Mustangs hold on to division lead in BM

The majority of the 16 teams in the Jones County Junior College Bobcat Math League faced uncertainty beginning the season. Every team faced the task of finding new team members to replace graduated seniors. As a result, new leaders are emerging mid-way through the season in every division.

One of the biggest upsets in the third week of competition came in the match between the Sacred Heart Crusaders and the Presbyterian Christian Bobcats. The Crusaders blasted the Bobcats 78 to 44. Despite the blow to Presbyterian Christian, the Bobcats currently continue as Gates Division leaders because of their 155 cumulative points and the other division teams' win-loss record.

PCS is in third place overall in the BML. Galileo Division leader Sacred Heart not only leads their division but they also lead the BML in cumulative points with 240. The Oak Grove Warriors' 202 cumulative points rank them in second place in the League with Archimedes Division leader West Jones racking up 153 cumulative points for fourth place in the BML.

Tying for third place MOP honors are Weslie Blackledge of PCS and Josh Cooper of West Jones, and Remy Poirrier of Sacred Heart and Olivia Viguerie of Oak Grove are tied for fifth place in individual average accuracy rates.

Upsets in three divisions have led to three teams moving up the ranks. The Heidelberg High School Oilers' close win over the Collins Tiger team earns them the second spot in the Gates Division. Because Wayne Academy lost to county rivals, the Wayne County War Eagles, 34 to 52, the Jaguars are in third place in the Gates Division. Laurel's Tornadoes' lost to their county rival, the Northeast Jones Tigers with the exact same score as the Wayne County teams, 52 to 34.

In the Pythagoras Division, the Warriors of Oak Grove crushed the Columbia Academy Cougars, 73 to 22. The Jaguars' loss moved them down a notch to land in third place in the Gates Division. Another team upsetting the divisional ranks is the South Jones Braves. They managed to hold onto

the win in their match against the Perry Central Bulldogs, 20 to 12. Quitman's 24 to 6 victory against the Sylva Bay Saints moved them up a notch to second place in the Archimedes Division. Just like PCS, the Mustangs of West Jones managed to hold onto their division leader status, even though the Raleigh Lions and the Mustangs each earned 32 points.

Next week the teams will enjoy a week off, before starting the season's stretch run. Teams will compete again during the week of October 16, with more opportunities to climb the divisional ranks and ensure postseason play. Most notably will be West Jones and Oak Grove squaring off because

a loss could lead to a slip in division ranking. Northeast Jones could be a problem for Presbyterian Christian when they meet on Monday, October 16, because both teams are evenly matched in their win-loss records. Heidelberg seems to be on the rise but the War Eagles could put a plug on the Oilers' "gusher."

South Jones and Quitman are both basking in their rise up the ranks. The winner of that match-up could land an invitation to the playoffs. Columbia Academy's Cougars will need to be ready to prove they are worthy of a higher rank and give the Lions of Raleigh a good fight when they meet Tuesday, October 17.

Sideline View: Happy birthday to No. 4

EDITOR'S NOTE - Today, we honor one of the best on the gridiron, as we wish Brett Favre a happy birthday. Favre was born on October 10, 1969, in Gulfport, Mississippi.

Many professional football players do not give their days on the high school gridiron even a second thought, and some remember only the past glory. They remember the



day when they scored numerous touchdowns or roughed up the opposing quarterback. Then, once in a while, you have a Brett Favre. The gunslinger from Hancock North Central High School in Kiln comes from a background of hard work.

If you knew Brett's father, Irvin, you would know what I mean when I say hard work. Every time I ever saw "Big Irv," he was in a pair of coaches shorts and always smiling, evidence of the passion that drove his work ethic. "Big Irv" made Brett Favre who he was — one of the most gifted quarterbacks in the National Football League. Irvin was a strong-armed baseball pitcher for USM back in the late 1960s, but he always knew he was destined to be a high school football coach.

