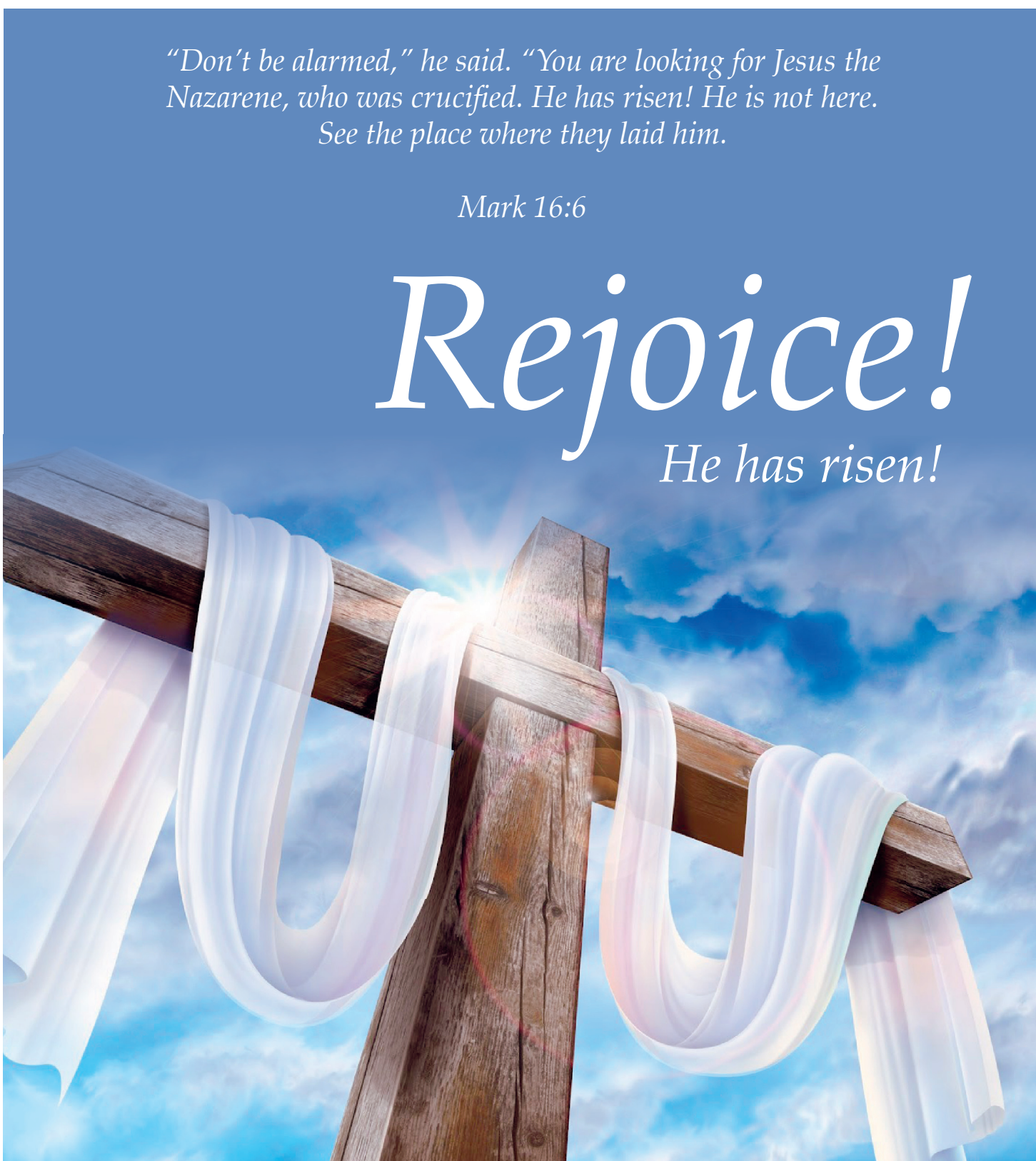

East side residents continue fight against rats

For the second time, a group of residents from Middle River, Essex and Dundalk gathered at the bi-weekly meeting of the Baltimore County Council on Monday, March 21, to raise awareness about the worsening rat infestation in their communities.

Although rats are an issue throughout the county, mostly in more densely populated communities, several east side communities have banded together to bring the issue front and center to the County Council in hopes that something will be done.

"I'm surprised at how many people have come out to support us," said Cliff O'Connell, owner of Cliff's Hi-Tech Body Shop and Cliff's Direct Effect in Essex and an organizer of the effort.

