ROCKIN' ON THE RIVER gets set for fifth installment



The fifth installment of Rockin' on the River is set to take place on Sunday, June 5 at noon. This year's addition features three Rockin' on the River mainstays with Kanye Twitty, Strait Shooter and The New Romance, as well as newcomer Awaken.

Five years ago Rockin' on the River was formed as a way for east side residents to enjoy some good music while hanging out on the water with members of the community. Don Crockett, co-chairman of Rockin' on the River, never expected it to become as popular as it is.

"When we started a few years ago, it was just a way to have some fun and bring a little joy to the community," said Crockett. "Now it's a staple. It's one of the biggest outdoor events in the state and it gets better each year."

Crockett's plan to bring joy to the community was two-fold. Yes, there

would be a day of music and revelry which would certainly bring joy. But Crockett and co-chair Mark Sullivan decided not to keep any of the proceeds, opting to team up with the Marine Trades Association to provide scholarship opportunities, as well as fireworks for the Middle River 4th of July celebration.

Five years later, things are a bit different, but the way they operate is still the same. Nowadays, Rob Baier of Starleigh Entertainment and Kanye Twitty co-chairs the event with Crockett. And this year Crockett and Baier decided to team up with Sam Weaver and the Back River Restoration Committee (BRRC),

with half of the proceeds from the event going straight to the BRRC. The other half will be distributed to other non-profits around the area.

"A lot of the money is going to go towards the crew, towards students, to actually go out and work in the environment this year and collect trash," said Weaver. "We collected 112,000 pounds of trash below the boom last year, and this year we're looking to triple that."

Weaver said they predominantly hire environmental students from the area so they can use what they've learned in class in the real world.

County Council could see public housing discrimination bill in June

A bill to prevent landlords from denying prospective tenants based on their use of Housing Choice Vouchers (HCVs) - commonly known as Section 8 - could be introduced to the Baltimore County Council for consideration next month.

Advocates of the measure have a "strong suspicion" that the legislation will be introduced near the beginning of June, according to Matt Hill from the Public Justice Center who spoke on the issue at the Wednesday, May 4, meeting of the Essex-Middle River Civic Council.

The principle goal of the bill would be to add a "source of income" provision to the county's current fair housing law whereby landlords could not refuse to rent to someone simply because they are paying with an HCV. Advocates hope the measure will lead to increased housing mobility and opportunity for the economically disadvantaged and decreased segregation in public housing.

"[Source-of-income discrimination] is a major problem," Hill said. "It's one of the reasons why voucher holders are still concentrated in certain areas of the county."

He said the anticipated legislation would add voucher holders to the protected classes in housing.

"Just like a landlord can't [discriminate based on race, gender, disabilities, etc.], they can't just hang a sign on the door that says, 'I'm not gonna take vouchers.'"

Hill pointed to a survey of one landlord in particular, Morgan Properties,

which accepts HCVs at its properties in Rosedale and Middle River, but not at the ones in Towson or Loch Raven.

"That's perfectly legal right now," he said. "They basically have a sign on the door that says, 'vouchers need not apply.'"

Hill noted that landlords could still do all of their normal screenings such as criminal or rental history.

"They can deny the voucher if they want to," he said. "But it can't be just because it's a voucher."

The issue comes about as the result of a deal reached between Baltimore County and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) following a complaint filed in November 2011 by the Baltimore County Branch of the NAACP, Baltimore Neighborhoods, Inc., and three individuals.

The complaint alleged that the county had not developed affordable housing in areas other than those that were concentrated by race and poverty, that it focused only on providing rental housing for seniors rather than families and that adequate numbers of accessible units were unavailable to people with disabilities.

The agreement, announced in March, requires the county to spend \$30 million over the next 10 years to entice developers to build or rehabilitate 1,000 affordable housing units that are "geographically dispersed in neighborhoods that provide access to opportunity;" provide HCVs to 2,000 families to increase access to

affordable housing across the county; market the units to tenants "who are least likely to apply," such as African Americans and those with a disabled family member; and seek the enactment of the source-of-income legislation. The county must also pay \$150,000 in monetary relief to the three individual claimants.