Brett, noted for having one of the strongest arms in NFL history, seems to have been predisposed to that same strong arm and passion for football. Watching him in his college days at Southern Mississippi,

you had little doubt that he could become a quarterback at the next level. Now, if you would have asked me back in his college days if he would attain the legendary status that he did, I would probably have been dubious. And my doubts, as things have turned out, would have been wrong, for Favre is now a resident in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, five years after his final play.

Until the time he decided to finally hang up his football cleats, he exuded the same joy that took root in his heart as a youth. Though overly zealous fathers whose sons are pawns for their own egos emotionally harm some young athletes, such was not the case for Irv and Brett.

"First of all," Favre said on a past ESPN interview, "having my dad as a

coach was fun. It also had its challenges, because he was probably harder on me than some of the other guys. He just wanted me to give 100 percent effort all the time. That's what he wanted from all of us. He expected a lot from me, and that helped me develop the work ethic I have today."

One might think that with Favre as quarterback, there couldn't have been too many tough spots. But that's certainly not how he remembers his high school career.

"It was definitely a challenge," he says. "There are many good football players at the high school level. Every team has good players, some more than others. The match-ups were fun, and we developed some great rivalries over the years.

Both of Brett's parents taught school, and indeed the football leadership skills that Brett has have came from both of them. He is quick to emphasize that it is not they who owe him a debt of gratitude. It is very much the other way around. Of his father, Favre says, "I still miss him. He was such a special part of my life and meant so much to my career."

So how, or even why, do you ask a Brett Favre to put away his childlike excitement that he brought to every football game he played? You don't. Brett is really a humble fellow and he still considers friends, teachers and coaches as important pieces to his football achievements and his appreciation for the game.

"I've been blessed to have had a successful career, and I never dreamed I'd win the Super Bowl or the MVPs, so I'm just thankful to be able to enjoy the game as much as I do."



How big was the win?

For a program that has seen two uncharacteristic seasons absent from the postseason picture, West Jones needed wins over Natchez and North Pike, teams also on the cusp of a third and fourth seed in Region 3-5A behind Brookhaven and Laurel, teams considered to claim the top two spots.

A 46-15 win over Natchez last week, and Friday night's victory against North Pike secures a much easier path to a playoff berth.

The Mustangs have four games remaining in 3-5A and need one more win - most likely against South Jones or Wingfield - to earn their first playoff berth since the 2014 season.

Turning point

On top 14-6 midway through the third quarter and deep within North Pike territory, West Jones made a play on special teams. A blocked punt by Damion Cunningham and two-yard scoop and score by Jon Micah Coleman squashed thoughts of a closer contest.

"When we played well, we played really well," said Pierson. "But when we played poorly, we played really poorly. What I like the most about our team was that they were disappointed in the times they didn't play well. That is the sign of a team you can build upon.

"We had a good drive in the third quarter and then the blocked punt. Then Coach Blackledge called the reverse, and I think that broke their backs."

The reverse handoff to senior wide-out Garrick Randolph that resulted in a 38yard touchdown three minutes after the scoop and score on specials teams pushed West Jones' lead to 20.

North Pike scored a safety and a touchdown in the final stanza to lessen the blow on the scoreboard and paper.

Running backs

Large gains on the ground from junior running back Micheal Neal and senior Austin Land set up two of West Jones' four touchdowns. Neal finished the game with 71 rushing yards and a six-yard score, while Land netted 163 yards on 23 carries and a nine-yard touchdown.

Where they go from here?

West Jones plays Laurel (4-3) at home in Soso next Friday night. North Pike travels to South Jones. Both games have 7 p.m. kickoffs.





"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil." -Ephesians 6:10-11 (ESV)

Red Devils cranking out wins in tough 4-1A

John Brown admits he's a little biased. When you compete year after year, week after week in Region 4-1A, it's hard not

"I'm biased to say that I think we have the toughest 1A region in the state," said the Stringer head football coach. "And I'm sure there's a handful of coaches not in our district that would probably agree with me.