He said that through speaking with residents of the Middlesex community, which neighbors his business, rats could be the top complaint that they have.

Additionally, he feels the county's response to rats was developed before the problem was so bad and needs to be updated.

"We just want them to sit down with us and take a new look at it," O'Connell commented. "Times have changed."

However, he acknowledged that education of residents is a big issue too, with some residents not realizing that what they are doing contributes to rat problems or understanding what they can do to

fix the issue.

O'Connell told the *East County Times* about an elderly woman in Middlesex who thought her trash bags being torn open and the droppings left around them were the work of birds. He did not deny that the bags could have been damaged by birds, but the droppings were unequivocally left by rats.

He suggested that the county could come through infested neighborhoods with informational mailers or door hangers as a public information campaign.

The overall goal of the coalition - consisting of communities across the east side such as Hawthorne, Aero Acres, Middlesex, North Point Village, Berkshire, West Inverness, Eastwood and Gray Manor - is to improve education, eradication and enforcement in Baltimore County with respect to rats.

North Point Village Civic Association President Dave Patro, among others, specifically took issue with several practices the county uses when dealing with rat issues.

First, he lamented that when people are cited by code enforcement for violations that contribute to rats, such as trash not in cans, uncut grass or pet feces not picked up, they can almost always have the fines waived by showing up to court in Towson. This, he said, does not teach them the lesson they need to learn.

Patro, who has been dealing with rat - see **RATS** on page 6 -

Police to have increased presence at Perry Hall's Honeygo, Gough Parks

Fifth District County Councilman David Marks announced on Friday, March 18, that Honeygo Run Regional and Gough Parks in Perry Hall will see increased police surveillance and other security measures in the coming weeks.

The White Marsh police precinct will be installing a portable observation device - a trailer with pole-mounted cameras - at Honeygo Run Regional Park. The precinct will also step up surveillance at both Honeygo and Gough Parks, and conduct a public information and education campaign.

For example, if officers see an unlocked vehicle or a vehicle where items of value are in plain sight, they will discretely place a flier on the owner's windshield to notify them of the problem, but in a way that will avoid alerting would-be criminals to the vulnerabilities.

"I'm told the fliers will be placed face-down," Marks explained. "It will be a gentle reminder."

Furthermore, the police observation unit and additional police will be in the area to monitor the vehicles until the owners correct the problem.

The observation unit should be in place within the next two weeks, Marks said, as the weather warms and more people start to use the parks.

Marks, whose district includes Perry Hall, requested the increased police presence in response to a recent incidence of a car being broken into at Honeygo Park and similar issues being reported at Perry Paw Dog Park.

The action also follows a rash of thefts from vehicles at area parks, particularly Honeygo, last summer after owners either left their cars unlocked or left valuables in plain sight, prompting thieves to break in.

"I would like to thank Captain Christopher Kelly and the precinct for their help with these measures," Marks commented. "With the warm weather, Gough

and Honeygo Parks will be experiencing much more activity, and we want to make sure visitors feel safe and know their property will be secure."

Hawthorne Elementary receives over 1,800 books in massive donation

For Matthew Sachs, a 12-year-old Owings Mills boy, reading is difficult. Sachs struggles with dyslexia, a reading disorder that affects upwards of 17 percent of the population.

Later this year, Sachs, who attends the Jemicy School, will be celebrating his Bar Mitzvah. And, as is tradition in the Jewish faith, an act of charity, or mitzvah, must be completed. Because of his struggles with reading, Sachs figured that he would hold a book drive to help a school in need.

Due to some good fortune, Sachs and his family selected Hawthorne Elementary as the school to receive his donation - a staggering 1,800 books.

"A neighbor of ours knew the principal here at Hawthorne and recommended that we donate here," said Jennifer Sachs, Matthew's mother.

Sachs had a relatively large goal - a book for each student at Hawthorne - but soon found he would be able to provide much more.

"We almost tripled the original goal, which was 650 books," said Sachs. "I never expected to get this many books."

Sachs not only took drop-off donations, but he and his family held an event at Earth Treks Climbing Center in Timonium, where those who wished to do some rock climbing were able to for the price of a book.

After Matthew and his family lugged the books inside, he visited a kindergarten class where he read the children "Green Lizards vs. Red Rectangles."