As part of the settlement, HUD agreed that there is too much subsidized housing in areas like Dundalk, Essex and Middle River. And in order to meet these requirements, Hill said, the county will institute targeted programs to incentivize movement of voucher holders from areas where they are currently concentrated to "opportunity areas" such as Perry Hall, Towson, Timonium and Lutherville.

Through the programs, residents could receive counseling to find areas with better schools and employment opportunities, security deposit assistance, moving assistance and vouchers to pay up to \$1,450 in rent for a two-bedroom residence. And these benefits would only be available in the opportunity areas.

Therefore, while there is no guarantee or mandate for people to move, the county would use these incentives to try to persuade voucher holders to spread out, Hill explained.

Currently, the majority of the roughly 6,000 HCVs in the county are concentrated in areas like Dundalk, Essex, Middle River, Rosedale and Woodlawn on the west side. And Hill compared Council Districts 6 and 7 on the east side, which have 1,347 and 1,732 HCVs, respectively,

to District 3 in the northern part of the county, which has only 14 total.

Based on population, these numbers indicate that District 6 has 149 percent of its "fair share" of Section 8 vouchers and District 7 has 165 percent, while District 3 only has 2 percent, according to Hill.

Yet, based on research done by the Public Justice Center, District 3 has "plenty" of apartments where voucher holders could live - 628 priced less than \$1,000 per month and 2,702 priced over \$1,000.

"So, certainly folks can move to Cockeysville or Timonium if there was some help, if landlords would actually take vouchers in those neighborhoods. It could work," Hill said.

Hill's purpose in speaking to the EM-RCC was to convince its membership of the effort's merits and to ask them to reach out to the County Council members, specifically Cathy Bevins.

Bevins (D - District 6) has not taken a position on the issue, not just because the bill has not yet been submitted, but also for "practical reasons," according to her aide, Dennis Teegardin.

"She's skeptical about if this law itself will actually move people," he said, adding that Bevins realizes that apartment prices in Essex and Middle River are a lot lower than in Timonium, Hunt Valley, Cockeysville and other such areas. Therefore, voucher holders might opt to stay, even with higher voucher ceilings.

County Executive Kevin Kamenetz believes this plan will spread the vouchers

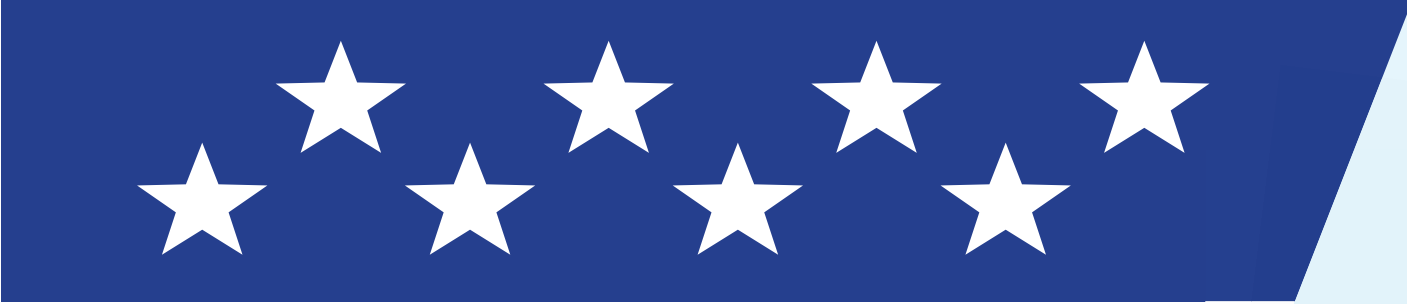

New playground at Eastwood Park dedicated to Bob Nozeika

A bright sky hung over Dundalk on Saturday morning, May 7 as a new playground at Dunnie Field, located in Eastwood Park, was dedicated to longtime community volunteer Bob Nozeika.

Nozeika was a beloved Eastwood resident who played a big role in the shaping of the Eastwood and then the Berkshire/Eastwood Recreation Council. The playground was named after him at the community's suggestion.

