# Vintage weekend set for July

# RA events tout Camaro's 50th anniversary

Summer is in full swing and this year hundreds of vintage racers will make the journey to Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin to celebrate the beauty and performance of some of the world's greatest racecars and sports cars, July 20-23 at Road America for the WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman presented by HAWK.

Widely known as one of the largest vintage racing gatherings in the United States, over 450 cars are expected to participate and both race cars and sports cars from all walks of vintage are welcome. With 16 different groups subdivided into several sub-classes the breadth of cars has something for everyone and there will be no shortage of spectacular racing.

Every year has a feature marquee and this year as participants descend on the historic circuit Road America plans to honor the Chevrolet Camaro as it celebrates its 50th Anniversary and host a reunion for the Sports 2000 racer as it celebrates its 40th Anniversary along with celebrating the 51st Anniversary of the Canadian-American Challenge or Can-Am Series.

Having the Chevrolet Camaro serve as the featured marque for The WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman is a fitting tribute for one of America's most iconic sports cars at America's greatest road course because Camaros are part of Road America's essential character and have raced at the fabled four-mile 14-turn circuit for decades.

Racing has always been present in the Chevrolet Camaro's bloodstream and koad America's high-speed four-mile track has long been a battleground for generations of notable racers. With drivers such as Mark Donohue driving for Roger Penske, Chevrolet Camaros became a formidable threat in the 'over 2 liter' category of the SCCA Trans-Am Series while taking top honors in 1969. Donohue's background as an engineer gave him a unique perspective and during this period he changed forever the way racing cars are developed. Penske meanwhile brought the art of sponsorship to a new level. This success was just the beginning of the Z/28 legacy of racing performance and the Chevrolet Camaro has went on to

# The playground is open!

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah School District students, staff, and administration are so excited to announce that Phase I of the All-Inclusive Playground at the Elementary/Middle School has been completed and ready for play! Students were ecstatic on the first day back from Spring Break when Ethan DeZwarte, junior kindergarten student, cut the ribbon to the new playground.

The playground design and structure, along with the smooth poured rubber surface, make it a breeze for children of all abilities to play together in a fun environment. There are varying degrees of challenges within the structure, ensuring that children of varying ages or abilities can grow with it. Many great features include climbers, slides and interactive panels. You'll also find some fun independent play items such as the sensory wall and the cozy dome in which to hide and climb. A bench has been added to the playground to rest after 50 rounds on the slide! We want to thank our very generous donors who supported this project. Through their generosity, we have almost reached the \$160,000 goal with fundraising still continuing.

Due to the success of Phase I, we have tentative plans to expand the all-inclusive play area to other parts of the playground. This would be Phase II. These plans include pouring a rubber surface in the southwest corner so we could to add a "spinner" and additional multi-sensory learning panels. Also we would like to add a "rocker" piece to the middle of the playground. This piece is designed to be accessed via a ramp so it can be located in the wood-chipped section. The cost of the various pieces of equipment and additional rubber surface for Phase II is approximately \$55,000-\$75,000 (depending on final selection of equipment). 

# **Motorsport Villas makes a splash**

Motorsport Villas of Elkhart Lake hosted an open house for region's first "car condominium" development June 3, officially breaking ground on one of the village's most significant developments.

Motorsport Villas represents the culmination of a dream of visionary and founder Bart Wolf and Wolf Developments.

The development is located in the Village of Elkhart Lake, just upon entry into the village from the south, and just east of Quit Qui Oc Golf Club.

Car condominium units that were originally expected to sell over the course of several years; instead nearly all sold in just a few months.

Only two villas remain. The open house included a rare view of several of the built-out car condo units.

The car condominium concept is not entirely new. Previously, it has been developed in industrial sites in metropolitan locals such as Minneapolis, Kansas City, Detroit and Chicago.

#### Scenic setting

Motorsport Villas is nestled adjacent to the LaBudde Creek State Wildlife Area along the Scenic Kettle Moraine Drive. The site was selected due to the picturesque surroundings and the unique acces to prominent local attractions, including Road America and the seemingly neverending tree-line curved roads in the area.

"From the beginning, we wanted Elkhart Lake to be the home of the Villas," Bart Wolf said. "It provides an unmatched opportunity to merge motorsports, race hertiage and all things motoring with a place for enthusiasts to live and vacation among automotive art, as well as stay year around.

