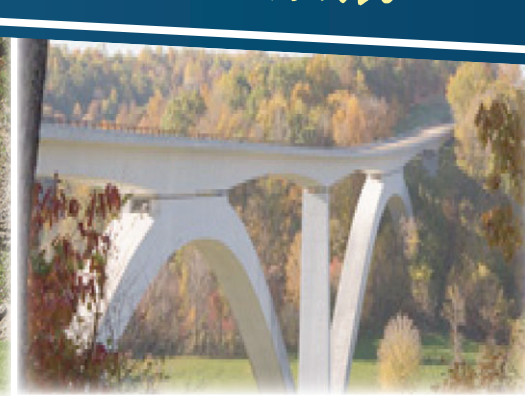

Welcome To Wayne County, TN



Wayne County is located in Southern Middle Tennessee near three of the most welcoming and beautiful natural sites - the Tennessee River, the Buffalo River and the Natchez Trace Parkway. Wayne County founding fathers chose some of the best of Tennessee when they established this county in 1817. Towns grew and prospered over the years. The cities of Waynesboro, Clifton and Collinwood remain today as our incorporated municipalities.

WAYNESBORO, the county seat built along Green River with its Public Square the center point where U.S. Highway 64 and Tennessee Hwy. 13 intersect. Hurricane Creek and Green River flow through the town adding to the beauty of this great little town.

CLIFTON, is located on the beautiful banks of the Tennessee River. The city grew through the years of river trade. This is a historic, quiet community rich in Civil War History, having been almost destroyed twice by fire during the War between the States.

COLLINWOOD, the youngest city in the county recently celebrated its 100th birthday. This friendly town is located at mile marker 355 on the Natchez Trace Parkway. The county's welcome center is located in Collinwood just off the Trace, where thousands of visitors are welcomed each year as they stop in and visit Wayne County.

If you are traveling down the Natchez Trace Parkway and you just need to pull over and rest for awhile, or if you need directions to the nearest place to eat, then pull off the Trace at mile marker 355 and visit the Wayne County Welcome Center in Collinwood.

The Wayne County Welcome Center has been in operation for nine years. It has been a welcoming site to over seventy thousand visitors, primarily travelers along the Natchez Trace Parkway. Most visitors have complimented on how amazed they are at the hospitality they were extended.

The welcome center is located at 219 East Broadway in Collinwood, just off the Natchez Trace Parkway at mile marker 355. The center is open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily.

Thirty volunteers staff the center seven days a week, 364 days a year. They are loyal, dedicated volunteers giving back to their community in a very special way. Visitors are greeted with fresh hot coffee, homemade treats, and a smiling face.

The Wayne County Welcome Center is much more than just a building. It is a haven for travelers who appreciate clean restrooms; a cozy fireplace in the winter; national weather coverage all day, every day; and countless maps, brochures, and travel information that is kept up to date and available.

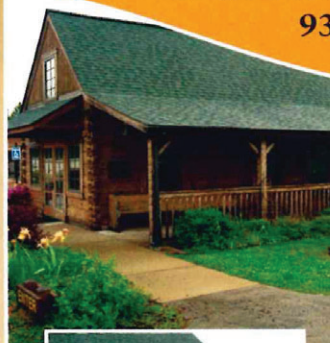

City of Waynesboro, Tennessee



Waynesboro, the county seat, is centrally located at the intersection of US Hwy 64 and TN Hwy 13. The two routes encircle Waynesboro Square, a designated Tennessee Downtown. Waynesboro elementary and middle schools, Wayne County High School, Technology Center, Adult Education and Board of Education are located along Main Street/Hwy 13 South. A selection of fast food restaurants, fuel stations and grocery stores lie in the central business district along Dexter Woods Blvd./Hwy 64, east of Public Square. Waynesboro is a progressive community, continuously developing its infrastructure to provide a higher quality of life for its residents. Recent projects include a water treatment facility expansion, walking trails

at City Park and the Sportsplex, purchase and revitalization of a local nine-hole golf course and the construction of a performance stage in City Park near the city pool, water slides and playground. RV hookups available on-site. Waynesboro City Park rests along Green River and hosts a playground, campsites and a large pool with 20 ft. and 150 ft. waterslides, diving well and kiddie pool. Open Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Waynesboro is governed by a five member commission, serving staggered terms. The Waynesboro Commission meets on the second and fourth Mondays of each month. Day-to-day operations are overseen by the city manager. 2015.