"My dad did a lot of great work for this community," said a very emotional Rob Nozeika, Bob's son. "He lived in Eastwood for 47 years and ran a lot of programs. He helped out a lot of people and he wasn't one to pat himself on the back. He wasn't in it for

the recognition."

Rob, who heads up the Berkshire/Eastwood Recreation Council, stated that his dad learned what he knew from Harold Dunn. According to Rob, Bob was always busy with lining or spraying the fields down, opening up the school for different programs and more.

"Kids learn and grow through play, and we are delighted to provide this playground to the Eastwood community for families to enjoy," said County Executive Kevin Kamenetz. "This playground is a special place named for a very special person. For four decades, Mr. Bob Nozeika was an energetic, positive life force in this community and he made a lasting difference

in the lives of generations of Eastwood residents."

The playground to honor Nozeika cost approximately \$82,000 to construct. It consists of a KidBuilders play structure with two slides, multiple types of climbers, talk tubes, and a transfer station for accessibility, a swing set and park benches.

"This is a long time coming," said Councilman Todd Crandell. "I was just reflecting this morning about how it's really a rare occasion where you can dedicate a playground, or a building or a field to just regular citizens who throughout their lives have done the right thing and given back."

The playground is located next to 400 Simmons Avenue in Dundalk.

out around the county. But Bevins told a group of Rosedale residents on April 21 that she feels she could ultimately have even more vouchers in areas of her district since there is more affordable housing available.

"There are areas that our housing is lower and the land is cheaper and they can build these types of things," she explained. "So for me, I'm kind of thinking that that could happen - instead of getting it more spread out over the county, maybe I get more of it."

But Hill believes that with Bevins' vote, the measure will pass when it is submitted to the Council.

"I think we've got three other votes, she'll be the fourth," he said. "If we don't get her vote, we're not going to pass the bill."

He posited that Third District Councilman Wade Kach would not vote for the bill since it could spread higher concentrations of voucher holders into his district. And Fifth District Councilman David Marks, who represents Perry Hall and Towson, has indicated that he would not support the measure either since his district could potentially see many

new vouchers relocate there.

"In some ways it's up to you and it's up to Councilwoman Bevins," Hill told the EMRCC membership. "Quite frankly, without this source-of-income law, I don't think [the county is] going to be successful" in placing 2,000 voucher holders in the opportunity areas while landlords there can still simply deny the voucher.

Councilman Marks first approached the issue from a land-use perspective in 2013 when writing to then-HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan to protest the department's proposed "Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing" rule. He opposed that action stating in his letter that it "runs counter to decades of policy in the United States where land use decisions have been made by cities and counties.

"I do not support giving federal regulators sweeping power to dismantle local zoning so communities have what the federal government considers the right mix of economic, racial and ethnic diversity," he wrote.

Speaking about the proposed law change which will eventually come before the council, Marks told the *East County Times*, "Simply spreading poverty around the suburbs is not the answer.

"It is an overly simplistic approach,"

he said, "one that destabilizes neighborhoods without solving the real problem, which is to find jobs for those people who want employment."

Marks, who during his time as councilman has used the quadrennial rezoning process in the county to try to lighten the load residential housing growth in general has placed on his district, feels there may be ways to meet the federal requirements without having to construct new housing. One such way, he said, would be to renovate existing units where there are already a lot of low-income residents.

"Now that Baltimore County has been faced with this lawsuit, I will evaluate each proposal on a case-by-case basis," he said. "I don't oppose renovating existing apartment complexes to improve the quality of life for residents, and I certainly support training, education and employment for those who want to escape poverty."

Following Hill's presentation to the EMRCC, the group's president, Bob

Bendler, described it as a rare opportunity to hear about legislation and research it before it is even submitted. And he urged the membership to take the information back to their communities for feedback.

"If this is the right thing to do, we want to support it," Bendler said. "If it's not the right thing to do, we're going to fight it. If it's something in between, then we're going to work with whoever to modify it to make sure that it meets our desires."

Under the terms of the settlement, Kamenez has 180 days to submit a bill to the Council. And if the bill is submitted in June, the issue could be over with by sometime in July since a bill has 40 days to pass or it dies.

