Orleans United Coalition Corner UNDERAGE DRINKING-WHAT PARENTS CAN DO

If you choose to drink, model responsible drinking behavior. Try to avoid sending any unintended messages and find ways to celebrate and relax without alcohol.

Don't make alcohol available to your child or their friends. This isn't only a matter of safety, it's the law.

Supervise parties in your home to make sure there is no alcohol and make sure your teens know the rules ahead of time. Learn more about social hosting laws and what they can mean for your personal liability in the event of underage drinking in the home.

Is your child socializing at someone else's home? Know where he or she will be. Call the parents in advance to verify the occasion and location and that there will be supervision. If the activity seems inappropriate, express concern and keep your child home.

Communicate your expectations and rules for when your child goes out with friends, and include regular check-ins.

Assure your child that he or she can call you to be picked up whenever needed.

Peter Nye and Mike Allen from the DEC when they went back to band the young eaglets in our local eagle nests. Peter and Mike, along with a lot of other volunteers, are the guys responsible for bringing the Bald Eagle back to NYS after we had only one (not producing) eagle nest left. Dan Carroll, then DEC Senior Wildlife Biologist for our two local Wildlife Management Areas, in those early years came up with an idea to place a camera up by the eagle nest so everyone could see what went on at the nest. Somehow he got me involved with that project and I have kept a close eye on our local eagles ever since.

In 2008 a eagle decided to set up "house keeping" over in the Oak Orchard Wildlife Management Area on an island in Windmill Marsh. I have of course kept an "eagle eye" on that nest ever since then.

This eagle, who I call "Windmill," was very successful at producing young from this nest but then one year she decided to build and use an alternate nest (not uncommon for eagles) on the other end of that island. I didn't like that as it was a very difficult nest to see so I had a discussion with her and the next year she moved back to the original nest.

The first time I realized "Windmill" was a little different was when Mike Allen, Sonny Knowlton and I went over to the nest to band the young eaglets the first year. We canoed over to the island and while Mike was putting on his climbing spikes under the nest tree I looked up and there "Windmill" stood on the side of the nest watching Mike! Most eagles would have been long gone, but not her. In fact she remained nearby during the whole procedure.

The second time I knew she was "different" was when I had set up a photo blind in two feet of water out from the island to photograph the bringing in of food for the eaglets after they were about 5 weeks old. I canoed in an hour before dark and sneaked in that blind, sitting on a five-gallon pail in two feet of water for 8 hours and never got the "shot" I was hoping for, as the adults' approach pattern to the nest almost prevented it. However when I left "Windmill" sat perched on a pine limb overhanging the edge of the island and remained there as I paddled by her. Taking advantage of that I turned the canoe so the light was right and had a nice photo session, with her not seeming to be much concerned about me.

Then four years ago "Windmill" decided to take over an huge osprey nest about 600 yards away in the marsh right next to Windmill Marsh. She was successful there for three years and I again was pretty much accepted by her in that area. Then this winter a bad wind storm blew down the nest tree. However her and her mate got right on the stick and started building a new nest on the edge of that marsh. Only problem was it was not built in a very stable situation and it was only 42 yards from a Handicap Trail that is also used by hikers, birders and bike riders. DEC personnel rushed in and put a predator guard on the tree and closed off the trail for public use so she would not be disturbed. Then along comes this last big wind storm and that nest goes down! My hopes then were that she would go back to one of the nests on the island on Windmill Marsh. Then this last week as I was monitoring the alternate nest, the original showed no signs of recent work, but the alternate did. I saw an adult come into the nest with grass, and shortly afterward the mate. Great sign! When they finally left "Windmill" perched in a tree near the Handicap Trail, so I took that route on the way out. The trail was only 30 yards from the tree and she never moved as I slowly drove by. I did not stop for a picture because of all the tree limbs in the way but about 50 yards away I had a clear shot and I stopped. She just sat there as I excitingly "shot" away for 20 minutes. She finally left, but just as she did she said, " I figured you wanted to get some good shots of me." Several shots gave me a good reading on her blue NYS leg band. I quickly send a picture off to Mike and Peter and they come back "banded in the Hemlock nest in 2003 as a female fledgling." WOW, 14 years old and still going strong! Hopefully they still have time for a successful nesting season. "Windmill" is 14 years old but Peter had one that was found hit by a vehicle a couple of years ago that had one of his leg bands on. It was 38 years old! The oldest banded Bald Eagle ever! Hope "Windmill" makes that! My contact information is 585-798-4022 or woodduck2020@yahoo.com.

