# Governor's Address: The Budget That Could Have Been, But is Not

Five months ago, we handed politicians in Augusta a balanced budget that included welfare reforms and a \$300 million tax cut for Mainers. That budget never saw the light of day and today, that budget is long gone.

Dear Maine Taxpayer,

Previous budgets maintained the status quo and did nothing to move Maine forward. My Administration stunned legislators by presenting them with a bold and comprehensive budget. We put the best interests of the Maine people before politics. We prioritized our working-class families and our most vulnerable citizens. For the first time in decades, our budget provided meaningful tax relief for Mainers with a vision for a prosperous future.

Politicians claim my budget focused on "tax breaks for the rich." But Maine's highest tax rate now kicks in for someone making only \$20,000—only liberals would call that rich. My plan would have cut taxes for Mainers of all income levels, and it would have moved 60,000 more low-income families off the tax rolls.

We also created tax credits for Mainers with low incomes and a high property tax burden. We chose to give property tax relief directly to Mainers—not to municipal politicians—by expanding the Property Tax Fairness Credit.

We provided even more tax relief for our elderly and those on fixed incomes by doubling the Homestead Exemption to help offset their property taxes.

While we heard a lot about taxes, our budget also strengthened our safety net for the elderly, disabled and mentally ill. We fully funded the Medicaid waitlist with \$46 million to provide services to all 2,000 eligible Mainers. For nearly five years, I have sought to adequately fund programs and services for our most vulnerable, but the call for help continues to fall on deaf ears.

The Appropriations Committee holds the purse strings in Augusta, and Mainers on the Medicaid waitlist have never been their priority. Instead, they protect illegal aliens. These same politicians pushed for \$6 million in welfare benefits for illegal immigrants. At the same time, they rejected proposals to fully fund nursing homes and services for severely disabled Mainers on waitlists.

My fiscally conservative principles differ very much from most Augusta politicians. I believe we must take care of Mainers first while we maintain an effective, efficient and accountable government. I believe that Mainers should keep more of their hard-earned money, and I think they know better than government how to spend it.

I want to be clear: this budget belongs to the 127th Legislature. It is not mine. It is a far cry from what I proposed for Mainers. They rejected real reforms for Mainers and voted for a budget that has a stranglehold on your hard earned money.

When I veto the Legislature's budget, it is because I care more for our elderly, disabled and mentally ill than asylum seekers. But a veto doesn't mean we have given up. We will never turn our backs on hardworking taxpayers and our most vulnerable Mainers.

When lawmakers go home, I will continue taking the truth to the people of Maine so someday Mainers will see prosperity.

## Local students intern with state agencies

The 2015 Maine Government Summer Internship Program began recently, with college students interning in various state agencies. The Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center at the University of Maine administers the program, which provides students with paid full-time 12-week work experiences. The program was es-

tablished in 1967 by the 103rd Maine Legislature to attract and select college students with ambition and talent for temporary internships within Maine state government. Interns provide valuable assistance to state agencies while gaining practical and professional skills in their fields of study. A total of 1,712 students have par-

ticipated in the program. Undergraduate and graduate students who either reside in Maine or attend a Maine school are eligible. Participating students' majors include political science, economics, engineering and environmental science. Maine government departments hosting the interns include the Departments of Edu-

cation, Labor, Transportation, Corrections, Administrative and Financial Services, Professional and Financial Regulation, Defense, Veterans, Emergency Management, the Maine State Library, and Workers' Compensation. 2015 interns from the local area are listed below. 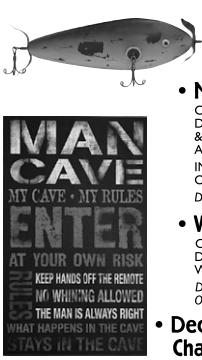

Enough is Enough

Portland policies will push asylum seekers to Lewiston

The gloves are coming off now!

Last week there was an editorial in the Portland Press Herald urging legislators to pass LD 369, which would allow General Assistance asylum seekers in Maine. The original bill has been gutted by an amendment that will allow asylum seekers to continue to get financial assistance from Lewiston taxpayers.

It will, however, relieve cities and towns from the burden of having to support illegal aliens. Passage of this bill will allow our progressive liberal Democratic friends to hustle the public with the claim they have voted for and are behind welfare reform.

