

# THE EAGLE HAS LANDED

Apollo is the resident bald eagle ambassador for Lake Metroparks. Found in Perry, he arrived at the Kevin P. Clinton Wildlife Center in June 2011 as a juvenile with an injured wing. He was learning to fly, taking test flights out of the nest and back again. On the second day he was practicing his flight, he flew into the territory of a pair of nearby eagles. Eagles are very territorial during nesting season, and the male of that pair came to chase the intruding youngster away. A fight ensued and the adult attacked the young eagle, breaking its wing and sending him down to the ground. A concerned neighbor called the Ohio Division of Wildlife and the eagle was brought to the Kevin P. Clinton Wildlife Center.

The eagle's broken wing was repaired and he was placed in a large flight enclosure with lots of room for him to stretch his wings and practice flying. Kevin P. Clinton Wildlife Center staff regularly helped him stretch and flex his wing. He spent six months in therapy, but unfortunately, he could not regain complete flexibility in his wing and is unable to fly. Because of this, he was not able to be released back into the wild.

Lake Metroparks requested an education permit from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for the juvenile bald

eagle to become a permanent resident. The permit was granted in 2012 and the eagle was then trained to become an Animal Ambassador. Staff named him Apollo in reference to the Apollo 11 mission to the moon; the lunar module was named Eagle. Upon landing on the surface of the moon Astronaut Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin stated, "The Eagle has landed."

The Animal Ambassadors, including Apollo, represent a variety of native Ohio wildlife species. These residents are under the permanent care of the Kevin P. Clinton Wildlife Center staff because their injuries prohibit independent survival. Animal Ambassadors allow us to educate the public about conservation.

To help educate the public about the remarkable history of the American bald eagle, The Apollo Project was developed to highlight its natural history, near extinction and comeback. The Apollo Project is a day-long school program fashioned after the Columbus Center of Science and Industry's program, COSI on Wheels. The program starts with a colorful presentation and an up-close encounter with two Animal Ambassador birds of prey. Then students view a PowerPoint program of Apollo's story and meet him in person. Students learn more about the eagle's adaptations by visiting seven interactive stations with hands-on activities to help them learn more about the bald eagle.

### The Anollo Projects hits the streets



# Thanksgiving & Hope

The horrifying event that happened in Las Vegas recently, as well as the massive fires in California and devastating hurricanes lately are all reminders of how important it is to take time to be grateful. Not only at Thanksgiving, but always- for our health, our homes, our friends, our faith and especially our family. It's impossible to accept how many truly awful things have been happening and how they just seem to be getting worse. I just don't know what to think. Certainly nothing positive.

But recently I bought a People Magazine. In it there was a person saying there was something to be grateful for, something I hadn't thought about. It was a person who was at the Las Vegas concert that night who witnessed something that was positive in the wake of it all. This person said they saw caring people and believed in humanity more that night and it was because of how every person there or passing by was willing to help those in need, even if they were complete strangers. It brings me to tears just thinking about it. How horrible some people can be to others in this world, but then to think of how many more are kind. I found hope and gratitude in that.

A few years ago I wrote a column on gratitude at home. It was called the Thanks & Giving Project. I think it's perfectly suited for this month. Here is a recap of that project and I hope you and your family will join us. Life is busy...hectic actually. There never seems like we have enough time in a day and we are quite focused on our to-do lists and calendars. This November, we can use project as a way to reach out to others and show love and kindness, as well as take a moment (or a day) to remind ourselves what really matters.

The 'Thanks & Giving Project' is a way of getting families (including my own) to appreciate what they have, recognize what they're grateful for, and find opportunities to make others feel good (even complete strangers). Parents, it's not just kids who need reminding. When someone opens a door for you, do you say thank you and hold it open for the person behind you? It's one of the simplest gestures; men and women refer to it as chivalry if a man does it. I call it courtesy (and we should *all* do it). Thanksgiving. Receiving, appreciating, giving back. It's a positive cycle we could stand to have more of, *in general*, not just in youth society. If you're married and have never done 'The Love Dare', I really challenge you to give this project some thought.

Here's how it works: Every five days, beginning on the first day of November, you will have something to accomplish. The first task will be carried daily throughout the month, and then there are a few other things you should do during November. It all ends (*if you want it to*) on November 30. **Here we go:** 

11/1: The B.A.G. Journal. I learned this at a work conference many years ago. It works! Make a list daily of these things: Blessings, Goals and Accomplishments. If you forget a day, no big deal, do it before bed or on the next morning (some people do it twice a day, once in the morning and once at night, but start small). If you already do this at home, open it up to dinner discussion to learn about the members of your family.

11/5: Give one thing away for the month of November. Allow the person to give it back to you on Thanksgiving. Not begrudgingly, and allow them free use of it.

11/10: Celebrate with someone in the family over an achievement. Give them a card or flowers, make them a treat or craft, you might want to offer them a foot massage (that last one is popular with moms).

11/15: Give away something of yours permanently to someone less fortunate.

11/20: Buy someone something with money you earned doing work. (Excellent for siblings-watch how some will hate to do this.)

11/25: Make someone a meal or a dish: Just something to eat even if it's just cheese and crackers or a bowl of ice cream. Waiting on someone with a cup of coffee or glass of milk is the same as making a meal because it's such a nice gesture (so small-but so big to the person receiving it). SEE PAGE 5

The timing of this task might encourage you to call your local church to see if you can help cook and donate a meal, invite a neighbor, single or elderly person, into your home for the holidays.

11/30: As a family, take out a blank sheet of paper and write out what you would do with a million dollars (cannot be spend on yourself). Would you donate to a charity? Would you help someone you know? How much of it would you give? Now write out what you would do if you were given \$100.00 of it back.

### Sometime during the course of the month:

Volunteer somewhere. Do someone's last fall law mowing, help with someone's grocery shopping, call a local center that serves people, or even animals, in the community. There are plenty of them. Call 211 if you aren't sure. How about cleaning someone's house or helping out a teacher after school to grade papers or prepare for class project?

Trade places with someone at home for a weekend or a day (swap chores). Kids could swap with mom and dad. We always think we have it hard until we live in someone else's shoes. Remember the show Wfe Swap, back in the late 90's? That show proved how each family member lived in a bubble (their own life/household) never seeing another's. But appreciating theirs when everything went back to normal after mom came home.

Send 3 Thank You cards in November. These could be to a parent for all the FREE taxiing, a child for being a good helper, or just for someone being themselves and special to you, it could also be a teacher, coworker or friend. Ideally, someone who most likely doesn't get much praise or appreciation.



Send 1 note to cheer someone up. It might be a neighbor with plaguing problems (whether bad luck, ill decision making or constant health struggles) we all need to be lifted up, a person who had surgery, a teen going through puberty. (Come on, puberty is serious stuff! Hint: I'd leave out the word 'puberty'.)

I read once, in Randy Paush's "Last Lecture", 'it's just a thing'. He was, of course, referring to his new VW Rabbit, while pouring a can of orange soda on his new white seats just prior to taking his niece and nephew out in it. His example for living, and treating others, is a lesson to be admired and respected. At the end of the night his nephew would vomit in the backseat. And it wouldn't matter...to anvone.

Sometimes we need to shift our focus to be able to gather a better perspective. Its often most effective when we take the attention off of ourselves, no matter how old we are.