Consignment Shops

Consignment stores have grown in popularity in recent years, particularly among bargain hunters. In addition to offering great deals, such shops also buy clothing, giving shoppers a chance to make a little money when retiring previously used clothing or merchandise.

Although thrift stores and consignment shops seem similar, there are differences between their business models. Thrift stores accept donated merchandise and sell it as their own for profit. The person who has donated the merchandise receives no compensation, although he or she may be eligible for a tax deduction depending on the size of the donation.

Consignment stores act as third-party sellers, or consignees. The individual bringing in the merchandise -- the consignor -- is the rightful owner of any items at the consignment store until the point of sale. He or she negotiates a contract with the consignment store that indicates how profits of items sold will be split. The store will keep a percentage of the money, while the person whose items have been sold will get a share as well. Should the items not be sold within a certain period of time, they can be returned to the original owner.

How to Plant a Tree for **Successful Growth**

More sunlight and warm temperatures frequently inspire homeowners to spend more time in the great outdoors during spring and summer.

Outdoor projects often top homeowners' to-do lists in spring and summer, with gardens and landscapes taking center stage. Planting more trees around the yard is one popular project that can improve property value and benefit the environment.

Why plant trees?

There are plenty of reasons to plant trees. Trees provide a natural form of shade, reducing air temperature by blocking the sun's rays. This can reduce reliance on air conditioning systems and make it more comfortable to spend time outdoors during the summer.

North Carolina State University College of Agriculture & Life Sciences says trees absorb and block noise and reduce glare. They also can trap dust, pollen and smoke. Trees also absorb carbon dioxide and potentially harmful gasses from the air. One large tree can supply a day's worth of oxygen for as many as four people, while also storing 13 pounds of carbon per year.

Getting started

Visit a garden center or nursery and select a tree that will be hardy in your planting zone. Choosing native trees can increases the likelihood that the new tree will adapt to its surroundings. Also, inspect trees to determine if they're healthy before taking them home. Look for evidence of root girdling, which occurs when the roots circle around the perimeter of the container and surround the trunk. Trees should not have any dead or dormant branches.

The DIY Network suggests locating the tree where it can thrive. This

means selecting a spot that can make it easier for the tree to grow tall and wide. Avoid planting near the house, where roots can crack concrete or asphalt, and always plant away from underground pipes.

Planting the tree

Now it is time to amend the soil. It's not enough to enrich only the soil in the hole where the tree will be placed. Move out into a circular area beyond where the roots will start so that roots can expand and properly anchor the tree. The next method of success is to ensure that the tree has a large enough hole to contain the existing root ball and allow for roots to grow and expand. Better Homes and Gardens experts say to prepare a hole that is two to three times as wide as the root ball of the tree. Treat the root ball gently. If the roots are wrapped in burlap, remove the burlap or push it to the bottom of the hole.

Backfill the hole with soil and check that the tree is straight. Stake the tree to help it stay upright and straight until the roots anchor it more effectively. A layer of mulch around the base of the tree can prevent weeds and reduce water loss. Water daily for several weeks until the roots have fanned out.

It's best to leave trees be for the first growing season, only removing broken or diseased limbs. Resist pruning and shaping until the tree has survived its first growing season.





Dos and Don'ts for Second-Floor Laundry Rooms

Laundry can be a cumbersome chore. In homes with more than one story, clothes are put in a hamper, carried down to the washer and dryer, where they are then cleaned, dried, folded, and taken back upstairs to be put away. The entire process can be inefficient, which may contribute to why so many people delay doing laundry for as long as possible.

As unenjoyable as it can be, doing laundry is a necessity. Fresh clothing not only looks and smells good, it is essential to personal hygiene. One way to make the process of doing laundry go more smoothly is to consider moving the location of the laundry area. According to the National Association of Home Builders, more homeowners are moving their laundry rooms upstairs so they don't have to transport laundry baskets up and down the stairs.

Before moving their laundry rooms, homeowners should take steps to safeguard their homes, and that may involve finding the ideal location for the new room. Find space for an upstairs laundry room and then consult with an engineer to be sure that the plan is feasible. An engineer and an architect can assess if a home is structurally sound enough to handle the weight and vibration of an upstairs laundry.