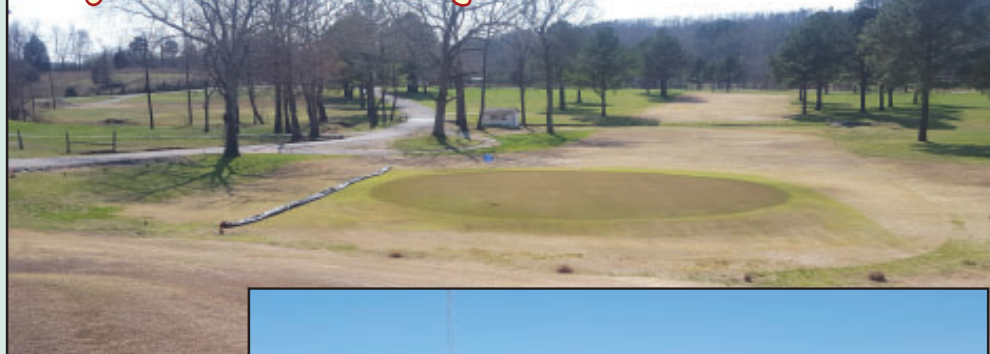

If you are someone who prefers to sunbathe while taking an occasional dip in the pool, or if you are one of the young (or young at heart!) who enjoys thrilling water slides, the Waynesboro City Pool has something for everyone. The pool offers a 150 ft. slide, a 20 ft. slide, a diving well, and a kiddie pool.

Aquacise classes are offered at the pool, along with private swimming lessons, night swims, and Red Cross certified lifeguard training.

For outdoor summer fun your family and friends are sure to enjoy, the pool can be rented for private parties and family events, available in two-hour or four-hour time blocks.



Located near the pool in Waynesboro City Park is a beautiful shaded area complete the picnic shelters and playground equipment. A great place for the kids to play, walkers to walk or just enjoy a picnic.

The pool is fully staffed and has fully trained Red Cross Lifeguards on duty at all times. Daily admission is charged, with children under three years of age getting in free! A full concession stand is available with pizza, hotdogs, chips, drinks, candy, and ice cream.

Pool hours are Monday through Saturday 11 A.M. - 5 P.M., and Sunday 12 noon - 5 P.M.

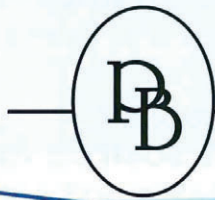
city of Clifton, Tennessee



A quiet and relaxing experience awaits you in historic Clifton, Tennessee. Nestled on the banks of the Tennessee River, Main Street ends at the former ferry landing that transported residents across the Tennessee River for many years. Clifton is rich in Civil War history. The river city played a significant role in the War Between the States due to its strategic location along the Tennessee River. In early 1862, Union forces occupied Stockade Hill behind Clifton Presbyterian Church. Officers' headquarters were set up in what is now the yard of Frank Hughes School on Main Street. The local Cumberland Presbyterian Church on lower Main, still bears the scars of the war that divided our country and nearly destroyed this community. Travel and community information is available at the Greater Clifton Area Chamber of Commerce located inside the Stripling Muesum. Clifton is easily accessed via US Hwy 64, TN Hwy

CLIFTON RIVER CITY OVERLOOK

Sit down, relax and enjoy the river overlook at the end of Main Street at Nathan Bedford Forrest's Crossing. The river city of Clifton is a place full of Civil War History. One can only imagine what took place on these beautiful banks of the Tennessee River.



CLIFTON RECREATION SPORTSPLEX



Cheers of fun and excitement can be heard almost every night from spring to fall as kids of all ages play weekly at the beautiful Clifton Recreation Ball Park. The park also boasts a wonderful playground area just a few yards away from the ball fields for the youngsters who prefer to climb and swing.

T. S. STRIBLING MUSEUM



Clifton is home to the T.S. Stribling Museum, located within the Pulitzer Prize winning author's home on Water Street. Stribling is Tennessee's only Pulitzer Prize winner, and this museum features several rooms of artifacts, exhibit panels, and preserved history that proudly display Stribling's acclaimed writings, as well as the Stribling family ties to Clifton and Wayne County.

T.S. "Tom" Stribling was born in Clifton and spent his adult life in the home with his wife, Luella, until his death. He was an influential author in the 1920's and 1930's, writing for magazines before he burst onto the scene with the release of his first serious novel. That novel, called "Birthright," critiqued race relations in the South.

Stribling's claim to fame came in 1933 after he published the second of three books in The Vaiden Trilogy – a set of novels that followed a family from Florence, Alabama through slavery and Reconstruction through the Great Depression. Stribling's Pulitzer Prize winning novel, The Store, became a bestseller and received high praise from publications such as Time magazine and The New Yorker magazine. The Vaiden Trilogy was reprinted eight times and sold 104,280 copies by the mid-1930's.

