



Conversation starters and stoppers

Most of us know how to start a conversation with someone we know. For example, "Hi John, how is Mary getting along? We heard she had a knee operation for that limp that's been bugging her and we hope she's on the road to a complete recovery." Or, "Well hello Jane, haven't seen much of you since the beginning of the fall semester. The kids' schedules sure cut into one's social life, don't they?"


Conversation starters—even with strangers—aren't that difficult to initiate. For instance, you have just been introduced to the new neighbor who has moved next door. You might open a conversation as follows, "Hello Michael, and welcome to our neighborhood. We understand that your wife is a teacher in the public grade school. What does she teach?" A brief question is always a useful conversation starter, particularly for a new acquaintance. Or, taking a position on a non-controversial issue is also good, "Hi there, as your new neighbor, I sure would like your views on the neighborhood betterment movement that is going around. I have some literature that you might find of interest."

Most of those conversation starters are pretty easy to initiate. But what about a polite, but effective way to terminate a conversation that has already become either deadly boring and/or irritating? For example, a new neighbor has decided to spark up his autumn leaf raking and lawn mowing chores with a lengthy

discussion with you about politics—local and national. He has just finished a decimating review of all that your governor has recently done in the area of police control and has begun a negative analysis of the national scene, starting with President Trump.

A polite way to end that discussion would be to take it over with your own remarks like, "Well, I've never become terribly interested or involved in politics. Too many personal problems get in the way." Then return to your leaves and raking. Another tactic is to agree (to excess) with your neighbor's position so that he or she will almost have to reenter the debate in opposition to his or her original position. For example, you might argue, "Yeah, Trump is something, isn't he? A real case for impeachment." Since that is further than your neighbor wanted to go, he's likely to drop the argument entirely.

But, in the final analysis, it's simply a matter of who wants to control the discussion—either by simply letting it go in the first place, or stopping it when (if) it gets out of hand. The next time you are faced with the desire to add something to an ongoing conversation that has gotten out of hand, just remember these few tricks of the trade, ask a relevant question or challenge the speaker's own position by stealing it and stating it firmly as your own. It's surprising how well it works.



Lake 98.1 features music, local announcers

Lake 98.1 serves as Eastern Wisconsin's local adult contemporary music station.

A new member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce, Lake 98.1 calls itself the "official at-work radio station" because it is the choice of many workplaces

Sales manager Terry Stevenson said the music format of the radio station appeals primarily to adults between the ages of 35-54, featuring music from the 80s, the 90s and today.














Pumpkin Days at Henschel Farm



Presented by the Friends of the Elkhart Lake Public Library, the event will provide guests with an opportunity to learn about Watson and his novels.




Watson has earned numerous prizes and awards for his work.

Celebrated architect

Frank Lloyd Wright's 150th birthday observance continues

Wade House Historic Site will celebrate the 150th birthday of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright with season-long exhibits, lectures, and educational activities focusing on Wright's life and work in Wisconsin and his relationship with Sheboygan carriage collector and restoration expert Wesley W. Jung.

The next event in our celebration will be a presentation titled "What Taliesin Looked Like, 1911-1912" by Jack Holzhueter, Wright expert and retired Wisconsin Historical Society staff member. On Thursday, Oct.12 from 7-8:30 p.m. at the Wade House Visitor Center, Mr. Holzhueter will tell the story of the acquisition of the Taliesin albums as well as explain the significance of the photos in the albums. Mr. Holzhueter's presentation will be preceded by a complimentary reception featuring microbrews and light hors d'oeuvres, which will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Two sets of photographs survive from the brief, three-year period when Frank Lloyd Wright's first version of his home and studio, Taliesin, stood on the brow of a hill outside Spring Green, Wisconsin. One set, taken by one of his draftsmen, Taylor Woolley, appears in a photo album acquired in a famous 2005 eBay purchase. After a hectic, four-day fundraising effort, that album was bought for the Wisconsin Historical Society. The other set was taken by Wright's preferred architectural photographer out of Chicago, Henry Fuermann and Sons. A set of Fuermann's Taliesin proofsheets was bought in 2011 for the society, again after a hectic fundraising effort. In 1914, an arson fire destroyed the house and left seven persons dead, so these two groups of photographs provide the best record of Wright's initial vision for his home. Wright rebuilt Taliesin in 1914; it burned again in 1925; and he rebuilt it a final time – Taliesin III, the version that survives today.

The ninth event in our "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" monthly speaker series will take place on Saturday, Nov. 4 at 1 p.m. and will feature a representative of Kubala Washatko Architects. In their presentation, which is titled "First Unitarian Society Meeting House Addition," Kubala Washatko Architects will describe their 2008 LEED Gold addition to the Frank Lloyd Wright designed First Unitarian Society Meeting House in Madison, Wisconsin. Built in 1951, the original Meeting House has been hailed as one of the world's most innovative examples of church architecture. A Kubala Washatko representative will describe how the firm helped the congregation maintain the integrity of Wright's original design while providing more space and modern environmental technology. Besides the afternoon lecture at Wade House on Nov. 4, there will be related programming in the morning at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center, whose 1997 addition was designed by Kubala Washatko Architects.

The "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original" monthly speaker series will take place at the Wade House Visitor Center located at W7965 Hwy. 23 in Greenbush, WI, halfway between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac. Admission to "What Taliesin Looked Like, 1911-1912" on Oct. 12 is complimentary. For more information, please visit our website at wadehouse.org or call 920-526-3271.

