The Feast of Corpus Christi (translated from the Latin as "Body of Christ") celebrates the institution

of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper. It originated in 1246 as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, in which the Sacred Host, accompanied by hymns and litanies, is car-

Governor's Address: Legislators must stay true to their principles

When I first ran for Governor five years ago, I made it very clear that I would stick to my Republican principles. Today, that hasn't changed.

Dear Maine Taxpayer,

First as a mayor and now as Governor, I held firm to the Republican principles of lowering taxes, reducing the size of government and reforming welfare.

It has not been easy. We took on the special in-

terests, the lobbyists and the political establishment. The state, local and national media have been against us every step of the way. Liberals spent millions in a brutal campaign to get rid of me. But I stuck to my principles. The voters saw through the negative media, and they didn't buy the barrage of political attacks. They want us to keep following our principles.

Mainers know I did not come here to defend the status quo. I came to Augusta to do what's right

Over the weekend, legislators worked long hours to accomplish absolutely nothing. They threw out any chance of cutting the income tax. They chose to keep giving taxpayers' money to illegal aliens. They gutted my proposal to put more DEA agents on the streets to stop vicious drug

gangs from selling poison in our neighborhoods. They rejected a Constitutional amendment that would give Maine people a voice in eliminating the income tax.

After 5 months, these legislators have done nothing.

Sadly, Republican leaders in the Senate joined liberal Democrats to roll back these reforms. They left their Republican principles at the door when they made these back-room agreements with Democrats. Fortunately, most Republicans in

Augusta are still holding strong. They remember why we won the election in November.

The budget process is grinding to a halt. So if you want to get rid of the income tax, you must contact your legislators. Find out who they are and tell them the status quo is unacceptable. Tell them to do the right thing for the Maine people.

Historical Society spotlights Packard-Littlefield Farm

The Lisbon Historical Society will feature a talk by the owners of the historic Packard-Littlefield Farm at its next meeting on Wednesday, June 10. Bob and Ella Mae Packard have developed this unique property, comprised of over 400 acres of farmland, wet lands and a managed tree farm, all bordering the Sabattus River in Lisbon. The entire property is an agricultural conservation easement, ensuring that it will be protected from development and remain a working farm.

The history of the Packard-Littlefield Farm is unusual in that it has been under the ownership of just two families - the Arris's and Littlefields, since its

establishment in 1790. The Packards will talk about various members of the Littlefield Family and how a family farm operated in the past in contrast to how one operates today.

Free and open to the public, the program will take place at 7 p.m. in Room 10 of the MTM Center on School Street in Lisbon Falls. Because of renovations to the building, the society archives and museum will not be open; those attending should use the front entrance to the building.

Enough is Enough

Governor rejects “parking ticket policies,” seeks prosperity

They sound like spoiled little children, who after getting their way over the years are suddenly introduced to the concept of “tough love.” Like any child after being told “no,” they whine that their parents are being unfair. They feel that their parents have become unhinged and unglued.

Last November Governor Paul R. LePage was re-elected by Maine voters. In doing so, he spent less money on his reelection than either of his opponents. His message and coat tails swept Republican candidates to victory. This led to Republicans taking over the Maine State Senate and gains in the House.

Governor LePage campaigned on tax reform – relief for those of us who actually pay taxes. He envisions and is working hard to eliminate the state income tax. If he accomplishes this, taxpayers should see a hefty increase in their take-home pay.

The Governor may be a politician, but he’s not your typical politician. He has something most politicians lack: intestinal fortitude. He is his own man who doesn’t dance to the harmonic tunes of progressive special interest groups, nor does he weigh his decisions on which is the path of least resistance.

He has a wealth of leadership qualities. He understands that to ensure

Governor LePage’s attempts to bring fiscal restraint to Augusta are being fought tooth and nail by progressives who have gotten their way by crushing their opposition over the past few decades. They hope to create a state that makes the republics of Vermont and Massachusetts appear to be conservative Disneylands.

Maine is a beautiful four-season state known as Vacationland. Last weekend we attracted a record number of tourists. However, we seem to have a hard time attracting businesses and permanent residents.

Some would argue the harsh winter weather keeps people away. But in Maine, an hour or two after a storm, everything is

CMCC adds new program in Life Science

Starting this fall, Central Maine Community College in Auburn will begin offering an associate degree program in Life Science. This new program will provide students

with a broad, general survey of scientifically accumulated knowledge focused on life and biological sciences.

Students completing the program could enter

the workforce as scientific technicians or transfer into science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) majors at four-year colleges and universities. The program will provide appropriate course sequencing for efficient transfer while reinforcing and deepening core learning across the

curriculum.

"The College is very excited to be launching the Life Science program," said Dean of Academic Affairs Betsy Libby. "The program provides new opportunities for graduates and has already enabled CMCC to expand our transfer relationships with four-year institutions.

