The Great American **Eclipse**

The August 21 eclipse will begin just before noon in the Shoals and continue


for almost three

hours.

Few people have ever seen a total eclipse of the sun,

but on August 21, we have the once in a lifetime opportunity!

The moon revolves around the earth about once a month and the earth is constantly moving around our sun. The moon moves directly in front of the sun about twice each year, blocking its light, and creating a total solar eclipse. In other words, the moon makes a shadow on the



earth, and within the shadow one experiences darkness. The shadow is usually only a few miles wide and races across the earth's surface. The shadow usually falls on oceans or in foreign lands, but on August 21 it will move across the U.S. from Pacific Ocean (10:15am PDT) to

Atlantic ocean (2:48pm EDT), passing across Nashville about 1:28pm CDT. The total eclipse will last less than three minutes, but it will be remembered for a lifetime. Of course, cloudy weather would ruin viewing.

accomplishments," Cabler said.

Johnson was born Genett Herston. She moved from her Central Heights Community birthplace to the Forks of Cypress Plantation when she was five. It was there that Genett learned to sew under the instructions of her mother.

"When Daddy would go to town, Mother would tell him to get two flour sacks alike so she could make a dress for us girls," said Johnson.

"We had nothing growing up," Johnson said. "However, I liked to sew and I made a lot of my own patterns. When I became owner of Style Rite Fabrics in 1974, I was dissatisfied with the current children's patterns. So, I hounded the McCall's pattern representative to give me the phone number of Robert Herman, CEO of McCall's. I called him several times until one day he called to say, 'I will be in Atlanta next week, meet me there.

Three patterns were chosen in Atlanta that Wednesday in 1983. The following Monday the phone was ringing when Johnson unlocked the door at Style Rite Fabrics. Herman was calling to invite Johnson and her business partner, Anita Moore, for a week at McCall's headquarters in New York City. It was then that pattern number 8626 made history for Johnson.

Over 350 of their designs have been published in the McCall's catalogs since that time, producing over 1,250,580 pattern sales in the U.S. and internationally.

Johnson owned Style Rite Fabrics in North Florence for fifteen years. She provided up-scale fabric and hard-to-find accessories such as French lace, trim, embroideries and satin ribbons, along with all other sewing notions.

What Should We Expect?

shadow the As approaches, one will see it racing across the ground at 1447 mph in Nashville, which is faster than the speed of sound. This is a spectacular sight if one is on a hill and can see the surrounding countryside. When the sun is totally eclipsed, you'll notice a rapid darkness, usually with an eerie green glow. Animals seem to notice and birds usually go silent. Since the air is suddenly cooled, winds often die down. With the bright solar disc darkened by the moon, one sees the solar hot gases surrounding the sun called the corona. People who have seen the corona say it is a wonderful sight. As the sun emerges from totality, it peaks through lunar mountains producing what is called a Diamond Ring and then Bailey Beads.

The Shoals will not experience the total eclipse, but people in the Shoals will see a partial eclipse where 97% of the sun is covered leaving just a thin crescent shape.

Viewing the Sun Can be VERY **Dangerous**

NEVER look directly at the sun, even if partially eclipsed. The only time

that the sun can be viewed safely with the naked eye is during a total eclipse, when the moon completely covers the sun. Such a total eclipse will not occur in the Shoals. For proper safety hint, go to: https://eclipse.gsfc.nasa.gov/ SEhelp/safety2.html

The safest and most inexpensive method is by projection. A pinhole or small opening is used to form an image of the Sun on a screen placed about a meter behind the opening.

Protect Your Eyes Watching the Sun

- Never look directly at the Sun without eye protection.
- DO NOT use sunglasses;
- DO NOT use smoked glass
- DO NOT use medical X-ray film or color film.

The Sun's UV rays can painlessly burn the retina causing permanent damage or even blindness when exposed for just a few seconds. The only safe way is to use an approved filter or a projection method. Eclipse glasses with special filters are available online. However, you can build "projection box" out of cardboard.



I have heard that a person cannot write their own Last Will and Testament that it must be written by a lawyer. I draw SSI and can't afford to pay an attorney. I don't own much but what I do own is paid for. What can

Delores, Florence, AL

You could write your own Will but I would not advise giving it a try. I had a case 15 or 20 years ago where a school teacher who had taught in Florence for 40 years wrote her own Will. She was careful enough to have the required number of witnesses but she named a bank as a co-executor of the Will. She did not relieve her executors of the duty to provide a bond. Her errors cost the family

about \$9,000.00. In Alabama a Will must be witnessed by two people. The

witnesses must actually see the actual signing, or the person making the Will (the testator) must acknowledge that they signed the Will and that the signature on the page is their signature. The best practice in making a Will is to not only have two witnesses but to also have a notary public notarize the Will. This makes the Will a "self-proving" Will. That means that you do not have to find the witnesses (often years later) to prove the signature.

