

SwitchGear Brewing

Craft brewery, tap room find a home in Elkhart Lake

Sometimes in life, we are nudged to make a change in directions. A trio of new business owners in Elkhart Lake like to think of it as switching gears.

Though the plans have been in the works for five years, this year Nick Kullmann, Mark Grasse and Ryan Feldmann shifted their dream into reality as they opened the SwitchGear Brewery and Tap room in Elkhart Lake's Feed Mill Shops.

SwitchGear Brewing has its foundations on the north end of the Feed Mill Shops, with its double doors opening adjacent to what was once the start-finish line for road racing on the streets of the village.

Beer aficionados got their first taste of Elkhart Lake's newly brewed beer on Memorial Day weekend, the target set by the trio when they formally established their business time line last year.

"We have been talking about the idea for about five years, but really began working on it seriously the past two years," said Nick Kullmann, the avowed home brew hobbyist-turned-craft brewer.

Kullmann serves as the brew master at SwitchGear, taking a personal hobby to the next level.

"It's really a hobby that got out of control," he said. "I always wanted to have my own business, and I think that's true of all of us."

Tried and true recipes

Kullmann took up the hobby of home brewing in 2000. He and his wife both liked to cook, raising their own foods in their garden. But, they also took a fancy to making beer and country wines.

The brew master always had a variety of his own beers on tap at home, and it was common for him to bring beer for graduation parties, weddings and other events.

"Whenever we were asked to bring a dish to pass, we would bring beer-on tap. And it usually ran out fast," Kullmann said.

Some of the SwitchGear Beer recipes got their tried and true tasting experience back in those days, as friends, family and neighbors weighed in on what they really liked.

Switching gears

The SwitchGear Brewing moniker carries many interesting connotations regarding the owners and the community.

Kullmann and Feldmann both see that they are switching gears personally as their children grow older. "I always wanted to own my own business, and the time is right for me now. I am still young enough to work long days and run around like an idiot," he said.

"Mark has an operational and accounting background, and he sees this as an opportunity to switch gears in that way."

Kullmann's main trade as an electrician-which also brings a connection to the SwitchGear name. In electricity, SwitchGear is a combination of electrical disconnect switches, fuses or circuit breakers used to control, protect and isolate electrical equipment.

When trying to find a location for the brewery and tap room, the owners first looked at a building behind the Paddock Club, which ironically served as the village's first power generation facility. The original owner of the facility was Matthias Gottfried, a brewer from Chicago.

Of course, any Elkhart Lake business is wise to tout its connection to road racing, doing business in the shadows of Road America.

"When we started thinking about using SwitchGear as our name," Kullmann said, "it was pretty obvious that our community is pretty tied to the race track, where drivers have to SwitchGears properly to be successful."

Great early reception

SwitchGear Brewing has been an instant draw in the Elkhart Lake community. "We knew we wanted to open by Memorial Day to hit the peak season in Elkhart Lake,' Kullmann said. "We couldn't have asked for anything better. The support from the community has been awesome. We never imagined it would be quite like this. In fact we have seen some really heavy swings in our beer inventory."

Kullmann said the two months of operation have also given the owners a better feel for which varieties of their beer are most popular with their guests.


What's on tap?

At the SwitchGear Brewing tap room, guests will always find both SwitchGear beers and other craft beer options on tap.

Currently the tap room devotes four taps to SwitchGear's offerings and the remainder of its 20 taps to guest offerings.

For the summer, patrons have cast their ballots with their taste buds, showing a preference for Pontoon Pounder, an American wheat beer, light and low on alcohol, and served with an orange slice.

'That's sort of true of all our beers. We aren't trying any tricks. It's all just beer."

Also on tap this summer are the Corner Five Smash Pale Ale, also fondly called C5. The Smash refers to single malt and single hop style pale ale.

The most unique of the four may be the Summertime Stout, a light version of stout.

Other varieties will be brought on seasonally. This past month, Kullmann unveiled a batch of Catamaran Pounder, the typical wheat ale lace with fresh raspberries. The one-and-done brew never stood a chance in the tap room as the first barrel disappeared in 10 short minutes.

SwitchGear will also rotate its taps of

Just routine

guest brews from time to time. Currently, some of their offerings include beers from Three Sheeps, Eighth Street Ale House, Plymouth Brewing, Wisconsin Brewing, Ahnapee, New Glarus, Ale Asylum, Central Waters, Bull Falls, Potosi and Badger State.

