Opioid crisis town hall meeting

The impact of opioids in our community as well as throughout the state of Mississippi was discussed recently during a town hall meeting held at the Ronald E. Whitehead Advanced Technology Center in Ellisville. Representatives from different agencies and organizations including the Department of Mental Health, MS Board of Pharmacy, MS Bureau of Narcotics, and Clearview Recovery Center, who make up the Governor's Opioid and Heroin Abuse Task Force, spoke on the opioid crisis providing information and possible solutions.

Steve Parker, deputy director of the Mississippi Board of Pharmacy, began the meeting by introducing Jones County Sheriff Alex Hodge,

who welcomed everyone to Jones County. Parker then introduced Representative Donnie Scoggins who spoke briefly saying, "You are concerned, just as I am, about the opioid epidemic and the problem that's going on. Here in Jones County we have had 8-10 opioid deaths just this year. That's

10 opioid deaths that were unnecessary."

A video message from Governor Phil Bryant was played and the governor said, "Eighty

percent of those we find are addicted to and have died from heroin overdose began with a prescription drug." He went on to say that from 2013 to 2016 heroin overdose deaths rose 2,000 percent. "This is a crisis that the President of the United States, the United State Congress and other leaders in the nation has realized," noted Bryant. "Governors are banding together to make sure our task forces will help solve this

Lt. John Harless with the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics gave an overview of the problem with opioids and illicit drugs. "Opioids are a class of drugs designed to reduce pain. They include Hydrocodone, Oxycodone, Lortab, and Percocet." All of these have led many people to addiction and to the next step, which is Heroin. "Heroin has come out of the shadows and it has moved to our college campuses, neighborhoods and everywhere we are," exclaimed Harless. He also added Fentanyl to the list, which is a powerful pain medication.

"Lately we have been seeing counterfeit pharmaceuticals because that is where the money is," said Harless. He added that many of the regular pain relievers are being laced with Fentanyl. He also said, "The first counterfeit pharmaceutical, that I am aware of, that was found in Mississippi came from Jones County."

He said statistics from the CDC showed that in 2015 there were 52,404 deaths that occurred nationwide from accidental drug overdose.

Over 33,000 of those were in the opioid drug class of drugs. This equates to 91 deaths per day or one death every 16 minutes.

Harless compared these numbers to the number of people who fly on a 747 jet, which seats approximately 400 people. "In four or five days, opioid addiction kills the same number of people that would be killed if that 747 crashed. That's eighty-one 747 crashes a year." He pointed out that if this were to occur the FFA would be investigating and would ground all 747s in the country.

Opioid addiction is an epidemic and steps must be taken to deal with it, which is why the governor developed the Opioid and Heroin Abuse Task Force. In talking about Fentanyl and the dangers of it, Harless said because it is cheaper the Mexican Cartel is mixing Heroin with it. "Because of that, what we're seeing across the country is first responders, police officers, EMTs, emergency room personnel and firemen are coming into incidental contact with Fentanyl. Fentanyl is designed to be a very potent drug and they are going into overdose, just by coming into

This is why local law enforcement, emergency responders, and firefighters are being issued Narcan, which reverses the effects of opioids. Ann Rodio, who is with the Department of Mental Health and is the State Targeted Response Opioid Grant project director spoke about two Bills that have recently passed that address Narcan. One of those Bills is House Bill 996. "What we want you to understand about this Good Samaritan Law is that no one who chooses to

or who chooses not to administer Narcan will be held liable when acting in a professional or personal capacity." The other Bill allows pharmacies across the state to dispense Narcan without a prescription.

Rodio asked the question, "Do you think substance abuse disorder is a mental disease?" She pointed out that when someone crosses the line into addiction many can no longer make rational decisions. "When someone says 'no one in their right mind would do something like that,' that is the issue. They are not in their right minds. They've lost their ability to choose," stated Rodio.

Rodio talked about the importance of breaking the silence when it comes to opioid addictions and addictions in general. "Silence is costing lives," exclaimed Rodio. "People who fall into addiction of any sort, especially opioid disorder and the stigma society attaches to it, is keeping people afraid, ashamed, and embarrassed. And it kills! People would rather die than ask for help because of the way society treats them. No matter how bad things are we want people to understand there is hope.

During the question-and-answer period, local physician Dr. Mark Horne said that 20 years ago physicians were urged to prescribe these opioids to relieve pain. He said, "Now, we have got to rein this in and put that genie back in the bottle." He asked about the new substitute drugs now available.

Dr. Randy Easterling, an addictionologist from Vicksburg and a member of the task force, was invited to address the question. Easterling said in his 30 years of practice in addiction medicine he has never seen the situation so bad. "Ninety percent of admissions to my chemical dependence unit are opioid addicts," exclaimed Easterling. "Five or six years ago, I hardly ever saw a Heroin addict. I see 10 to 15 a day now. It's an epidemic of giant proportions." Easterling reiterated the highly addictive characteristics of opioids.