STRIBLING PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Clifton Library is a branch of the Wayne County Library and is located at 192 Main Street, Clifton. The Clifton Library opened in the fall of 1996 in the T.S. Stribling home now the Stribling Museum, before moving to it's current location. The library has several of Mr. Stribling's writings, some of which are available for checkout. Library hours are: Sunday – Closed, Tuesday-Friday from 10:00-5:00 and Saturday 10:00-2:00.



The City of Collinwood is a small town with a friendly atmosphere nestled near the beautiful Natchez Trace Parkway in Wayne County, Tennessee.

Collinwood is located along TN Hwy 13, twenty-five miles north of Florence, Alabama and 12 miles south of Waynesboro, between Natchez Trace Parkway mile markers 349 and 355.

Collinwood encompasses a land area of approximately 1792 acres, or 2.8 square miles, within the borders of Wayne County which is the second largest county in the state of Tennessee. Parks and Recreation revitalizes the city and enriches the lives of our city residents, the community, and the City of Collinwood as a whole.

The Wayne County Welcome Center is located on Broadway Street, two blocks from Natchez Trace Parkway mile marker 355 and accommodates visitors from around the globe seven days a week. Volunteers staff the facility, a custom-built log cabin structure constructed in 2005. Merchants along Broadway offer a variety of goods including Carhardt outerwear, hardware, boutique clothing and homemade fudge. Groceries, fuel, food, antiques, automotive and healthcare services are available throughout the community. The former train depot is listed in the National Registry and houses the local library and train museum. Ralph Hughes Memorial Park rests at the intersection of TN Hwy 13 and Main Street, Volunteer Park is situated behind the local fire department on Depot Street and Sandusky Dixie Youth Park rests along Oak Drive. Visitors are welcome to camp overnight in any of the three parks and RV access is available at Sandusky Park. The City of Collinwood is governed by a five-member elected commission serving staggered terms. The City Mayor and Vice Mayor are selected by the commission.

WAYNE COUNTY VETERANS PARK



What was just a vision for many years became a reality in 2016 when the Wayne County Veterans Park was constructed on a vacant lot on Broadway Street in Collinwood, Tennessee. The park presently consists of lights and seating that surround a beautiful monument engraved with the names of Wayne County veterans. As more funding becomes available, the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary plans to add more features to the lovely site in the future.

COLLINWOOD CITY POOL CAMPGROUND - TENNIS COURTS

The Collinwood City Pool opens Memorial Day weekend and closes on the second weekend in August. There are always two life guards on duty. The pool facilities include a concession stand, ADA compliant restrooms, and both a full size pool and a wading pool for the little ones.

Located directly beside the Collinwood City Pool, the city has available camper hookups for camping, located next to a picnic pavilion area.

Tennis courts are also located near the City Pool area, offering more outdoor activities for residents.

RALPH HUGHES SR. MEMORIAL PARK

Ralph Hughes Sr. Memorial Park, in downtown Collinwood, includes a stage for musical performances, basketball courts, playground equipment, a pavilion, picnic tables and lots of green open space.



SANDUSKY DIXIE YOUTH PARK

Collinwood also has a well kept Dixie Youth Ball Park, complete with 4 fields, concessions stand, and nice pavilion area. Families can be found playing ball at these facilities at all times throughout the year following regular baseball and softball season. The park has been named and dedicated to the honor of Danny Sandusky for all his support and hard work that he had attributed to the park for many years.

COLLINWOOD DEPOT LIBRARY



The Collinwood Depot Library is a branch of the Wayne County Library system. The library is located at 101 East Depot Street in Collinwood. Tammy West serves as Branch Manager. Business hours for the library are Monday 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Tuesday through Friday 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The library is closed on Sunday.

The Collinwood Depot Branch Library held its grand opening on September 4th, 2001. It is housed in the old Depot Train Station building which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on April 1st, 1988. The building was originally built in 1916 next to the railway that connected Collinwood to Iron City, Tennessee. The depot originally had four rooms, with a baggage room and an additional warehouse added in 1918.

With railway operations on the downturn, the station ceased operation in 1939 and the tracks were removed in the early 1940's. After the abandonment and removal of the railway, the depot was used for various purposes in the following years including a private home, a warehouse, and even a grist mill. The Collinwood City Government utilized the depot building as City Hall from 1967 to 1977, and it later became home to the Collinwood Senior Citizens Center. To the advantage of the citizens of Collinwood, the depot building was completely renovated and is now known as "The Collinwood Depot Branch Library."

The staff welcomes folks to stop by and visit their unique library.

INDEPENDENCE DAY - STAGE 64



The annual Independence Day Celebration in Waynesboro City Park is always a great crowd pleaser. The event will be held this year on the 3rd of July, kicking off the Independence Day celebration with wonderful food, music, and a fireworks show that the big city folks come to Waynesboro to see.

