Revealing the sweetest little secret in Laurel

 The word "secret" is defined as "something known only to a certain person or persons and purposely kept from the knowledge of others." Sometimes things unwantedly become a secret. Such is the case of Sweet Somethings Bakery and Studio Bread & Breakfast Suites owned by Joseph and Jamie Watkins and located on Central Avenue in historic downtown Laurel.

"It's amazing! More people know about us from all over the United States and the world than do right here at home," exclaimed Joseph. Jamie added, "My daughter (Natalie) just this week had someone say to her that they didn't know there was a bakery in downtown Laurel, and we've been here over a year."

In one week alone people from six different states signed the register inside the bakery. The guests in the bed and breakfast during that same week included a couple from Canada, who had ridden the train to Laurel, and Karen from Washington, D.C., who works with the *Washington Post*.

"Will say that the lodging was exceptional, exceeded all expectations, plus fresh cookies waiting after a late night of driving," wrote Karen. "I'm always delighted to support inspired

small businesses and downtown revival. Who would want to stay at a soulless chain hotel near the interstate when you can bunk in a beautifully restored large apartment in a lovely town?"

Guests taking advantage of the unique studio bed and breakfast suites will awake to the sweet aroma of baked goods rising from the bakery below. The four suites are located above the bakery and the Watkins have painstakingly kept the original characteristics of the old building, which was built in 1923, while renovating the upstairs. The characteristics of the building includes 16-foot beaded board ceilings with their original crown molding and forest green and mint color scheme; part of the walls are the original brick walls; and the flooring consists of the original red oak and pine wood floors. Light streaming in from the large windows brightens each suite, which offers a living room space with fireplace, kitchen area, and different sleeping capacities. The Blue Room has one queen bed and will sleep two people. The Central Avenue Overlook Room has two queen beds and two bunk beds and sleeps approximately six people; however, more have been known to snuggle into this room. The Steeple View Room has two queen beds and sleeps at least four. It has access to a large deck on the back of the building,

and the First United Methodist Church steeple in downtown Laurel can be seen from the deck and large living room area. At certain times of the day the sound of the church bells ringing can be heard echoing through the downtown area. The fourth suite is called the Family Getaway and is not usually available for rent.

"We wanted a place where if the girls wanted to come help in the bakery, the grandkids would have a place to hang out," said Jamie. In addition, Jamie and Joseph spend a good amount of time there themselves. They have a large family which includes four sons, three daughters, and eight grandchildren with a ninth grandchild on its way.

Jamie and Joseph said they didn't set out to own a bed and breakfast. For 16 years, Jamie worked out of a 10-foot by 14-foot building next to her house in Ellisville. "It was Jay, Heather, Bridget, me and Natalie working in that little building during King Cake season," said Jamie laughing. "We were bumping booties and bellies. All of us were working around one little table." They made the King Cakes and Joseph delivered them. The King Cakes could be found in Carol's Produce in Ellisville, all of the Keith's Superstores, and as far south as Purvis. "For

six years, during King Cake season, my Friday, Saturday, and Sundays were spent doing deliveries,” exclaimed Joseph. He works during the day as a facility plant manager and engineer with Howard Industries at the Delphi facility in Laurel and said as soon as he got off from work on Friday, he was on the road making deliveries.

But Jamie wanted a larger place and wanted to hire some help, so she could “slow down.” Well that didn’t quite happen. The slowing down part that is.

“The Lord moves in mysterious ways,” said Joseph. He explained that they had spent two years looking for a place in nearby Ellisville but, “it just wouldn’t come together. Then one day, we were standing in the yard and Jamie said, ‘I think I want to be in Laurel.’ After she said that she got a big old smile on her face and said, ‘Something is calling me there.’”

The couple started looking at buildings in the downtown area and it didn’t take long to find their building, which was built in 1923 and was originally a grocery store named Ross the Grocer. Throughout the years it has served several different functions. When they bought the building, it had been vacant for several years.