LD 369 was crafted in my office at Lewiston City Hall. Its intent was to relieve Lewiston and Maine property taxpayers of the burden of supporting illegal and asylum-seeking individuals

by bringing municipal and town General Assistance laws into compliance with federal and state laws. These laws currently bar assistance to these individuals.

Portland's elected officials have stepped forward to champion the cause of these "persecuted" individuals. But what price will they pay? Very little. They have run out of places in which to house asylum seekers.

The increased demand for housing in Portland by young and not-so-young professionals is rising. Portland is becoming a developer's dream. Standing properties are being taken down to create upscale housing. Where will our visitors go? Why, Lewiston, of course!

Lewiston property taxpayers will be asked to greet them with compassion and an open wallet. The influx of these visa-possessing, so-called "persecuted" individuals will cause Maine's moniker of Vacationland

to be changed to Asylumland with Lewiston acting as Maine's version of Ellis Island. To those of you who would brush this off, let me refresh your memories.

Several months ago when I first learned of the financial burden being placed on Lewiston's General Assistance program, I spoke to the Rev. J.P. Shamala, who was identified to me as frequently accompanying asylum seekers to our General Assistance office to help them obtain

assistance.

In subsequent conversations, I repeatedly told Shamala that the asylum seekers were putting a financial strain on Lewiston's budget and asked that he stop bringing them here. Apparently, this neither registered with nor moved him, as he continued to bring people into Lewiston's General Assistance office.

It has also come to my attention that our local progressive legislators have stacked the deck by including emergency aid for asylum seekers in the state budget should LD 369 in its current form be defeated.

Then there is LD 368, which was also crafted in my office at Lewiston City Hall. This bill would bring municipal and town General Assistance laws into compliance with federal and state laws. This legislation is squarely aimed at domestic individuals who swarm to our city and state, burdening an already strained General Assistance program, as well as school, police, fire, ambulance, hospitals and other social service budgets.

As of this writing, I have no idea if any amendments have been introduced to water down the original legislation.

In the beginning of this column, I said the gloves are coming off. During my time as mayor, I have worked with our state legislative delegation on various issues concerning Lewiston. It has now become clear that they have not been listening. The stab wound in my back is not fatal. I will no longer be hustled.

The passage of LD 368 and LD 369 as originally intended will lift a tremendous financial burden off

Lewiston taxpayers. Any of Lewiston's delegation that votes on other than the original intent of these bills does not deserve to be re-elected.

Their vote will clearly show whether they are representing the financial interest of Lewiston voters or bowing to the philosophical beliefs of their Southern Maine puppet masters.

It's time for Democrats to stop running a three-card Monte game on the taxpayers of Lewiston and Maine.

keting tools, materials or activities.

To be eligible, businesses must be less than six years old, employ fewer than six people, and be located in Androscoggin, Franklin, Kennebec, Oxford or Somerset counties. A 25% match of the prize amount will be required. Businesses owned by either men or women may apply. Not eligible to apply are non-profit organizations and businesses.

A total of \$800 will be available in the June, 2015 grant cycle. Three businesses will be chosen on a competitive basis to receive grants of \$400 (first prize), \$250 (second prize) and \$150 (third prize). Priority will be given to applicants whose businesses operate in or support downtown business districts. Awarded

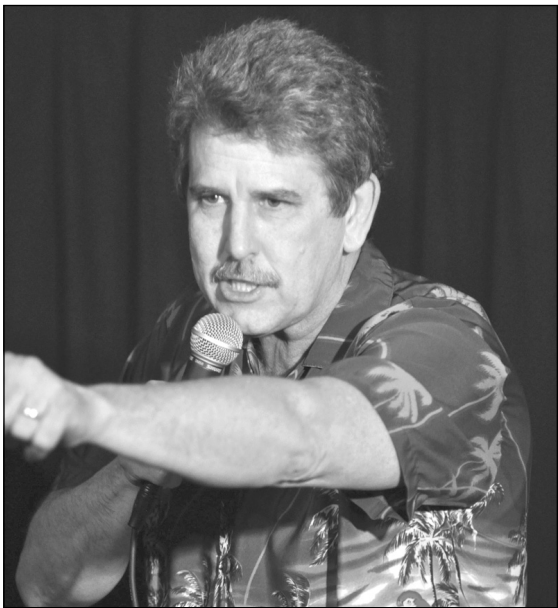





## ELHS teacher wins summer fellowship