One of the biggest concerns with regard to moving a laundry room upstairs is the fear of flooding or leaks. There are certain steps to take to minimize these risks. Experts advise installing an easily accessible water shut-off valve. Turn off the valve when the washer is not in use. Also, steel-braided washer hoses are more sturdy than standard hoses and are less likely to burst. Homeowners also can place the washer in a drain pan, which will catch overflowing water and drain it through a pipe. Some areas may require a floor drain as an alternative.

Homeowners also must recognize that noise can be a problem with



Items to Avoid When Composting

Composting is an eco-friendly activity that can also save homeowners money on fertilizer and pesticides. Organic material that can be added to soil to help plants grow, compost reduces the amount of waste that would otherwise end up in landfills, reducing the amount of methane gas that such landfills produce. But the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency notes that not everything can be added to compost piles. The following are some items homeowners should not add to their compost piles or bins, courtesy of the EPA.

· Black walnut tree leaves or twigs: Leaves or twigs from black walnut release substances that might prove harmful to plants.

· Coal or charcoal ash: Coal or ash from charcoal, such as the ash that builds up in the bottom of charcoal grills, may contain substances that are harmful to plants.

 \cdot Dairy products: When added to compost piles, dairy products, including butter, milk, sour cream, yogurt and eggs, can be malodorous and may attract pests, including rodents and flies.

· Diseased or insect-ridden plants: The diseases and insects that plague plants may survive being transferred to compost piles. When the compost is ultimately distributed, these diseases and insects might then plague other plants.

· Fats, grease, lard, or oils: Fats, grease, lard or oils also may attract rodents and flies, and that might be due to the unpleasant odors such substances can produce when added to compost piles.

Meat or fish bones and scraps: Like fats, grease, lard or oils, scraps from meat and fish and fish bones can smell unpleasant, potentially attracting rodents and flies.

· Pet waste: Pet waste, including soiled cat litter, may contain parasites, bacteria, germs, pathogens, and viruses that can be harmful.

Reduce Energy Costs While Ensuring Homes Stay Cool

According to the International Association of Certified Home Inspectors, as much as half of the energy used in homes goes toward heating and cooling. The following are a handful of ways to make heating and cooling a home more eco-friendly.

Insulate

Insulation often is associated with warmth, and rightfully so, as it is used to protect a home from cold weather. However, insulation also is effective at cooling homes. Many insulation materials work by slowing down the way heat moves through materials and into spaces. Proper insulation can provide effective resistance to the flow of heat, meaning it can help block hot air from flowing into the interior of a home. Insulation will help reduce the amount of work a cooling system will have to do to cool a home thanks to the flow of heat.

Replace air filters

Air filters trap dust, debris and other microscopic particles so they are not circulating in the air or clogging up vents. Over time, air filters can become so bogged down with dirt that air cannot move through a home very easily, forcing cooling systems to work harder. Simply replacing the filters can help cooling systems work more efficiently.

Adjust the thermostat

Programmable thermostats allow homeowners to adjust their cooling systems for when they are home and when they are out. Air conditioners can be set at higher temperatures when residents are at work or school, and then lowered before residents arrive home.

Try evaporative coolers

Sometimes called "swamp coolers," these devices can be effective in regions with low humidity. The U.S. Department of Energy notes that these coolers evaporate water into the air to provide a natural and energy-efficient means of cooling a home. When operating an evaporative cooler, windows are opened part way to allow warm indoor air to escape as it is replaced by cooled air. Unlike central air conditioning systems that recirculate the same air. evaporative coolers provide a steady stream of fresh air into the house. Plus, they consume only about one-quarter of the energy consumed by more traditional air conditioners.





How to Recognize Water Damage in a Home

Homes are potentially susceptible to a host of problems. While unforeseen problems can prove costly, homeowners who keep attentive eyes on their homes can oftentimes discover small problems before they escalate.

Water damage is a potentially costly problem that can afflict any home. Old homes tend to be most susceptible to water damage, and that damage can manifest itself in various ways. The following are some telltale signs of water damage that should give prospective home buyers pause and compel current homeowners to seek professional assistance as soon as possible.

Stains

Many prospective home buyers have been disappointed by the sight of water stains during an open house or home inspection. Water stains tend to be on ceilings and/or walls. Stains on ceilings tend to be round, while wall stains are straight lines down the wall that may or may not have forced paint to peel. Water stains are not necessarily indicative of a major problem, but homeowners should have the stains examined by a professional while potential buyers should direct their home inspector's attention to the stains.