Wolf said Villa residents will now be part of the continuing legacy of the area, whether they enjoy the return of IndyCar Racing to Road America, the vintage race car parades or the Villa's own events.

Owners have the option of living either full- or part-time in the Motorsport Villa community. Additionally, owners can create an income opportunity by renting out their villa as they wish.

#### Love of racing

Wolf Developments President Bart Wolf grew up in Elkhart Lake and has raced on the national scene since for over 30 years. He started in karting at the age of 7.

Bart has been a part of the national racing scene since. He has over 60 wins in SCCA national races, nine track records, and has been in the top 3 on a national level 10 of the last 12 years.

All this through a local crew going headto-head with heavily funded efforts with resources covering crew support, coaching, and funding of the car development itself. His tenacity as a driver led him to many victories in professional races going head-to-head with up and coming Indy car drivers. That drive to succeed has extended into the business world: through combining this specific blend of hands-on know-how of car preparation and racing alike, Bart created Wolf Motorsports.

Senior lending for the development was provided by Hiawatha National Bank of Sheboygan, Architectural Design was prepared by LCM Architecture of Sheboygan and construction services provided by Quasius Construction, Inc. Subcontractors included JSM, Drexel, and KW Electrical

The project was created, in part, through the development of a tax incremental

become one of the most sought after collector cars, no matter what the year, and a current model has been announced this year to carry on the legacy.

Always evolving, every version of the Chevrolet Camaro has been embraced over the decades, offering people a way to express themselves. Camaros have been a canvas for personalization and competition. From 600-horsepower-plus versions that can exceed 200 mph to the most affordable models that get more than 30 mpg and deliver more than 300 horsepower, Chevrolet and the Camaro's universal appeal has made it a symbol of Americana.

Road America is proud to continue the 50th Anniversary celebration of the Camaro with a racer's reunion, races for club and pro series–vintage, historic and contemporary racers; a concours with expert and people's choice awards, track touring, parade laps and a vendor marketplace making The 2017 WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman the ultimate destination for Camaro enthusiasts and an event that everyone of all ages can enjoy.

The sights, sounds and smells of rare and historically significant Sports 2000 racing machines will make their return for The WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman at Road America as well as the popular Sports 2000 racer celebrates its 40th Anniversary.

Preceded by the International 2-liter, two-seat FIA Group 6 sports racing car class, Sports 2000 was the creation of Brands Hatch circuit owner John Webb in 1976, as an antidote to the high costs and dwindling entries of the Chevrons, Lolas and Abarths in the early and mid 70's. With a tightly controlled motor specification, reasonable tire bills and the support of the largest and most successful commercial racing car manufacturers at the time, the first race was held at Oulton Park in April 1977 and won by Olympic ski champion, Divina Galica, in a Lola T-490.

US Lola importer Carl Haas brought over five Sports 2000's for a group of SCCA racers in the Midwest in the fall of 1978, the class being accorded SCCA National status in 1980 and continuing on today. These cars have a strong following internationally, with active groups particularly in the UK and the USA along with those in Scandinavia, the Netherlands and Australia. In addition to nearly 80 Sports 2000 racers expected in the paddock will be the most widely decorated Sports 2000 in America, piloted by John C Fergus II, with eight SCCA Runoffs championships and one Pro Sports 2000 championship to its credit.

Competitors and fans will have the unique opportunity to catch all the action from these rare racers as they traverse through Turn 5, negotiate Canada Corner and barrel up the famed Front Straight to capture a bit of history. The Sports 2000's will be on track with qualifying on Saturday and a special race on Sunday.

Along with honoring the Chevrolet Camaro and Sports 2000, Road America celebrates the 51st Anniversary of the Canadian-American Challenge or Can-Am Series. This is perhaps the most fondly remembered racing series ever, as it had minimal rules. Two seats, fendered bodywork, and that was about it. Unlimited engines, fat tires and unimaginable speed sums up what Can-Am was and the McLaren team ruled the early years. They won five years in a row at Road America, twice with Bruce McLaren and once each with Denny Hulme, Peter Gethin, and Peter Revson. In each instance the race was no contest, as the orange McLarens simply were the ones to beat. Their stranglehold on the Can-Am was broken in 1972 when Porsche practiced extreme excess in their designs. Porsche built a twin turbocharged five-liter V-12 engine that put out well over 1000 horsepower. They hired Roger Penske's team to run the car, and as expected, they won as they pleased. George Follmer took the win at Road America in 1972 and Mark Donohue in 1973, each winning the season championship.