Grammy-winning artist Jason Crabb will be the headlining performer on Stage 64 on July 3rd. Crabb is a well-known artist who performs gospel, southern gospel, country, and pop music.



Vendors are allowed to set up in the park for free in the playground area facing Stage 64. No registration is required for vendors, and new and returning vendors are welcome to participate.

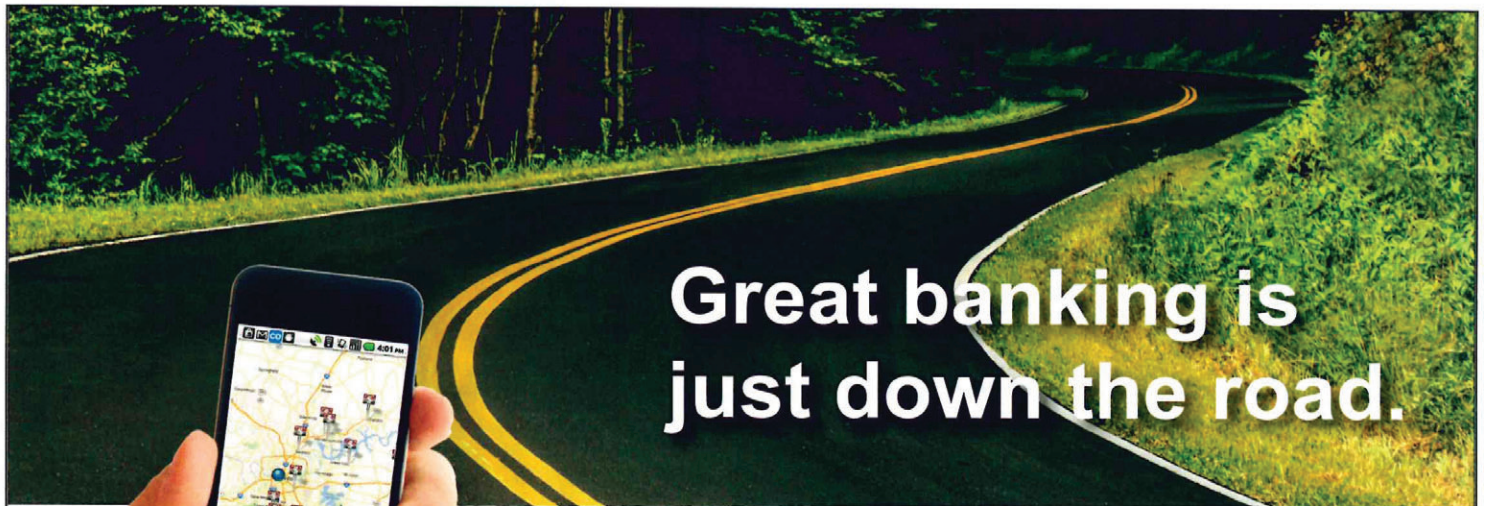
At designated rest stops, cyclists will be offered spring water from Collinwood Springs and homemade cookies

RELAY FOR LIFE



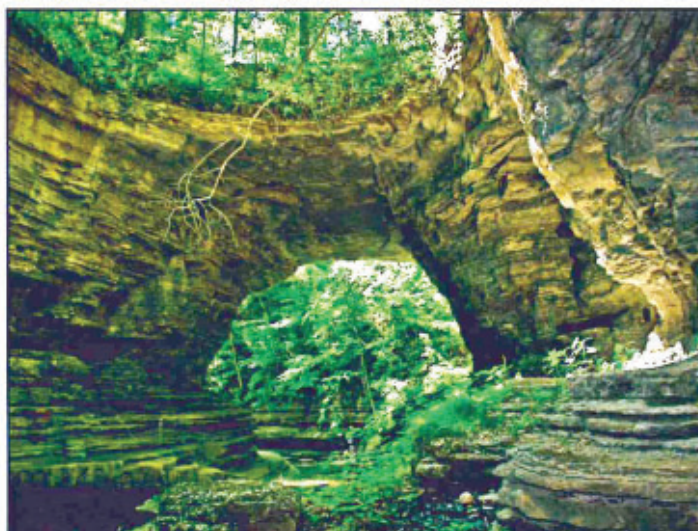

BEAUTIFUL NATURAL BRIDGE

The sight of this natural formation of rock and water, known as a natural bridge, is enough to take one's breath away. Once a cave, the force of spring water over the course of thousands of years transformed it into a magnificent double span bridge. The Woodland tribes used the bridge as a place where peace councils were held. Other Native American tribes, such as the Choctaw, Chickasaw, and Creek, walked the trails around the bridge and used the site for different purposes throughout history. Historical stories have been passed down through the years, one of which speculates that Davy Crockett gave his first political speech



atop the bridge.

