
n Sunday August 13 a quaint community celebration was held at the corner of Quimby Road and Gurdwara Avenue to celebrate the street name change.

# **Evergreen business owner 'Charlie Ly' shot and killed after refusing to open his cash register**

suspect, Muniunmee Hendrix, has been arrested in the shooting death of popular Evergreen business owner Hao "Charlie" Ly, owner of Jim's Liquor Mart on Quimby Rd.

The 911 call came in at 10:53 p.m. When police arrived, they found Ly, 57, on the floor with a gunshot wound. He was pronounced dead a short time later.

Hendrix, 21, demanded money from Ly's wife Lilly, but she refused. During the altercation, Ly See ARREST, page 8

Carrasco then stated with regard to the Sikh Community and the Gurdwara, "you have been the part of growth and beauty of our city of San Jose and you gave us 'today' (referring to the road name change ceremony) she then said, "thank you so much."

# Family Justice Center: A good start to escaping domestic violence

o one wants abuse to continue; everyone wants to feel safe in their homes," says Cindy Hendrickson, Assistant District Attorney of Santa Clara County. "It's not easy to escape domestic violence, but visiting a Family Justice Center is a good way to start,"

Survivors of domestic violence can receive free support and legal consultations from a multi-disciplinary team of professionals at the county's three Family Justice Centers. Clients will speak with a confidential advocate. They can also speak with a district attorney, a victim services advocate, and a family law or immigration attorney. These attorneys provide legal advice to help clients with restraining orders, VAWA, U-Visas, divorce, and child custody issues. Survivors may also make a police report if they so choose but are not required to do so to receive services from the FJCs.

Family Justice Center (FJC) staff can also arrange for clients to meet with representatives from probation, the Departments of Family & Children Services and Child Support Services, Second Harvest Food Bank, Dress for Success, and a host of other organizations. They may also

visit the FJCs as many times as needed. What Hendrickson loves most about the FJCs is, "the opportunity to connect with victims in a comfortable, quiet setting where many resources are available all at once. It affords us the ability to meet them where they are (in terms of their journey), and to provide them with empowering information."

Locally, Asian Americans for Community Involvement (AACI) hosts an FJC in East San Jose at 749 Story Road, Suite 50. The San Jose FJC is open to all survivors on a walk-in basis every Thursday from 9am - 5pm. AACI is a prime location for the FIC because the organization already serves survivors through their domestic violence program Asian Women's Home (AWH). AWH services are free, confidential and provided in 13 languages and dialects including a 24-hour hotline, emergency shelter, safety planning, Safe Chat Silicon Valley (online chat), legal and social services advocacy and accompaniment as well as peer counseling and individual therapy. Other locations include North County at the YWCA Silicon Valley and South County at Community Solutions.

One Chinese-speaking survivor who received services through the Asian Women's Home was in dire need of legal services. She shared that she was "feeling helpless and hopeless" before she was introduced to the San Jose Family Justice Center. The FJC provided her with the legal information she needed in order to better understand her case and what to expect. Translated from Chinese, she said, "I am very thankful to have FIC resources. It helped me to build up my confidence to handle my own legal case. I feel this is the most important for people experiencing domestic violence like me. And I was very fortunate to meet my own lawyer there, who later handled my case the best she could. That saved me!"

# Lead in water is harmful

Dear editor,

Recently, an op-ed article appeared in the San Jose Mercury News (8/1/17) regarding testing of drinking water in schools for lead.

The article is "Opinion: Unsafe levels of lead in drinking water at San Jose schools?" by Jason Pfeifle.

The following is an excerpt from this article: "...the [San Jose Unified School District] regularly tests water from its school drinking fountains for lead. In fact, they do so twice per year ... We all know that lead is highly toxic, particularly to children. But what is less widely known, perhaps, is just how harmful even low levels of lead exposure can be to kids' overall growth and development. Recent research shows that even at blood levels

below 5 micrograms per deciliter (a level once thought to be safe), lead can still cause diminished intellectual and academic abilities, higher rates of neurobehavioral disorders like ADHD, and poor growth in children.

This is why pediatricians across the country stress that there is no safe level of lead for kids. And the American Academy of Pediatrics now recommends a safety standard

of 1 part per billion for lead in school drinking water."

Los Angeles Unified School District also regularly tests drinking water in all of its schools for lead. They include newer buildings in their testing protocol because, until 2013, some amount of lead was permitted in plumbing products. The following is an excerpt from a New York Times article titled "Schools Nationwide Still Grapple "With Lead in Water" dated March 27, 2016:

"But even newer buildings can face a threat. Under industry pressure, Congress defined "lead-free" in the amendment as no more than 8 percent lead. Plumbing hardware like faucets and connectors often contained that much lead until 2013, when the permissible level fell to near zero. Los Angeles school officials learned of the 8-percent rule the hard way. In the 131 schools built over the last

decade, the district installed thousands of water fountains with long-lasting brass fittings to reduce maintenance costs. They later discovered that the leaded brass fittings tainted the water in some fountains beyond the E.P.A.'s

lead standard."

