



The Self-Made Man

Many seem to put a lot of stock in being what is at times called a "self-made man." It is a foolish idea, really. No person is truly self-made, but for Christians to embrace this attitude is sinful. The Christian's attitude is better summed up in the thought, "But for the grace of God."

The apostle Paul wrote of this to the Corinthians in 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, asking, "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."

The Bible even argues against a slave who is born anew in Christ trying to escape his earthly slavery. Paul wrote, again to the Corinthians, "Let every man abide in the same calling wherein he was called. Art thou called being a servant? care not for it: but if thou mayest be made free, use it rather. For he that is called in the Lord, being a servant, is the Lord's freeman: likewise also he that is called, being free, is Christ's servant. Ye are bought with a price; be not ye the servants of men. Brethren, let every man, wherein he is called, therein abide with God" 1 Corinthians 7:20-24).

The spiritual warfare Christians engage in is just that spiritual warfare. Christians are to fight the good fight in whatever circumstance we find ourselves. While we are freed in Christ if we are born anew while enslaved to other men, we do not revolt against our earthly masters but rather serve them as godly servants of Christ. As a godly wife may convert her unbelieving husband (1 Peter 3:1-2), a godly servant (or employee) may influence an unbelieving master.

In the kingdom of God, the born-again slave is free in Christ and the born-again master becomes enslaved to Christ. In Paul's letter to Titus, in chapter two, he addresses the teaching of aged men and women, the teaching of younger men and women, and in Titus 2:9-10 he writes of servants, saying, "Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters, and to please them well in all things; not answering again; not purloining (holding back or pilfering), but shewing all good fidelity; that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things?

How can we apply this as Christians today? First, if we find ourselves losing the freedoms we have enjoyed in the United States and becoming enslaved to others, Christians will enjoy the freedom found in Christ and serve their masters willingly - seeking to please them, not answering back, not holding back or stealing from them. We will seek to adorn the doctrine of God in all things by our good works and good examples.

Second, while we do enjoy the freedoms we have today, Christians will remember other instructions we have from the Lord. Two come to mind. In Colossians 3:23 Paul wrote: "...and whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men..." Then in 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12: "...study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you; that ye may walk honestly toward them that are without, and that ye may have lack of nothing."

Let us remember that God was willing to spare Sodom and Gommorah for the sake of ten righteous (Genesis 18:32). Our nation is burdened under a heavy weight of sinfulness. What might the faithfulness of the few offer to the nation we live in?





If you have Medicare the price may be \$300.00. If you have Medicaid the price may be \$180.00. If you are an armed service member with Champus or Tricare the price may be \$150.00.

I enjoy negotiating. I have my own strategies for achieving a goal in a negotiation and I've taken courses and read books about mediation, arbitration and negotiation. Let's face the fact that most things are, to some degree, negotiable. Medical care is not. And because it's not, there ought to be a set price so that people with different coverages or levels of income are not charged different amounts for the same service. I think that's a problem with healthcare.



fishing guide Cameron Gautney of Muscle Shoals. "I am seeing a lot more boats on Pickwick. People are coming from all over the country to fish Pickwick."

Gautney said as recently as two years ago most of his clients wanted to fish for bass on Guntersville Lake. Now, 90% of his fishing trips are on Pickwick Lake. In the 2016 *Bassmaster* survey, Gunterville Lake was ranked number five in the Southeast and Pickwick Lake was ranked seventh.

Tim Horton, a Bassmaster Elite Series professional angler and outdoors television personality, said Pickwick Lake is deserving of its ranking as the top bass-fishing lake in Alabama. "The bass fishing on Pickwick is red hot right now. It's absolutely on fire. Lots of big largemouth and big smallmouth are being caught."

Horton, of Muscle Shoals, attributes the number of big bass being caught on Pickwick to the proliferation of aquatic vegetation on the lake. "The grass has turned Pickwick into one of the best lakes in the country.

"You used to be able to win most any bass tournament on Pickwick with five fish that weighed a total of 20 pounds. Now 20 pounds will not even get you a check in some tournaments," Horton said. "It's taking 30 pounds to win a lot of the tournaments now on Pickwick."

The 47,500-acre lake was completed in 1938 and has been called the Smallmouth Bass Capital of the Word.

Pickwick Lake's upstream neighbor, Wilson Lake, was ranked 18th in the *Bassmaster* survey.

"Wilson doesn't get the attention that Pickwick gets, but it's also full of big bass," Gautney said.

Susann Hamlin, president and CEO of Colbert County Tourism and Convention Bureau, said, "We have people from all over the world who come here to fish our lakes." "They come here to fish and stay in our hotels, eat in our restaurants, buy gas, shop and visit other attractions. It's great for the local economy. With both of our lakes being ranked among the top lakes in the Southeast, we will have even more visitors coming here to go fishing.'

Medicare Minute "Medicare Supplements"

Medicare supplements, also known as Medigap policies, are designed to help cover some or all of the deductibles, copays and coinsurance that Original Medicare does not cover. Medigap policies are sold through private insurance companies.