In 1933, the property at Natural Bridge was developed as a recreational fishing camp. Then, in 1955, it was updated and re-opened as a tourist attraction. For several years, Natural Bridge was a popular gathering spot for Wayne County teens and families. Two of the original stone structures, a stone arch and the dining hall, still stand.

Throughout the 20th century, the beautiful property was a venue for concerts featuring many well-known artists. Large crowds would attend the events to enjoy the music and the peaceful scenery the park had to offer. Throughout history, folklore has placed many popular performers, outlaws, and bandits in the area.

The Shaw family purchased the property in 1991 and restored it to the beautiful place that it is today. The natural bridge provides the backdrop for Tennessee Fitness Spa's tranquil setting enjoyed by clients as they visit the spa.

HUNTING AND FISHING

Public hunting and fishing opportunities in Wayne County are numerous, including four TWRA (Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency) managed wildlife areas and multiple creeks, streams, and rivers.

The current TWRA properties are Arnold Hollow, Eagle Creek, Tie Camp, and Browntown. West of Waynesboro, over 7800 acres make up Arnold Hollow. Tie Camp is another 8,000 acre site southeast of Waynesboro, and Browntown is over 6,000 acres southwest of the county seat. Just north of town is the popular Eagle Creek TWRA site, 22,000 acres, primitive camping is allowed at the log cabin campground along the historic Clifton Turnpike.

As for fishing, Wayne County has many small streams such as Hardin, Shawnettee, Forty-Eight, and Indian creeks that provide great smallmouth bass and rock bass (redeye). However, access is limited, so obtain permission from the landowners to legally wade fish these streams.

The Tennessee River at Clifton has numerous species to fish year round and can be accessed by boat or bank at one of the areas' marinas or from the banks along the city's riverfront. Before hunting or fishing, be sure you know the rules and regulations. Two perfect guides are the Tennessee Hunting and Trapping Guide and the Tennessee Fishing Guide.

WATER RECREATION

Wayne County families and visitors are blessed with an abundance of water flowing throughout the county, offering lots of activities to enjoy throughout the year. Whether it's boating on the beautiful Tennessee River, canoeing down one of the beautiful streams, or just enjoying a relaxing day fishing or swimming at one of the local creeks, there are lots of memories to be made on our waterways.

Green River flows throughout the city of Waynesboro, from the Waynesboro Municipal Golf Course on the south end of town to the RV Park located in Waynesboro City Park. The Waynesboro City Park also offers tons of fun at their city pool.

Crazy Horse Recreational Park located on the banks of Buffalo River invites you to pitch a tent, park the RV, or reserve a room for the night, then launch a canoe and float the Buffalo. Other canoe outfitters can be found in the nearby Flatwoods community.

Boaters can enjoy the beauty of the Tennessee River via a pontoon cruise with rentals available from Clifton Marina, or launch their own boats at Clifton or Beechview marinas.

The City of Collinwood also has a city pool, located in the city park facility just off Highway 13 South. Camper hookups are available next to the pool.

THE TENNESSEE RIVER



The Tennessee River at Clifton is a beautiful sight to behold - from the beautiful bridge crossing the river, from the eyes of boaters, or from the fishermen on the banks.

The name of the river is believed to have come from a Cherokee Indian village which was located on the Little Tennessee River. The name was spelled in various ways, such as Tanase, Tennessee, Tanasi, or Tinassee. The Tennessee River was explored during the period of rivalry between the French and the English for the territory west of the Appalachians, and a few small forts and posts were established on its banks. Earlier, explorers and fur traders had entered the lower course of the river from the Ohio River. Although the Tennessee served as a route for settlers moving southwest, its role as a westward passage was negligible compared with that of the Ohio.

The river's north-flowing lower course was strategically important during the Civil War, for its valley offered an invasion route into the western Confederacy.

The development of the river system as an important inland waterway began in 1933 with the establishment of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA).

In the mid-19th century, Clifton emerged as a key riverport city and the most important commercial location in the county.

While the Tennessee River is still an active shipping route, it has also become a great recreational site, offering opportunities for lots of different activities. Boating and fishing are two of the most popular recreational activities where the Tennessee River flows through Clifton.

SHOAL CREEK CANOE RUN

Shoal Creek Canoe Run was established in 1997. Canoes and kayaks are available for rent by individuals and groups along the beautiful Shoal Creek in Iron City, Tennessee.

Enjoy spectacular scenery while floating along the creek. Bring your cooler and pull over on a sandbar for a picnic. Take a dip in the clear water. Grab a pole and catch some fish, such as small- and large-mouth bass, black perch, and catfish (just to name a few).

