Peterson gets 17 years in death of his five-week-old daughter

being charged John Douglas Peterson with murder.

John Douglas Peterson, 33, Palisade, pleaded guilty on July 28, 2017, to Second Degree Unintentional Murder in the death of his five-week-old daughter, Rylie. He was sentenced to 17 months in prison at a Sept. 27 hearing. Peterson had no prior criminal record. At the time of the incident,

November 18, 2016, he was married to the mother of the baby, with whom he had a long-term relationship.

According to the criminal complaint, the mother ran to the store to get ingredients



the sink. Finally, he admitted to throwing the baby, who suffered abusive head trauma and physical abuse and who died at Children's Hospital on Nov. 21 of last year.

Peterson was arrested and booked into the Aitkin County Jail. His bail was set at \$1 million without conditions or \$250,000 with conditions.

The defendant's sentencing memorandum, filed on Sept. 18, 2017, sent by his attorney Michael Brandt, Anoka, to Judge David Hermerding and Stephanie Shook, special assistant county attorney, paints a complicated picture of Peterson.

Many family members and friends, including a local pastor, addressed the court on his behalf for his sentencing on Sept. 27. Peterson was presented as a man who didn't know his own strength, who was used to dealing with heavy equipment and who did not understand how to parent his daughter.

Peterson has shown remorse for his actions, has erected a shrine for his daughter and cries alone in his room at night, according to his mother, with whom he now lives.

On the other hand, little Rylie showed other signs of abuse, including a fractured tibia (inner bone of the lower leg) and various bruises on her legs and her ear.

The memorandum sums it up thusly:

"When deciding what the

appropriate sentence should be, the question before the court is whether Mr. Peterson is a monster, a creature with no regard for the wellbeing of his most vulnerable, or a flawed human being, an ill-equipped father who, in a moment of weakness, succumbed to his baser instincts and did the unthinkable.

Defendant argues that all of the facts and circumstances lead to the conclusion that the Defendant is not a monster, but a caring, compassionate, son, friend, brother, and yes, father. "




