County attorney moves to shutter media in Hunter case

Assistant County Attorney Candace Prigge filed a Motion for Restrictive Order with the Crow Wing County Court on Friday, September 15 in the case of the State of Minnesota versus James Jesse Hunter. She is "asking the court pursuant to Minn. R. Crim. P. 25.03, to order that the parties be prohibited from discussing the case in the media through a press release, interviews or other disseminations of information to the public that is from the attorneys, their office staff or anyone involved in the investigation."

The request came after Hunter's Attorney Edward Shaw misstated in an article published in the September 16 issue of the *NewsHopper* that, "[Crosby Lieutenant Kevin] Randolph accused members of the Crosby Police Department of taking bribes." Shaw corrected his statement after the NewsHopper had already gone to press. Shaw's revised statement said, "Randolph accused members of the Crosby Fire Department of taking bribes."

Randolph was the only witness called to testify at a Franks Hearing on September 13 at Crow Wing County Court pertaining to false information being used in obtaining search warrants in the filing of charges against former Crosby Mayor James

Prigge's motion stated, "the editor of the NewsHopper, Eric Heglund, was contacted because neither he nor anyone from his paper attended the Sept. 13, 2017 hearing. Eric Heglund was contacted and advised that the information was obtained from a press release provided by Attorney Edward Shaw. One of the allegations in the article is that Lieutenant Randolph testified that Crosby Police Officers accepted bribes. That is patently false. Eric Heglund advised that he guestioned the veracity of that information, however, Attornev Shaw did not respond to his guestions prior to press time and Heglund printed it, because they didn't have time to verify it. Other information in the article is similarly misleading as to the actual testimony and legal issues addressed at the hearing."

On Sept. 15, Police Chief Kim Coughlin made two phone calls to Heglund to ask the NewsHopper to cover both sides of the story. Coughlin claimed the story that was published was 90% inaccurate or misleading.

When Heglund asked her several times to give the other side of the story and any other comment Coughlin declined the offers; and as of press time no press release has been given to the NewsHopper by Coughlin.

In a phone interview with Edward Shaw, in response to the upcoming ruling, he said, "It seems rather one sided."

Shaw said that Randolph has been extensively quoted in the media has been on KKIN radio station, out of Aitkin, on more than one occasion.

"I've repeatedly asked the City of Crosby and the County Attorney's Office for copies of those recordings. And haven't gotten them, " said Shaw.

And he also noted there is a certain irony to the motion.

"They're asking that the defense side be silenced from talking to the media, said Shaw. "But they're the one that must have shared with the Courier their motion concerning media access. A free press, not to sound cliche', is part of a free society. Transparancy and sunshine are important. I'm not afraid

of the media looking at what I'm doing, because, I'm not afraid of public scrutiny. And if Mr. Randolph and the City of Crosby didn't have anything to hide. They wouldn't be worried at all about what the media might be saying. They're trying to have the media silenced and cover up what they're doing, instead of justifying it in an open forum of ideas. They are asking essentially for a one way street. They talk to the media, share what they're doing with the media including this latest

"They filed that motion Friday afternoon.... the ink must not have even been dry on that motion the prosecution filed before someone with the City of Crosby ran over to the Courier. What they want is they can talk to the media all they want. But the defense can't say anything. That doesn't seem particularly fair. They want to have literally hundreds of stories repeating terrible accusations against Mr. Hunter, ruining his business, his reputation and they don't want Mr. Hunter to be able to respond. I think what they're mad about is what happened at that hearing. Things that Randolph said that simply make no sense. Not talking to a key witness at a claimed assault. That doesn't make any sense at all. It's not consistent with any notion of good police work. If I'm investigating an assault Nick McCartan told Mr. Randolph in the recording of the interview. Ryan Presnell was there, he spelled out his name. No effort whatsoever to contact Mr. Presnell. I had my investigator contact Mr. Presnell. That's how we got a statement from Mr. Presnell. And Mr. Presnell's account pretty significantly disagrees with Nick McCartan's account and pretty well agrees with Mr. Hunter's account."

The judge is expected to rule on the request on Monday, Sept. 25.





Specialist with DNR says good waterfowl opener expected this weekend

Duck hunting is expected to be good when Minnesota's regular waterfowl season opens a half-hour before sunrise on Saturday, Sept. 23.