There are a few minor rapids on the upper run, but overall, the creek is Class 1. It's the perfect outdoor family activity, so bring your kids and pets. If you forget the necessities, don't worry. Our store is open 7 days a week starting at 6 a.m.

For the fisherman, we carry live and artificial bait and tackle. Hunting and fishing licenses also available.

If you canoe with us, then camping is free that same night.

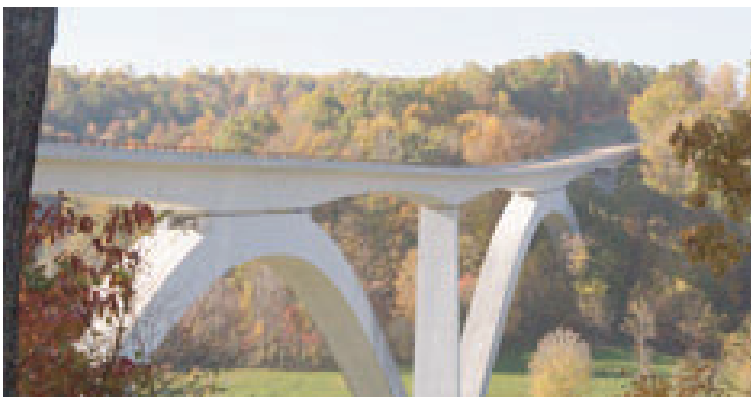

The Beautiful Natchez Trace

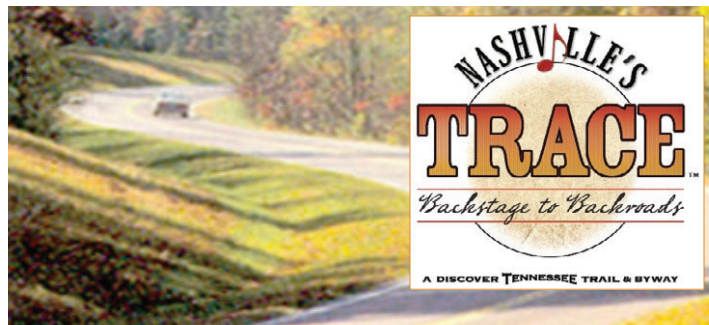
444 MILES OF BEAUTY

Natchez Trace Parkway is a beautiful 444-mile drive through exceptional scenery and 10,000 years of North American history. As one of 394 units of the National Park Service (NPS), a National Scenic Byway, and an All American Road, the Natchez Trace Parkway commemorates a route that played an important role in American history. Used by American Indians, settlers, and future presidents, the Natchez Trace was most heavily traveled by the “Kaintucks” during the late 1700s/early 1800s. Over 10,000 boatmen traveled the route in 1810. Today, visitors can enjoy not only



a scenic drive but also hiking, biking, horseback riding, and camping. Locals refer to the parkway simply as “the Trace,” and the town of Collinwood in Wayne County has a Welcome Center just off the Parkway designed to greet and educate travelers.

The Natchez Trace Parkway has numerous recreational activities to match any interest or experience level. Whether camping, motorcycling, hiking, biking, boating, fishing, or horseback riding, there are countless opportunities to experience the history, culture, and natural resources of the area. Over its length, the Parkway crosses four ecosystem provinces and eight major watersheds, and provides habitat for over 2,200 species of plants, 47 mammal species, 134 species



of birds, and 70 species of reptiles and amphibians.

The Parkway has been designated as one of Tennessee’s major tourism trails—Nashville’s Trace. One hundred three miles of the Natchez Trace Parkway travel through the rolling hills of central Tennessee. Enjoyable at any time of year, this section of the Parkway is particularly beautiful during mid-October when the leaves are changing color. Several million people visited the Parkway last year, and these numbers continue to put the Natchez Trace Parkway on track to be among the top ten most visited National Park Service sites.

Michael and Kathy Dumont, a native Rhode Islander and a native Illinoisan, followed their hearts and purchased the old Victorian-style home known as the Hughes home, located at 204 West Pillow Street in Clifton. The Dumonts have taken on the renovation of this beautiful and historic location, and plan to open it as a Bed & Breakfast in late 2017.

The Dumonts began their odyssey of preservation in Middle Tennessee with the restoration of the historic Commodore Hotel in Linden, Tennessee. With the Commodore in Linden being such a success, the Dumonts decided when the Hughes house came up for auction in Clifton that it would be a perfect location for another historic inn.

The Hughes house in Clifton was originally built in 1892 by William Hughes, the son of a prominent business owner in Clifton, Thomas Ridley Hughes. William and his wife Lillian had nine children, all of whom were raised in the home and attended school in the building which still stands adjacent to the house. The house is in the Victorian-era style, with many of the fixtures, floors, and stained glass windows being original to the home.

