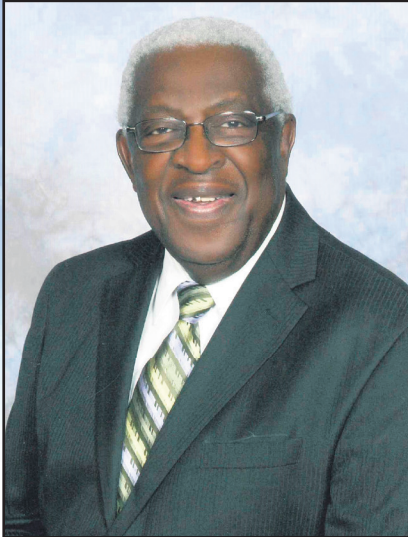

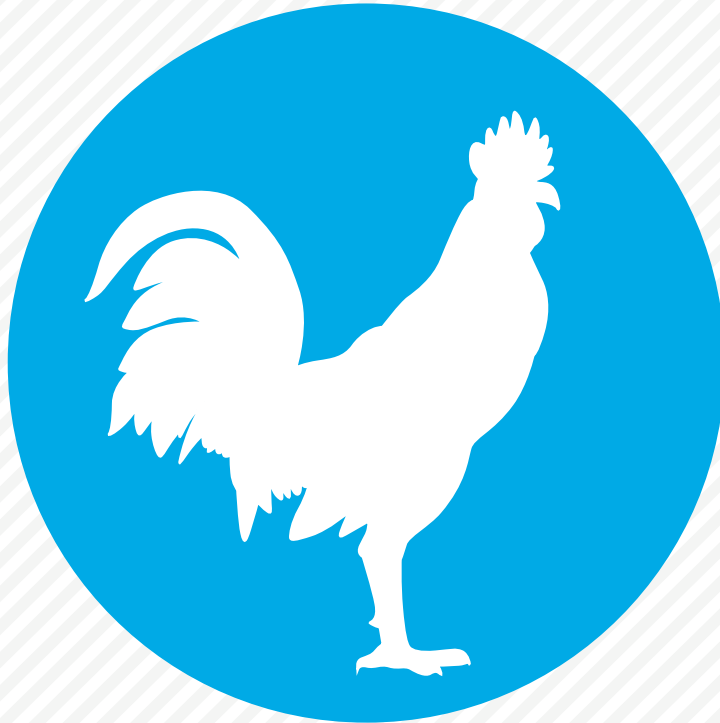

RULES & REGULATIONS

All Rules and Regulations MUST Be Followed As Written

1. All entries are open to Coffee County Residents only except where specified otherwise in this fair booklet.
2. All exhibits must be entered by 5:00 P.M. Sunday, September 17, except animals. The buildings will be open all day Sunday for you to arrange your booth or exhibits. Articles remaining on the grounds or in the building on Monday after the Fair will become property of the Fair Association. The Fair Board will dispose of all articles left on fair property 10 days after the close of the fair.
3. No premium will be paid except on items mentioned in the premium list, but any article which will add to the general interest of the Fair will be welcomed.
4. When, in the opinion of the judges, an article is not worthy of a placing, no premium will be paid.
5. All premium awards will be paid as soon as possible after judging. **Premium Checks must be cashed within 10 days.**
6. Everything shown must be of the current year's crop of work.
7. Judging may be started immediately after closing of entries if so desired by the superintendent in charge.
8. Entries made in vocational, 4-H, and special booths will be permitted in open classes.
9. **The Coffee County Fair Association will not be responsible for any personal injury or property damage of any kind whatsoever received on the Fair Grounds or in connection with the Fair.**
10. The Association reserves the right to refund in whole or part, money paid for privileges or concessions and refuses to allow any party to operate or do business should they become objectionable.
11. No radios, CDs, loud speakers, or loud music will be allowed in the stands.
12. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds without a permit from the Fair management except from their places of business or exhibit area.
13. The management of the Fair shall have the privilege of inspecting at any time, any concession or privilege stand. Anyone found violating the laws of the Federal or State governments or the regulations of the Fair Association, or in any way failing to comply with the terms of their contract, shall be compelled to comply with said laws, rules or regulations or remove his concession from the grounds.
14. Each concessionaire must confine himself to the space assigned to him.
15. Concessionaires must keep their spaces in a sanitary condition by removing filth or refuse from their assigned spaces.
16. Management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as they in their judgement may deem advisable. In the event of conflict of general and special rules - the special rules will govern.
17. All food or concession booth rent must be paid by September 1.
18. Concessionaires are requested in the interest of all concerned to buy their supplies from firms or persons advertising in this catalog.
19. No lotteries or any other money making schemes allowed except upon the written permission of the Fair Association.
20. **No articles will be removed from the grounds until after 1:00 P.M. Sunday, September 24. All articles are to be picked up no later than 3:00 P.M. on Sunday following the Fair.**
21. All stands constructed on grounds and left 30 days after the Fair will become property of the Fair Association with the privilege of the builder using the same structure the following year.
22. Junior participants shall cease at the end of the calendar year following the participant's graduation from high school or the end of the calendar year following their 19th birthday, whichever comes first.
23. When junior participants marry, they assume adult responsibilities and must therefore participate in adult categories.
24. "Fairest of the Fair", "Miss Teen", "Junior Miss", & "Little Miss Coffee County" will participate in all Fair Activities. The "Fairest of the Fair" will agree to attend the State Convention in Nashville in January. If the "Fairest of the Fair", "Miss Teen", "Junior Miss", or "Little Miss Coffee County" cannot fulfill their duties, they will relinquish their crown & title to the runner-up who will then assume all of the duties and privileges.
25. There will be an admission charge of \$5 per person ages 8 and up. Ticket booths will be open at 4:00 P.M. Saturday, September 16 & Monday through Friday and 10:00 A.M. Saturday, September 23. **There is no admission charge for Sunday, September 17.**
26. Contestant and one parent will enter free for the "Junior Miss Coffee County" and "Little Miss Coffee County". Contestant will enter free for "Fairest of the Fair".
27. There will be a \$30 charge on ALL returned checks.