Lead is very harmful to human health, especially for children. The Evergreen School District has an obligation to provide a safe and healthy environment for its students. I urge the Evergreen School District to emulate the San Jose and Los Angeles Unified School Districts, and test drinking water in all ESD schools for lead on a regular basis, rotating the sources so that, over a cycle, all sources are tested. I also urge the ESD to adopt the safety standard of 1 part per billion for lead as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics.



Guests are welcome to share and split items at no additional charge depending on your appetite. This is a great way for a family group to sample several different meatball combinations at one sitting.

House of Meatball got its start in Morgan Hill, and the chain has been making its way north since opening late last year. With the success of the Morgan Hill restaurant, McQuaide wanted to open three more locations in the Bay Area, including the brand new one in Evergreen Valley.

The Evergreen location on San Felipe Rd. is a sit down diner while the Morgan Hill location is generally used for quickly picking up lunch. 




Hendrix allegedly shot Ly in the chest.

While trying to save her husband's life, Lilly Ly was ordered by Hendrix not to call police or "I will kill you." She defied his order and began calling 911, according to family members. They said the gunman knocked the phone out of Lilly's hand. Hendrix tried to open the cash register, but failed, and ran off empty handed.

While exiting the store, Hendrix lowered his mask and threw it in the parking lot as to not cause suspicion. His face was caught on a newly upgraded security camera as he was leaving the store.

# Investigation moves quickly

"Unbelievable investigative work," is how San Jose Police Chief Eddie Garcia described the investigation."

after reviewing the store's surveillance tape
from the attempted robbery. The detective
matched Hendrix's image and description

Detectives learned the suspect was on probation for a previous weapons charge in

the shooting of his unarmed neighbor in the leg with a stolen gun. Hendrix' beat the attempted-murder charge by claiming selfdefense. Hendrix's probation officer helped confirm the suspects identify.

Burglary detectives were tipped off that Hendrix was reportedly trying to sell merchandise potentially important to the investigation, according to Garcia.

"An arrest warrant was issued and Hendrix was picked up without incident in Merced, CA. Clothing and the silver semiautomatic handgun used in the armed robbery was found with the suspect," said Garcia.

Hendrix, 21, was taken into custody August 10 after San Jose police detectives tracked him to the Central Valley. He was booked into the Santa Clara County Main Jail the next morning and is being held without bail.

Hendrix grew up in Evergreen and attended Millbrook Elementary, Quimby Oak, and Chaboya Middle schools. He also allegedly spent time in juvenile hall. "It seemed that he was always mad at the world," according to a school official.

A vigil service, organized by local resident Lulu Gomez-Montez, was held in the parking lot of the business on Friday, August 11 for family, friends and store customers.

At the vigil, family members expressed their appreciation for the fast work of the San Jose police department. We are extremely grateful to SJPD and the community for all the support," said Ly's son, Jason Ly. Jason said his dad was an "incredibly

honest and hardworking man, and a great father."

Business owners in the Quimby Rd. strip-mall said it was a senseless tragedy and they were saddened by the loss to the community. "Our hearts go out to Ly's family.

A funeral service was held for Ly on Wednesday, August 16.

#### In shock

Ly's family said they are in absolute shock and grief about the killing of "Charlie" – especially Ly's wife who is still

traumatized. "He was an incredibly humble, hardworking, kind, loving man and his life did not deserve to end this way. We are trying as hard as we can to process and cope with this loss. We appreciate everyone's support and love."

# Fire prevention 'fee' finally suspended

Por six years, ruling Democrats have extorted money in the form of a fire tax from hundreds of thousands of rural Californians, including many seniors on fixed incomes.

# **Lower Silver Creek sediment removal begins**

The Santa Clara Valley Water District is removing sediment from Lower Silver Creek near Lake Cunningham in Evergreen.

Removing sediment that has accumulated within the creek will restore channel capacity, minimize sediment build-up in the future and maintain the creek's capacity to carry floodwaters while sustaining a stable and healthy creek ecosystem.

Work began July 24th and will take approximately four weeks to complete. Work hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Should delays occur, work hours may include Saturday.

A five- to ten-person crew is working at the project site using an excavator, a loader, dump trucks, water trucks and street sweepers. A generator, designed to operate quietly, is pumping water as needed around the project site and back into the creek farther downstream. Expect typical construction noise during work hours from operating heavy equipment.