"If there's anything good that has come out of this crisis, a lot of research has been cranked out in the last decade on pain," said Easterling. "What we've learned is acute pain and chronic pain is two different animals." He said for years physicians have prescribed opioids for pain with broken arms, legs, or hips without question. "Research has shown if you write over a three-day supply the addiction rate goes up six to seven percent," said Easterling. "If you write a seven to ten-day supply it goes up to 15 percent. If you give a 30-day supply of hydrocodone for acute pain, 33 to 35 percent of those people will be taking it a year later." He said all providers must rethink the way they treat acute pain which includes giving physician orders for Tylenol, Motrin, and other pain medicines with non-opioid components.

Big 3 fares well in college football

Looking back at the weekend's college games was what we expected: three big wins for USM, MSU and Ole Miss. Ole Miss struggled in the opening half, and as all SEC teams are expected to win at home against an FCS opponent, they did, 45-23. After trailing 16-7 in the second period, they went on a 31-point explosion to go 2-0 on the season.

UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson thought his team played hard and showed toughness. "You have to pick your poison against Ole Miss on what you want to focus on stopping. They have an outstanding quarterback," said Simpson. "We would have had to play a perfect game, and we didn't," added the Ellisville native. Ole Miss coach Matt Luke knows his defense is not playing well. The Rebels' de-

fense allowed over five yards per rush as Ladarius Galloway rushed for 188 yards. A couple of bright spots were Bay Springs native Javien Hamilton and Wayne

County's Benito Jones. Hamilton, who played at JCJC last fall, got the Rebels' first turnover of the season — a fourth-period interception. Jones, who plays nose guard on defense, says the overall effort was good. "Our play was iffy. We've got to get better. We started off slow, and

we have to pick it up next week," stated Jones. Laurel's Octavious Cooley snared his first pass reception as a Rebel.

Rebel quarterback Shea Patterson is pretty special. He set a single game passing record for 489 yards and fired five touchdown passes. Four of the TDs took less than two minutes to drive the field. He has some of the best receivers in the SEC to throw to in A.J. Brown, Demarkus Lodge and D.K. Metcalf.

A lot of questions about the Rebel will be answered this Saturday night when they travel to play the University of California for a 9:30 kickoff on ESPN. This game could define the Rebels' season.

Bulldog defense really good

MSU played great defense last Saturday night in their 57-21 win over La. Tech in Ruston. MSU nose guard Jeffery Simmons scored two touchdowns and blocked an extra point in the game. Former JCJC defensive back Jonathan Abram teamed with Leo Lewis to sack Tech quarterback J'Mar Smith. Collins native Mark McLaurin led the defense with ten tackles and also had a pick. MSU kicker Logan Cook was a silent killer. He kicked off nine times into the end zone for touchbacks and also punted three times for a 47.7 yard average with no return yards for the former Columbia Academy senior. Quarterback Nick Fitzgerald was steady, accounting for 235 yards of offense as he ran for two long scores and passed

Pain can be related to joint hypermobility or "double jointed" loose joints. This is the definition of hypermobility: "joints that easily move beyond the normal range expected for that particular joint". Although this feature can be an interesting party trick sometime this abnormally loose joint(s) can be easily injured. You have supportive ligaments that are designed to protect your joints, not designed for overstretching to the point of painful injury or abrupt over stretching. If this happens this can sometimes lead to pain, strain/sprain, sometimes even dislocation. This trait is usually passed down in family members and can be tested using the Beighton Hypermobility scale. I'll tell you the test to keep it simple. Try to touch your thumbs to your forearms by bending your wrist down and slightly pushing the thumb towards the bottom of your forearm. If you can do this on one side, try the other. If you are able to do this part of the test, you have 2 points out of 9 for the test. Now try seeing how far your pinky fingers bend back (Do NOT over stretch yourself to the point of discomfort!), if you go past a 90 degree angle (straight up towards the ceiling) this is another point. Now try the other hand. If you can, you now have 4 points out of 9. The rest of the test involves your elbows, your knees, and if you can place your hands flat onto the floor.





Historic Deason home receives special projects grant from NSDAR program

The Deason Home in Ellisville recently received a Special Projects Grant from the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution to complete the exterior restoration of the southern side of the home. Funding for this project was made possible through the sponsorship of the Tallahala Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution. NSDAR Special Projects Grants Program provides local community grant funding to support projects exemplifying the organization's mission areas of Historic Preservation, Education and Patriotism.

The Deason Home was presented to the Tallahala Chapter NSDAR in 1991 by Welton and Frances Anderson Smith. Since that time, the chapter has worked diligently to restore the home to its original glory. With the interior complete, their efforts have been focused on the exterior for the last few years. The restoration of the southern exposure completes the majority of the work needed on the outside of the home. Windows were reworked, rotten wood replaced and it now sports a bright new coat of white paint. Over the last two years, similar work has been done on the rest of the exterior. The home is on the National Register of Historic Places and is a Mississippi Landmark. All work was done under the guidance and approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History. Future projects will include a handicapped access ramp and foundation repairs.