* The Coffee County Fair is not responsible for any incorrect Premiums listed within the Fair Book.

Rules:

1. Each contestant must have reached her 16th birthday but not her 21st birthday by September 1, 2017.
2. A contestant cannot qualify if s has been married, given birth to a child, or been found guilty of a felony.
3. **Dresses should be formal. Split no more than 4 inches above the knee or side. Contestants will not be allowed to wear or carry flowers during the judging of the contest. The winner, who will represent Coffee County Fair in the state contest in January 2018, must have a floor length formal gown.**
4. Contestants will be judged on beauty, poise, personality, and interview.
5. Contestants must attach a copy of their birth certificate or a copy of their driver's license to their entry form.
6. Each contestant must reside within the boundaries of Coffee County or the corporate city limits of Tullahoma for a minimum of one year prior to the contest.
7. A non-refundable fee of \$25 must accompany the entry form.
8. The winner must represent "The Fair" at the different events during the week of the fair and throughout the year (must attend practice and crown the winner at the 2018 Fair). If the contestant cannot attend the State Fairest of the Fair Contest, she must relinquish her crown and the runner-up will become the new Fairest of the Fair. The Fair Association will furnish room and board expenses at the State Fairest of the Fair Contest.
9. During the Fairest of the Fair Contest, the contestant will not be allowed to have visitors backstage. *Any contestant with visitors backstage will be disqualified.*
10. Contestants must be and always have been of the female gender.
11. **There will be a late fee after September 1 of \$75. No late entries will be taken after September 7.**

Enclosed is a summary of Tennessee Fair Regulations - health requirements for livestock at fairs and exhibitions.

Special Comments:

1. It is expected that all exhibitors will bring only healthy animals to fairs and exhibitions. Although state and federal animal health officials will be performing some inspections, **fair officials are responsible** for ensuring that all animals entering fairs for exhibition are in overall good health and are accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Animals showing clinical signs of contagious disease should be sent home immediately. Violations should be reported to the state veterinarian or his agent.
2. Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection are to accompany all animal(s) to the respective shows with the exception of in-state Tennessee equine and poultry. In-state Tennessee equine six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months. Poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions should be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days, **or be tested on-site prior to exhibition following strict biosecurity procedures**, or originate directly from a flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the Tennessee Poultry Improvement Plan. As part of increased awareness and surveillance for Avian Influenza and other poultry diseases, all bird's physical appearance should be assessed at the time testing is conducted.
3. Health certificates issued in satisfaction of these Tennessee Fair Regulations shall be good for 90 days for Tennessee livestock only.
4. Please note that exhibition requirements for out-of-state livestock are the same as regular import requirements.
5. **Warts and ringworm are considered contagious and infectious diseases and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.**
6. **Scabies, contagious ecthyma (soremouth), footrot, cutaneous fungal and bacterial infections (i.e. club lamb disease, caseous lymphadenitis) are considered contagious and infectious diseases, and are permissible exclusions only if considered inactive by the issuing veterinarian and noted as such on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.**
7. **Avian Influenza – All out-of-state poultry must originate directly from a Pullorum- Typhoid Clean Flock and a H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative official Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.**

Also, please note that if highly pathogenic Avian Influenza is detected in Tennessee or a neighboring state, the commingling of poultry at fairs and exhibitions may be suspended.