The donation was more than welcome at Hawthorne, with teachers and administrators - as well as students - buzzing about the donation when the

County Council passes free meals pilot program for BCPS

Parents of students at Hawthorne Elementary, Dundalk Middle School and Dundalk High School will no longer have to worry about breakfast and lunch for their children after the Baltimore County Council passed a resolution on Monday night that will see all students at the aforementioned schools receive free meals through a federal program beginning next school year.

Resolution 32-16, sponsored by Councilmembers Cathy Bevins, David Marks, Vicki Almond, Tom Quirk and Julian Jones, passed 5 - 2 on Monday night, with Councilmen Todd Crandell and Wade Kach voting against the resolution.

"This program does not raise taxes, but I know it will improve the lives of so many children who currently do not get enough to eat, and ultimately improve learning in our schools," said Bevins. "That's how you break the cycle of poverty."

The schools were selected through discussion with BCPS and the school system's food and nutrition service, with areas of extreme poverty targeted.

As part of the pilot program, school officials would collect data on attendance, test scores and disciplinary action to help determine whether to expand the program to other

county schools.

While there was broad support from the Council, Crandell, Kach and Marks all voted in favor of an amendment that would see the current free and reduced price meals program audited. That amendment was shot down with the vote splitting along party lines.

According to previous audits of the current program, 4 percent of students who are eligible to receive free or reduced price meals did not qualify after application, while 20 percent of those receiving the benefits were actually denied in their application.

Crandell stated that the Council should be focused on helping those who have slipped through the bureaucratic cracks as opposed to utilizing taxpayer money to give everyone, including those who can afford meals, free meals. Crandell said that he didn't want to send the message that it was the job of government, as opposed to parents, to feed children.

Bevins, however, was quick to note that free meals for students wouldn't cause taxes to rise, as there's already \$13 million in an account just waiting to be used. The councilwoman also had a slightly heated exchange with Crandell, stating that she found it "hard to believe" that the councilman would vote against a bill that would help

many children in his district. Crandell then reaffirmed that he was more focused on helping those who truly need it. For educators, the answer is relatively simple - provide the meals to ensure that students don't go hungry.

"You will just have those moments that it will become very apparent that they haven't eaten in a while," said Kate Miller, an assistant principal at Hawthorne Elementary in Middle River. At the Council meeting Monday night, Bevins noted that she would like to make Miller her appointment to the committee that will help guide the program.

A few members of the council made the point that the job of feeding hungry children oftentimes falls on teachers and school administrators, with many keeping granola bars and other snacks in their classroom for children who are hungry.

"These children can't do their best in school because they are hungry," said Abby Beytin, president of the Teachers Association of Baltimore County. "They aren't getting the nutrition they need to pay attention in class. They are losing ground in their learning year after year because they cannot focus on their education."

Jones made the point that although none of the schools that were selected

are part of his district, he was still voting for the bill because it's the job of the government to ensure that all receive the help they need, regardless of what district they call home. Jones went so far as to say that while he supports the pilot program, it doesn't go far enough, adding that he would vote in the affirmative right then and there to expand the program to all schools. Besides helping students fight off hunger, Jones maintained that parents no longer having to worry about preparing breakfast or lunch will save them time and money, which would have an economic advantage.

Advocates of the resolution maintained that the program would help eliminate the stigma for students who need help when it comes to receiving meals. The program would eliminate all of the paperwork that is currently required, which would in turn allow more time and money to be spent on quality meals. It was also noted that every time a student changes schools, they currently need to fill out new paperwork.

More than 45 percent of Baltimore County kids qualify for free and reduced price meals, and 38 schools qualify for the schoolwide provision. Over 17,000 schools across the United States currently offer free meals.

Bevins talks legislative priorities, announces new Middle River Depot tenant

In her visit to the March 21 meeting of the Greater White Marsh Citizens Council, Sixth District County Councilwoman Cathy Bevins reaffirmed that having the Bird River dredged is her top priority in the upcoming Baltimore County budget.

After first announcing it at a Bird River Road Neighborhood Association meeting a month ago, Bevins held that the estimated \$4 million project is still first on her list for funding in her district.

The Bird River was last dredged in 2001 at a cost of about \$1.3 million. But over the last 15 years, sediment pollution - resulting from increased development and poor storm water management upstream - has filled in the channel and the cost to re-dredge it has risen dramatically.

The current Maryland state budget, if it passes as is, will allocate \$1 million for the project in each of the next two years. And the state has already committed the funds for engineering and planning the project.