If you would like to visit Jones County's oldest home, private tours can be arranged through the Deason Home website www.deasonhome.org. The chapter is also making plans for its annual Open House and Reenactment which is scheduled for October 28, 2017.

Laurel School Board partners with MSBA in superintendent search

The process of searching for a new Superintendent of Education for the Laurel School District is underway by the Laurel School Board. Wednesday morning, August 30, President Miranda Beard, Vice President Ann Barrow, and Board Attorney Dick Yoder announced that during their Tuesday night meeting, the board unanimously approved to contract with the Mississippi School Boards Association to assist with the search for a new superintendent.

Present Superintendent Dr. Chuck Benigno announced three weeks ago his plans to resign in order to take a position as a member of the faculty at William Carey University in Hattiesburg. His last day in the

December 31.

"We have been proactive, behind the scenes, for the past three weeks," stated Beard. "As of last night, the board did decide to partner in an agreement with the Mississippi School Board Association using their superintendent search services to help us vet and find the best candidate for the Laurel School District. Many people realize and understand that the Mississippi School Board Association has great experience, national ties, great data base, and a Superintendent Academy that they conduct annually. They also have an understanding of a new law that the Mississippi Legislature put into effect July 1. We want to make sure we abide by those laws."

She said that the MSBA's su Laurel School District is set for perintendent search services has a 10-year history of successfully matching the right candidates for a district. The new law pertaining to the hiring of a superintendent was explained by Yoder.

"The Legislature adopted (a law), and it went into effect July 1 of this year, that adds specific requirements as to who can be a superintendent. One of those requirements is that an individual have not less than six years of experience, which includes at least three years of administrative experience as a school building principal. It requires that they have served in a school with an A or B rating or in a school where they have shown advancement of that school from one grade to at least the next higher grade. There is also a saving part for current superintendents and

The keynote speaker, Dr. Suzanne Carreker, will present "Best Practices for Classroom Teachers of Reading and Dyslexia Therapists." Carreker is principal educational content lead at Lexia Learning Systems in Concord, Massachusetts. She serves on the board of the International Dyslexia Association and is the author of William Carey University's Dyslexia Therapy Program curriculum, Basic Language Skills. Carreker was the former senior vice president of innovative solutions at Neuhaus Education Center in Houston, Texas. Better watch out for these Tornadoes

Over the past three years, the Laurel Tornadoes have compiled a 36-8 mark on the gridiron and have made winning region titles and trips deep into the postseason a common trek. The Tornadoes even outdueled Oxford in 2014 to win their third state title, and they made it back to the title game a year ago. Many of the young men who helped propel Laurel to the Promise Land of Football have finished their high school careers; in fact, quite a few of them are now exercising their talents on Saturdays at the college level.

So, with the absence of those difference-makers and the current dependence on quite a few young or inexperienced guys at wide receiver and in the backfield, Laurel fans likely would understand if the Tornadoes performed at a slightly lower level in 2017. But that's not what LHS head coach Todd Breland and his staff understand or accept. The Tornadoes coaching crew is pushing this group of young men to excel just as their predecessors have.

"We have a great coaching staff here that just coaches their hearts out, and they deserve a lot of credit," Breland stated Friday night after his Tornadoes had just downed powerful Petal, 25-23.

Laurel opened the season with a convincing victory over Callaway, 24-12, before dropping a 20-14 decision to a strong Hattiesburg squad and then getting shellacked by 6A giant Oak Grove, 42-12. After that outing against the Warriors, it might have been tempting for this group of Tornadoes to start folding their tents and look ahead to 2018. But that's not the culture Breland and his staff have built at LHS. This team regrouped on Monday, went back to work and came out Friday night expecting to do what

they do . . . win! And don't forget this: their expectation to win Friday night would have to be proven against a Panthers' team that a week earlier had crushed Brother Martin High School, a 5A team from Louisiana. Mississippi high school coaching legend Marcus Boyles paces the Petal sideline, so no Laurel coach or player expected it to be easy Friday, and it wasn't.

"A lot of the things I do on the sidelines I learned from him (Boyles) working at Wayne County," Breland noted. "I think the

Quarterback Sinclair Ulmer, who did a superb job playing in the stead of starter Xavier Evans, promptly found Jontarius Henderson streaking through the Petal defense, and Henderson didn't stop until he arrived at the Panthers' 12. When he parked, there were 43 ticks left on the game clock. Laurel fans were hooting and hollering, but Laurel was unable to cross the goal-line with two incomplete passes and a short run. Breland then drained the game clock down to three seconds before calling time-out and sending Juan Lechuga to the field for a chance to be a hero. Lechuga didn't disappoint. He calmly split the uprights from 26 yards to give Laurel a dramatic, come-from-behind