The Can-Am was last held in 1974, its demise essentially due to its success. That is, with virtually no rules, only one or two teams could reasonably win, so the rest went home. But while it lasted it was most memorable. The fans reacted accordingly with the biggest crowds ever at Road America until the top CART years of the mid 1990s which is exactly why Road America and fans alike enjoy the return of the Can-Am cars every year during the WeatherTech<sup>®</sup> International Challenge with Brian Redman presented by HAWK.

The festivities kick off on Thursday, July 20, with gates opening at 7 a.m. Test sessions begin at 8 a.m., and run through-



out the entire day. On Friday the on track action resumes with practice sessions in the morning and qualifying sessions in the afternoon.

Friday evening, the tiny village of Elkhart Lake will spring to life with a blend of art-on-wheels as over 100 race cars will parade from the track to downtown Elkhart Lake for judging and spectator viewing beginning at 6 p.m., for the Concours d'Elegance.

This event is a must see spectacle for enthusiasts of all ages as the quiet town is taken over by vintage racing cars. The sound, while not as visceral as being at the track itself is unique in that you are seeing the pinnacle of vintage racing rumble through public roads. Standing ten feet from a 1,000 horsepower big block Can-Am car, or the beyond mad 80's Formula 1 turbo cars as they idle and rev by you is a sensation that goes beyond hearing and it is inexplicably cool.

Everyone is invited to take part in the concours viewing but Road America encourages fans and patrons to arrive early (before 5 p.m.) to allow enough time for parking and to find your perfect viewing location along the parade route and Lake Street where the race cars will park. Please consider these alternate routes into Elkhart Lake. County Road A from the East, Golf Course Road from the South and County Road J from the West.

On Saturday qualifying resumes in the morning for all groups. Then in the afternoon racing gets underway with qualifying races for each group. Over 100 sports cars will then gather again on Saturday evening in downtown Elkhart Lake from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. for the second night of the Concours d'Elegance. Brimming with rarity, the street fills again. Most of these cars are rare metal, fast metal, and only once in a lifetime that you will see them metal. The access again is unprecedented.

Seeing owners giving little kids seat time in the cars is part of the fun. In short, events like this, having the young ones exposed to the cars, and the sensations surrounding the event is critical to continuing the heritage of vintage racing and events like The WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman presented by HAWK make all of this possible.

On Sunday, the featured racing begins at 9 a.m. Races are held until 12:15 p.m., when the Concours d'Elegance awards for Best Street and Race car; Best of Show and the People's Choice award are announced near the paddock vendor area which is centrally located in the paddock. The rest of the day is filled with exciting feature races for each group. Other fan attractions include autograph sessions, an automotive art and vendor fair, on-track touring, Road America's Zip Line and public go-karting at the CTECH Manufacturing Motorplex.

Tickets are available online or during the event at the gate. Additional information is available at www.roadamerica. com or by calling 800-365-RACE (7223). All races run rain or shine and anyone 16-years-old and under are free with a paying adult at the gate. Parking and paddock access is also free.

# Paddock Club observes 10th birthday

### Chisholm family helps revive an old Elkhart Lake name

It seems like only yesterday in many ways that Lynn Chisholm was looking around Milwaukee for places to start her own restaurant.

Little did she know that an opportunity was opening up in Elkhart Lake, just down the road from her hometown of Plymouth.

Fast forwarding to 2017, Chisholm is celebrating the 10th anniversary of her opening of the Paddock Club on Elkhart Lake's historic Lake Street.

Known for its comfortable fine dining atmosphere, the Paddock Club has become an Elkhart Lake staple. But even Chisholm admits, she couldn't have managed the transition without a lot of help from her family.

In her role as managing partner of the Paddock Club, Chisholm traces the Paddock Club's success to a call she received from her father back in 2007. "Dad called and let me know that the old Village Green restaurant was for sale," she said. "There was a special draw to that location, and being able to go back home."