"The number of breeding ducks in Minnesota and North America has been good in recent years, so we're optimistic that will result in a good duck season," said Steve Cordts, waterfowl specialist with the Department of Natural Resources. "Wetland habitat conditions and wild rice lakes are in pretty good shape. Canada goose populations remain high as well, so there's lots of opportunity to hunt geese this fall."

Duck seasons and limits The duck season structure is similar to recent years. The waterfowl seasons are based on a federal framework that applies to all states in the Mississippi Flyway. Waterfowl hunting regulations are available wherever DNR licenses are sold and online at mndnr.gov/regulations/ hunting.

Duck season will be open for 60 days in each of the three waterfowl zones: In the north zone, duck season is Sept. 23 through Tuesday, Nov. 21.

In the central zone, duck season is Sept. 23 through Sunday, Oct. 1, closes for five days, then reopens Saturday, Oct. 7, and runs through Sunday, Nov. 26.

In the south zone, duck season is Sept. 23 through

Oct. 1, closes for 12 days, then reopens Saturday, Oct. 14, and runs through Sunday, Dec. 3.

The daily duck bag limit remains six per day. The mallard bag limit remains four per day, including no more than two hen mallards. The daily bag limits are three for wood duck and scaup; and two for redheads, canvasbacks and black ducks and will reopen in conjunction one for pintails.

The DNR will post a weekly waterfowl migration report each week during the duck season. The reports are typically posted on Thursday afternoon at mndnr.gov/ hunting/waterfowl.

Goose and sandhill crane seasons

Minnesota's goose season

with the duck season statewide on Sept. 23, with a bag limit of three dark geese per day the entire season. "Dark" geese include Canada geese, white-fronted geese and brant. The daily bag limit for light geese is 20. "Light geese" include snow, blue and Ross's geese. Goose season will be closed in the

central and south duck zones when duck season is closed.

The season for sandhill cranes remains open through Sunday, Oct. 22 in the northwest goose and sandhill crane zone only. The daily bag limit will be one sandhill crane per day. A \$3 sandhill crane permit is required in addition to a small game hunting license.

Steps to replace aging election equipment now available

Minnesota Secretary of State Steve Simon announced that his office is now accepting grant applications to assist with the purchase of new voting equipment—the first formal step that counties, cities, towns and school districts, which need assistance, can take to replace aging election equipment.

Earlier this year, Secretary Simon's push to replace Minnesota's aging election equipment was signed into law. The legislature authorized \$7 million in grant funding to assist with the purchase of new voting equipment. It provides up to a 50

percent match for mandatory equipment, such as optical scan precinct counters, optical scan central counters, or assisted voting devices; and up to a 75 percent match for electronic rosters. The bill was authored by Rep. Tim O'Driscoll (R-Sartell) and Sen. Kiffmeyer (R-Big Lake).

The deadline for jurisdictions to submit an application for grant funds is Dec. 15, 2017 at 4:00 p.m.

"It is critical that we ensure voting equipment is up to the standards Minnesotans expect and I encourage all counties, cities, towns and school districts to consider this available resource," said Secretary Simon. "My office expects local jurisdictions to request more than \$7 million in grant funding available, which is why I will continue to work with the legislature to address this pressing need and ensure voting equipment works properly and consistently in precincts all around the state."

Grant amounts will be determined based on the number of precincts used for the November 2016 State General Election (4,120 precincts statewide). The Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State determined that the

maximum possible grant that could be awarded would be \$5,000 per precinct. If the applications submitted exceed the \$7 million allocated by the legislature, which the Office believes is likely, this amount will be proportionally reduced. At a minimum, if every county applied, the awarded grant would be \$1,699 per precinct.

Important Dates for the Grant Application:

Dec. 15, 2017: Applications must be received by the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State by 4 p.m.

Jan. 31, 2018: Grants will be awarded with across the board reductions if requests exceed the funds available

Feb. - March 2018: Grant contracts signed and returned, funds provided to jurisdictions

Feb. 2018 – Aug. 2019: Equipment purchased

Aug. 31, 2019: Unused funds must be returned to Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State

Sept. – Dec. 2019: Possible second round of grants from unused/returned funds June 30, 2020: Unused

second round funds must be returned to Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State