Beer lovers can enjoy their favorite pint, or they can put together a sampler paddle of any of the 20 brews on tap.

Tap room atmosphere

Patrons coming to SwitchGear should expect a vintage industrial tap room atmosphere—a great environment to enjoy beer and conversation. Although soda, ice tea and lemonade are available, SwitchGear's only alcohol offering is beer. Sorry, no mixed drinks.

Additionally, SwitchGear does not serve food. The tap room welcomes patrons to bring their own food to the beer tasting environment.

"This is a tap room. It's a place for people to gather socially, have a few beers and talk," Kullmann said.

SwitchGear encourages its patrons to bring food from other Elkhart Lake restaurants into their setting.

Nothing beats having a beer with one's

favorite sandwich. Pizzas are often ordered in as well.

"Not only do we not want to mess with

food, we consciously did not want to displace other businesses that serve food. We want to make and serve beer. Why should we mess with what's working —there are plenty of good restaurants already here in Elkhart Lake."

A patio is offered for outside seating.

All of the tables and chairs at Switch-Gear were built by the owners. "We cut the steel, the wood, everything in my garage. We reclaimed old barn boards for the back bar cabinets," Kullmann said.

"But we definitely had a lot of help with everything to get this place ready. We are thankful for all those who gave us a hand," he added.

SwitchGear's tap room is open for beer tasting Tuesdays through Saturdays. Hours on Tuesday to Thursday are 4-9 p.m. Fridays hours are 4-11 p.m. Saturdays the tap room is open from 11-11. Hours may fluctuate for fall or winter.

Nest embraces quality, integrity

Since 2002, Nest has offered inspiration, expertise and service to make your home a haven.

Owner Pam Butler Channel, celebrating her 15th year in business likes to call her store a handmade home store.

Nest is a boutique-style home store that offers a variety of home design ideas from luxurious linens and accoutrements to dress the table, bed and to textural rugs, distinctive work by American artisans and custom furniture.

Located at 823 N. Eighth Street in Sheboygan, Nest is an Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce member. Butler Channel started the store next to a dry cleaning operation on New York Street, but Nest has found a home on Eighth Street since 2005.

"I always wanted to own a store," Butler Channel said. "I saw the space was for rent when I was taking my dry cleaning in."

She cracks people up when she tells them that she started Nest with her \$10,000 in savings.

For Butler Channel, it wasn't the capital but the concept that proved golden.

"From the start I already had people in mind that I wanted to work with, local artisans that I wanted to work with on consignment. I just kept putting everything back into the store, and this is where we are today," she said.

Butler Channel has made a reputation for Nest by carrying ethically-made, often hand made goods, by artisans, women's cooperatives and small, responsibly run businesses.

"We often meet with the designer who educates us about their materials and processes, so we can, in turn, share that with our customers," she said.

Nest has always used the philosophy of finding the right small producers, making sure the goods are made with integrity and paying them fairly for their expertise. Similarly, Nest seeks to educate its customers and inspire them with unparalleled service.

This may not be the easiest way to do business, but for Butler Channel and Nest, it is the most rewarding.

"At the end of the day, it takes three things to be successful no matter what you are selling, no matter to whom and where, and regardless of the economy—honesty, friendliness and gratitude," she added.

More than 200 artists

Today, Nest features products from more than 200 artists. They continue to be picked for their attention to being responsible vendors. "We don't want to be about turning a buck on someone else's back," Butler Channel said.

Her other focus lies in finding vendors that bring a uniqueness to Nest. Many of the offerings at Next are things that customers won't find anywhere else in this part of Wisconsin, or sometimes even in the Midwest.

Unique products from unique vendors are used to create unique designs for each individual customer's spaces.

"You don't want to go to a neighbor's house and see the same rug on their floor. People want to have a distinctive space for themselves," she said.

Butler Channel's husband Kim owns a complementary business called Dovetail









Woodworking, which enables her to come up with furniture solutions "you just can't find anywhere else."

In addition to the store, Butler Channel runs a successful Nest Design business, which works on designing unique spaces for people's needs.

Nest's Eighth Street location is open for business Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturdays from 10-5.

In summer, hours expand to include Sundays from 11-3.

Major events throughout the year at Nest include holiday open houses and special vendor events.


The proceeds will support the hospice's community outreach and patient care programs, all of which share the goal of maximizing the comfort and enhancing the quality of life for patients and their

Frank Lloyd Wright carriages feted

In 2017, Wade House Historic Site will celebrate the 150th birthday of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright with seasonlong exhibits, lectures, and educational activities focusing on Wright's life and work in Wisconsin and his relationship with Sheboygan carriage collector and restoration expert Wesley W. Jung.