Trucks and crews are accessing the creek from a maintenance entrance on Cunningham Avenue. Expect no road closures, but traffic control or flaggers may be needed at times during work for safety

# 'My San Jose' app service allows residents to report problems

here's a new smartphone app in town that will allow Almaden residents to make Almaden Valley cleaner, safer, and more vibrant by making it easier to report problems.

The new "My San Jose" app was officially launched on Monday, July 31. The new service allows residents to communicate with a few clicks to report cases of graffiti, potholes, illegal dumping, abandoned cars or streetlight outages to the city.

"With the launch of the My San Jose app, it's now even easier for San Jose residents to serve as our eyes on the streets and help us build a cleaner and more vibrant city," said San Jose Mayor Sam Liccardo. "The new app not only provides the kind of on-demand, seamless customer experience that our residents have come to expect, it will help us deliver services more cost-effectively and serve as a building block for a more robust and sophisticated tool in the years to come."

Residents can create a regular account, or create an anonymous account, and begin submitting specific requests. Having a regular account, not anonymous, allows for broader features and personalized service. Service requests can be logged with or without photos; either way, your request will be categorized and mapped for you to see. You can see other mapped requests and follow them if you want updates on those.

to see and keep track of. Set as an option on a smartphone, when a request is completed by city workers, they indicate the problem has been resolved and a notification alert is sent out.

It is expected that the number of illegal dumping reports coming in from the "My San Jose" app could double or triple. Mayor Liccardo said hiring is currently underway to double the number of crews assigned to illegal dumping. It has been reported that during the last sixmonths, the city has picked up more than 2,000 mattresses, 906 shopping carts, 680 tons of mixed debris, 498 gallons of motor oil, 189 gallons of paint, 308 gallons of human biological waste, and more than 1,200

# Scammers tempt local homeowners with promise of lower energy bills

It's the middle of summer and much of the US is running their air conditioners to beat the heat, translating to higher energy bills.

Scammers use this opportunity to tempt consumers with the promise of lower energy payments.

#### How the Scam Works

You get a call from someone claiming to represent a local energy company or government agency. This "representative" says that they are part of a program to help homeowners lower their energy bills. The details vary; this "program" may involve registering for tax credits, enrolling in an alternative energy program, or signing up with a competitive energy supplier.

Be sure to do your homework before accidentally falling for a scam! In some cases, con artists want to enroll you in a nonexistent program or sign up for tax credits, which requires you sharing personal information, such as your Social Security or Social Insurance number. This opens you up to the risk of identity theft. In other versions, the "program" involves paying upfront for future energy savings that never materialize.

# Tips to avoid an energy bill scam

Here are some tips for spotting scams that claim to help you lower your energy bills:

- Verify the program before enrolling. Before you sign up, confirm that you are dealing with a representative of a real program. Call your energy company or government agency using the number on their website or your energy bill.
- Understand your energy options: Some municipalities in the US now allow "competitive energy suppliers," alternatives to traditional utility companies that may be able to offer a better rate on your energy bills. But like any opportunity, be sure you understand the terms of the new contract and how it differs from your existing one.



# Solar eclipse viewing area at Hogue Park

ven though Santa Clara County won't be in the path of a total solar eclipse on Monday, August 21, we will get to view a partial eclipse, with about 75 percent of the sun being covered.

This is a rare and exciting event that you won't want to miss. But please make sure you have the proper glasses. Looking directly at the sun will injure your eyes. If you're looking through a telescope or camera, you will need a special filter.

There will be many areas for viewing in Santa Clara County, including San Jose's Hogue Park. The San Jose Astronomical Association is hosting a free viewing event from 9 a.m. to noon on Monday, August 21, at Hogue Park in West San Jose. RSVP at: sjaa.net/events/solar-eclipse-2017

To prepare for the solar eclipse, several local libraries are providing special presentations:

Dr. Andrew Fraknoi, astronomy professor at Foothill College, will lead a discussion from 2 to 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 12, at the Milpitas Library, 160 North Main Street, Milpitas.

The San Jose Astronomical Association will share information about the solar eclipse from 2 to 4 p.m. on Saturday, August 5, at Joyce Ellington Branch Library, 491 East Empire Street, San Jose. SJAA Solar Astronomers will have densely filtered solar telescopes in front of the library.

SJAA will also conduct a solar eclipse viewing workshop from 2 to 4 p.m. on Saturday, August 12, at the Bascom Branch Library, 1000 Bascom Avenue, San Jose.

And here's something you might not have thought about. In California, the eclipse will reduce solar energy supplies that help power the grid for more than two hours while the moon blocks the sun. The California Public Utilities Commission is asking all of us to conserve energy during the time the eclipse is expected to occur in California, from 9:02 to 11:54 a.m.






