Visitors saw a pioneer town including a school, church, post office and a working blacksmith shop, a working printer's shop, and a home from the early years with a wood burning stove.

There was a water wheel with the water turning the wheel to operate the grinding for the corn.

There was also a zoo at the show with baby animals

Visitors also saw a caboose on train tracks like tracks that went through the towns in the early years.

Yet the best of all are the stories and memories of Bill and Sylvia Langenbach, who started the event 39 years ago. Then is was a one day event with a few exhibits for family and friends. Now it is a three day event with new exhibits yearly.

Last year, a new log museum building was opened to display artifacts from the founding father's (James E. McGrath) logging camps. Also there were exhibits from the McGrath Historical Committee with information from the surrounding nine townships. The City of McGrath information includes legal



documentation of Incorporation Day of March 23, 1923.

The ghost towns of Solana, Arthyde, Tronnes, Bloemendal, Ostlun, Silver Star, Veteransville, Red Top, Giese, and Boston are not forgotten:

This year the new exhibit was the Steam Engine from The Buffalo-Springfield Roller Co. in Ohio. It was in line with the many steam engine tractors, steel wheels tractors, from the '50s tractors, antique trucks and approximately 300

vehicles in the parade.





World-renowned artist's work unveiled at Reif Center in Grand Rapids

World-renowned wildlife artist, and Grand Rapids area resident, Brian Jarvi will debut his latest work – a monumental seven panel exhibition of African wildlife, titled African Menagerie - at a one-night only event, Satur-

day, September 16, at the Reif Performing Arts Center in Grand Rapids.

Those interested should gather at 6 p.m. in the lobby of the Reif Performing Arts Center for an hors d'oeuvres reception and to enjoy a collection of the smaller paintings. At 6:30 p.m., crowds will move into the Reif's Wilcox Theater for a short presentation and film about the work, and then finally to see African Menagerie revealed. At the conclusion of the event, the panels will be repackaged and sent off on tour. Tickets are \$20.

Three years in the making, African Menagerie is a 32 ft. wide, free-standing arc, consisting of seven interlocking panels. The work features over 200 African mammals and birds. "It would take a person hours to identify all of the species," said Todd Wilkinson, author of the coffee table book that accompanies the work.

Also in the painting, is a

small human figure, meant to be the face of all humankind. Together these 200 species look the viewer in the eyes as if to ask what are Homo sapiens willing to do to prevent Africa's wildlife legacy

from going extinct in the wild.

Born in Floodwood, MN, Brian Jarvi gave up a job with the railroad in the mid-1980s to pursue his dream of being a painter. He captured attention quickly by winning the Minnesota Duck and Pheasant Stamp competitions in successive years (the first individual to do so), then also finished high in the Federal Duck Stamp Contest. A safari in Kenya and Tanzania sparked an interest in the animals of Africa, and it is this line of artistic inquiry that has established his reputation as one of the top wildlife painters of his generation.

"The transformation that Brian Jarvi has undergone from being a very talented sporting artist in the Upper Midwest to creating exciting works worthy of hanging in major museums with the best animal painters of all time is nothing short of phenomenal," said David J. Wagner, who is curating the African Menagerie traveling exhibition.

The masterwork, accompanied by more than 60 of Jarvi's studies and smaller paintings will shortly embark on a national traveling museum exhibition. However, it is the artist's wish to share this landmark work first with his community in the Grand Rapids area on Saturday, September 16. African Menagerie seeks to address an extinction crisis that is unparalleled in the age of man, one that affects hundreds of animal, bird, and plant species around the world. Be it poaching, human population pressure, pollution, or climate change, humans are forcing creatures into smaller and smaller spaces. "It is my hope that African Menagerie will serve as a catalyst to wake people up," said Jarvi.

the challenge of our generation and it's one we share with our kids and grandkids. In all of my travels I've never met people with a stronger conservation ethic than my fellow Minnesotans," Jarvi

said. "What I hope African Menagerie does is not only inspire viewers to ponder

older, this is the spectacular diversity of creatures but that it helps raise awareness about the plight of many on the panel that are critically imperiled."

"A lot of 'wildlife art' out there today is unimaginative and really does nothing to advance what truly great art always does—and that is spark a conversation, getting viewers to reflect on issues of importance in their own time," Wagner said, then adds:

"What Brian Jarvi has done with African Menagerie is enormously courageous. It is giving him a place in art history. It's one thing to even attempt something so audacious and ambitious; it's another to have the talent to actually pull it off in a way that will leave people talking a century from now. He really succeeds." Most importantly, Wagner notes, society in the future will have to judge if generations of today stepped up to the challenge by listening to Jarvi's message.


