Welcome to the 42nd installment of Essex Day!

The 42nd annual Essex Day festival will be held on Sunday, Sept. 17, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the 400- and 500-blocks of Eastern Boulevard - the heart of Essex. And if ya don't know, now ya know.

While the festival officially starts at 10 a.m., as always, the opening ceremonies begin at noon. So there's plenty of milling around and exploring that can be done before things really get going.

Essex Day is known to be chock full of fun, from the music on the Main and Gospel stages, to the boats and cars on display, to the vendors with something for everyone and even the well-known pop-culture

characters making their rounds. And fear not - THERE WILL BE CARNIVAL RIDES THIS YEAR!

That's right - after a brief absence last year, the carnival rides are back, and they will have quite a large rides and amusements area.

According to Ric Metzgar, chairman of the New Essex Day Festival Association, not having the rides last year was a disappointment for everyone, including the association. He noted that 2016 was the only year the festival was without the popular section, and the association did not know they would not have it until the morning of Essex Day.

The company that was supposed to supply the

amusements abruptly went out of business, Metzgar said, leaving them high and dry. He added that three or four other such companies in Maryland have also recently gone out of business.

Moving westward down the Boulevard, the opening ceremonies will start with elected officials and other honored guests being led down to the Main Stage at Taylor Avenue by the brass band from the United House of Prayer church. There and then, the festival will begin in earnest.

"And I got confirmation that Governor Larry Hogan is coming," Metzgar said. "He told me more than once that he wants to be there and it's on the schedule."

Providing great tunes all day on the Main Stage will be The River Dogs starting at 12:30 p.m., The Doug Lester Band at 2 p.m., beloved crooner Ronnie Dove at 2:30 p.m., The Dave Nicely Band at 3:30 p.m. and Covered from 4:40 p.m. to the end of the festival.

the Gospel Stage on the eastbound side, across from Uncle Eddie's, pumping out enjoyable and familyfriendly music all day long.

There, visitors will see the aforementioned United House of Prayer brass band starting at 12:45 p.m. following their march down from the Main Stage after the opening ceremonies. Next up will be Downing Lane at 2 p.m., followed by Heaven for Sure at 3 p.m. and Covenant Brit Ministries at 4 p.m.

"So we're going to have the gospel music all day," Metzgar said. "And it's going to be multi-cultural, going to be contemporary, to southern gospel to bluegrass. That's going to be a good thing."

Again, find more information on these artists later in this supplement.

At the west end, visitors of all ages will be delighted to see a variety of interesting vehicles, including Jeep Renegades, assorted boats and massive tow trucks meant for towing tractor trailers, according to Metzgar.

And everywhere in between these stops will be interesting vendors for food or other goods to purchase and make your day complete. However, Metzgar admitted there may not be as many vendors as there has been in the past.

"But we're trying to change a little bit around for more local arts and crafts and not so many of the same thing," he said.

Metzgar used snowball stands as an example, saying there will not be an abundance of them along the




The photo to the right shows a glimpse of Essex Day in the late 1970s, near the time when it first began as a festival.

According to former festival organizer June Donovan, the photo shows the Middle River band - a more than 30-member concert band - performing on the main stage, which is a far cry from the rock and country bands that have filled the stage in more recent years.

The initial purpose of the festival, which was originally called Super Sunday, was to raise money for the restoration of the Ballestone-Stansbury House on Rocky Point.

In its third year, the festival's name was changed to Essex Day. And once the Ballestone restoration was complete, the main purpose shifted to showcasing the businesses along Eastern Boulevard in the heart of Essex.

No matter the purpose, though, Essex Day has always been a day for Essex residents to come out and celebrate who they are as a community.







Since 2009, Middle River rock trio The Riverdogs have been working their way around town. One of the harder working bands in the area, it's an absolute rarity that a week will go by that these guys aren't playing. And more often than not, you can find them at local establishments like Sue Island, PatRick's or Carson's Creekside, or you can take a trip down I-695 to Pasadena to catch them around there.

Besides being one of the area's best guitarists, Lester is also a quality vocalist, with a deep baritone delivery. And when you combine Lester with Clyde Allen and Annie B., the entertainment value is maximized.

So if you're looking to dance the afternoon away to some big-band stylized performances, the Doug Lester Band is the perfect act for you. For an hour and a half he and the group will transport you back a few decades with renditions that rival the original cuts.

Perhaps no artist set to perform this year has the clout that oldies legend Ronnie Dove has. The country and pop crooner has been working in the music industry for over 50 years, with 23 appearances on the U.S. Hot 100 chart - reaching as high as No. 14 with the title track off of his 1964 album Right or Wrong. On the U.S. Adult Contemporary charts, he reached as high as No. 2 with "I'll Make All Your Dreams Come True" from 1965.

Dove then went solo and signed with Diamond Records, where he stayed until the late 60's. Diamond would eventually fold, with most of their catalogue lost to the ages. Fortunately, Dove's music managed to live on. And if you needed proof of that, just hop on YouTube and see the hundreds of thousands of hits his works have collectively garnered over

Since his very first public appearance in a grade school play singing

"Away in the Manger" in his hometown of Herndon, Virginia, Ronnie heard the roar of applause and knew he was born to perform.