"We had some kids last year, I taught them how to run a boat and they were picking up trash and they learned to deal with politicians," said Weaver. "It

benefits them because they get a hands-on opportunity and they learn a lot that they don't teach in school."

Crockett and Baier decided to fully team up with the BRRC after dropping off a check last summer. Baier saw the amount

of garbage removed from the water and was incredibly moved by the effort the group puts in. That day Crockett and Baier decided that the BRRC was perfect.

Besides a new recipient for donations, Rockin' on the River will feature a new band this year with Awaken. Awaken has been on the scene for two decades, and they have a strong fan base on the east side.

"These guys are some of the best musicians you'll see, they're just great performers," said Baier.

Awaken plays plenty of regular fan favorites like "Don't Stop Believing" and "Jessie's Girl," but they also manage to work in more difficult songs like Rush's "Tom Sawyer."

"We're all over the place," said Awaken vocalist Scott Wilson. "We were pretty heavy in the beginning, so heavy that places wouldn't give us a look. When we decided to go with a variety type of look, that's when things started taking off for us. You can please the masses that way. We still have the people that followed us when we were heavier, but now we've pulled in more."

And if you needed proof they pulled in more fans, just check the River Watch restaurant any time they play, as a packed house is always guaranteed.

Despite some of the differences, there are plenty of similarities to past installments of Rockin' on the River. For starters, it will be hosted at the beautiful Conrad's

Ruth Villa in Middle River, which Crockett often refers to as a "little slice of heaven." Located on a 15-acre peninsula on Edwards Lane, Conrad's is surrounded by Frog Mortar Creek, with the property providing land and sea access.

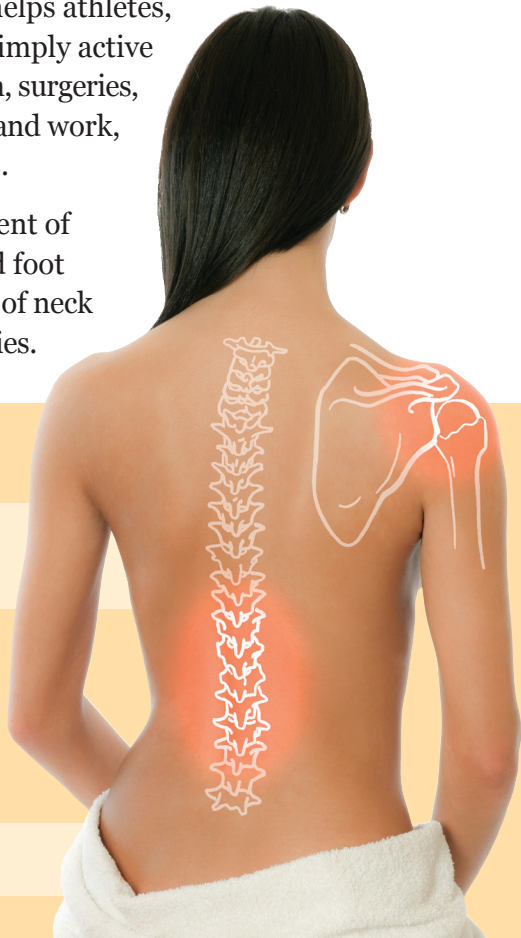

Tradepoint Atlantic gifts \$100,000 check for Sparrows Point turf field

Last Wednesday, the Sparrows Point boys took on Kenwood in what was supposed to be a meaningful game with title implications. Kenwood slipped in their two games leading up to Sparrows Point, so the contest didn't have quite the gravitas that it could have. However, something more important took place before the game - Sparrows Point was gifted a \$100,000 donation from Tradepoint Atlantic to help build a new turf field.

The donation was actually first announced at an open house hosted by Tradepoint Atlantic on April 27, with the presentation taking place last week.

Tradepoint executives, including CEO Michael Moore, VP of Operations Aaron Tomarchio and General Counsel Mike Pedone, were joined by Sparrows Point High School principal Emily Caster, Councilman Todd Crandell and about a dozen Sparrows Point alumni that are currently employed by Tradepoint Atlantic.