In their search for a building they met Ben and Erin Napier and became good friends with them. “We met Ben and Erin before they started the ‘Hometown’ show with HGTV,” said Joseph. “This (the bakery) was like a project for all of us. Erin helped design the front, Jamie did the inside, Ben built the bread table and the product display shelves, and I did the outside. All Ben wanted was a lifetime supply of sticky buns.”

Jamie said she and Erin talked about what Jamie wanted: “I told her I wanted two big windows on each side of a big center door,” remembered Jamie. “I said I wanted people to be able to see all the way through the bakery.” A few weeks passed by and one day Joseph received a text from Erin with a rough pencil drawing attached and the words, “Here she is.”

“It was exactly what I wanted,” exclaimed Jamie. Joseph then took her drawing, scaled it out, and built the front of the bakery exactly the way Erin drew it.

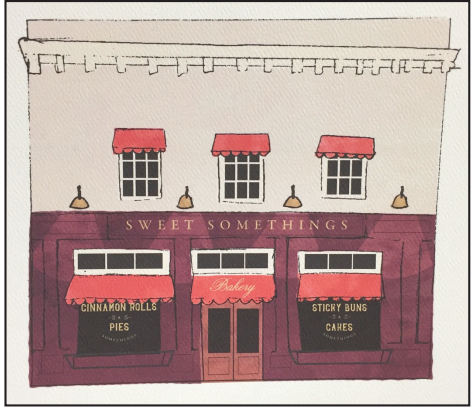
Joseph did the same thing to the studio bed and breakfast suites, except this time they sought the help of a young architect, Bill Holloway, who had recently moved back to Laurel. Just like with Erin, Jamie told Bill what she wanted and he drew it up. “I told him I wanted it to be light, open and airy, and I wanted the ceilings to shine when you walked in,” said Jamie. When she saw Bill’s rendering, she saw what she had imagined. “It’s the most amazing thing. I said how did he do that? How did he know what I had in my mind? It’s just amazing.”

“We tore out some perfectly good office space,” said Joseph, “but we did it with an idea in mind and good intentions. The original footprint remains, but it’s not nearly the same.”

As mentioned before, the original brick walls can be seen along with a couple of large cracks running up and down the wall. The same type cracks can be seen in many of the downtown buildings; they can be linked to an incident that happened in Laurel at 4:15 a.m. on January 25, 1969. According to the Transportation Research Board’s TRID Database Accident Report, Southern Railway train 154 with 15 tank cars of petroleum gas, 139 cars, four diesel-electric locomotive units, and a

caboose derailed when one car 62’s wheel broke. The derailment immediately set off a series of violent fiery explosions. Fireballs could be seen flying through the dark early morning sky as several tank cars exploded. It was reported that people in around Laurel feared the world was coming to an end. If you ask anyone that lived in Laurel or Jones County during this time where they were when the tanks exploded, they could probably tell you without hesitation.

Sweet Somethings Bakery and Bed & Breakfast is not the only building in downtown that the Watkins own. They also own the old Mel Mac Shoe Store building located next to Fred’s at the opposite end of Central Avenue from the bakery. Construction is underway for the popular Italian Restaurant Mimmo’s Ristorante & Pizzeria to come into the building. Plans are for Mimmo’s to also have a bed and breakfast above the restaurant. According to Jamie, an eight-foot water fountain with real Olive Trees from Italy surrounding it will be part of the restaurant’s inside décor.

The clippety-clop rhythmic sound of a horse’s steel shoes striking the pavement as it trots down the street pulling a beautiful white carriage behind will soon be heard and seen in the streets of downtown Laurel. Joseph said they will soon be offering one-horse carriage rides. “We’ve got the horses, but I’ve got to get Mimmo’s finished first.” Joseph said plans are for Mimmo’s to be opened by mid-October.



