





Can a patient in hospice be taken to the ER, or admitted to hospital, if necessary? Some people have been told Medicare will not pay and want to know what to do if pain isn't controlled.

There are really two issues here. **1. Can hospice patients still go to the ER/hospital?** Yes. The primary goal of Medicare for hospice patients is to help

Dr. Robert Webb Medicare for hospice patients is to help them to remain at home, and die there comfortably, with dignity. Therefore, a hospice is obligated to do whatever's necessary to achieve that, including continuous care by an RN during times of any symptom crisis.

The hospice cannot make a patient revoke hospice [give up their hospice service] just because they need to be in the hospital to control symptoms.

When symptoms can't be controlled, or some unrelated crisis occurs [such as falling and breaking a hip], a hospice should arrange for patients to be taken to the ER, stabilized and return home, or to be admitted. And these services are covered, either through the hospice benefit or under 'regular' Medicare.

2. How to control someone's pain? Hospice staff <u>are</u> responsible for controlling a patient's symptoms, whether it's pain, shortness of breath, etc.

Suggestions for pain: start with extended-release acetaminophen [*Tylenol Arthritis*] combined with nondrug options [such as rubbing a mentholated cream, like *Bengay* or *Biofreeze*, into the painful area]. If that doesn't help, adding much stronger drugs, like the narcotics morphine or methadone is usually successful. In our hospice, many patients requiring a narcotic are using methadone with good success—although more sedating, it has better pain relief and is less expensive than other narcotics.

Just because a drug didn't help one person, doesn't mean it won't work for someone else. Each of us is unique and often require a 'trial-and-error' approach until something is found to work!

in June of this year, Verizon (for reasons I cannot fathom) purchased Yahoo for 4.5 billion dollars. Then, at the beginning of this month, Yahoo sheepishly

announced, "You know those 500 million addresses that were hacked? Well, umm, haha, the number was just a little higher than that. What we meant to say is that ALL THREE BILLION accounts were hacked. Yep, every last one of them. SORRY!"

Again, we're talking all your security questions, your email address and the password and even your "backup" email address that many users use to recover their Yahoo account. This information is readily available from the "dark web" which is the equivalent of a biker bar for nerds.

The thieves are clever. They can use this information to sign into your account, search your emails for something from, say, Amazon. Then they can visit Amazon, click the "forgot password" link which is sent to your Yahoo address, then they gain access to your Amazon account and enjoy a shopping spree. The same tactic can be used on most of your online accounts.

Almost daily, I hear from a client who is having some random issue with their Yahoo account so it's already horrible even without this fiasco. But this latest news from Yahoo is simply inexcusable. They obviously do not take their client's security seriously. They are flat-out liars. There is really only one thing you should do in my opinion: abandon them and switch to another more responsible email provider. My suggestion would be either Google's Gmail.com or Microsoft's Outlook.com, both 100% free. There are plenty of other choices as well.

To terminate your account, you can visit a special page they have that makes this easy. You'll just need to search for "Yahoo Termination Page." Log in with your Yahoo credentials and all will be revealed. Before you go, you're going to need to tell your friends. I'm sorry but there is no easy way to do that unless, like me, you only have five friends to begin with. Next, you'll need to change your login credentials for all the online accounts you use (Amazon, banks, etc.). If you've depended on Yahoo for a long time, this is going to be an arduous task but you really do need to abandon them before they screw up even worse. With all the lawsuits they are facing, it may be a matter of time before they go bankrupt leaving you stuck in the water.



Dear J.P.,

I see nothing wrong with it, as long as you're buying with cash and you're also debtfree. A vacation home is a wonderful "extra" as you start building wealth. Remember though, it's still basically a very large, very expensive toy. In most cases it will go up in value, and if you rent it, it might become something of a money maker for you.


But here's another side to vacation home rentals. You'll probably make some money, but in most cases there will be several weeks during a year when it sits empty. You're not going to get rich renting it out. So, they're not really great investment properties. What you're talking about is more of a plan to offset the annual costs of your toy. If you look at it that way, I don't think you'll be disappointed.

If you're determined to go this route, be ready to deal with spills on the carpet and damage from your guests, along with general maintenance and repairs. There's always something that needs attention when you own a property. But if you can handle all that emotionally and financially – and you're not looking for it to be a bigtime investment that will make you rich – you'll be fine. —Dave

Dear Jim,

Babies are wonderful, important things. Having kids, even the thought of having kids, is a big emotional deal. But sometimes it can cause people to change their financial plans and directions.