"You're talking about Resurrection Catholic, who won a state championship a few years ago; Lumberton's won four; Stringer has won four; and East Marion, I think, is at three-plus. We have a very tough region, and we have to go up against some future D1 athletes, which is usually few and far between in 1A."

The 6-1 Red Devils are rolling as of now, especially after knocking off Resurrection Catholic last Friday night, 45-39, to begin play in Region 4-1A. The milestone was a first for Brown and his gang.

"We're starting to execute well," said Brown. "Our kids are gaining more experience too. I fill like we are beating the teams we should be beating or supposed to be beating.

This past week, Resurrection [Catholic] was our biggest test so far. It helped us see how far we are. We haven't beaten them in a handful of years. We came through that night with some big plays, and it was

a hard-fought game."

Week one of the season didn't go quite so well. Stringer was forced to rebound after getting forked – no pun intended – by county rival, Bay Springs, 41-8. Six wins later, here the Red Devils stand.

Other than experience (returning eight to nine starters on both sides of the ball and many playing both ways), prosperous living has come from junior running back Anthony Thomas.

"Anthony is a good part of our offense," Brown said. "But we also can throw it. And we can throw it to more than one individual too. So it makes it tough on our opponent. All of that opens things up for Anthony even more. A great offensive line helps out too."

Thomas averages 10.9 yards per carry. The junior back has compiled 879 yards on 81 carries, plus 203 receiving yards on 10 catches and a team-high 16 touchdowns, including three punt returns for scores.

"We've been working hard in the weight room and practice," said Thomas. "And we haven't given up on anything, even after our loss to Bay Springs.

"We stick together [as a team] and keep

Junior quarterback Caleb Dyess is a huge contributor to the Red Devils success on offense as well. Dyess, who tore his ACL last season, has come back strong, completing 55 percent of his passes for 1,036 yards and 13 touchdowns. He's rushed for three scores too. His most targeted receiver is senior Reece Barber, who has 556 yards on 21 catches and five TDs.

Brown says the key moving forward is health. Stringer has avoided major injuries through seven full weeks of games.

"We have to say healthy," said Brown. "So far all we've had is depth injuries. Our number two running back is injured, but we've had some guys to step up. He was also our outside linebacker, and we've had kids step up there."

The goal this season with five games remaining, all Region 4-1A contests, is best summed up in Thomas' words: "to win state."

Brown, Thomas, Dyess and the rest of the Red Devils travel to Salem on Friday night. Kickoff is slated for 7 p.m.

Professional baseball league to include Laurel

The National Urban Professional Baseball League is bringing a team to Laurel in the spring of 2018. The league announced the plans through a media release late Wednesday afternoon.

The newly created league consists of four teams representing four states: Texas, Louisiana, Tennessee and Mississippi. It plans to expand in the com-

Wooten Legion Field in Laurel will serve as Mississippi's home field. The Laurel City Council approved the use of the field to serve as Mississippi's hosting site. Laurel Recreational Director Elvin Ulmer plans to upgrade the field and park to accommodate the league's specifications. The city of Laurel will receive a sum of \$30,000 from the league and at least 3 percent of all advertisement sales.

"Baseball in our inner-cities is dying,

and the NUPBL will be giving African American baseball players a new hope to live out America's past-time," said Michael E. Mayden. "This league will offer minority baseball players the opportunity to play the game they love on a professional level, an opportunity many have been denied.

"A few years ago, a little league baseball team from the Southside Chicago by the name of Jackie Robinson West captured the hearts and soul of the nation. Most importantly, they captured the heart and soul of the African American community around the world. We want this league, the NUPBL, to capture the heart and soul of the nation and most importantly the hearts and the souls of the African American community. We are looking for excitement, enthusiasm and support from the African American Community for this league from the East, West, North and the South."

Each team will play 90 regular season games, 45 at home and 45 on the road. Tryouts for the Mississippi team is scheduled for October 20. Mayden adds that the league "in no way will be limited to only African American players.

Players will receive a salary - based on a players need and athletic ability - and roster spots will be open to high school senior players, college players not playing league ball, and non-committed major league players.