In Alabama these insurance companies can sell you only a "standardized" policy identified by a letter, such as Plan F. The most common supplemental plans in Alabama are Plans A, B, F, G and N. The term "standardized" means that Medicare requires all plans with a particular letter to have the same basic benefits regardless of the company selling it. For example, a Plan G with one company has to have the exact basic benefits as Plan G with every other company selling it.

Two things to keep in mind when shopping for a Medigap policy. First is the premium. Different insurance companies can charge different premiums for the exact same policy. This means you could pay more for your Medigap policy from one company than you would from other companies offering the same basic benefits. It's a good idea to check with someone who can show you the premiums from several companies to be sure you're getting the best premium for you coverage.

The second thing to keep in mind is the type of Medigap policy you are looking at. Some companies offer a Medicare SELECT policy. SELECT policies may require you to use a defined network of providers to receive full coverage, meaning you may not have full coverage from a provider even though the provider accepts Medicare. A standard Medigap policy will allow you to go to any provider that accepts Medicare. If you are not sure about the type of Medigap policy you are looking at, or its premium, you can contact or come by our office for help.



Some of us may remember from our school days something called the Monroe Doctrine, which essentially informed the world that the Caribbean was our own backyard and that we did not appreciate foreign powers playing around in it. In the last few years, Russia has returned to the Caribbean basin, a region it had all but abandoned after the Cold War. Moscow is building a satellite-tracking station in Managua, considering reopening Soviet-era military bases in the region, and expanding economic ties and doling out aid in countries across Central America and the Caribbean.

China also has been building up its presence in the Caribbean. Chinese companies and the government have poured \$6 billion into the area since 2012, according to the American Enterprise Institute. In April U.S. Navy Admiral

about China's exercise of soft power in the region as well as the growing involvement of Russia's military.

In a bygone era, such incursions might have drawn a quick or even hostile U.S. response. Today China sees a disorganized and inward-looking United States, and they see themselves as able to establish a long-term vision through gradually building influence. And surely it is enticing for Russia to have this chance to establish itself as a

regional power. Perhaps Americans should look beyond our current divisions and consider what we would like the world to look like in twenty years.



YAHOO, YOU LOST YOUR **EMAIL ACCOUNT!**

in the movies. If I could pull off that trick, I'd be writing this article from a beach in Tahiti instead of sweltering here with you guys!

Losing your account can be a disaster. Once a hacker has access to your email account, he can scour your messages for notifications from your bank, online shops, and other personal accounts. He can visit Amazon, for example, click the "forgot password" link then have a password reset link sent to your email address. Once he does that, he has full access to your Amazon account. Using similar

measures, he can transfer funds from your bank account. They might send an email to your friends claiming that "you" were mugged in a foreign country and need money to get back home. The point being, a hacker can have all sorts of fun with a stolen email account.

This doesn't need to happen. You must take the initiative to protect your accounts. I've discussed the necessity of enabling 2-step authentication before. If you ignored that article, please go to the Courier Journal's website and search for "2 step." But in addition to

that, you need to update your account recovery information so you can get back into your account if the unthinkable happens.

This information applies to AT&T, Bellsouth, and Yahoo addresses only. AT&T and Bellsouth are in cahoots with Yahoo. Yahoo "hosts" the email for AT&T and Bellsouth. That's why you have to go to a Yahoo web page to check your email.

Account recovery information used to mean "security questions" such as your mother's maiden name, first-grade teacher or favorite pet. After Yahoo got hacked a couple of years ago, they stopped using those question because the hackers had access to the answers. Now you have to use a separate recovery email address (such as a spouse's or close friend) and a mobile phone number.

I know, I hate giving up my mobile phone number to anyone but this is a requirement if you want to stay safe.

So, head over to your Yahoo/AT&T/Bellsouth account, sign in and click on "Account Security. From there, click "email addresses" or "phone numbers" then click "add recovery email address" or "add recovery phone number" and follow the instructions.



Fire Ants Surface After Recent Rains

AUBURN, – Thanks to recent rains, fire ant mounds are popping up in lawns across the state. An Alabama Extension entomologist says what appear to be new mounds have been around for probably several months at least.

"Just because you don't see fire ants doesn't mean they aren't there," said Dr. Kathy Flanders, who is also an Auburn University entomology professor. "When it is hot and dry, colonies don't build the high mounds we are all familiar with.

"But when the rains come, they resume mound building and that's why they seem to pop up overnight."

She adds that understanding fire ants, Solenopsis invicta is key to managing them. "Usually people work too hard, spend too much money and use too much chemical to control fire ants, but it's really easy to control these things if you understand their biology."



Most fire ants in Alabama live in highly territorial single-queen colonies which may produce on average about 40 mounds per acre. However, in some portions of Alabama, fire ants live in multiple-queen colonies which are more tolerant of each other and may produce in excess of 200 or even 300 mounds per acre.



A colony contains around said. 300,000 worker ants. The

queen ant lays all eggs, and

only queens can perform

this function. "When a queen is in full

form and has worker ants

to help her, a queen can lay up to a 1,000 eggs per day," Flanders said.