A Will should dispose of all of a person's property and therefore language such as "I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to ______, all of my estate, of whatever kind and character and wheresoever situated, of which I die seized and possessed of or to which I may be entitled or which I may have the power to dispose of at the time of my death, to be be ____ absolutely, forever, provided however survives me."

A Will should name a trusted and responsible person to execute the terms of the Will. A Will should also name an alternate person to execute the terms of the Will.

A Will should also relieve the trusted executor of the duty of purchasing a bond.



Opioid Addiction: A State of Emergency

commission investigating the opioid addiction crisis has asked Preseident Donald Trump to declare this crisis a national emergency. As a physician practicing medicine in a state considered one of the major opioid abuse epicenters of the country, I can understand the sentiment. Opioids, for those who don't know, consist of substances ranging from prescription pain medicine (hydrocodone, oxycodone, fentanyl, morphine to name a few) to heroin. Some of them, namely prescription pain medicines, can be beneficial for the relief of severe pain under the right circumstances. Indeed, several conditions associated with severe and debilitating pain can be significantly helped by these medicines and provide a patient with a better quality of life. Somewhere along the way, however, things got out of control. The widespread prescribing of these substances, as well as individuals obtaining them illegally from friends, family and dealers, has resulted in a great number of people developing dependence on these substances and some even transitioning to heroin use. This, in turn, has resulted in an

epidemic of overdose deaths. When we think of opioid addiction, many of us imagine a disheveled person living on the streets shooting up substances like heroin. While that certainly occurs and is part of our opiate problem, the crisis goes much deeper than that. Well-dressed, well-mannered individuals working 9-5 jobs, attending church on Sundays and paying taxes also struggle with addiction. These two ends of the spectrum, and everybody in between, are not immune to this problem. This effects teachers, farmers, housewives, politicians, lawyers and yes, even physicians. We tend to look down on addiction as simply a condition where the person just lacks the willpower and discipline to stop using. The reality is that addiction to substances like opioids should be viewed as a chronic illness

Very recently, a presidential in the same manner as diabetes, high blood pressure and depression. Opioid addiction essentially rewires your brain in such a way that the craving for these substances can be an enduring fact of life. Many, with proper support, can overcome it, although most will tell you that the craving never completely goes away. Others unfortunately do not overcome it. A great many lose the battle, the price being their lives.

As a community and a society, we need to stop thinking about opioid addiction as somebody else's problem. This affects all of us as either directly or indirectly. We lose family members and friends constantly to overdose. Fatalities have occurred on the roads due to impaired driving while on opioids. Businesses are in crisis because they have trouble finding employees that don't show up to work under the influence of opioids. Children get taken away from parents who are unable to care for them because of their struggle with addiction. Significant medical resources are constantly mobilized to deal with the aftermath of overdoses. Monday afternoons in late summer are typically a slow time at Spring Park in Tuscumbia, but that will not be the case on

August 21 That is when a huge crowd will gather to celebrate a near total solar eclipse.

A solar eclipse celebration at Spring Park will be from 12:30-2:30pm on Monday,

August 21. The eclipse is expected to reach its peak in the Shoals at 1:28pm. Admission is from

The eclipse will cause the skies to darken significantly and temperatures to cool in north Alabama as the moon passes between the earth and the sun. Although the Shoals is not in the path of totality, ninety-five percent of the sun over Colbert County will be obscured at the peak of the eclipse. It

will be dark enough in north Alabama for street lights to automatically turn on and for planets and stars to become visible in the

"It's going to be a once-in-a-lifetime event to see the skies become that dark during the middle of the day," said Joel Kendrick, Tuscumbia's director of Parks and Recreation. "We are going to celebrate it in a big way at Spring Park."

The last solar eclipse of this magnitude that was visible coast-to-coast in the United

States occurred in June of 1918.

As the sky begins to darken on the day of the eclipse, the dancing waters and light show at the park will begin to play songs related to the sun, darkness, and eclipses. There also August 21

mute congressional opposition to the forced healthcare law, Obama allowed Congress to opt out, leaving only the American people enslaved by the legislation they created. 

Medicare Minute

Medicare "Donut Hole"

August and September are two months we get calls on the coverage gap or "donut hole". This happens because there is a temporary limit on what your drug plan will pay while you are in the gap. The good news is not everyone will enter the coverage gap. The coverage gap begins after you and your plan have spent a certain amount on covered drugs. In 2017 once you and your plan combined have spent \$3,700 you will enter the coverage gap.

Here's the way the coverage gap works. Imagine you have a prescription that retails for \$300 per month. Your copay, hypothetically, is \$30. This means your plan would pay the rest of the cost or \$270. Medicare will track what you paid (\$30) and what your plan paid (\$270) and count the cost of the drug as \$300 for that month. Let's also say that the other prescriptions you are taking equals \$100 per month. You are now at \$400 per month. In this example you would reach the coverage gap sometime in October.