So the county just needs to match that state funding for the next two years to get the job done, Bevins said. She added that dredging is not likely to be done before 2018, but she has committed to getting it done.

Next on Bevins' list is completing a feasibility study for connecting three of Middle River's public parks which are relatively close together: Marshy Point

Nature Center, Eastern Regional Park and Gunpowder Falls State Park - Hammerman Area, the first two being owned by Baltimore County and the latter owned by the state.

This is something Bevins had asked for last year as well, but did not get. She also commented that she thought it should be relatively easy to connect the two county-owned parks, at least, but the railroad track which leads to the Carroll Island power plant was in the way. So they need to figure out a way to cross or get around it.

While other parts of the county, such as Perry Hall, have bike lanes on roads or separate bike trails connecting many of their parks, the two main roads connecting these parks - Ebenezer Road and Eastern Avenue - are not suitable for cyclists or pedestrians.

There is also not currently enough room along them to create dedicated bike lanes. And while Eastern Avenue does currently have a bike route, it simply allows cyclists to share the road with automobile traffic.

Finally, information about the future of the Middle River Depot has been in short supply of late. But the councilwoman was able to inform the group of a freshly-signed lessee for the property at 2800 Eastern Blvd. in Middle River - Summit Point Kart.

issues for a long time and feels they have made little to no progress to this point, looks at it from a public health standpoint because rats carry diseases which can sicken or kill pets and humans alike.

"It's literally a rat race," he said, "and we're losing."

Additionally, he has personally walked through his community with code enforcement inspectors and contracted exterminators and seen what they miss. He and others decried that the exterminators tend to do small amounts of poison baiting in fully infested neighborhoods, which does not solve the problem.

Sixth District County Councilwoman Cathy Bevins backed this up with numbers from Hawthorne in her district, where the county's contractor baited just 79 homes in the community of 1,800.

Still, other communities such as Aero Acres in Middle River are left to fend for themselves on the issue because they do not qualify for county rat treatments even though they are plagued by them.

Aero Acres, though densely populated, consists of single-family homes instead of rowhomes and does not have alleys for property access and, therefore, must pay for extermination themselves.

"We're going to try to bait them ourselves and anyone who wants to participate is welcome," said Bob Driscoll, president of the Aero Acres Civic Improvement Association.

But he also noted that his association joined the effort in hopes that they can convince the county to treat their neighborhood as well.

"We had a positive response from [the Council] last time, so we're going to double our numbers and try again and see what we can get."

Seventh District Councilman Todd Crandell, whose district includes Dundalk and most of Essex, said he thinks that the organized effort on behalf of the communities has certainly raised awareness. "But the jury is out on whether the efforts by the county and the citizens will match up to the extent needed to have a significant impact," he commented.

Crandell also explained that rat eradication expenditures fall under the County Code Enforcement Office's service contract budget, which does not specifically delineate rat funds. Therefore, it is difficult to know how much could or should be spent for that purpose.

But he said the numbers suggest that less than half of what is available is being spent.

"In my mind, this backs up the community's assertion that rat eradication has not been as frequent as necessary or expected, leading to an exacerbated rat problem," Crandell contended.

The councilman was hopeful that the new contractor for the county will do a better job, but he said residents need to do their part too, specifically regarding trash and pet waste.

"I think this is a prime example of when government and citizens need to work together to get the job done," he said.

All involved in the effort were pleased when the County Council members complimented them for their organization and respectfulness. And O'Connell noted that each speaker has prepared and rehearsed talking points so that they go in armed with facts and statistics rather than just yelling or ranting.

"We believe that we have the Council's attention," said Lynne Mitchell, president of the Eastwood Residents and Business Community Association. "And that's what we wanted."

SPK, a Virginia-based company, uses 28-horse-power go-karts capable of reaching speeds as high as 72 mph, which are "the fastest concession karts in the western hemisphere," their Facebook page claims.

The Middle River Depot has been slated for major redevelopment over the last several years from a former airplane factory to a shopping and entertainment center, to include a new Super Walmart and the hopeful relocation of the Middle River MARC train station from the south to the north side of MD Route 43.

The redevelopment plan, dubbed Martin's Landing, consists of 12 pad sites at the front of the 62-acre property, the Super Walmart in the back and a variety of businesses in the main building, which would be renovated. But the building has been problematic because it is governed by a Maryland Historical Trust easement that mandates a certain percentage of it be preserved.

