MEET ME ON THE RIVER

GET YOUR FEET WET AND PADDLE YOUR WAY THROUGH TENNESSEE

Rain or shine, any day on the river is a good day and Tennessee State Representative Judd Matheny couldn't agree more. Matheny has spent his life navigating the waterways of Tennessee and beyond, not only from the seat of a kayak but from the state capital as well, working to protect and preserve one of Tennessee's greatest natural resources.

Manchester's proximity to three lakes (Tim's Ford Lake, Normandy Lake and Woods Reservoir), and two major rivers (Duck River and the Elk River) make it the ideal location for kayak, canoe and stand-up paddle-board enthusiasts to explore the scenic waters of South Central Tennessee and to get a close up view of the abundant wildlife that lives within the delicate ecosystem along the river. The Duck River, at 284 miles long, is the longest river located entirely in the state of Tennessee. It is also one of the most biologically diverse rivers in North America, home to more than 50 species of freshwater mussels and over 150 species of fish.

The last 15 years have brought major improvements to the cleanliness of Tennessee rivers and lakes, a result of raising public awareness on the important issues that concern water quality through education and enforcing environmental laws. Through these efforts, wildlife habitat is being restored and the recent reintroduction of the bald eagle and river otter are proof these efforts are not in vain. Matheny adds, "On any given day you'll see a mink, otter, all types of fish, snakes, turtles and more—I've passed right under a bald eagle within 15 feet of where it was sitting over the river."

Matheny is also working with others to make the river more accessible by increasing the number of ingress and egress points. This involves creating and maintaining good relationships with private land owners along the river and respecting the privilege of river access through keeping the launch points clean and free of trash.

Paddling down a lazy Tennessee river, through the old stomping grounds of Davy Crockett or passing by the ceremonial gathering places of the Woodland Indians, creates a sense of awe and reverence for the land. The senses come alive with the sights and sounds of the river —the wings of a blue heron taking flight, the splash of a trout jumping, the rhythm of the water gently rocking the boat. A day spent on the river is relaxing, peaceful, refreshing and exhilarating all at the same time—it just doesn't get much better than that.

When asked if he had a favorite memory of his river adventures, Matheny replied, "I probably can't give you one particular memory, but I could give you a thousand different ones of people laughing and swimming and having a great time".

AREA LAKES 8 RIVERS

NORMANDY LAKE

Normandy Lake offers a number of public boat ramps, and campgrounds. Covering 3,160 acres it offers anglers superb fishing opportunities. The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Agency regularly stock rainbow trout in the Duck River below Normandy Dam. The lake boasts sizable populations of largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and is one of the top spots to tangle with the feisty Kentucky bass. In recent years thanks to a very successful stocking program by the TWRA walleye have taken the spotlight from late spring through summer as a preferred quarry by many anglers. Crappie anglers fish the lake year round.

TIMS FORD LAKE

Tims Ford was impounded in 1970 when the Tennessee Valley Authority built a hydro-electric dam across the Elk River. The 10,700 acre lake is one of the most picturesque in Tennessee and is regarded as one of the top bass fishing and recreational lakes in the Southeast. The lakes deep clear water has made it famous for those in search of small-mouth bass. In addition the lake hosts excellent populations of largemouth bass, Kentucky bass, Rockfish, hybrids, crappie and catfish.

DUCK RIVER

Winding 269 miles through Middle Tennessee, the Duck River is one of the state's most scenic waterways. But there's more here than meets the eye. Underneath the surface, the river teems with an almost unsurpassed variety of freshwater animal life. It is one of three hot spots for fish and mussel diversity in the entire world.

WOODS RESERVOIR

Woods Reservoir was the only recreational lake in the area for decades. Impounded in 1952 by the Air Force as a water supply for Arnold Air Force base the lake soon became Middle Tennessee's favorite outdoors recreation site.