"For instance, the University of New England will accept all Life Science credits as applied coursework, and we are working with several other universities to establish transfer agreements for our students. These transfer agreements not only allow for a seamless transition, but in the end, they save our graduates time and money."

The 61-credit program will include 34 credits in lab science, consisting of two-semester sequences in Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology and Organic Chemistry. Students seeking admission must have a high school diploma or equivalent and be qualified to enroll in College Writing (or College Writing Seminar) and College Algebra.

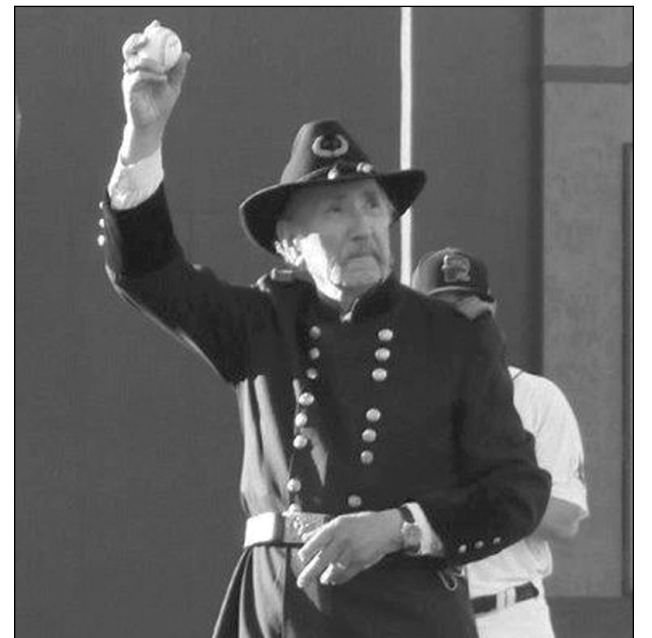

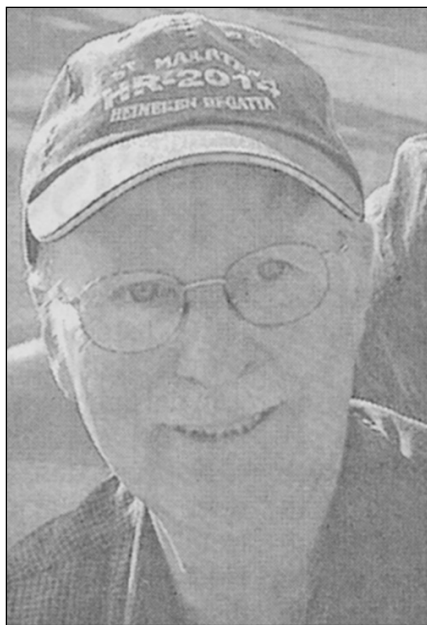
In Memory of Michael P. McGuire

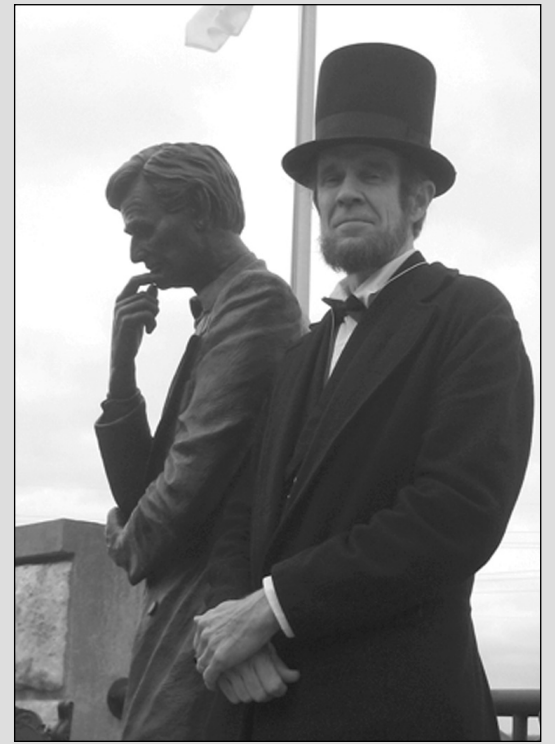

Their younger brother, Samuel, served in the U.S. Navy as Acting Master of the ironclad gunboat U.S.S. Galena when it sustained fire on the James River. 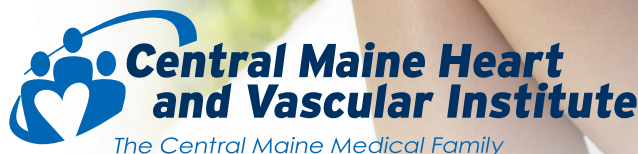