"You can't tear it down, you can't change it, you can't even board up a window," Bevins lamented.

However, SPK plans to utilize 500,000 square feet

of space in the building - fully half of its total square footage - with little renovations. So they can be open incredibly soon.

The company simply has to do some painting, lay down the track and fix the sprinkler system as per the fire code. As a result, they have signed a five-year lease and plan to open in June of this year.

Bevins explained that the business will be different from other local go-kart businesses like The Go-Kart Track in White Marsh and Autobahn Indoor Speedway in Essex in that those are mostly just for fun going around a track.

SPK is more of a learning experience to train at different levels and learn how to race them competitively, she said. "And by the time you're done, you can actually be a racecar driver. It's serious."

The business plans to accommodate different skill levels, such as actually training and racing or holding instruction to teach kids about driving and safety. They also hope to draw customers in from all around the region and as far away as New York as a weekend destination, as well as host things like team-building activities for local companies during the week.

"So I'm excited about something new and unique coming to Middle River," Bevins commented.

The noise from the gas-powered karts will be fully contained in the building and there is already adequate parking. But since there is nothing else currently operating at the Depot, they will be installing some signage.

Additionally, the business is anticipated to create approximately 40 jobs in the area for mechanics, flaggers and other needed employees.

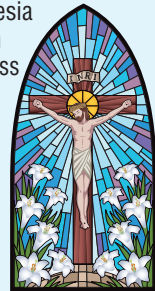

Police are investigating a hit and run crash in Dundalk involving a 13-year-old girl.

The girl was crossing Holabird Avenue near Searles Road when she was struck by a red Mercedes Benz. The car fled the area even though several witnesses tried to prevent the driver from leaving the scene. Witnesses said the car was displaying Maryland War of 1812 registration plates. The driver was described as a white male. There was a front seat passenger in the car, described as a white female.

The child was transported by County Fire Department personnel to Johns Hopkins Children Center for treatment. The girl is in stable condition and is expected to survive her injuries.

On March 18, police located the vehicle involved in the hit and run. On March 21, the driver of the vehicle was identified. Charges against him are pending further investigation.

Anyone with information regarding this incident is urged to contact Baltimore County police.

Fire crews rescue boy from well in Rosedale

Baltimore County Fire Department tactical rescue experts rescued an 11-year-old boy who had fallen into a well on the grounds of a Rosedale McDonald's during the evening on March 20.

Crews from Texas Station #17, home of the BCoFD's tactical unit, and confined space teams from Pikesville and Bowleys Quarters volunteer fire companies were among the units dispatched at 6:39 p.m. to the 6300 block of Kenwood Avenue.

Two 11-year-old boys had been playing outside the McDonald's when they fell into a 36-inch, stone-lined opening that was covered with landscape fabric and mulch. One of the boys started to fall into the hole but was able to get out before he fell in completely; he called for help. The other boy was stuck 30 to 45 feet below the surface.

Crews from Station 17's Tower 17 used a rope system to lower a firefighter into the hole, where he was able to reach the boy and secure him to a harness. At 7:15 p.m., rescue crews lifted both the boy and the firefighter to safety.

Both boys were transported to Johns Hopkins Children's Center with non-life-threatening injuries.

The hole appears to be an old well and is the property of McDonald's. Baltimore County Public Works crews have covered the well with a steel plate for safety.

MDTA police intercept over 8,000 packs of cigarettes

The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) police have arrested a New Jersey man who had more than 8,000 packs of untaxed cigarettes with a retail value exceeding \$51,000 in his car.

On Wednesday, March 16, an MDTA officer stopped Ronaldo R. Gracia, 42, of Newark, N.J., on northbound I-95 in White Marsh. Gracia, who was driving a 2007 GMC Yukon, had his vehicle's rear license plate obscured. After a brief roadside interview, the officers located cigarettes throughout the vehicle's interior and took Gracia into custody without incident.

"I am really grateful for the continuing victories our state's transportation law enforcement professionals are having in this ongoing battle against cigarette smugglers," said Maryland Comptroller Peter Franchot. "We have a truly efficient cross-government partnership with these men and women that is giving smugglers fits."

The MDTA police contacted the Field Enforcement Division of the Comptroller's office regarding the seizure, and an agent charged Gracia with transport-

ing cigarettes within Maryland without the tobacco tax being paid and unlawfully possessing more than 30 cartons of unstamped cigarettes. The total tax loss for the state of Maryland is \$16,040. In addition, the MDTA police charged Gracia with failure to maintain a legible registration plate free from foreign material.