I would urge you not to accept the first opinion and pricing model you receive on

Alabama's Largest Direct Mail Weekly something like this. I've heard

prices of \$35,000, but that includes as many attempts as it takes until your wife becomes pregnant. I've also heard of single attempts priced at \$7,500 each. There are all kinds of options and guarantees, because they understand someone who is willing to do this really wants a baby.

If I'm in your shoes, I'm not accepting the idea that there's one approach and one pricing structure to all this. I would explore other options, as far as doctors and clinics are concerned. Then, with your income, you could consider taking off a couple months from paying down debt and put some money toward the ÎVF. If it doesn't work pay off a little more debt, pause the debt payoff, and try for a baby again. Take some time, learn a little more, and go from there always using cash for the endeavor. God bless you two!

Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) begins October 15th and extends through December 7th. You will find that there are many ways to sign up for your 2018 plan. You can enroll online, enroll over the phone, have a noninsurance person help you enroll or you can enroll in your plan through a local insurance agent that is certified to offer Medicare plans.

If you want to deal directly with a particular insurance company you can do that online or over the phone. All insurance companies now have a website and toll free number to call. Some people feel as though they need help in choosing a plan. They will call on a friend, family member or non-insurance person to help them. All three of these methods are perfectly acceptable under Medicare guidelines. If you choose to enroll without the help of an insurance agent it will be up to you to read and understand the plan's summary of benefits, assure that the doctors, hospitals and pharmacies you want to use are in the plan's network and make sure your drugs are covered on the plan's drug formulary.



Although President Trump would like to unilaterally pull the U.S. out of the multi-national nuclear agreement with Iran, he cannot legally do so. Congressional approval is required. Congress denies approval, the If agreement will stand and another poorly-considered campaign promise will not be kept, which will add to the president's already acute, and much deserved political heartburn.

Iran Has Not Erred

The Congress, in order to authorize the president to withdraw, must do so on the basis of a finding that Iran has willfully violated the agreement. That will not be an easy task.

Congressional requesting In approval, the president must provide

(IAEA) inspectors that Iran is willfully violating their end of the bargain. Neither the IAEA nor our own military and intelligence sources have discovered or been provided with evidence to support such a conclusion to date.

Nowhere in all his ranting about this terrible agreement has the president identified a single instance of willful Iranian non-compliance, nor have any of the other parties to the agreement (United Kingdom, Russia, France, China, Germany and the European Union), nor has the aforementioned International Atomic Energy Agency, the organization tasked with inspection and monitoring of Iran's compliance.

then releases geographically focused messages to others who have downloaded the social media platform.

The Shoals Idea Audition is an annual event sponsored by the University of North Alabama, Bank Independent, and the Shoals Chamber of Commerce. For four years this event has taken place under the auspices of Shoals Shift, a creative effort through the Shoals Entrepreneurial Center and partially funded by the Appalachian Regional [·] Commission to attract, nurture and promote the Shoals creative and tech economy. The event is designed to foster businesses, new help entrepreneurs polish their presentations, and introduce community leaders who may be instrumental in helping make their ideas a reality. The top scoring ideas will be awarded a \$5,000 cash prize, with \$2,500 and \$1,000 to second and thirdplace winners, respectively.

The second place winner was Shoals Take Out, an existing Florence-based food delivery company that auditioned to obtain funding to expand technology in their business. Zip Vending took home third place with their proposal to develop smarter and more customerfriendly vending machines.

Over 30 competitors presented their ideas to a preliminary round of judges. These presentations were reduced to five who presented in a final round to judges and an audience of about 150 UNA students and guests.

"I am glad I didn't have to judge these competitors," stated Caitlin Holland, Chamber President. "All the applicants had very producible ideas. I hope everyone continues the research and development of their products or services and will continue the trend toward innovation and entrepreneurship going on in the Shoals at present."

Shift, developed Shoals who initially the Idea Audition format, has other opportunities for budding entrepreneurs to showcase their conception. 

Alabama has always been at the forefront of serving our nation and honoring our veterans, such as Medal of Honor recipient, David McCampbell of Bessemer, Alabama who shot down 34 Japanese planes in the Second World War.

Letters to the editor of newspapers have been the spark that ignited national ideas. Mr. A.B.R Shelly of North Carolina saw the photo of the Marines raising the flag over Iwo Jima in 1945. He wrote a letter to the editor stating, "Reproduced in bronze, this actual scene should make good art and a fitting tribute to American men and American valor." The Iwo Jima monument was born.

Elementary school student Rabel McNutt was blessed to have Mr. Walter D. Ehlers as her godfather. He was the oldest holder of the Congressional Medal of Honor at the time of his death in 2014. Ehlers stormed the Beaches of Normandy and fought in the hedgerows. Prior to attending his funeral, she watched videos of state funerals on YouTube.