ELK RIVER

ATTE-

The Elk River begins at Tims Ford Lake and flows over the Cumberland Plateau to the Wheeler Dam in northern Alabama, where it connects with the Tennessee River. The river flows through woodlands and farm areas, offering a quiet, scenic place to canoe and camp. It's a calm-water river with Class I water. Along the banks and greater area, you'll see wildlife like blue heron, beavers, deer, wild turkey and hawks. Wildflowers and limestone formations offer other attractions.

D onnaroo Music and Arts Festival, considered by Dmany as the pinnacle of American music festivals, is making history by forging a trail where no other festival has gone before. For four days in June, over 80,000 people come together in the fields of a 700 acre Manchester, Tennessee farm known as Great Stage Park (aka The Farm). During this short span of time, a closeknit community is born with the shared purpose to simply enjoy one another, listen to great music, eat well and most of all "have a really good time". It doesn't matter where you are from, what you do for a living, what kind of car you drive, or what kind of music you listen to, labels and stereotypes are left at home. And for a moment, that passes all too quickly, people stand together on the common ground of The Farm and create what becomes the seventh largest city in Tennessee-a city filled with high-fives, laughter, smiling faces, brotherly love and music.

Bonnaroo is serious fun no matter what direction you turn. From Centeroo, which is the nucleus of the festival grounds, as its name implies, to Which Stage or What Stage, This Tent or That Tent, the Solar Stage or the Other Stage (new for 2017), the Comedy Theatre or the Bonnaroo Cinema, there is no wrong way to go and wherever you are is the right place at the right time. The only challenge will be in deciding what to do next.

Sustainability is a core value of the folks at Bonnaroo and \$1 from every ticket sold goes towards the sustainability work on the festival grounds. These funds and other generous donations have already enabled Bonnaroo to install a permanent solar system, the first ever at a major American music festival. Festival goers are encouraged to carpool, utilize shuttle services, use refillable containers, compost, recycle and share in helping to keep the area green and clean.

Of course it really is all about the music and every year Bonnaroo boasts a diverse and stellar lineup like no other. Over 100 top acts will come from all over the world and for some of the acts, this will be the only festival they play all year. Where else can you see U2 (their first ever U.S. festival headlining appearance), the Red Hot Chili Peppers, the Weeknd, Margo Price and Greensky Bluegrass all in the same place and possibly even on the same stage together? - Trisha Sandora

FRANDS-ON SCIENCE CENTER COMMUNITY COMMITMENT TO SCIENCE CREATES REGIONAL ASSET

s you drive down into Tullahoma on Highway 55, there are few places in Middle Tennessee where the opportunities for learning, inspiration, and fun are so boundless. Since opening its doors in 1995, the Hands-On Science Center has been an institution of singular importance, providing access to exceptional informal science education and offering transformative experiences for children and adults alike.

Ambitious and visionary, community leaders, engineers, scientists, and professionals came together to make a transformational investment in the region and its citizens ... creating an 11,000-square foot facility dedicated to making science and math fun. With community support, the Hands-On Science Center is an important catalyst in the advancement of education and career awareness in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), while also playing a role in workforce development and economic growth.

Hosting over 18,000 visitors a year, the Center is a significant contributor to the region's quality of life. With an observatory, music garden, human sun dial, and over





100 hands-on exhibits inside the facility (with 92 other exhibits in storage awaiting rotation), visitors explore all facets of science. Last year we enhanced our aquatic center and added a 180-gallon salt water fish tank, a fresh water tank, and by June 2017, a predator tank will be operational.

The Hands-On Science Center' newest endeavor ... developing a makerspace for designing and building all kinds of educational projects. With the resources, tools, and materials,—everything from basic electronics and making circuits to using craft materials to design an astronaut suit, the makerspace will attract all ages with curiosity and focus. Just as we do in our education programs and camps, our visitors will watch others design or collaborate with other makers, as they discover scientific principles. Combining a Science Center with a makerspace provides an education with the best of both worlds. 

