Business Administration (A.S.)

The Business Administration Associate of Science degree program is designed primarily for students who plan to transfer to a four-year college or university and to major in a business-related field. Business Administration requires a variety of skills that include supervising staff, developing departmental plans, setting goals and deadlines, and customer service.

This program is also offered online through the College's Virtual Campus. Additionally, students can move on to pursue their bachelor's degree in Business Administration through Albright College at the University Center in Pottstown.

Mathematics (A.A.)

The Mathematics Associate of Arts degree program is designed to meet the transfer requirements of four-year colleges and universities for the many disciplines that require a strong mathematics background. These disciplines include: Computer and Information Science; Business and Economics; Science and Engineering; Statistics, Actuarial Science and Operations Research; Mathematics and Education; Medicine and Law. LIBERAL STUDIES (A.A.)

For added convenience and flexibility, the program is offered online through the College's Virtual Campus.

You will fulfill the College's General Education Core Curriculum requirements and prepare for transfer to a four-year college or university, where you can complete a bachelor's degree. A number of elective choices gives you a chance to explore your individual interests. By using these electives to focus on one subject area, you can build an unofficial concentration in anything from English to accounting.

We work extensively with other colleges and universities to develop articulation agreements that will assist you in choosing a four-year college and continuing your program of study. We have partnership agreements with dozens of area colleges.

The program is ideal for students who wish to pursue careers in education, law, foreign service, research, communication and information management, as well as for jobs in the federal, state and local government and at historical sites.

The College's Psychology Associate of Science degree curriculum integrates a broad spectrum of courses in psychology and other disciplines to prepare students who wish to transfer to a four-year college or university to continue their study of psychology in preparation for careers as counselors, therapists, case managers and various kinds of psychologists.