Although many original details remain in the home, the Dumonts are modernizing the "necessities," making the rooms updated yet still historic. There will be five bedrooms available for rent B&B style when the house is completed. The entire house, including the in-ground pool overlooked by a large screened-in porch, may also be rented for special occasions.

DAVID CROCKETT STATE PARK

If you're looking for a great place to camp or just spend the day, then make a trip to David Crockett State Park. Located just off Highway 64 in Lawrenceburg, Tennessee, this beautifully preserved state park is dedicated in honor of Tennessee's most famous native son, David Crockett. Its 1,100 acres now feature seven energy-efficient and environmentally responsible cabins available year-round, along with over 100 camp sites for primitive campers and RV enthusiasts.

An Olympic-size swimming pool, paddle boats, and fishing on Lindsay Lake can be enjoyed by all ages. David Crockett Restaurant inside the park is open daily and can cater to groups up to 250.

A replica of an old gristmill houses the park museum and interpretive center, and the environmental classroom overlooks the area where David Crockett's industrial operations consisting of a powder mill, gristmill, and distillery were once located on Shoal Creek below Crockett Falls.

Miles of hiking and bicycling trails meander through the woods, bringing you closer to the abundance of wildlife around you. Deer, squirrels, rabbits, turkeys, and an array of other birds await your visit. As you cruise through the park by car or bike, you just might get the feeling that you're the attraction all the other wildlife is there to see!

LAUREL HILL LAKE

Laurel Hill Lake is a beautiful 325 acre lake full of largemouth bass, crappie, bluegill, red ear sunfish, and channel catfish. The lake is restocked annually by the TWRA. There is a beautiful picnic area with grills, restrooms, a camping area, boat dock, and a youth-only fishing area.

This is a beautiful area for both fishing and camping. (Speed boats, jet skis, inboard motors, and sail boats are prohibited-only outboard and trolling motors allowed for use on the lake.)

Laurel Hill Lake is conveniently located near a number of towns including Lawrenceburg, Hohenwald, and Waynesboro. Take Chisholm Creek Rd. off of U.S. 64 to Brush Creek Rd. which leads to the lake entrance. There is also an exit off the Natchez Trace Parkway (Brush Creek Road) that leads to the lake entrance.

SHILOH MILITARY PARK

Shiloh National Military Park, located in Hardin County, Tennessee, contains a wide array of historic sites. In addition to the battlefield of Shiloh itself, the park contains a separate unit at Corinth, Mississippi that preserves and interprets the Siege and Battle of Corinth. Located within the boundaries of Shiloh park is also a United States National Cemetery, where approximately 4,000 soldiers and their family members are buried. A National Historic Landmark in its own right, the Shiloh Indian Mounds are also located with the park boundaries.

Both the Shiloh Battlefield and the Corinth Civil War Interpretive Center have large exhibit spaces dedicated to showing visitors the tools of war, the people who used those tools, and the effects of their use.

Audio Visuals/Films, Auto Tours and Audio Tours are available. There are also Ranger Programs, Living History Programs, Special Events, and for the kids Junior Ranger Programs. The park staff at Shiloh Battlefield conducts ranger-led interpretive programs during the peak season from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

The Shiloh Battlefield Visitor Center is open year-round from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For more information on the park, call (731)689-5696.

tax work. So my dad believed with hard work, I could do it. Thanks Pat Warren’s family, he was a kind and wonderful boss. As it turns out, one of the only bosses I ever had.

Starting out was rough with long hours and hardly any customers. I would like to thank my early supporters, because without them I would have never made it. The late Attorney Chuck Peterson who bought pizza from me almost everyday, because he wanted me to make it. He gave me words of encouragement that were more valuable than money. He was important to my success.

The late Mr. Robert Taylor discovered Pizza Corner and began bringing over the entire staff of Allen Barnett Chevrolet. He convinced everyone to at least try out “the corner”. They did and soon they were loyal customers too. Robert was a true friend.

My towns people were the ones I received my best free advice and encouragement from. The late Mr. Morris Ray, the late Mr. Jimmy Hodges, the late Mr. William Thomas Helton, and the late Mr. Harold Young were always there in my low times to cheer me up and push me forward with stories of their own business survival. They were always positive and encouraging during the rough times; always reassuring me that I COULD make it. I have often wondered if they really thought it was possible? I know they are so proud of me now. Thank you my dear friends.

The late Mr. James H. Haggard, Sr. was by far the greatest help to me. He was my landlord in the very beginning. He was always kind and helpful with his words. He never wanted to charge me for rent because he saw my struggles. He apologized the day he had to go up on my 50 dollars a month rent. I will never forget his kindness and how he influenced my life.