Since her initial decision to depart the Milwaukee hospitality scene, Chisholm's efforts at the Paddock Club have been enhance by a serious helping hand from family members. Her parents and her three siblings have all played a role in the Paddock Club's revival of a long-time Elkhart Lake restaurant location.

She still gets help from sisters Cheri and Kim and brother Scott.

"There was a great sense of security in doing this with my siblings, and having the support of our parents," she said.

#### **Historic naming**

The restaurant name is taken from the infamous Paddock Club which thrived during the area's legendary gambling era of the early 1900's.

In fact, pictures of an infamous gaming raid of the old Paddock Club still grace the walls of its new namesake.

Chisholm said that the free-wheeling history of the old Paddock Club fit in with her need to do what she wanted as a restaurateur and find out who she was without having restrictions.

Today's Paddock Club is shrouded in a beautiful Cream City Brick setting, layered from pieces salvaged from other dismantled buildings.

Customers gather around a beautiful old Brunswick bar, complete with a full back bar mirror. Chisholm credits her father with finding the 1900's era bar at a Chicago location, from where it had to be relocated by flatbed truck as the Paddock Club went through its early transformation.

#### Straight forward, approachable

Chisholm calls her approach to the menu offerings at the Paddock Club "straight forward" and "approachable."

"Describing my food is hard," she said. "I cook the kind of food I want to eat, and it's always changing."

Chisholm emphasized her desire to cook with the seasons, using local produce wherever possible.

"For me it's about bringing big flavor using great technique and doing it with a level of comfort," she added.

The menu at the Paddock Club is designed for universal appeal, whether the customer is a tourist or local resident. The Paddock Club offers some standard fare alongside choices you might not normally find in Eastern Wisconsin. Meals are also known for their generous portion size at the Paddock Club.

#### Small plates stir creativity

Chisholm has also engineered a change to smaller portions for those who don't want to walk away feeling stuffed.

Small plates are featured on Tuesday nights, but the small plate philosophy stems from Chisholm's desire to offer a wider variety of creative menu choices. "After we were in the restaurant about three or four years, I remember being bored one winter, doing the same thing all the time," she said. "Small plates gave us the opportunity to try new and creative things for our guests."

Small plates also enabled the Paddock Club to play with different cuisines and options, to introduce a little more casual style, even leaning to what she calls "street food." At the same time, it offered a more

affordable dining option.

"We still try new things on Tuesday small plates nights, and our choices revolve with the seasons, based on the produce that's available," she said.

"As we tweak our menu offerings, we are constantly asking ourselves what we are inspired by and what we are hungry for," she added.

#### **Spacious seating**

The Paddock Club may look small from its exterior, but don't let that fool you. Between the front dining room, back dining room and bar side dining, the Paddock Club can seat up to 175.

The front dining area can accommodate up to 40 people, while the back seats 30. Both can be used for private events. "We have hosted rehearsal dinners and other special events in those areas by reservation," Chisholm said. "We have also hosted weddings here.

#### **Special events**

The Paddock Club has also been an energetic partner with Vintage Elkhart Lake in hosting wine dinners and pairings. The Paddock Club has also hosted beer pairing dinner events throughout the year.

Chisholm has also hosted Dinner on the Farm, cooking and serving unique meals at Park Ridge Organics each fall. The dinner comes complete with a tour of the farm. "It's great cooking over an open fire," she said.


#### Growing with community


### **McNamer** speaks at graduation

# ELGHS adopts Laude System

Recently, Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has abandoned the traditional Valedictorian/Salutatorian designations for graduating seniors in favor of the Laude System.


Typically, the Laude System recognizes three levels of honor graduation: Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor).

The laude score is based on a formula in which students are rewarded for taking classes with higher rigor. The program is based on a two tier system: tier 1 worth 1 point per semester awarded to transcripted and AP courses, and tier 2 worth .5 points per semester awarded to advanced standing and teacher selected courses.

The range for recognition bands beginning with the class of 2017 are as follows: Cum Laude - 7 to 10.5 points; Magna Cum Laude - 11 to 14.5; and Summa Cum Laude - Greater than 15 points.

A minimum GPA of 3.25/4.00 is needed in order for a student to be recognized in the laude system.