Cumberland Caverns located in McMinnville, Tennessee, is one of the most extensive known caves in America. Portions of this caving system were originally known as Higgenbotham Cave and Henshaw Cave. Considerable exploration of previously unseen sections along with integration of the two caves substantially enlarged Cumberland Caverns to the more than 32 miles that can be toured today.

Surveyor Aaron Higgenbotham discovered Higgenbotham Cave (now a national landmark) in 1810. Venturing into the cave alone, he was trapped for three days on a high ledge when his torch went out. According to local legend, his hair had turned white by the time a rescue party found him. Aaron Higgenbotham did not penetrate very far underground, but shortly after the close of the Civil War, someone explored for over a mile in Higgenbotham Cave and discovered a huge avenue–60 ft. wide, 10 ft. high, and 2000 ft. long–the "Ten Acre Room." The name "Shelah Waters" and the date "1869" are inscribed on the walls in candle smoke or scratched into the rock in many rather remote areas. This is the oldest name and date in the cave. Higgenbotham Cave is mentioned in old histories of Warren County as a local attraction, and Thomas L. Bailey in "Resources of Tennessee" first described it in print for 1918.

ON SACRED GROUND

Manchester's own state park, a favorite among history buffs thanks to its Native American heritage dating back two millennia, turns 50.

ON SACRED GROUND "We were the first official state archaeological park in Tennessee and are one of only two currently in existence," says Park Manager Keith Wimberley. "The cultural aspect of Old Stone Fort is what brings so many visitors here, and the scenic beauty is right up there with any park in the state." Since the site itself hails from a pre-historic era,



LITTLE DUCK RIVER GREENWAY

The Little Duck River Greenway connects the Coffee County Raider Academy, Dave King Park, Fred Deadman Park, the Recreation Complex, the Town Square, Old Stone Fort State Park and the Caretakers Entrance of Old Stone Fort on State Hwy 41. It is a 2.4 mile, 8 foot wide concrete walkway with wooden boardwalks, bridges, an octagonal overlook, and the Keep Coffee County Beautiful Memorial. The newest section just opened up at the Manchester Sports Park.

much about the Native American rituals are left up to interpretation, but what historians do know is that the site was not used for habitation, burials or defense (settlers often dubbed such enclosures "forts"). Manchester's own state park is a favorite among history buffs thanks to its Native American heritage dating back two millennia. "[The Woodland Indians] wanted to set their sacred space apart," Wimberley explains. "This was meant only to be a ceremonial gathering place." Upward of 200,000 people visit Old Stone Fort State Archaeological Park annually, many to experience its history and others for the abundance of outdoor offerings, including its iconic cascading waterfalls. Located at the point where two rivers drop off the Highland Rim plateau, the park is rife in water sources; falls plunge from the beginning of the trail down to the depths of Tennessee's Central Basin. Long, wall-like mounds that were characteristics of the Woodland Period flank the riverside trail, and park visitors will find a set of parallel mound walls oriented to within one degree of the summer solstice sunrise at the narrow neck of land before the Little Duck and Duck rivers meet. Boasting 51 heavily wooded campsites outfitted with water and 30-amp electrical hookups, grills, picnic tables, hard-surface pads and restroom facilities with showers, Old Stone Fort State Park is not just for day-trippers, but also appeals to those who want to spend a weekend-or longer-exploring the area with Manchester as their home base (campsite fees are \$24 a night with a twoweek stay limit). The park has a museum and gift shop, a 1.25-mile perimeter trail within the ancient enclosure and four additional miles of developed trails, while the campground has its own Nature Trail. A playground for children is located in the picnic area along with more than 30 picnic tables and grills, in addition to a shelter available for rent. Birders can delight in catching glimpses of such native species as the Northern Parula, Red-eyed Vireo and occasional blue heron. Fishermen love the park for the copious largemouth Bass, bream and catfish that swim the waters of the Duck River. There are also interpretative programs every Saturday and Sunday from Memorial Day to Labor Day led by seasonal rangers and suitable for all ages. "[Old Stone Fort] is truly a hidden gem," Wimberley says. "A lot of people who grew up close by will show up and say, 'I've lived here my whole life and never really knew this existed.' And when they discover it, it's something special."