The investigation revealed Gracia was traveling from Virginia to New Jersey. After processing, Gracia appeared before a District Court Commissioner where a \$75,000 bail was set.

In late February, the MDTA police also recovered more than 20,000 packs of untaxed cigarettes with a retail value exceeding \$133,000 following a traffic stop on I-95 in Baltimore County. In that instance, Ammar M. Shamahk, a 32-year-old man from North Carolina had been pulled over by an MDTA officer for exceeding the posted speed limit. He was traveling from North Carolina to New Jersey. The Comptroller's office put the total tax loss for the state at \$41,000. A District Court Commissioner set the bail for Shamahk at \$75,000.

The National Weather Service's "Turn Around, Don't Drown" campaign raises awareness about the hazards of attempting to drive through floodwaters.

Also, www.floodsmart.gov - the web site of the National Flood Insurance Program - is an extremely valuable resource about flood risks and flood insurance. The site contains the most recent information on flood maps and allows you to enter your zip code for information about your level of flood risk.

Though tornadoes are usually associated with the Midwest, they are fairly common in Maryland as well. The conditions that spawn tornadoes can occur at any time of year, but especially in spring and summer.

Bookmark the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) excellent resource on tornadoes, www.ready.gov/tornadoes. This site includes where to go and what to do when a tornado is sighted.

Be sure to stock up on supplies - such as water, canned foods, flashlights and batteries - before a major weather event leaves you in need.

House Republicans reveal impact of transportation proposal

House Republicans revealed on Tuesday, March 1, the impact of a Democratic proposal that would completely change the way the state funds transportation projects.

"House Bill 1013 upends a system that has worked for decades," said House Minority Whip Kathy Szeliga. "It discards the county's input on their transportation priorities and instead creates a scoring system for transportation projects that weighs heavily in favor of mass transit in urban areas."

Maryland already has a system in place to select transportation projects for the Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP). Every year, the secretary of transportation tours the state, holding public hearings and gathering input from citizens and elected officials. Each county sends a list of their transportation priorities and the projects are selected based on the priorities of the counties and the funding available.

Governor Hogan has invested an unprecedented \$2 billion across the state - dollars to fix every single structurally deficient bridge and move Maryland forward on the top-priority road projects in every jurisdiction of the state. House Bill 1013 creates

a scoring system where projects are awarded points based on various criteria. The scoring is weighed heavily in favor of urban areas and mass transit.

"This bill scores projects in different parts of the state in exactly the same way," said Delegate Bob Flanagan, who served as the transportation secretary from 2003 - 2007. "This fails to recognize that different parts of the state have different needs. For example, economic development might be more important in some parts of the state while congestion relief is more important in another. This weighting system gives no consideration for the various needs of the state."

"This legislation has far and long-reaching consequences for the future of Maryland's transportation infrastructure," said Delegate Jeff Ghrist. "Had this bill been enacted in 2015, Montgomery County would have received 96 percent of the transportation funding. Projects that would make our roads safer, such as the widening of the notoriously dangerous MD 404 on the Eastern Shore would not have received funding if this bill had passed last year. Transportation taxes are paid by all Marylanders, and the funding should benefit the entire state, not just one or two jurisdictions."

Ruppersberger, Young Introduce Bipartisan Bill to Help Protect Coastal Communities

Congressmen C.A. Dutch Ruppersberger (D-MD) and Don Young (R-AK) last week, for the fourth time, introduced bipartisan legislation that will help local and state governments build coastal resiliency along the nation's 95,000 miles of shoreline. The "Digital Coast Act" will provide coastal communities with updated mapping data that can be used to prepare for storms, manage floods, restore ecosystems and plan smarter developments near America's coasts, harbors, ports and shorelines.

Geospatial mapping information can be complicated, very expensive to collect and difficult to use without in-house expertise.

"America's fragile shorelines are home to more than half of our country's population and millions of businesses that supply most of our gross domestic product," Congressman Ruppersberger said. "Yet current coastal maps and geospatial data are woefully inaccurate, outdated or even nonexistent. The Digital Coast Act will give local planners and managers the high-tech data they need to make accurate decisions and smart investments that could save people and property."