The next event in our celebration will be a presentation titled "The Frank Lloyd Wright Carriages" by Vicki Nelson Bodoh, past president of the Carriage Association of America and an avid carriage-driving enthusiast. On Thursday, August 10 from 7-8:30 p.m. at the Wade House visitor center, Bodoh will share the results of her two year-long study of Frank Lloyd Wright's horse-drawn carriages at Taliesin in Spring Green, WI, and the connection she discovered between the famed architect and Sheboygan carriage collector Wesley W. Jung. Bodoh's presentation will be preceded by a complimentary reception featuring microbrews and light hors d'oeuvres, which will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Bodoh's tale begins in 2000 with the rumor that horse-drawn carriages remain at Taliesin, home of Frank Lloyd Wright, in Spring Green and continues with research done over a period of two years to locate the carriages, find evidence that they were used at Taliesin and driven by Frank Lloyd Wright and discover the connection to Wesley W. Jung of Sheboygan. In her presentation, through compelling photos and stories, Bodoh will document the mystery of the horse-drawn carriages that remain at Taliesin in Spring Green, and how they were used by Wright, his family and the fellowship of apprentices. Bodoh will also highlight the relationship of some of Wright's carriages to the horsedrawn vehicle collection of Sheboygan carriage collector and restorer Wesley W. Jung, which is housed in the Wesley W. Jung Carriage museum at Wade House Historic Site.

The seventh event in our "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" monthly speaker series will take place on Saturday, Sept. 16 at 1 p.m. and will feature a lecture by Dr. Brandon Ruud, Abert Family Curator of American Art from the Milwaukee Art Museum, titled "George Mann Niedecken." Dr. Ruud will share the life and work of interior architect George Mann Niedecken, including how Niedecken's influence played a role in furnishing many of Wright's best-known Prairie School houses.

The "Frank Lloyd Wright Carriages" presentation will take place at the Wade House Visitor Center located at W7965 Hwy. 23 in Greenbush, WI, halfway between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac. 
Lakeland hosted Movers and Shakers





Yield to Pedestrians

We have had some issues with cars failing to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians in posted and unposted intersections. With the large numbers of families walking throughout the Village, our police will be vigilant in monitoring the crosswalks.



Wisconsin State Statute reads:

The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian or personal delivery device, or to a person riding a bicycle or electric personal assistive mobility device in a manner which is consistent with the safe use of the crosswalk by pedestrians, that is crossing the highway within a marked or unmarked crosswalk.

State Statute calls for a stiff fine for not yielding to pedestrians. You could be fined up to \$250. The Elkhart Lake Police Department (ELPD) has issued a total of 23 citations for crosswalk violations so far in 2017.

The police department will also be monitoring speed limit violations. The speed limit in the Village is 25 MPH. Again, with the numbers of tourists and residents walking throughout the Village, we are taking this very seriously.

Driving Under the Influence

This summer we seem to have a particularly large volume of DUI citations. Please do not drink and drive. The penalties for a DUI violation become very expensive. Our goal is for all of our residents and guests to have a fun and safe environment in our Village. We currently have issued seven OWIs so far in 2017 versus the six that were issued in all of 2016.

Open Intoxicants

The Village has regulations regarding the consumption and carrying of open containers. There are only three events that the Village allows drinking on the streets in designated areas. These events are: Fireman's Picnic Parade, Downtown Night, and Vintage weekend. Once the barricades come down for these events the ordinance is in force.

The open intoxicant ordinance states: No person shall consume or carry in





open containers any alcoholic liquor or fermented malt beverages on any street, sidewalk, parkway, municipally owned swimming beach, or railroad property within the corporate limits of the Village. The fine for a violation of this ordinance is \$149.20.

4th of July Celebration

No one can remember the last time it rained on Fireman's Picnic weekend. However, rain does not stop Elkhart Lake from having a party. The rain on Friday night did not prevent the Village from having one of our best firework's displays ever. This year Wolverine Firework's displays play, formerly known as Bartolotta Fireworks Company, put on the show for us. The skies cleared just in time, giving us a perfect night for the show.

We were not as lucky on Sunday. Congratulations to everyone who participated in the parade and to all who endured the weather to watch the parade.

A special thanks to our Public Works Department for cleaning the streets and Village after the weekend of celebration.