"This was a collaborative effort" said Crandell. "Both the project itself and the large, generous donation from Tradepoint Atlantic."

Crandell went on to thank the group for not just the funding for the field, but for "this general sense of new optimism that we have on the North

Point Peninsula and in the surrounding community."

Moore explained that the donation wouldn't have happened without the efforts of Crandell. According to Moore, Crandell repeatedly brought the project to the attention of the Tradepoint executives, and they decided to act.

Moore went on to stress the importance of Sparrows Point High School, as about 10 percent of their workforce are alumni from the high school.

"This was truly a group effort, a community effort," said Caster. "The students are incredibly excited. I've been asked no less than two hundred times about when the field is going to open."

While a timeline has not been set for the building of the turf field, Caster stated that she hoped to be back in a matter of months to unveil the new field.

A few weeks back, Crandell was at a ribbon cutting and remarked the importance of regular people and smaller businesses working to make the community better due to a lack of large donors in the area. The Tradepoint donation is a reminder, however, that Sparrows Point is on the cusp of something big.

"The future looks bright, and when

you have a company with an investor that is not only redeveloping the site but also taking an interest in the community, that's great," said Crandell. "They really saw this turf project as an opportunity to impact thousands of kids and families, and once we educated them on the real need here they came through. It's just one more indication that this area is on the rise."

The field will also get plenty of use from the Edgemere-Sparrows Point (ESP) Recreation Council, which thousands participate in each year.

According to Crandell, this wasn't just something that the community wanted, it was something that they desperately needed.

"It wasn't like Sparrows Point High School and the ESP rec council were saying that they wanted one because everyone else had one, they had a real need. There's a lot of pressure on the fields down there with a very successful recreation program and student athletes using the fields, and they just can't take it," Crandell said.

Skip Hammond from the ESP Recreation Council was on hand for the presentation as well, and he thanked Tradepoint for the "lifetime benefit" of a turf field.

And of course, the Tradepoint executives present didn't leave empty handed, with Caster providing each with some Sparrows Point High School gear.

The Knights will take on Bel Air on Friday afternoon.

In the 3A North bracket, Patapsco took home the top seed and earned a first round bye. The Patriots will take on the winner of North Harford and Edgewood. Patapsco has looked loaded in all facets of the game this season and they'll be looking to keep their winning streak going. Also in the 3A North bracket, Eastern Tech was given a seven seed and will take on Rising Sun in the first round.

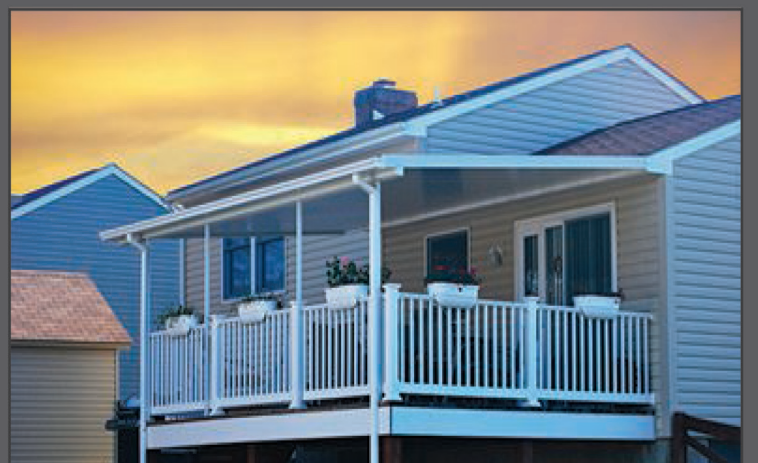

Bird River Watershed Water Quality

The Chesapeake Bay Foundation is asking for names of volunteers interested in participating in the effort to determine bacteria levels of the waters within the Bird River watershed.

At this time, 12 families have generously stepped forward to assist.

We are in need of families who are willing to acquire water samples from tributaries, such as White Marsh Run, Honeygo Run and Windlass Run, as well as from the Bird River at Harewood, Twin Rivers and Railroad Creek.

