
Veterans Day program at schools Nov. 10

Guest speaker for the program is retired United States Air Force Major Matthew Waage.



A favorite fall nut

It always amazes me that so many people are not familiar with hickory nuts—what they look like, where they grow, or how they taste.

As a child, I spent many an hour under the shade of the large, old hickory nut tree that grew in our backyard.

The hickory nut grows with an outer green shell around it, about the size of a golf ball. As the nut ripens, this outer coating shrivels and turns a dark brown or black, pulling back from the hard white nut underneath. Then, when the frost comes or a strong autumn wind shakes the branches of the tree the nuts fall naturally to the ground.

My mother introduced me to hickory nutting not just in our backyard but also in the country. We would drive along the country roads north of Plymouth until we spotted some hickory trees; then mom would stop the car and we'd check to see if any nuts had fallen and then take our paper bags and begin to gather.

However, we had a memorable encounter near Little Elkhart Lake one year. It never occurred to us that hickory nut gathering other than in our own yard was stealing. After all, the nuts were just there, ready to be picked up and if the farmer who owned the land didn't choose to pick them—well then, they were fair game. A farmer friend always told us to pick as many of the nuts as we wanted.

But one year we must have wandered

further along the ridge than usual, for all of a sudden a stranger appeared at the foot of the hill (with a large dog) and asked us what we though we were doing stealing his hickory nuts.

I never would have expected of my mother but she must have thought that he fully intended to take the nuts we had already gathered. She haughtily tossed and scattered those nuts we had already gathered and puffed, "There! If you want these nuts, you pick them yourself."

Fortunately future hickory nutting wasn't that traumatic and it always provided a pleasant outing to wander on those crisp autumn days. Yes, we were always careful to check with the farmer who owned the land to insure that we were welcome to gather his hickory nuts.

Cracking and picking out the nuts is another story. Mom wrestled with the old-fashioned nutcracker, which consisted of a jaw and lever attached to a wooden mount. The dried shells tended to shatter and fly all over. Picking out the nuts was a painstaking, time consuming job. Both my brother and I only had patience to do this for about fifteen minutes. Mom finished up while brother Bill and I were busy studying.

I do think it is well worth the turmoil and stress because that delicious taste is worth the efforts. My mom's hickory nut cake was something no words can describe and some toasted, salted hickory nuts on a hot fudge sundae—well, it's worth stealing some nuts if you have to.

LEED Gold addition to the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed First Unitarian Society Meeting House in Madison, Wisconsin.



On Sat., Nov. 4 at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center, Floyd Hamblen will discuss how Taliesin and the School of Architecture at Taliesin carry forward the traditions of Frank Lloyd Wright.

Speakers to talk about Wright

On Saturday, Nov. 4, Wade House and the John Michael Kohler Arts Center will join together to celebrate the 150th birthday of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright by exploring his architecture through the eyes of a Taliesin Fellow and Kubala Washatko Architect.

The first event in this joint celebration will be a presentation by Floyd Hamblen, Taliesin Fellow, Architect, and Faculty at the School of Architecture at Taliesin. On Saturday, Nov. 4 from 10 to 11:30 a.m. at the ARTery at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center, Mr. Hamblen will share insight on Taliesin history and the fellowship. Pulling from a rich history, he will discuss how Taliesin and the School of Architecture at Taliesin carry forward the traditions of Frank Lloyd Wright.

Mr. Hamblen's talk will be followed by a presentation by Tom Kubala, Principal Architect and Co-Founder of The Kubala Washatko Architects, Inc. From 1 to 2:30 p.m., at the Wade House Visitor Center, Mr. Kubala will highlight the Kubala Washatko Architects' 2008 LEED Gold addition to the Frank Lloyd Wrightdesigned First Unitarian Society Meeting House in Madison, Wisconsin. Built in 1951, the original Meeting House has been hailed as one of the world's most innovative examples of church architecture. Kubala will describe how the firm helped the congregation maintain the integrity of Wright's original design while providing space and modern environmental technology. Mr. Kubala's presentation will be preceded by a complimentary reception featuring microbrews and light hors d'oeuvres, which will begin at 12:30 p.m.

In addition to the Nov. 4 opportunities, the John Michael Kohler Arts Center and Wade House Historic Site have ongoing activities to help guests explore architecture. In the ARTery at JMKAC from Oct. 30 through Nov. 30, guests will be able to explore local architecture through a drawing and model-making project inspired by the visiting architects and titled "Architecture in your Neighborhood." Through May 31, 2018, Wade House will display "Frank Lloyd Wright: A Wisconsin Original," a display which includes The Wright Carriage Exhibit, A Taliesin Album, and a Young Masters Workshop.

In addition to offering shared programming on Saturday, Nov. 4, the John Michael Kohler Arts Center and the Wisconsin Historical Society have collaborated to enrich the member experience of both organizations. On Saturday, Nov. 4, for one day only, members of each organization will enjoy discounts at both organization's shops and cafes. Wisconsin Historical Society (WHS) members can show their WHS membership card

at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center to receive a 10 percent discount at both their ARTspace shop locations and a 10 percent discount on a soup, salad or wrap purchase at their ARTcafe. 
















Author Watson presents at Elkhart Lake Library

Author Larry Watson will be the featured guest Thursday, Nov. 2, when the Elkhart Lake Public library hosts an author's evening.