"No other state in the nation understands the need for coastal

resilience and mapping more than Alaska," said Congressman Don Young. "With more than 44,000 miles of coastline, much of which is not fully mapped, Alaska's coastal communities rely heavily on our waterways and shipping channels to support all forms of social and economic prosperity: goods from the lower 48, critical transportation needs, search and rescue operations, and the state's largest private sector employer - our fishing industry. The Digital Coast Act is an important step towards developing a system that supports our coastal communities with up-to-date and reliable information on our coastlines and weather conditions."

The bill, H.R. 4738, creates the "Digital Coast" program at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), allowing it to begin a comprehensive mapping process and make the data available on its website for free and easy public access. NOAA will also train decision-makers at the local and state level on how to use the datasets to answer questions like, "What is the storm surge threat in this area?" or "How much will this bluff erode over the next decade?" or "What are water level trends at the marina where a dock is being built?"

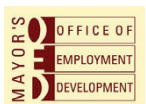

Obama follows Delegate McDonough's lead on sanctuary policies

The Justice Department maintained that it would be reviewing their current list of sanctuary cities and local subdivisions and would be cooperating with Congress in investigating whether or not there are others that are not currently on the list.

Furthermore, the Federal Bureau of Prisons stated that it will not release illegal immigrant criminals to a local community if they have a sanctuary policy. State and local facilities release 15,000 criminal illegals without notifying federal authorities.

So, the Obama administration and Delegate Pat McDonough have joined together in the spirit of enforcing federal law and protecting public safety.

Two bills that Delegate Pat McDonough has introduced to the General Assembly in Annapolis (HB 1282 and HB 1298) will, in fact, make it much easier for Maryland to comply with these new strict policies by the federal government. Delegate McDonough's legislation requires a simple 10-day pre-release notification to be provided by local officials to the immigration authorities as to when a criminal illegal is to be released.

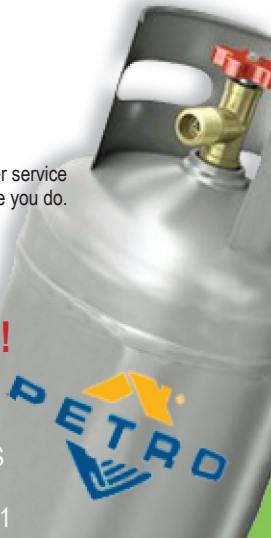

Faith-based movies are certainly in vogue at theaters nationwide right now, as evidenced by the wide release of current flicks like "Miracles From Heaven" and "Risen;" the box-office success of such recent money-makers as "God's Not Dead" and "Heaven Is for Real;" and the anticipated release of such forthcoming films as "God's Not Dead 2" and the remake of "Ben-Hur." These flicks definitely have appeal to the target demographic. Like a Michael Moore or Dinesh D'Souza documentary, they are mostly "preaching to the choir" films, though.

But I always find flicks that are not specifically religious movies but have religious, or at least spiritual, scenes in them to be somewhat more believable than films in which no one mentions God or prays or goes to church. If the Earth really was attacked by aliens or the country really was plunged back into war, there would be a lot of people in pews. Then, there are those mainstream flicks where characters have much smaller crises, but the script still works in some form of spiritual belief to add texture.

So, as I was writing up my recent review of "Miracles From Heaven," I asked myself, "What are some my favorite scenes involving religion in non-religious movies?" I immediately discounted films that had innately religious settings like "Sister Act" or "The Sound of Music." Films with priests as central characters like "The Exorcist" were also not considered. I also left out any film dealing with the Afterlife like "What Dreams May Come"

or "Defending Your Life."

I'm talking films that have nothing do with faith in any way... except for a scene or two where suddenly a character or characters' belief system was suddenly and organically brought into the plot for the betterment of the film. Here are my top five:

1) "Glory" - One of the great Civil War films of all time, chronicling the heroic exploits of the all-black 54th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry under the command of Col. Robert Gould Shaw (Matthew Broderick). My favorite scene in the movie is where members of the 54th gather the night before the climactic battle of Fort Wagner and pray aloud and sing hymns knowing that, for many, tomorrow will be that "great gettin' up morning."

2) "Independence Day" - There are few alien invasion movies where as the E.T.'s lay waste to the Earth, you get a scene of a Jewish man (Judd Hirsh's Julius) holding a prayer circle to calm the nerves of some scared children and one recently fired Secretary of Defense. When James Rebhorn's warhawk Albert Nimzicki gets pulled into the circle, he protests, "I'm not Jewish." To which Julius replies, "Nobody's perfect."