This project will take place between Memorial Day and Labor Day. Samples are to be collected immediately after a rain event of a half-inch or more, then taken to the lab in Dundalk within 24 hours. It is predicted that this will occur six to 10 times throughout the summer.

Bacteria from runoff is highest after each significant rainfall. Data collected will provide us with important information that tells us where the highest levels of bacteria are originating and hopes of possible actions to reduce those levels.

We are attempting to organize groups

of families for specific locations throughout the watershed. A location coordinator will direct an available volunteer to gather a sample and/or take the sample to a designated driver. A volunteer driver will take all the samples to the lab.

This may sound slightly complicated, but will be very easy if we have an abundance of volunteers checking in with an area coordinator. A larger number of volunteers will lighten the task for a few and broaden our survey areas.

Mr. Tom Zolper, with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, will meet with us to provide sample bottles and directions for the project. What another great opportunity to directly involve the kids to learn about the water quality in their local streams and river! Student Services Learning hours will be available.

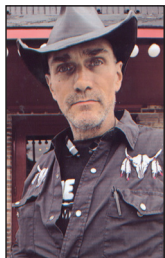

MSP reminder regarding window tint regulations

The State of Maryland regulates post manufacture window tint film on all motor vehicles registered in the State. These regulations state that windows can have post manufacture window tint film added to allow 35 percent light transmittance (amount of light going through glass) and indicates the types of vehicles and the locations that tint is permitted.

Passenger cars: All windows on these vehicles are regulated and have to meet the 35 percent light transmittance requirement. The brake light in the back window cannot be covered by tint.

Trucks, vans, SUVs: The only windows regulated on these type of vehicles are the windows immediately left and right of driver. These two windows are the only ones that have to meet the 35 percent light transmittance requirement.

Windshields: Post manufacture window film can not be placed on the front windshield below the AS1 mark or five inches down horizontally from the top of the windshield whichever is less.

Colors of tint: COMAR (11.14.02.14.D.1) Prohibits red, yellow, amber and reflective (mirrored) post manufacture window tint film.

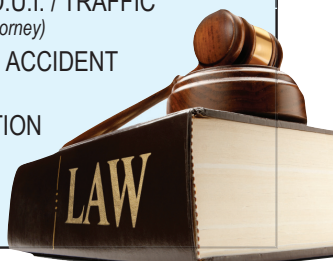

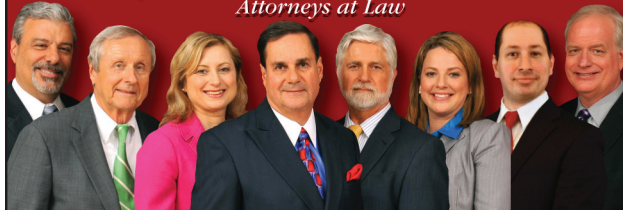

New 'CAPTAIN AMERICA' is a super super-hero flick

"Captain America: Civil War" is basically two-plus hours of Marvel telling "Batman Vs. Superman: Dawn of Justice" over and over again: "This is how you do a comic book movie! This is how you do a superhero mash-up!" It's absurd how much co-directors Joe and Anthony Russo get right in this film. It's absurd how many characters and plot points screenwriters Christopher Markus and Stephen McFeely jam into the movie without it feeling bloated. This is all of the fruits of nine or 10 films' worth of labor coming together in one glorious big-screen entertainment. The table setting has all been done. This is the meal, folks. Savor it!

Yes, it's a Captain America film. Chris Evans' Cap is front and center and THE main character here. But it's basically "Avengers 3," folks. Let's just be honest

about that. There's no Thor or Hulk. My guess is, when the battle royale comes down in this flick between all of the heroes, the Powers That Be realized that Thor and Dr. Banner's monstrous alter ego would lay down some seriously violent smack on characters that would not be fun to see.

So, instead, they have Ant-Man (Paul Rudd) reversing his super-power and becoming the size of a skyscraper and fighting. They have Spider-Man (Tom Holland) using a technique from "an old 'Star Wars' movie" (the kid's words) to try and bring him down. They have Black Widow (Scarlett Johansson) trading blows with Hawkeye (Jeremy Renner) and each asking the other while sparring, "Can we still be friends after this?!" And it all takes place in the sunny daytime at an evacuated airport in Germany.