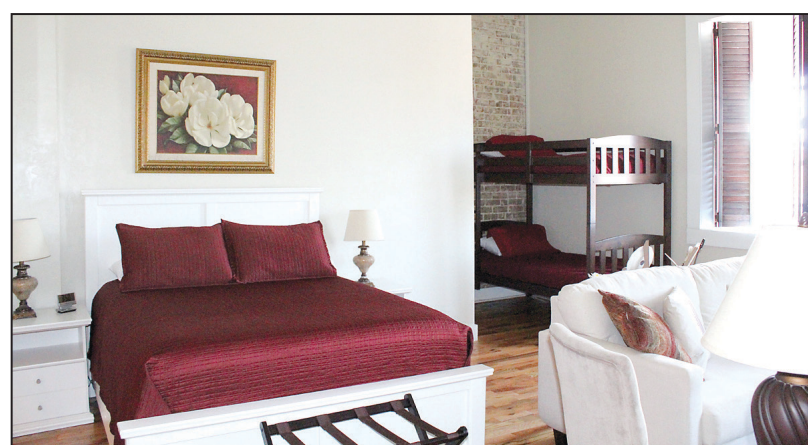
From the front window you can see all the way through the bakery into the kitchen.

Suzanne McKee-Waddell to be one of keynote speakers at ADHD and Related Concerns Conference

HATTIESBURG, MISS. – Keynote speakers have been announced for the 14th Annual ADHD and Related Concerns Conference Oct. 19-20, to be held at Temple Baptist Church in Hattiesburg, Miss. She and her husband were long-time residents of Jasper County.

The conference, hosted by Hattiesburg Clinic Connections, will feature Suzanne McKee-Waddell, MS, PhD, CCC-SLP, as Thursday's keynote speaker and Richard L. Davis, MS, PhD, CCC-SLP, as the keynote speaker on Friday.



McKee-Waddell is a literacy, math and gifted studies consultant for multiple school districts throughout Mississippi with more than 30 years of experience in various levels of education, including teaching roles in higher education. Throughout her career, McKee-Waddell has incorporated classroom strategies in content area subjects and holds Mississippi licensure in K-8 Elementary Education, Gifted K-12 and Cooperative Education.

She has also served as director of the Frances A. Karnes Center for Gifted Studies at The University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg, where she oversaw daily operations of the center's activities. McKee-Waddell is the recipient of various awards and most recently was recognized for her work by the Mississippi Alliance for Arts Community Representative Award in regard to her STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Math) community education initiatives.

Davis is president and CEO of the Arbor Scientia Group, a global medical communications company headquartered in Carlsbad, Calif. He is also an author, speaker, consultant and executive coach. Davis has developed a number of innovative education programs at Arbor Scientia, including "train-the-trainer" meetings organized as "speaker's boot camps" with intensive instruction by a team of speaker coaches and highly sought-after programs on principles of adult education; the role of personality profiles in audience psychology and speaker effectiveness; and teaching how to teach.

He has coauthored numerous articles in medical literature on many educational topics, including outcomes analyses, speaker presentation skills and how to design medical presentations. His work has most recently been published by Cambridge University Press as a book he coauthored with Stephen Stahl, "Best Practices in Medical Teaching."

McKee-Waddell will open this year's conference with a keynote session titled, "The Twice Exceptional (2E) Student: A Hidden Gem," which will explore who the "twice-exceptional child" is and offer a different perspective when it comes to children with disabilities.

"I am excited to offer my input in a cross-collaborative effort and share my educational knowledge on a personal level concerning the needs of children regarding ADHD and the intellectually gifted child," said McKee-Waddell. "Many people don't realize that an individual can be intellectually gifted and have learning disabilities. This is a combination we refer to as twice-exceptional, or 2E."

McKee-Waddell said history has shown that some of the world's greatest minds suffered from disabilities like ADHD and dyslexia. In her message, she plans to tackle negative biases that follow people with learning disabilities and emphasize the need to help these individuals develop and celebrate their talents so they can thrive with their condition.

"In 30 years of education in our state, I have witnessed the gifts and talents of our school children daily. We define children by how we manage the negative but overlook and do not sometimes take full advantage of their embedded talents and gifts."

She said she wants her message to provide hope for managing the upside of a child's mental strengths instead of focusing on the downside, while also accommodating and managing the medical side of the child's condition.

"My advocacy is in the whole child. In other words, 'being different doesn't make you bad'."