The worker ants forage for food, build mounds and

protect the gueen. When a

queen dies, the entire colony

will die because there will

The bait method usually will control 90 percent of fire ant colonies. It is effective and inexpensive at \$10 to \$20 per acre. Flanders also said the bait is the safest method for children, pets and the environment.

Many people do not understand fire ant biology and try to control the insects using individual mound treatments. Treating individual mounds can be costly and may not offer good control.

First, not all colonies have a visible mound. This means that homeowners will miss treating some colonies. Also, worker ants will often move the queen ant, eggs and larvae away from danger. Worker ants will move the colony

if they perceive a threat to the queen or colony and reestablish in a different While individual area. mound treatments may kill worker ants, they are not as effective as the bait method in killing the queen.

"If we miss the queen, we haven't controlled that colony," Flanders said. 'Once we kill the queen, we kill the colony."

Try the Two-Step Method



Flanders said a two-step method that combines bait treatment of an area with spot treatment of nuisance colonies that move into the bait treated area is an effective control strategy. Learn more here at www. aces.edu/go/752.

In more rational times, the baby would be taken from the home and the mother would be committed to a facility where she could sort out her own problems.


Unfortunately, we do not live in rational times.

Line Worries

Editor:

Do transmission lines negatively impact human animal health? and Mounting research shows we have no cause for concern.

All electric wiring systems must be properly grounded to ensure safety. Small currents may flow from these grounding points called neutral-toearth voltages. Some of this is stray voltage which comes into contact with livestock and may cause behavioral changes. Transmission developers

try to avoid and mitigate stray voltage. Usually, this means placing transmission lines a certain distance from distribution lines.

Landowners and developers should discuss how stray voltage will be avoided or corrected when negotiating an easement. We found most developers are willing to work with landowners to "microsite" transmission infrastructure to minimize risk to a farm operation.

Another common concern is electric and magnetic fields (EMF). All electronic devices emit EMF, which



can be damaging at high levels. X-rays are a familiar source of high EMF.

Transmission lines emit lower levels of EMF than most household devices. For example, computers give off 60-100 hertz, while transmission lines emit 50-60 hertz. Because EMF levels decrease over distance, at 300 feet levels are similar to average homes and offices.

There is no e p i d e m i o l o g i c a l evidence for other health consequences. Additionally, no study has found a cause and effect relationship between low levels of EMF and negative health effects.

If a landowner is worried about EMF, developers should work with them to increase setback distances from homes and buildings.



Besides Blood Sugar, What Other Things Do I Need to Keep an Eye Ŏn as a Diabetic?

While the major focus of medical care in a diabetic patient is to get good control of their blood sugars, there are several other things that must be taken into account to help keep diabetics healthy and free from complications of the disease. While many aspects are worth mentioning, the most important areas to focus on are the following: 1. foot care, 2. eye care, 3. checking for cardiovascular (heart and circulation) complications 4. monitoring the kidneys and 5. vaccinations. I will discuss each of these areas in more detail.

The foot is a very common place for complications to arise in patients with diabetes, especially those whose blood sugars are not well controlled. It is always a good idea for patients to keep an eye on their feet regularly and to report to their doctor the development of any calluses or ulcers. Primary care providers should also routinely perform a diabetic foot exam on these patients. One part of the foot exam is to look for foot ulcers or callused areas that are at high risk for developing into ulcers and addressing them as they arise. A good foot exam should also look for evidence of what is called diabetic neuropathy, that is, nerve damage in the feet that can cause numbness, tingling and burning pain in the feet. This is especially important to look for because neuropathy can make it easier to develop foot ulcers. Lastly, attention should also be paid to the checking the circulation in the feet, because poor circulation in the feet is also a risk factor for ulcer development and difficulty in them healing. The eyes are also vital to

monitor in a diabetic patient. A common complication of diabetes is called diabetic retinopathy, which is essentially damage to a part of the back of the eye called the retina. With enough damage, this could lead to vision loss. Therefore, it is important to have a diabetic eye exam yearly by an ophthalmologist. They can also look for other diabetesrelated eye complications such as cataracts.

with diabetes are at greater risk for developing cardiovascular disease. This includes heart attacks, strokes and circulation problems all related to the development of blockages in blood vessels called arteries and their smaller branches called arterioles. Depending on other factors such as age, blood sugar control, the presence of signs or symptoms of cardiovascular disease, smoking status, family medical history and other health issues, your physician may want to do regular testing for cardiovascular disease. This may include tests such as stress testing, ultrasounds of your carotid (neck) arteries and checking your leg circulation by ultrasound or

other testing. Diabetes is well known to potentially weaken the kidneys, and routine testing of your kidney function by both bloodwork and urine testing is recommended. Urine testing, in particular, is especially important because it can look for the presence of protein in your urine, one of the early signs that diabetes may be causing kidney damage.

Finally, it is important to be up to date on vaccinations, as patients with diabetes have weakened immune systems and are more likely to develop a wide variety of infections. Unless you have had a significant adverse reaction to it, a yearly flu vaccine is recommended and staying current with pneumonia vaccination is also extremely important. If you have diabetes, work with your primary care provider to ensure that you are up to date on all appropriate monitoring for diabetes complications.