Last, but not least, is my incredible husband Michael A. Francis. I met him on the square after work August 1983 and nothing was ever the same. We were married two years later. A cruise aboard the “SS Emeralds Seas” for a honeymoon, and we were back to work on remodeling our restaurant. Emeralds Restaurant was born! And as they say, the rest is history!

I built my dream by being courteous and kind to everyone, like my daddy taught me.

I hope you will always feel welcomed and appreciated when you come to my “little corner”.

I can tell you that this is a really great ride once you get on Highway 13 and turn South. After you go through Linden it just gets better. Out in the middle of the country you'll find the Outpost Bar & Grill at 2049 Highway 13 North, Waynesboro, Tennessee 38485, 931-722-7358.

The Outpost is a log building with a totem pole out front and a carved bear by the Stix and Slitz bathrooms. It's big and comfortable. When you walk in you feel like you just got home. Wally Dunn and his wife Marne keep this place spotless and fresh. There is a dance floor, pool room, big bar and some of the best food you can imagine. Wally makes everything special and you can wash it down with one of his 41 different brands of cold adult beverages. Everything begins as fresh

meat procured locally in Tennessee. Wally says his gourmet burgers are his best seller and "We're a bar with a high quality problem." The burgers are all hand patted. He smokes his own "Almost Famous Near Perfect Pulled Pork." The Bourbon burger is my favorite but the Classic, Smokehouse, Country, Fireworks and Baconator burgers are awesome too. So is the loaded Nachos, Walkin' Taters and Deluxe BLT.

Folks come from as far away as northern Alabama, middle and western Tennessee, Mississippi and Arkansas. It's just a "have to" stop in God's country. There is entertainment every Saturday night through November and great recorded music all day long. They open every day at noon but may open a little early on Sunday depending on when the sports and games are on. They have free pool, Karaoke and dancing on Friday nights. Several years ago this used to be a rough place but when Wally bought it a couple of years ago he ran off the trouble makers and now it's just a fun loving and peaceful place to have a high class meal and rehydrate with some great refreshment and friendly people. Wayne County History

CIVIL WAR IN WAYNE COUNTY

Although no significant Civil War battles took place in Wayne County, thousands of troops passed through the county on their way to places such as Shiloh and Nashville.

In November of 1864, Confederate Major General Cheatham's troops rested at Wayne Furnace east of Waynesboro on their march north to what became the Battle of Nashville. An archaeological dig of this area in the early 2000s located remnants of old iron works, and identified one of the three paths known as the Trail of Tears.

A Gateway Marker is located at the Wayne County Welcome Center in Collinwood in the vicinity of where Civil War troops traveled to or from the battles of Shiloh, Corinth, Franklin, and Nashville.

MUSICAL HERITAGE

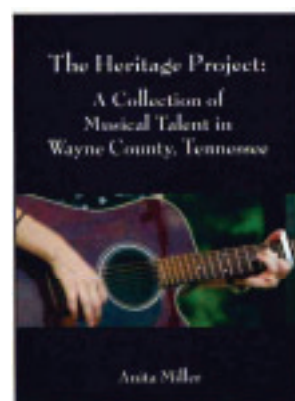
Wayne County lies in the heart of the birthplace of Americana music! You can travel from our county in virtually any direction and within just a short drive encounter every genre and style of music. Just north of us is Nashville, the country music capital of the world. Head west and you'll find yourself in Memphis, the home of Rock 'n Roll and Elvis Presley.

Mountain music and bluegrass lies to our northeast in the Appalachians and Kentucky. Just a skip south and you can find the soul of 1960s R&B in Muscle Shoals, Alabama. If

you need a good case of the blues, Mississippi isn't far away. And you certainly don't want to miss out on the undeniable presence of southern gospel music here in the heart of the Bible belt!

Wayne County's musical heritage has been influenced by all of these genres, and we have made an impact on them as well! Wayne County is the home of such prominent musical figures as Mark Collie, an International Rockabilly Hall of Famer who had a string of charting country hits in the early 1990s; songwriter Don Von Tress, who penned the platinum hit Achy Breaky Heart; Marvin Morrow, who has been nominated for numerous awards and recognitions in the gospel and bluegrass genres; and Ben Daniel singer/songwriter whose songs have been performed and recorded by several Nashville recording artists.

Last year, the Chamber of Commerce released a musical heritage book titled "The Heritage Project: A Collection of Musical Talent in Wayne County, Tennessee." The book outlines many of the artists and performers throughout our history. You may purchase your own copy of the book through the Wayne County Chamber of Commerce, P.O. 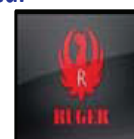
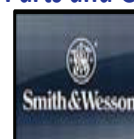