# Historical adventures offered at Wade House

# **Boating rules will be enforced on lake**

Boating rules are in effect for Elkhart Lake, as they are on all Wisconsin lakes this summer.

Please follow the regulations, as they are being enforced by the Elkhart Lake Police Departments' Boat Patrol

1. A Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible to each person in the boat.

2. A speed of SLOW NO WAKE is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. SLOW NO WAKE IS DEFINED AS THE SLOWEST POSSIBLE SPEED A BOAT CAN OPERATE WHILE STILL MAINTAINING STEERAGE.

3. Maintain a speed of SLOW NO WAKE at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the SLOW NO WAKE BUOYS, and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift, or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing, or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities, must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed persons. 6. NO SUNDAY OPERATION of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. ELECTRIC TROLLING MOTORS ARE PERMITTED.

7. There is a radar enforced speed limit of 35 mph.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while waterskiing, jet skiing, etc. and during times of high volume boating activity.

9. A Sheboygan County Recreation Pass may be required. Contact the Planning and Resources Department at 920-459-3060 for details.

# Wright birthday feted in 2017



The next event in our year-long celebration of Frank Lloyd Wright is "Regretting Mr. Wright: Mamah Tells Her Own Story," a museum theatre performance featuring Elizabeth Carlson as Mamah Bouton Borthwick, the woman for whom Frank Lloyd Wright left his family in 1909. "Regretting Mr. Wright" will be held on Thursday, July 13 from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Wade House visitor center. The presentation will be preceded by a complimentary reception featuring microbrews and light hors d' oeuvres, which will begin at 6:30 p.m.

# Landing Blitz offers lake protection info

Thousands of Wisconsinites will take to the waters this 4th of July weekend for the state's busiest boating holiday.

Many will be greeted at boat landings by AIS staff and volunteers sharing a simple but powerful message: You have the power to protect lakes and rivers from aquatic invasive species.


The weekend will mark the ninth annual Landing Blitz, a statewide effort to remind boaters and other water lovers to take action to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species, which pose great risks to the health of our lakes and fisheries.

"This campaign has become a mainstay of our prevention efforts, since the holiday draws both frequent and infrequent boaters to the water, allowing us to empower a lot of people," says Bob Wakeman, statewide aquatic invasive species coordinator for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

Clean Boats/Clean Waters staff and volunteer inspectors will be on hand at landings in Sheboygan County from June 30 through July 4 to give demonstrations of the prevention steps and educate boaters about invasive species. Their efforts will build on the success of last year's cam-



# **Caboose project nears conclusion**

The caboose project is coming to a conclusion. The Elkhart Lake Historical Society has been taking the lead on this project.

In the 1970's, Dick Wehmeyer and David Sutcliffe were instrumental in bring Soo Line #247 to the village. Over the years the caboose fell into disrepair. The discussion centered around getting rid of the caboose, or restoring it.

At that time, resident Michael Crowley stepped up and donated a considerable amount of money to kick-start the project. The Historical Society formed a committee consisting of Steve Sutcliffe, Dick Wehmeyer, Michael Crowley, Alan Rudnick, Steve Kapellen, Rich Solek, Pat Zorn and Jessica Reilly.

Despite the extent of damage that was found, the fundraising effort was very successful considering the cost of the project. The cupola that is the top part of the caboose was completely rotted out. It took the entire summer of 2016 to restore that.

Fred Bower headed the restoration team. Fred has completed many rail cars and cabooses in his career. His attention to detail will make this project and this caboose a tourist attraction for many years to come.

We will have a dedication ceremony in August. Watch the website for date and time. The committee would like to thank the many people and companies who made generous donations to the caboose project.

#### **Planning Commission**

At the June Planning Commission meeting, approval of a concept plan was given to James Balestrieri for a new building to be constructed between Throttlestop and Compassionate Care Vet Clinic. The proposed building will be approximately 15000 square feet and have a similar look to Throttlestop.

Premiere Development is still working on a TIF amendment to be included in the Wolf TIF. They are requesting TIF incentive to help pay for infrastructure for the housing development on the corner of Highway 67 and Hickory.

The Commission continues to work on the Victory North housing development.



This would bring 50 to 55 houses and duplexes to the village.

#### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m.-10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 M.P.H. on the water.