He later honed his vocals and musical proficiency as a four-year member of his high school glee club. After graduation,, he joined the U.S. Coast Guard and was stationed on a buoy tender off the coast of Baltimore. It was during these four years that Ronnie became a burgeoning pop performer, singing Elvis covers in local pubs on his evenings off. After his time in the Coast Guard, he formed The Belltones, and the rest, as they say, is history.

From the beautiful arpeggiated "Say You" (which ends with a breathtaking falsetto) to the joyful stomper "Happy Summer Days," Dove's set is guaranteed to keep you grinning from ear to

Ronnie Dove is set to take the stage from 2:30 - 3:20 p.m. Considering he has made appearances on "The Ed Sullivan show," "Merv Griffin" and "American Bandstand," you'll want to take in this performance even if you aren't familiar with his tunes. Ronnie Dove: 'Essex Day will be a special day for me'

Renowned crooner and inaugural entertainment hall of fame member Ronnie Dove will hold down the middle spot on the Main Stage at Essex Day this year, which he said will be "special" for him because of his familiarity with the area and its residents.

Dove, born in Virginia, was

stationed in Baltimore while serving in the U.S. Coast Guard in 1955, which was when he truly got his singing career started.

According to Dove, he visited an establishment called Elmer's in Baltimore one night and ended up getting on stage to sing a few songs with the band that was playing. That band later broke up, he said, but he stayed with them, "and I sang with them there for four years while I was in the Coast Guard."

When he left the Coast Guard, he said, he formed a group called The Beltones, working many different clubs around the city.

Then in 1963, he went to Nashville and recorded four songs, including his first hit, "Say You."

"And then we had 21 in a row after that," Dove said. "We were on the charts for six years."

He also met Elvis Presley in 1964, "which was an exciting moment for me," he said, because Presley was why he got started singing in the first place. He said he met Bobby Darren not long after that.

Soon after, Dove traveled all around the country, touring different cities and appearing in several music circuits and television shows, such as Dick Clark, Ed Sullivan, Ralph Emory and more.

However, he said he is always happy to be in and around Baltimore.

"Baltimore's been good to me," he said, noting that he has done many shows and other appearances all around the region. "The whole state of Maryland is my playground. I love it."

Aside from being in one of his favorite places, Dove said Essex Day will be "kind of a special day" for him, particularly because of the Main Stage lineup.

Dove is scheduled to follow The Doug Lester Band on the Main Stage, starting his set at approximately 2:30 p.m. And Doug Lester's father was Dove's first guitar player when they played at Elmer's in Baltimore.

"I've known [the younger Lester] since he was born," he said. "So when he turned 17, he started playing bass [guitar] for me in my band and he's been with me ever since. So he's like my other son."

Dove called Lester a great guy, great singer and a great guitar player.

"Just a marvelous, marvelous guy," he said. "He's unbelievable."

Dove is also showcased in the Maryland Entertainment Hall of Fame, which is on display at the Heritage Society of Essex and Middle River museum, located at 516 Eastern Blvd. in Essex. In fact, he was the first person inducted into that hall of fame.

He said Buddy Love actually created the MEHOF just so that Dove could be showcased in it.

Dove has appeared at Essex Day many times, the last being about three years ago, he said.

"It's always been fun; it's a special place for me," he said. "I love that part of town. It's always fun to get there and do something."

He noted that he also performed at the Dundalk Heritage Fair for 15 years in a row from 1998 - 2012, so he is intimately familiar with the area.

Dove commented that he has always enjoyed performing at Essex Day because he knows so many people in Essex and around the area.

"They're all friends," he said. "Years ago I used to have fans. Now I have friends that I have known their

children, their mothers and fathers." He added that some of those children were raised on his songs.

"It's like 'old home week,' and I enjoy it so much," he continued. "It's going to be a special day for me."

The well-known singer turned 82 years old on Sept. 7, but said he has been singing since he was 5. And he has no intention of retiring any time soon, stating that he wants to perform on his 100th birthday. He also plans to make plenty more Essex Day appearances in the meantime.

Dove noted that he also signed a deal three years ago with Real Gone Music to sell all 21 of his greatest hits on one album.

He mentioned that he discovered the better-quality master recordings of his songs in England and made a deal with RGM to make and sell the record.

"I owned the masters from when I was with Diamond [Records, Inc.], but they were all recorded in Mono."

The higher-quality masters allowed RGM to put together a superior greatest-hits record which is now for sale on Amazon. The record also comes with a book, Dove said, that tells his whole story from 1964 - 1969.

Dove was named the top singles artist, top easy listening artist and top easy listening selling artist in the 1965 Billboard Awards and won four Cashbox Awards the same year, including best singles male vocalist,

best LP male vocalist and best R&B male vocalist, according to the biography on his website.

"Today, although his good looks have matured, this veteran performer hasn't lost his voice, enthusiasm or his public appeal," the biography contends. "He still makes every lady feel that he is singing just to her."