Deteriorating wood

Wood around windows or doors that is deteriorating may indicate water problems. The wood might be deteriorating because water is infiltrating the wood during storms. Baseboards and molding that is dilapidated or beginning to deteriorate may also indicate water damage.

Buckled drywall or wood

Drywall or wood that is buckled or beginning to buckle is another potential indicator of water damage. Drywall buckles when it gets wet, and that is often a sign that there is a leak behind the drywall. Severely buckled drywall will feel as if it has ridges. Wood also buckles when it is exposed to excess moisture, and this can usually be felt when walking on the wood barefoot or in socks.

Odor

Sometimes water damage is best detected by the smell test. Homeowners who notice the smell of mold or mildew in rooms that previously never emanated such odors might have homes that are in the early stages of water problems. The water damage might be behind the walls, where mold is beginning to form thanks to water damage. Older homes tend to be musty, but call in a professional if you notice that mustiness if more pungent than usual.

Water damage is a potentially costly problem, especially if it goes unnoticed for months or even years. Homeowners and prospective home buyers should be on the lookout for signs of water damage before problems escalate and require expensive repairs.





Employment: The Next Step After Graduation

Graduation is an exciting time in the lives of students. After years in the classroom preparing for life after school, graduation marks a time when students are finally ready to enter the "real world" and land their first professional job.

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics advises that earning a college degree can greatly improve a person's chance of landing a job. The more education a person receives, the lower his or her prospects of being unemployed become. The BLS said that, as of 2014, individuals with a bachelor's degree could earn on average \$1,101 per week, compared to \$668 for persons with high school diplomas. Those with bachelor's degrees had a 3.5 percent unemployment rate compared to 6 percent for those with only high school diplomas.

The National Center for Education Statistics estimates that roughly two million students earn bachelor's degrees each year. Many others will go on to earn master's or doctorates before entering the workforce.

As the economy continues to improve, job prospects follow suit. According to a job outlook from the National Association of Colleges and Employers, employers had plans to hire 8.3 percent more new college graduates in 2015 than in 2014. The growth of businesses and the rising rate of retiring Baby Boomers has spurred employment prospects.

Landing a job post-graduation requires diligence on the part of new grads, and the following are a handful of ways to make those pursuits more successful

· Hit the ground running. It's tempting for recent grads to take the summer off and have a lax approach to job hunting after all of the hard work they put into their education. But recent grads can get a head start on their competition by beginning their searches immediately after earning their degrees. Create a list of a few target companies you have your eye on, and then tap into your network to find a contact at each company and reach out to that contact directly.

Take a career assessment test or work with a career counselor to narrow down the fields and positions that speak to you. Avoid the "I'm willing to do or learn anything" approach to job applications. Employers may see that as desperation.

· Don't rely entirely on the Internet. Oftentimes, landing a good job requires reaching out to people in person. In a MonsterCollege survey, 78 percent of job-seekers said networking was a factor in their job searches. Standing out from the crowd may involve physically standing out. Attend conferences or speeches from people who work at the companies you're investigating. Don't be afraid to shake some hands and introduce yourself to others.

· Think about what you can offer to prospective employers. Narrow down your specific skills and customize your résumés or cover letters to the specific talents you can offer each potential employer. Use examples that illustrate these skills from past school courses, volunteerism or part-time jobs. Your "quirks," like being the most punctual person in your group of friends, may turn out to be the skill an employer admires the most. Consider developing a career portfolio that highlights your past achievements.

· Do your homework before an interview or networking opportunity. Always be prepared before an interview or when meeting with someone you are soliciting for job help. Research the company and know its background so you have an idea of how the company runs. Keep a list of questions at the ready. A knowledge of the company can help you stand out from other applicants





In a small bowl, combine tandoori paste, 2 tablespoons yogurt, lemon zest, and lemon juice. Put chicken in a baking dish. Pour tandoori mixture over and stir until chicken is coated. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours.

Light a fire in a charcoal grill or heat a grill pan. Brush grill or pan lightly with oil. Cook chicken for 4 to 5 minutes on each side, or until juices run clear when pierced with a skewer. Transfer to a cutting board and let rest for 5 minutes. Cut each tenderloin into 2 long strips (if using chicken breast fillets, slice each fillet into 4 long strips).

Using a vegetable peeler, cut carrot and cucumber into thin ribbons. To heat naan, follow instructions on packet. In a small bowl, stir 1/2 cup yogurt, garlic and chopped mint together.

Place naan on a work surface. Divide chicken, cucumber, carrot, and mint leaves
