform bacteria are found, special follow-up tests are done to determine if harmful bacteria are present in the water supply. If this limit is exceeded, the water supplier must notify the public by newspaper, television or radio. To comply

with the stricter regulation, Hawk Pride has increased the average amount of chlorine in the distribution system.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU) nephelometric turbidity unit is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

Disinfectant Byproducts - contaminants formed when chlorine is used as a disinfectant. ND – None detected

NOTE: The tables list drinking water contaminants that we detected during the calendar year of this report.