So, it's not Batman fashioning a kryptonite spear in a dingy old building during a Gotham City rainstorm and trying to stab Superman to death. The characters aren't trying to murder one another. In fact, there is an actual objective amid the battle royale. The Avengers have basically been split in half by a United Nations



resolution requiring them to fall under international jurisdiction and petition for approval anytime they want to launch an attack - whether defensive or offensive - against an enemy threat.

Iron Man (Robert Downey Jr.) has seen enough planetary destruction and is tired of cleaning the blood of collateral damage off his hands. He rallies such heroes as War Machine (Don Cheadle), Black Widow and The Vision (Paul Bettany) to his side. Cap has seen bureaucracy become corrupted. What happens if the Avengers are ordered to attack a target they think is wrong? What happens if they are ordered to stand down when they know people will be harmed by their inaction? He rallies the Falcon (Anthony Mackie), Ant-Man and the Scarlet Witch (Elizabeth Olsen) to his side.

At the airport, Cap and his longtime friend Bucky a.k.a. the Winter Soldier (Sebastian Stan) are trying to get to the Avengers jet to go and handle a bigger threat they believe to be emerging elsewhere. But Iron Man and the others have orders to stop them and bring the Winter Soldier to justice for his suspected role in a terrorist bombing. As Cap and Bucky sprint their way to the plane, the heroes battle around, above and alongside them. It's about 15 minutes of pure superhero movie bliss that is worth the price of admission alone.

The fact that so much of what precedes this massive sequence and what follows also holds interest is a minor miracle. At all times, you have the central dilemma between the Marvel movie universe's two biggest players, Iron Man and Captain America. It's legitimately emotional when these two find themselves on different sides and can't bridge the gap.

I won't go into too much detail about the real villain behind it all. It's actually the weakest part of the movie. But that's just nitpicking. "Captain America: Civil War" is summer-movie mythmaking on a very high level. Make mine Marvel indeed!

"Captain America: Civil War" is rated PG-13 for extended sequences of violence, action and mayhem and some language.

Radiohead strike a chord with "A MOON SHAPED POOL"

Few bands have been as consistently good and as forward thinking as Radiohead. The owned radio play with their debut single "Creep," they put the definitive statement on 90's alternative rock (1997's *OK Computer*), changed the direction of rock and electronica (2000's *Kid A*) and proved that the use of strings in rock doesn't need to be completely saccharine (2007's *In Rainbows*).

Their newest album, *A Moon Shaped Pool (AMSP)*, is rather grounded but still sees them doing things most bands choose not to. In the past the band has used orchestral sound to add layers or another dimension. Here, the strings are at the forefront thanks to guitarist Jonny Greenwood, who has spent time outside of the band scoring P.T. Anderson films such as "There Will Be Blood," "The Master" and "Inherent Vice." On *AMSP* Greenwood barely picks up a guitar, but the virtuoso's instrument of choice is hardly needed as the songs are primarily built on Greenwood's orchestral compositions.

As such, the whole album has a very cinematic feel to it. There are still electronic glitches and tape hiss, but almost every song is reliant on Greenwood's ability to craft stirring swells, tonal shifts and anxiety-inducing plucks (like on the album's first single "Burn The Witch").

Fans of the band will recognize many of these songs, with seven of the 11 tracks surfacing at some point over the last decade, predominantly in live performances. The albums closer, the heart-wrenching "True Love Waits," has been performed since 1995. It was actually released as a live track on an EP in 2001, but it finally has a proper studio recording that's absolutely stirring.

While Radiohead albums tend to have very overt statements about technological advances, climate change, politics and everything else that could make one anxious about the future, this one is relatively subdued. There are a few warnings about groupthink and a call to rally around environmental change, but most of this album deals with love and loss.

It may have seemed like Radiohead were winding down with their last album, the middling *King of Limbs*, but this new release shows they still have what it takes to put out mind-blowingly strong work. This album is absolutely an instant classic, and could very well be the defining album of the 2010's. Considering that this band has owned the previous two decades, this isn't much of a surprise.