MESSAGE IN A BOTT

GEOCACHING...A REAL-LIFE TREASURE HUNT THROUGH TENNESSEE

In the hollow branch of a tree that grows along the edge of the Duck River outside of Manchester, there is a message in a bottle. This particular bottle is a small lock-tight orange medicine-type bottle that holds various items such as a logbook, a codeword, a pen and an item or two left from those who have been here before. The logbook is filled with the dates and signatures of fellow treasure hunters, some who have added a short message revealing where they are visiting from (London, Illinois, California), or other exciting details about their travels such as "getting married tomorrow". This hidden bottle is a geocache, one of more than 3 million that are hidden all over the world as part of the rapidly growing game of discovery known as Geocaching.

Geocaching is a great way to explore a new destination and to exercise the mind and the body while you are at it. It is also adding a whole new dimension to travel and family vacations, providing an inexpensive activity that involves everyone and even provides an itinerary of where to go and what to see.

Geocache Tours are a series of multiple geocaches in an area. South Central Tennessee has two Geotours, the Jack Geotour consisting of 66 geocaches spread across 9 counties and the Discover South Central Tennessee Geotour consisting of 87 geocaches across 14 counties. Each Geotour has a downloadable passport where players can log their codewords to win trackable "geocoins" (Read more about this at www.sctta.net/ geocaching). These tours take visitors to locations they may not ordinarily visit, such as city parks, rivers, historical landmarks, restaurants and other businesses along the beautiful backroads of Tennessee.

Ready to get started? The first step is to go to geocaching.com and sign up so that you can view

the geocaches. Next, choose a geocache to find (chances are there is one hidden close by), then enter the coordinates on a GPS device and let the search begin. The geocaches are always placed in some type of weather proof container such as a film canister, a medicine bottle, a water bottle or an ammo box and may be hidden behind a bush, next to a building, under the stairs, in a tree or all sorts of other places. Although Geocaching can be done with any GPS device by manually entering in the coordinates, the Geocaching App is an invaluable tool that helps locate the coordinates, gives hints as to where to look and provides fantastic information about the geography and history of an area.

Some fellow geocachers have a great sense of humor and have left small items in the geocache along with a clever or funny message in the logbook. Upon opening one of the caches that was hidden deep within the bushes, a plastic spider was sitting on the logbook...very funny!

A word of advice from one fellow geocacher to another, once you have found the geocache you are searching for, take a moment to look around at the beautiful landscape, the wildlife, the remnants of history and if the cache is located at a business, stop in and say hello. Finding the geocache is only the beginning of the adventure.

Manchester Arts Center

The Mission of the Manchester Municipal Arts Commission is to foster, promote, and encourage the development of the arts in Manchester and the surrounding areas.

The organization serves Coffee County and surrounding counties of Rutherford, Cannon, Warren, Grundy, Franklin, Moore, and Bedford. It has roots dating back to 1968, when the emphasis was on the visual arts. It was incorporated by the state and named the Manchester Municipal Arts Commission. In 1995, this group purchased a building at 909 Hillsboro Blvd. The building was leased to a professional theatre group which renovated the interior for theatre and reception use and operated the facility for one year. Since Oct. 1, 1996 the MMAC, with the help of those trained in college in theatre and a cadre of volunteers, took over the building and put on the productions.

In 1996, the Commission applied for and received 501(c)(3) status as well as a state tax exemption. Since that time the group has produced 5 or 6 shows yearly accompanied by complementing art shows. Active youth groups, Teen Actors Guild (TAG) and Wee Actors Guild (WAG,) were formed which put on one show yearly as well as having monthly activities. The teen group had Coffee Shops with open mic and felt a vested interest in the Manchester Arts Center. Both groups took adult led trips to professional shows and art galleries. The building was completely renovated, including lighted parking area, a ramp into the building for those with disabilities, new roof, rebuilt theatre seating, and improved lighting and sound. Even when the building was destroyed by a fire in 2006, the Arts Commission continued to function and provide quality events for our community.