Under most plans in 2017 once you have reached the coverage gap your plan will temporarily stop paying anything on your drugs. This means you will be responsible for the entire cost of your prescriptions. The silver lining around this very dark cloud is Medicare has negotiated a discount on the drugs you use. For name brand drugs you will pay 40% of the retail price of the drug and on generic drugs you will pay 51% of the retail price.

If you are eligible for Medicare but still on employer

coverage you may wonder why you have never reach the coverage gap. This is because employer coverage does not have the "donut hole". The coverage gap only applies to Medicare prescription drug plans. Also remember that Medicare drug plans can vary which means your coverage in the gap can vary.

Same Eugenic Ideologies

Editor:

The defense of Planned Parenthood by Democrats who claim to be the great protectors of the minorities is puzzling. Even more puzzling is the fact that most minorities vote for the Democrats. Sanger spoke at a Ku Klux Klan rally in Silver Lake, New Jersey in 1926. Following the invitation, described Sanger receiving elation after multiple speaking requests from white supremacy groups. She writes of the experience on page of her book, An Autobiograpny. In her writings on breeding an ideal human race, Sanger described those considered undesirables as ...human weeds,' 'reckless 'spawning... breeders, human beings who never should have been born."

Planned Parenthood is a corrupt, profit-driven corporation that serves one purpose and one purpose alone, to obtain as much blood money as it can. God knew each of us before we were formed in the womb and had a purpose for us. (Psalm 139). It certainly should be de-funded.

Farmers Mkts Boost Access to Fresh Food

Editor:

There is nothing better than slicing up a ripe garden tomato fresh off the vine. However, some may not have the means to grow fresh vegetables in their backyards.

At the Center for Rural Affairs, we work with rural communities to build healthy, sustainable, local food systems. That includes supporting farmers markets.

Farmers markets expand access to fresh, healthy food in communities that need it most. They provide affordable, competitive prices for low-income families, and many accept food vouchers.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), more than 5,000 farmers markets across the country accept Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, with the number of new locations increasing at an average of forty percent per year.

Vendors are reaping the benefits. According to the National Farmers Market Coalition, 362,477 SNAP households made at least one purchase at a farmer's market in 2014. That means more families are eating healthy and fresh local fruits and vegetables.

Farmer's markets also provide beginning farmers a low-cost way to enter the marketplace and grow their businesses. Small and medium existing farms can supplement their revenue by selling at markets, supporting the sustainability of family farms.

The USDA reported 8,675 markets in the country in 2016. This number is up from 2,863 in 2000. Many consumers now have the opportunity to eat food grown within a few miles of their homes. That money stays in their small towns and helps local economies.

HOME IMPROVEMENT DEBT?

Dear Dave,

I'm debt-free except for my home, and I'm considering having solar panels installed on the roof of the house. It would cost about \$27,000. I have \$80,000 in savings, but the company doing the installation will finance it all for just one percent interest. It's almost like free money. My electric bills average around \$310 a month, and I thought this would be a good way to save money in the long run. What do you think?

Michael

Dear Michael,

If you have to finance the project, my answer is no. My guess is the break-even analysis you're trying to give me is the sales pitch your solar panel company gave you. That's how they sell solar panels, but it doesn't justify going into debt.


You told me you have around \$80,000 in savings right now. Why not just write a check? Let me ask you a question. What if you could borrow \$10 million at one percent interest and put it in the stock market? Would you do that? Of course, not. It would be way too risky, right? Basically, we're talking about the same kind of thing. I made you feel the risk by scaling things up in my scenario. You're not feeling the risk right now because we're talking about \$27,000 instead of millions.

This move wouldn't bankrupt you, but wealthy people don't do the kind of thing you're talking about. Either pull the money out of your savings account and buy the panels, or don't buy them at all!

PROBLEM PLAN

Dear Dave,

I make \$48,000 a year, and I have \$35,000 in credit card debt. I owe \$25,000 on my home, and I was thinking about taking out a loan against my house to pay off the credit cards. Is this a good idea?

Mike

Dear Mike,

I would never advise anything like this, unless it's to avoid bankruptcy. Here's the problem with that kind of plan. Most people who do that kind of thing don't change their financial habits. In fact, they end up with a new mortgage and new credit card debt somewhere down the line.

You need to start building a track record of paying off debt. Cut up the credit cards, slash your spending, and start living on a tight, written, monthly budget. Prove to yourself that you're not going to take out a mortgage and turn around and run up a bunch of new credit cards.

I want to see you not take on any new debt and reduce that \$35,000 credit card bill dramatically over the next six months. If you can knock out half of it in a year, you can take care of the other half in another year or less. Then, you wouldn't need a second mortgage!