McKee-Waddell's keynote session will take place at 8:45 a.m. that Thursday.

On Friday, Davis will deliver a presentation called, "No One Ever Told Me," in which he will highlight the significance of communication skills in our lives and how important it is to understand what is necessary to be effective in our interactions with others.

His goals are to challenge attendees to think differently about how they communicate; explore what happens when communication is done right; and offer useful tools to enhance anyone's skill level.

Davis' session will kick off at 8:30 a.m. that Friday.

Other focus topics at this year's conference include dyslexia, autism spectrum disorders, behavioral strategies, the impact of the Digital Age and an update on ADHD medications, among others.

First week of Bobcat Math League sees familiar teams taking lead

Last year's leaders have started the new season of competition in the Jones County Junior College Bobcat Math League dominating their foes. As every team is rebuilding with new players this year, the 2016 BML champions, Oak Grove, and last year's 2nd place team, West Jones, managed to crush their opponents. Sacred Heart, the 2015 BML champions, showed no mercy for its first challengers by racking up a 58-point lead. The Crusaders' math coach, Rick Muli, came into the season with a cautious optimism.

"Coach Wilson and I had more than fifteen students try out this year for the JCJC Bobcat STEM competition team. We've been busy selecting a team while practicing after school. While captain Nick Gallardo and senior Sohbian Thriffiley are returning starters, we are fielding a relatively inexperienced group of students who have, however, put in a great deal of effort beginning this summer with some online work that was assigned. I am especially hopeful and pleased with the freshmen who have joined us, including yet another Gallardo, Kate. The team hopes to return to the playoffs, and advance

further than we did last year. Donna Wilson and I hope that they enjoy the competition, learn something about math, science, teamwork and sportsmanship, and we represent Sacred Heart honorably."

The Heidelberg High School Oilers proved they are fighters by tying its opponents, while perennial top team contender Northeast Jones let the Wayne County War Eagles snatch their victory away.

Also emerging this season are new Most Outstanding Players, with Presbyterian Christian's Daniel Duran-Hernandez, Wayne County's Megan Sickinger and Oak Grove's Olivia Vigerie all earning a 70 percent average accuracy rate. Eleven more mathletes tied with a 60 percent average accuracy rate during this week's match-ups.

In the Galileo Division, Sacred Heart begins the season as the division leader with its astounding 76 to 18 victory over the Collins Tigers. Wayne County fought hard to rack up 50 points with the Northeast Jones Tigers on their heels with 44 points. Next week, the War Eagles will have to soar high above the Crusaders to get another victory when they meet on the JCJC campus in a 4:30 p.m. match on Monday,

September 25. The Northeast Jones Tigers should have it a little easier next week going head-to-head with the Tigers of Collins in a "catfight."

Presbyterian Christian outscored the Wayne Academy Jaguars by 20 points, with a final 47 to 27 score. The Bobcats look to continue their long winning streak as Gates Division leaders despite having a lot of new members. Heidelberg and Laurel tied with 26 points each in their first meeting, leaving room for Wayne Academy to move up in the ranks next week, if the Jaguars can decisively overcome the Laurel Tornados. The Oilers face the division leaders, which could be a serious test of their abilities.

The Mustangs managed to maintain their winning ways from last season. Despite a new crew of mathletes, West Jones took command of the competition, trouncing the Quitman Panthers 60 to 23.

The Columbia Academy Cougars took on the Perry Central Bulldogs, with the Bulldogs only getting 21 points and leaving the Cougars in second place in the division with 38 points.

All of the Archimedes Division's teams could easily take the lead in the coming weeks,

if West Jones stumbles or the other teams learn to adjust to the competition.

The Warriors of Oak Grove proved themselves as reigning champs and Pythagoras Division leaders, with a decisive 63 to 26 victory over the South Jones Braves.

Raleigh's Lions roared past the Sylva Bay Saints, 46 to 12.

Next week, the "new" South Jones team should be more comfortable hosting the Lions on their "Reservation," while the Saints will host the Oak Grove Warriors.