Elkhart Lake leads county growth

Elkhart Lake led the county in increase of assessed value for commercial and manufacturing. The village added \$6,323,000, or 31% to our Commercial assessed value. We added \$4,112,700 or 59% to our manufacturing assessed value. This pace will not continue but we will see more increases as projects are fully assessed by the State.

Is TIF investment important? Ask Elkhart Lake

Sheboygan County - TIF investment is the number one tool to stimulate growth in Wisconsin. Sheboygan has done well, in part, stimulating new multi-family housing with this tool. The benefits will have a supportive impact on future retail growth.

Elkhart Lake has also used TIF to stimulate growth, and it is providing broad based results. While the Village represents about .6% of the county's population, it delivered nearly 4.0% of the new commercial construction for the past year, and over 7.8% of the cumulative new construction combining residential, commercial, and industrial.

Report reveals Sheboygan County significantly outgrowing the state

From mysheboygan.com staff September 13, 2017

Wisconsin's annual report on property tax reveals that Sheboygan County is significantly outgrowing the state.

The just-completed report revealed strong commercial and industrial growth in Sheboygan County, which added nearly \$160 million in new construction value, or a 5.4% growth rate, over one entire percentage point faster than the State of Wisconsin's growth of 4.1%. Growth across Sheboygan County was not even. Achieving the lion's share of development was:

Village of Elkhart Lake City of Sheboygan Village of Waldo Village of Oostburg City of Sheboygan Falls Town of Wilson

Village of Howards Grove

The bulk of development in Sheboygan County was commercial development, easily outgrowing many comparable areas such as Rock, Fond du Lac, and Outagamie counties. The local growth in commercial was over 30% faster than the state overall. Industrial development was 230% greater than state average, again vastly outpacing most comparable areas.

"The growth in industrial and commercial is highly encouraging. This data aligns perfectly with Sheboygan County's recent history. We have seen tremendous

job growth. Our Achilles Heel remains, that we are not building enough housing. Even with the boom in apartments and knowing what is in the development pipeline, we still expect a significant housing shortfall by 2020 worth nearly \$50,000,000 in untapped development," said Dane Checolinski, Director of the Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation (SCEDC).

Where Sheboygan County underperformed was residential development. Comparing similar data reveals residential new construction was 40% less than Wisconsin's average. Sheboygan County's new home construction value was only \$349 per capita, while communities such as Outagamie, Eau Claire and Brown built well over \$600 of new homes per capita.

Checolinski stated, "It has become a real dilemma for our area. Our employers are hiring many Americans from outside the area, but available housing is not keeping up with demand."

Winter Rules begin Nov. 15

Winter parking regulations go into effect on Nov. 15. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

PARKING REGULATIONS All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street or the parking lot on North East Street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed

Snow Removal

10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24

hour period.

Residents have 24 hours after a winter storm to remove ice and snow from their sidewalks. Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home

Yard Waste and Leaves

Yard waste, leaves/brush/garden debris etc. can be disposed of at the dumpster located at the Village garage from April through October. Dumpster hours are Wednesdays 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturdays 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.





The racers passed the start/finish line 10 times for a total distance of 33 miles. This was the first race of four races on July 23, 1950 and was for novices with cars having under 1500 cc. The picture shows a blue MG-TD, one of many MGs entered in this race and was won by Larry Whiting of Chicago in a French built Simca,

"Some reports stated there were 1,500 spectators while others said 5,000 attendees. Merchants were happy and looked forward to 1951."

About the music of the 60's. The 60's

decade produced some of the best music of all time. Countless songs from the 60's generation have been remade by others and television commercials used the recordings to sell their products. Movies such as Dirty Dancing and American Graffiti immortalized this period of our history. In the 60's rock music dominated the popular music charts. Elvis Presley continued to score hits in the early part of the decade, but the music continued to diversify with the folk revival, girl groups, and surf music, all impacting the early part of the decade. The Motown Record label brought more African American artists back to the forefront of the pop charts. By 1964 American artists are sharing the top of the charts with U.K. bands led by the Beatles and The Rolling Stones. In the U.S. garage bands emerge, inspired by the British Invasion sound. Sixties songwriting moves beyond pop love songs and begins to include social consciousness

and political statements. In the latter half of the decade psychedelic music reflects the growing hippie culture. Bubblegum music is created to generate radio friendly pop singles. Album sales begin to gain importance, as a harder rock sound emerges and sows the seeds for heavy metal.

About the Tradition of Halloween. The American Halloween tradition of "trickor-treating" probably dates back to the early All Souls' Day parades in England. During the festivities, poor citizens would beg for food and families would give them pastries called "soul cakes" in return for their promise to pray for the family's dead relatives. The distribution of soul cakes was encouraged by the church as a

> way to replace the ancient practice of leaving food and wine for roaming spirits. The practice, which was referred to as "going a-souling" was eventually taken up by children who would visit the houses in their

neighborhood and be given ale, food, and money.

The tradition of dressing in costume for Halloween has both European and Celtic roots. Hundreds of years ago, winter was an uncertain and frightening time. Food supplies often ran low and, for the many people afraid of the dark, the short days of winter were full of constant worry. On Halloween, when it was believed that ghosts came back to the earthly world, people thought that they would encounter ghosts if they left their homes. To avoid being recognized by these ghosts, people would wear masks when they left their homes after dark so that the ghosts would mistake them for fellow spirits. On Halloween, to keep ghosts away from their houses, people would place bowls of food outside their homes to appease the ghosts and prevent them from attempting to enter.