Now that the new Manchester Arts Center is once again in a new building, we anticipate adding more events, offering more classes and continuing to serve the youth and adults in this community and surrounding areas.

THE COFFEE COUNTY FAIR CELEBRATES THE HERITAGE OF RURAL AMERICA

The Coffee County Fair has been bringing the community together and creating lasting memories since 1857. The county fair, one of the oldest forms of community celebration, recognizes the value of rural life and provides a means for showcasing the achievements of the past year. Whether it be a homegrown heirloom tomato, a jar of blackberry preserves, a hand-quilted bedspread or a 4-H steer that has been successfully raised and trained, the county fair is a place for those efforts to shine. And shine they do, with parades, competitions, livestock shows, blue ribbons, prize trophies, buckles and rhinestone studded crowns.



The Coffee County Fair keeps a firm hold on tradition and at the same time embraces the future, as it introduces new generations to different aspects of agriculture through educational displays and activities. A stroll through the livestock barns provides a glimpse of the hard work kids have put into their 4-H projects throughout the year. Solid core values such as stewardship and responsibility are seen in action as kids care for their animals. Visit the fair on a show day and watch these same animals as they are transformed from ordinary barnyard animals to champions dressed in their Sunday best with shiny coats and polished hooves. There is also a video display that highlights the Century farms in Coffee County, recognizing families that have owned and farmed the same land for at least 100 years.

The annual fair not only provides a gathering place for people of all ages, it also offers a host of activities. At the Youth Day field events (sponsored by the Sheriff's Dept.) kids can enter races such as the sack race or three-legged race. The Petting Zoo allows kids to get a close-up view of farm animals and to feel the soft fur of a rabbit or the cold wet nose of a calf. The Pedal Pull lets kids put their driving skills to work and of course it wouldn't be a county fair without the Dog Show & Costume Contest.



But wait, there is more. Mule races, live music performances, corn dogs, BBQ, ice-cold lemonade and the Rotary Club's famous funnel cakes. Then there are the carnival nights with dozens of thrilling rides and games of chance. A good time is sure to be had by all.

Years of effort and hard work have gone into making the Coffee County Fair withstand the test of time in an ever-changing world. From the volunteer Fair Board members to the devoted citizens and sponsors, countless hands work year-round to plan this event and before the current fair is even over, the planning for next year's event is already in the works. The 2017 Coffee County Fair will continue the tradition of one of the oldest county fairs in Tennessee with a new list of blue ribbon winners, and even if that apple pie didn't win first place, there is still the pride and satisfaction that comes from being a part of the county fair and sharing your labor of love with the community.

The Coffee County Fair is as authentic as it gets with real life stories and people that remind us of our heritage and of the important things that make life extra special— a winning combination of agriculture, food, music, hand-made goods, sportsmanship, showmanship, family, friends, and most of all good old fashioned fun. - Trisha Sandora

From the extensive salad bar filled with fresh vegetables, side salads and Lisa's homemade Soup of the Day to the shish kabobs, steaks, and braided thin crust pizza, the menu offers plenty of excellent options and a few tough decisions, such as whether to order the J & G Special pizza or the Chicken Parmesan. The open kitchen that stretches across the back of the restaurant speaks volumes about the pride the family takes in a clean and well-prepped kitchen. It is quickly evident they have been doing this awhile.

Manchester is a better place thanks to the Rouvelas' who chose to call this small town home back in 1973. Lisa adds, "We love the people and the people love us." As Lisa makes her way around the restaurant, stopping at tables to visit and to welcome customers both new and old, it is clear that the love she speaks of is mutual. They don't make restaurants like this anymore and J & G Pizza and Steakhouse is a rare find. Don't worry if you have trouble making a decision on what to order, there is always next time and this is one restaurant you will want to visit again and again.