Presented by the Friends of the Elkhart Lake Public Library, the event will provide guests with an opportunity to learn about Watson and his novels.

Christmas Tree effort helps many

The program is called the Christmas Gift Tree and Christmas Gift Tree Plus.

The program has enjoyed overwhelming success over these years. Hundreds of children's Christmas' were brightened through the Christmas Gift Tree and through the Christmas Gift Tree Plus programs, thousands of dollars in gift cards, were distributed to community families in need.

On Saturday, Nov. 18, Grace Lutheran will put up and/or decorate six trees. They will be located at Grace Lutheran, Charlene's, Off the Rail, All Seasons Restaurant, the National Exchange Bank, and Vintage Elkhart Lake.

The process for the community to help out with the Gift Tree is to go to one of the locations and 1) Take a children's ornament off the tree. 2) Purchase an age appropriate gift. 3) Wrap the gift. 4) Securely attach the ornament to the package. 5) Return the gift to Grace Lutheran Church or to the location the ornament was taken. This should be done by Wednesday, Dec. 20 so the contributions can be made available for pick-up.

While many families appreciate the gifts for their children, they also have other needs, such as food and gas. This is where the Christmas Gift Tree Plus program comes in.

Helping with the "Plus" program is also very simple 1) Go to any of the six locations. 2) Take a "Gift Card" ornament from the tree. 3) Purchase a \$25 gift card at the business of your choice that will provide either gas or groceries as designated on the "Gift Card" ornament. 4) Securely attach the ornament to the actual gift card. 5) Return the gift card to Grace Lutheran Church, or to the location from which you took the gift card. This should be completed by Sunday, Dec. 17 or Monday, Dec. 18 so they can be distributed, prior to Christmas.







What's a First Responder you ask?

If you don't know what a First Responder is, we are glad. It means that you have been healthy and lucky. We hope to never meet you in an emergency situation! That being said, we want you to know who we are just in case. We are Emergency Medical Responders and Emergency Medical Technicians.

We are also accountants, engineers, bartenders, police officers, truck drivers and students. We are volunteers, with more than 70 years of experience between us. Together we answered more than 300 calls in Elkhart Lake and the Town of Rhine in the past couple of years.

Our role is to bridge the gap of time between calling for an ambulance and its arrival. Sometimes that is six minutes and other times that may be 15 minutes, depending on the status of the ambulance and your location. If you're bleeding or struggling to breathe, that can feel like a lifetime. We respond from wherever we are when your call comes in. Luckily our employers allow us to leave when we are needed. We show up morning, noon or night to your home, your workplace, the side of the road, a restaurant, or the golf course, and have trained to deal with everything from cuts and broken bones, car accidents, childbirth, to full cardiac arrest.



First Responders do all these things to help others, but we are helped also. We get the satisfaction of being able to do something in a situation that makes many people feel helpless. We go to sleep at night knowing we are needed. If you are looking for something different, a way to give as good as you get, consider joining our ranks. It's not easy, it's not for everyone, but it might be for you.

The Emergency Medical Responder class is offered through LTC. If you want more information or have questions any of our members would be happy to talk with you. 



Violinist, Chee-Yun, and Cellist, Christopher Rex, will conduct a Master Class on Friday, Nov. 10 at 4 p.m. at the John Michael Kohler Arts Center. All string musicians, teachers and students in the Sheboygan area are invited to attend. The workshop is open to the public, including both musicians and non-musicians. Observers are always welcome.

McMahon stated, "We will open with the Slavonic Dance, Op. 46 No. 1, one of the best and liveliest of the Slavonic Dances that Dvořák wrote. Next the great artistry of violinist Chee-Yun and cellist Christopher Rex, along with the SSO, will share Brahms' final work written for orchestra, the Double Concerto."

Since her first public performance at age 8 in her native Seoul, violinist Chee-Yun has enraptured audiences on five continents with her flawless technique, dazzling tone and compelling artistry. She has performed regularly with the Philadelphia Orchestra, the London Philharmonic, and the Toronto, Pittsburgh, Atlanta and National symphony orchestras. Her orchestral highlights include a concert with the Seoul Philharmonic that was broadcast on national television and her tours of the US with the San Francisco Symphony and Japan with the NHK Symphony. Chee-Yun plays the 1669 Francesco Rugeri violin, which she has owned since 1991 and currently resides in Dallas, TX where she is an Artist-in-Residence and Professor of Violin at Southern Methodist University.


Christopher Rex joined the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra as Principal Cello in 1979. He took up the cello at age eight. Following his studies at the Curtis Institute of Music and The Juilliard School, he was a member of the Philadelphia Orchestra for seven seasons. Rex's solo appearances with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra have included Shostakovich Concerto No. 1, Tchaikovsky Rococo Variations, Strauss' Don Quixote, the Victor Herbert Concerto #2, and the cello concertos of Elgar, Schumann, Dvořák, Saint-Saens, Hindemith, Prokofiev, and most recently Samuel Barber. In addition, Rex is in his 15th Season serving as artistic director of the Madison Chamber Music Festival,

in Madison, Georgia. He is also founder, general and artistic director of the Amelia Island Chamber Music Festival on Amelia Island, Florida.

McMahon added, "The program will be rounded out with Dvořák Symphony No. 9, "From the New World", a symphony that is popular and well-loved. The New World Symphony was last heard performed in concert with the Sheboygan Symphony eleven years ago."