Fair Biosecurity

Please review and implement the biosecurity recommendations for exhibit organizers and exhibitors related to swine provided by the National Pork Board that can be found at <http://m.pork.org/News/4545/SwineShowBiosecurityRecommendations.aspx>.

Also, be aware of the potential exposure of fair attendees to E. coli 0157 from animals exhibited on the fairgrounds.

Below is a summary of recommendations for fair management by the National Assembly of State Animal Health Officials and the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians to better protect fair attendees from disease:

- Provide easy access to hand washing stations.
- Post informational signage that includes the following messages:
 - *No eating or drinking in the animal areas.*
 - *Wash hands frequently.*
 - *No pacifiers, sipping cups or strollers in the animal exhibition areas.*
- Discourage sleeping in the animal exhibition areas.
- If human or swine influenza-like-illness is associated with the exhibition, animal health and public health officials should be notified immediately.
- People who have influenza-like illness should leave the exhibition immediately and seek medical care. They should advise their health care provider about their fair attendance.
- People at high risk for developing severe complications from influenza should limit their exposure to swine.

Summary: Livestock Health Requirements For Fairs and Exhibitions

I GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
- (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE: Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
- (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter, and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

Show Rules & Requirements

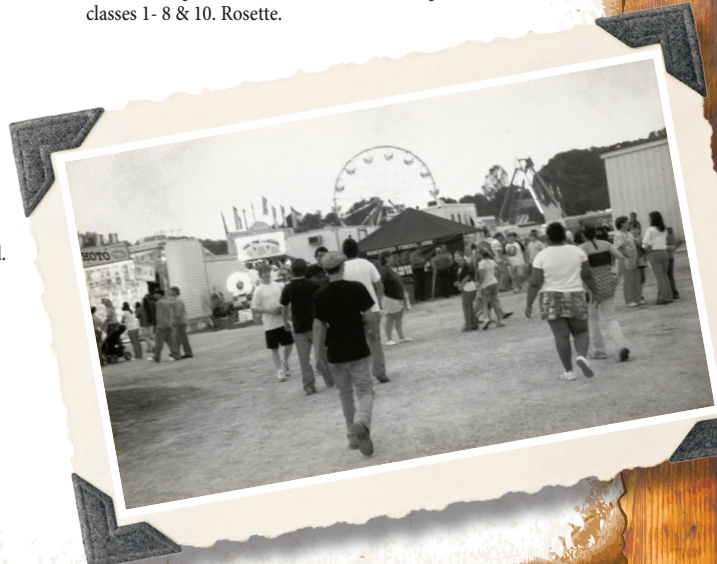
1. Animals may begin to arrive after 8:00 A.M. All animals must be entered in the show between 8:00 A.M. and 10:30 A.M. Proof of age by registration papers required.
2. Classes will be provided for all breeds with at least 10 head of cattle. In order to have a breed show, there must be at least two (2) different families and two (2) exhibitors. (parents & children are considered as one family.) The general livestock superintendent's decision will be final!
3. The Open Heifer Show & Junior Heifer Show will be conducted simultaneously. Awards for both Open & Junior placing will be awarded.
4. Health rules are as follows: All cattle shall be accompanied by Certificate of Veterinary inspection recording evidence of a negative test for Brucellosis within 90 days. The negative test requirement shall not apply to:
 - a. Cattle less than 18 months of age (both vaccinates & non-vaccinates.)
 - b. Steers & spayed heifers
 - c. Cattle from Certified Brucellosis-Free herds.
5. All animals entered at owners risk! Coffee County Fair Association will not be responsible for accidents.
6. Bedding will be furnished for in-barn use. Please do not bed with straw.
7. Animals may be removed from the Fairgrounds immediately following the show.
8. Entry fee of \$3.00 per head required for Open Show entries.
9. Nose leads required for bulls over 1 year old.
10. Junior show exhibitors must be 19 yrs. old or younger. Adults may assist very exhibitors if required.
11. Junior show entries must be registered in a junior's name and shown by a junior exhibitor.
12. All animals brought to grounds must be unloaded and exhibited.
13. No unethical practices for show preparation.

13. Breed Champion & Reserve, Bull: 1st & 2nd places in classes 1 - 8 & 10. Rosette.