A slate of upcoming films to Marvel at

With this past weekend's blockbuster success of "Captain America: Civil War," Marvel and Disney are well-positioned for the future. The nine or 10 films that came before it certainly set the table for this latest thrilling adventure. But, remarkably, "Civil War" sets the table for several films to come in the "Marvel Cinematic Universe" as it has come to be called.

Here's what's on the way in the next few years (with a few minor spoilers for those of you who have yet to see the new "Captain America"):

"Doctor Strange" - It probably would have been better to get a new "Iron Man" or "Ant-Man" movie into theaters next. But the next big Marvel flick will do some universe expanding with Benedict Cumberbatch playing the title role of a brilliant, but disgraced surgeon. He comes under the tutelage of a sorcerer (Tilda Swinton), who teaches him mystical powers. There don't appear to be any crossover characters like Cap, Iron Man or Black Widow in this one. And who knows if the events of "Civil War" or any of the other films will be referenced? Still, the supporting cast of Rachel McAdams, Chiwetel Ejiofor, and Mads Mikkelsen promises this to be a very well-acted film. (Nov. 7)

"Spider-Man: Homecoming" - This will really be the first film to take off from the events of "Captain America 3." First of all, I'm really glad we're not getting another origin story for this character. "Civil War" clearly takes place several months after the radioactive spider bit Peter Parker (Tom Holland). Second, Marvel/Disney finally has the property away from Sony. Spidey was more than a cameo in the new film. He had a really meaty part that had him establishing a great rapport with Iron Man/Tony Stark. "Homecoming" WILL have Robery Downey Jr. in a supporting role AND Marisa Tomei will be continuing as the hottest Aunt May yet. (July 7, 2017)

"Thor: Ragnarok" - I confess. I'm really not a comic-book nerd. I'm a "Star Wars" nerd. I have no idea who or what "Ragnarok" is. Sounds either like a Scooby-Doo word to me or maybe someplace John Denver used to play his folk music live. But I do know this film will feature the two characters NOT featured in "Civil War"... Thor and Hulk. So, I'm there! (Nov. 3, 2017)

"Black Panther" - As good as Spidey's introduction in "Civil War" was, Black Panther's was better. He had an actual character arc in the film, and his decision late regarding whether or not to take revenge gave the third "Captain America" some surprising dramatic punch. Chadwick Boseman hit it out of the park as this character. I can't wait to see what the director of "Creed" does with him. (Feb. 16, 2018)



"The Avengers: Infinity War Part I" - Word has it that "Civil War" co-directors Anthony and Joe Russo will be changing the title or dropping the "Part I" altogether, as they insist they are making two standalone films that are going to be shot back-to-back. We'll see. It'll just be good to get another giant mash-up in two years' time as Earth's mightiest heroes face an even greater threat. (May 4, 2018)

"Ant-Man and the Wasp" - I really enjoyed the first "Ant-Man" movie, and the character's appearance in "Civil War" is easily one of its highlights. Paul Rudd brings a lightness to the Marvel Cinematic Universe that is greatly appreciated. Best of all, it looks like he's getting back co-star Evangeline Lilly and director Peyton Reed for his own personal sequel. (July 6, 2018)

"The Avengers: Infinity War Part II" - Again, this may or may not be the final title. But it'll be interesting to see if Marvel and Disney can move forward with the multiple franchises after this film with actors getting older, salaries getting bigger and so forth. It's gotta end sometime, right? Hopefully it ends with a very big bang! (May 3, 2019)

But this isn't even counting next May's cheeky-titled "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2" and a "Captain Marvel" flick in 2019. Too much? Time will tell.

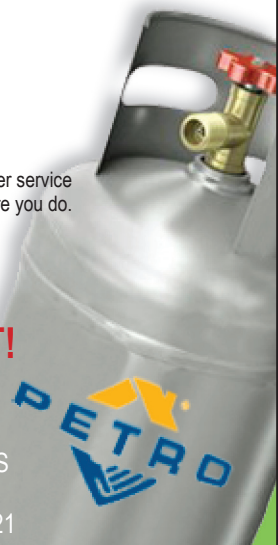
