

My mother did many of those things, but mostly she fished from the bank and on a limited basis in a flat bottom aluminum boat not far from shore. She even hunted a bit. We were forever picking berries or pears, and she always made pies and jellies. I have tried to follow in her footsteps but personally felt that my products were just not quite as tasty or colorful as hers had been. Maybe that 's just the way we remember our childhoods!

It was probably 2001 and I had been invited out to the Champagne Ranch for a dog field trial which they were going to follow on horseback. Mr. Pelton, who organized the dog event, knew I loved to ride and so I got the Sunday afternoon invitation. Taking two cars, my daughter Jessica and I followed the directions which took us waa-aayyy off the highway. It seemed about 15 miles off Highway 11 that we drove the track through gently rolling prairie. Not sure if we were in Delta or Hunt County. Jessi had just come along to see me off before she went back home to the Metroplex that day. When we pulled up at the end of the track at the isolated hunting cabin, someone came out and told me they had my horse saddled and ready and that the others had already gone out to the wagon. I climbed aboard and my guide Mr Ragan and I took off on these Tennessee Walkers with me waving goodbye to Jessi as I went over the hilltop. I guess she found her way back to the road without incident.

When we got to the wagon, the men were just about ready for the next phase of the dog trial. There were about fifteen of us riders. We followed the dogs over hill and dale at the smooth, ground-eating pace of the Walkers. I found out personally why the mountain folk use these animals for fast transportation over uneven ground. When you go down in a gulley and back up on a Tennessee Walker, it's like you were riding on an air cushion instead of the bone-jarring impact and climb you'd feel upon the back of a quarter horse.

Never having ridden a Tennessee Walker before on open land, I was pleasantly surprised to find that "jumping gulleys" could be a pleasant experience. Back at the wagon for a snack and cold drink, the only hitch I ran into was that since the ride was made up totally of men (except for this radio DJ) there was no real need for a restroom facility. I held back as the crowd of riders and dogs took off for headquarters, and after locating



a small bush on the wide open prairie, I caught up for the merry ride back in to headquarters where plenty of food and drink awaited the party. Soon I decided to head back to civilization before dusk fell, as I was driving alone.

As I observe my 30th year working here in this community, I have come to treasure the unplanned, and the odd and unusual experiences along with the gala ones. I would place this memory right up there with the Pickton coon hunt night and my circus elephant ride in the Civic Center arena. Sure has been a colorful career.





The season will soon begin to turn to Fall! Next to summer that's my favorite time of year with colorful leaves and crisp football nights. Til next week, I'll watch for you and enjoy the last of summer at the corral gate.



WATCH OUT FOR THE KIDS

Motorist should drive with extra caution around children going to and from school!

•Obey signs, signals, and crossing guards in school zones.

•Slow down especially with children walking/biking to school and around bus stops and in school zones and in low light or bad weather.

•Learn and obey the school bus laws in your State.

•Drive focused and alert at all times. Avoid use of electronic devises and other distracting behaviors while driving.

•Ensure everyone in the vehicle is buckled up properly and that children are in the back seat in the proper seat.

•Drop off so the child does not have to cross the street, and then avoid U-turns.

•Look for and expect to see pedestrians and bicyclists, especially before and after school.

School bus riders are safest when children:

•Stay three giant steps (six feet) away from the curb when waiting for the bus; and when the school bus arrives, wait until the driver says to board.

•Quickly board the school bus, find a seat, sit facing the front, and do what the school bus driver and safety patrols say to do.

•Getting off the bus, cross in front at least five giant steps (10 feet) away and look left-right-left for traffic. Wait for the driver to signal it is safe to cross



A TRIP THRU THE WEST

Tumbleweed Smith

It was a perfect eight days. Monday to Monday in July. We left just before eight in the morning, had a picnic lunch near Perryton, then visited Dorothy's house in Liberal, Kansas. Dorothy herself took us through the Land of Oz and even sang Over The Rainbow for us. When we were planning our trip we made a list of the things we wanted to see along the way to our North Dakota destination. Dorothy's place was one of them.

We arrived in Dodge City, Kansas around 4:30 and went to the Boot Hill complex where we were thoroughly entertained. We saw an old west gunfight, had a delicious meal, and went to the saloon for a floorshow that featured first class entertainment including can-can girls, comedy and songs from Miss Kitty herself. We spent Monday night in Dodge City.

Tuesday we drove through Ogallala, Nebraska, saw the old town there and ended up in Scottsbluff. We visited the national monument, which has the longest tunnel in Nebraska (it's not long). We walked around the sandstone cliffs that overlook the town. Later we had a five star meal at The Emporium restaurant

We took our time and were never rushed. We left Texas with a speed limit of 75. We got to Kansas with a speed limit of 65. In Nebraska, it is 55. At some national parks we visited, the speed limit is sometimes 15 miles per hour.

Wednesday we went to Hot Springs, South Dakota and visited the impressive Fort Robinson, a sprawling frontier outpost during the Indian wars. We took a ride on a horse-drawn wagon while listening to a historian tell us about the place. Lakota Chief Crazy Horse was killed here. He fought with Sioux Chief Sitting Bull against General Custer at the Battle of Big Horn in Eastern Montana territory. Later we met up with friends in Hot Springs, South Dakota and visited some other friends who lived there. Hot Springs has a stream running through it with several places to swim or wade. The city has an impressive dig site where some of the largest mammoths have been found. The dig is all under roof in a gigantic modern building complete with air conditioning.

Thursday, on our way to Mount Rushmore we came to a halt because a herd of buffalo had stopped traffic both ways. The fascinating animals just ambled around the pavement and finally moved off onto the grass alongside the highway. Lots of camera action there. Rushmore makes my heart beat faster. It is a tribute to creativity and ingenuity on a large scale. It's special to me because I interviewed Lincoln Borglum, who finished the giant stone faces after his father, sculptor Gutzon Borglum, died.

We spent a couple of nights in Rapid City, then met some other friends in Sturgis. Saturday we traveled to Bowman, North Dakota, completing my visit to every state. Then we traveled to Wyoming for a visit to Devils Tower. Love the folk tales of bears and Indians. On the way home we spent the night in Pueblo, Colorado. It was a week well spent, seeing new places with three different sets of friends. The cities of Spearfish and Deadwood, South Dakota are beautiful. Frank Lloyd Wright said Spearfish had some of the best building sites in America.


