





writing, "Thank you for reading. Be strong and courageous." Some people even had their picture taken with him.

Those who had previously read his story, stopped to shake his hand or tell him how much it meant to them. "I was teary-eyed when I read your article," said one man. "I'm a cancer survivor and it touched me," said a woman.

"It's been very exciting," says Watkins, "and most importantly, it's bringing hope to others."







Times staff writer s more than 50 inches of rain fell over Houston, Texas, the fourth largest city in the United States, more than 450,000 residents will need disaster assistance.

Houston's resources are overburdened, which is why cities and counties like the City of San Jose and the County of Santa Clara are being called on to provide assistance.

"Here in San Jose, we remain all too familiar with the pain and challenges that follow natural disasters, and we will continue to do whatever we can to help our brothers and sisters in Texas recover from the devastating effects of Hurricane Harvey."





History: How it all began in 1977

Fifty-two years ago a group of women gathered together, wanting to make a difference in their community. They started with small events – a carnival, a few fashion shows, and then in 1977, they hosted a small art and wine festival held in Parma Park. Today that same club has grown from a small group of women to a highly active group of community members that hosts the annual Almaden Valley Art & Wine Festival, an event that draws more than 20,000 people.

Almaden Valley Women's Club forms

In 1965 the Almaden Valley Women's Club (AVWC) was formed by a small group of women. The goal was simple: Bring awareness and raise money for organizations in the community. The group's first "event" was a hot dog stand at a local church festival.

From those humble beginnings the club expanded to host an annual themed fashion show. The first beneficiary was Zonta, a school for children with disabilities. Funds were raised for Zonta with the annual fashion show as well as a pool party. Within the next few years the group expanded the events to include a carnival which was held at the Almaden Center, the shopping center where Safeway is located today. The carnival was an annual four-day event and funds raised were used for improvements at several local schools as well as the library.

Women's club expands its reach

In 1977, the Almaden Valley Women's Club decided to expand their reach and organized the first Almaden Valley Art & Wine Festival. Co-founded by Almaden's own Pat Dando (who passed away last month). The event was held at Parma Park and was co-sponsored by the Almaden Community Center and the Bret Harte Community Center. "In the early years it was a small festival at Parma Park," says Rocki Kramer, long-time member of the Almaden Valley Women's Club. "There was also a race held in the morning called the Great Grape Race. We had a small children's area and the food was provided by community non-prof-

The festival was a hit and the attendees increased each year. In 2005 during renovations of the Library and adjoining park,

the event was moved to Almaden Lake Park. The move offered some challenges but also many opportunities. "Almaden Lake Park allowed us to host our festival amongst the beautiful trees and the beautiful lake," says Carina Johnson, longtime member and current AVWC President. "We were able to have a children's area that was included in the main park and was not at a separate location. We were able to bring in more artists, food vendors, entertainment and beverage booths. It was a huge challenge at that time reinventing the way we put on our festival to this new location. Now, 12 years later, we are quite efficient running a 20,000 persons attraction at the lake park."

Even with the larger venue, the club never lost sight of their roots in the community. To this day the stage is filled with community acts including local dance and cheerleading organizations, local karate studios, local music schools and more.

The club has always had the goal of contributing to local organizations. In the early days, along with Zonta, the club raised funds to provide playground equipment for Parma and Greystone Parks, donation of books and a movie projector to the Almaden Library, and raised money for the local Fire Department enabling them to purchase a "Jaws of Life" rescue tool. Today the organization maintains its commitment to serving the needs of the Almaden Valley community and those of greater San Jose through funds raised at the annual festival. All proceeds are now donated as community grants to educational facilities and non-profit organizations community including Academic and Service Scholarships given to graduating seniors living in the Almaden

While the festival itself has continued to grow and evolve, the heart that drives the festival is still the dedication of the group of women who started this tradition and those who continue ensuring that San Jose's longestrunning festival never loses sight of supporting the community. The Almaden Valley Art & Wine Festival is run and managed entirely by volunteers—the people who live, work, and play in the community. When she joined AVWC, Carina Johnson was looking for something beyond the volunteering that she'd done at her children's school. "I was looking to make a difference in helping a club that supported our Almaden Community and make lasting friendships along the way," she says. "I also wanted to be part of a club where I could emphasize and use my skills and feel accomplished

beyond taking care of my family; to feel personally accomplished!"

Rocki Kramer also emphasizes the community involvement aspect. "If you live in Almaden and are involved in the club, it gives you a wonderful opportunity to give back to your community," she says. "Our club has a huge history in Almaden Valley," says Johnson. "We celebrate 52 years in 2017 of giving back to the Almaden and greater San Jose communities. A few ladies started this club with the desire to help others in need and we have continued that commit-

ment today through our club and the funds earned through 41 years of Art & Wine Festivals. We have created and host an event that brings our community together to have fun, enjoy each other's company, attracts artists from all over the bay area to display their hand made artistry, enjoy community entertainment, tantalizing food and of course great wine and beer. All proceeds have always and continue to be given back each year in the form of grants to non-profit groups and scholarships to high school senior students. Not many clubs in the state can say they are named one of the longest running festivals in California. We must be doing something right!"

The Almaden Art & Wine Festival is scheduled this year for Sunday, Sept. 17 at Almaden Lake Park from 10am – 6pm. The festival features two stages of entertainment, multiple wine tasting booths, hundreds of craft booths, a wide variety of food vendors and food trucks, a children's area and a silent auction. CITY COUNCIL SIGNS OFF ON 3 VILLAGES

City of San Jose can't figure out where to place 'tiny homes'

Tiny Homes: Where will they be welcome? The San Jose City Council has approved three "villages" each with 25 "tiny homes" for the homeless, but doesn't know where to place them.

The approval vote was 9-2, with Councilmembers Don Rocha and Johnny Khamis casting dissenting votes. Both wanted the "villages" placed on private instead of city-owned land.

Each cottage would be approximately 70 square feet, according to the proposal, and each site would house about 25 of them. All the villages would come with hired security and case managers and cost \$1.4 million on the high end, according to housing staff. The City currently spends more than \$2 million a year cleaning up homeless camps.

The City Council is reaching out to Santa Clara County, the Santa Clara Valley Water District and other local government agencies to help find land for the tiny homes. They set a two-month deadline to find new locations and draft an improved outreach plan.


The council was supposed to go into this week's meeting with at least one site suggestion from each of the city's 10 council districts, but only councilmembers Khamis and Chappie Jones offered sites.

Residents cited fears during testimony about the criminality of the unsheltered and how tiny homes would devalue their properties. Many said they want to help the homeless, but not if it affects property values.

The top five states where going tiny is a bit easier than the rest are California, Oregon, Texas, North Carolina and Florida, according to EcoBuilding Pulse.



City's illegal fireworks pilot program fizzles

The City of San Jose's illegal fireworks reporting program has fizzled.

San Jose City manager Norberto Dueñas has announced that the online pilot program unfairly issued citations and those who received a citation will be pardoned.

What brought down the pilot

program was a major flaw in that the appeal process required fines to be paid up front. Cita-tions are now being converted to warnings and those who already paid fines will soon be reimbursed.

Duenas admitted that the criteria for fireworks use citations had not been evenly applied to all of the citations. "The fairest action was to replace the citations and associated fines with a warning letter." More than a thousand online complaints were filed about illegal fireworks between late May and July 12, resulting in 45 citations based on video or photographic evidence.

City staff will continue to review and refine the pilot program and will share future proposed changes to the City's fireworks enforcement efforts in the weeks and months ahead.