Rabel and her father, Bill McNutt, came up with the idea to convince the President to designate a state funeral for the last Medal of Honor recipient from World War II as a final salute to this hero. It was also a way to honor all 16 million men and women who wore the uniform in World War II. There were 464 men who were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for gallantry in the Second World War. Only four remain today. World War II veterans, like

fighter pilot McCampbell, once lived among us. They were our teachers, coaches, elected officials, and business owners. Today the Greatest Generation has slipped into the shadows of life. They deserve a great sendoff and a final salute from an appreciative nation.



Successfully Transitioning Your Houseplants Indoors for Winter

By Melinda Myers

Help your houseplants make a smooth transition from their outdoor summer home back inside for winter. The lower light and humidity indoors along with any insects that hitched a ride indoors make it difficult to keep these plants looking their best.

Give them a shower before they move indoors. A gentle

blast of water washes dust and dirt off the leaves and dislodges aphids and mites that might be feeding on the pla nts.

G r a d u a l l y prepare the plants for the lower light conditions indoor. Start by placing plants in the sunniest southor west-facing window available or grow them under artificial

lights. Leave them here for several weeks if the final destination receives less light

less light. Next move them to an east-facing or well-lit north facing window. Again, leave them here for several weeks. Gradually decrease the amount of light the plants receive until they reach their final location. This gradual acclimation helps the plants develop more shade tolerant leaves. Foregoing this process results in yellow leaves and massive leaf drop. This is stressful on the plant and its caretaker. Skip this step, reduce the

Skip this step, reduce the stress on your plants and keep them looking their best throughout the winter by growing them under artificial lights. Using a combination of natural and artificial light helps plants better tolerate the lessthan-ideal indoor growing environment.

Isolate these plants from your indoor houseplant collection until you are sure no insects tagged along. Check under the leaves and along the stems for aphids, mites, scale and white flies. Use an eco-friendly product like Summit Year-Round Spray Oil (SummitResponsible Solutions.com) to prevent these pests from moving onto the rest of your indoor



garden. This highly refined mineral oil suffocates the insects, doesn't poison them, and is approved for organic gardening.

Continue monitoring for pests over the next few weeks. Reapply the organic insecticide every two weeks as needed. Always read and follow label directions when using any organic, natural or synthetic chemical.

Increase the humidity by grouping plants together. As one plant loses moisture from its leaves, or transpires, it increases the humidity around its neighboring plants.

Further increase the humidity and decrease your workload by placing the plants on a gravel tray. Place pebbles in the bottom of the saucer or other shallow container. Set the pot on top of the pebbles. Allow excess water to collect in the pebbles below the pot. As this water evaporates, it increases the humidity around the plants.

You'll also eliminate the amount of time spent and mess made when pouring off the excess water that collects in the saucer. Plus, you'll avoid root rot and other diseases caused by plants sitting in a waterfilled saucer.

Give your plants a bit of TLC as you tuck them into their winter lodgings. Your efforts will be rewarded with healthier, pest-free and better-looking plants to enjoy all winter long.







I had an on-the-job injury and waited a little over two years to have surgery and now the workers compensation company says I can have the surgery but nothing else. What can I do? Were they supposed to tell me I had a time limit?

Charles, Rogersville, AL

The insurance company has no duty to tell you to sue them or advise you in any way. I don't

think they could tell you wrong and trick you into not filing. At any rate if you don't ask and you don't know and you don't file within the time limit then your case is over before it started.

The law regarding injuries is extensive and fairly complicated. I have seen cases where lawyers missed deadlines or allowed their client to

give a full release when a partial release would have made their client a lot of money. In most cases there is a two year statute of limitations. If you wait more than two years, in most cases, you have no claim. In an on-the-job injury claim, the statute of limitations is two years. However, if the injured worker received temporary total benefits (money while recovering) for a specific injury, the statute begins to run on the date the last payment is made.

I would not want to wait more than two years. It makes me nervous. In your case there is sort of a divided statute of limitations. I don't think this is well recognized but after two years and a day you gave up your right to a lot of tax free money in the form of weekly payments and then a final settlement, the amount of which is determined by many factors such as your previous wages and benefits, as well as how well you recovered from your injury after surgery.

However, I do think that in a workers compensation case, and specifically a workers compensation case, you are still entitled to medical care after two years and could enforce that right in court.

I also believe that as time goes by facts and evidence are lost and medical causation required to be proven becomes far more difficult.

Talking to a lawyer that handles injury cases is usually free. I find it enjoyable to meet people and discus these issues and if I like the case and want the job I say so and if I don't I say so. I don't mind answering questions.

A free consultation means just that. It could be, as in this case, quite valuable.