3) "Election" - I love the scene where three of the four main characters - Type-A high school go-getter Tracy Flick (Reese Witherspoon), her class president rival, Paul Metzler (Chris Klein); and his angry, adopted sister Tammy (Jessica Campbell) - separately pray to Jesus and God for things they want. Despite some R-rated content, I think it's actually one of the most realistic depictions of communing



with the Creator ever put on film. It shows the kind of odd, self-involved things that people more often than not actually pray for rather than the open-hearted, selfless things they should pray for.

4) "Highlander" - For centuries, an epic showdown has been brewing between the unredeemably evil Kurgan (Clancy Brown) and the good-hearted Connor MacLeod (Christopher Lambert). When the two Immortals finally meet, it's 1985 in a Manhattan church where Connor has come to honor a lost love from centuries earlier. You're thinking, "Oh *bleep*! It's on!" But then we learn that churches are neutral ground for Immortals. So, instead of a huge swordfight, we get a darkly

funny, character-based scene in the middle of a film marked by grandiose action and flashy music-video tricks.

5) "The Sessions" - There's a great scene where Mark, who has been confined to an iron lung on account of his polio, consults with William H. Macy's Father Brendan about losing his virginity. His plan is to hire a sex surrogate. But because he is a devout Catholic, he fears such intimacy out of wedlock will be a sin. Father Brandon considers the man's debilitating illness, takes into account his devotion to God and eventually answers, "I have a feeling God is going to give you a free pass on this one. Go for it."

'MIRACLES FROM HEAVEN'

is a hell of a good faith-based film

At one point, the new film "Miracles From Heaven" quotes Albert Einstein when he was asked about matters of faith. Al answered that, in his view, there are two kinds of people in this world: "Those who believe nothing is a miracle, and those who believe everything is a miracle." That's kind of the point this new movie tries to make, and does - that every once in a while, for those who believe and those who want to believe, a bona fide miracle happens in the world. But in order for that miracle to happen, a whole lot of smaller, less heralded miracles have to happen along the way - instances of

good-hearted people coming together for a few seconds or longer to help the miraculous along.

"Miracles From Heaven" is based on real events. Is it based on a true story? That's something for you to decide for yourself. My purpose as a reviewer is to determine whether it's a good movie, a good representative of its genre, and worth the time and money of both its target audience and those outside the target audience open to the experience. In my estimation, the answers to those questions are all "Yes!" This is the best of the recent slate of faith-based movies to hit cinemas.

Jennifer Garner and Martin Henderson star as Christy and Kevin Beam, a happily married Texas couple with three beautiful daughters. One night, their middle child Anna (Kylie Rogers) runs to the bathroom and throws up. A couple of weeks later, they find her in her bed writhing in pain from repeated stomach aches. She is diagnosed with an incurable intestinal disease that will require her to be fed through a tube and on heavy medications the rest of her likely short life.

But Christy refuses to give up. She finds a specialist in Boston, Dr. Nurko (Eugenio Derbez, excellent in the role), who is testing an experimental drug treatment for people with Anna's condition. If successful, she may be able to eat some solid food and not be in such constant pain. But the treatments and the travel between Texas and Massachusetts are terribly expensive, and Kevin already mortgaged the home to expand his veterinary practice. There are people who show kindness to the Beam family along the way - specifically John Carroll Lynch's Pastor Scott and Queen Latifah's quirky waitress, Angela - but credit cards have limits, as do people. When Dr. Nurko's drug treatments stop working, the end seems near for little Anna.

And that's when what many consider to be a miracle happened. If you are unfamiliar with the true-life story or

book by Christy Beam that this film is based on or haven't seen the trailer which has given away pretty much the whole friggin' movie, I won't spoil the third act here. I will say that the film is gently played and extremely well acted. I liked that characters like Pastor Scott and Dr. Nurko were people who freely admit they don't have all the answers. They have ideas and opinions, beliefs and suppositions. But not answers to questions like "Why does one person get cured when others don't?" or "Why is that person made to suffer and others aren't?"



It's a movie that honors the journey we're on and seeks only to provide a ray of hope. I recently was part of a Facebook thread where a bunch of my movie geek buddies and I celebrated our mutual love for "The Exorcist." I've always maintained that the 1973 fright-fest is effective because you legitimately feel the presence of real evil in the film. And if that's possible, I believe it was Billy Graham or maybe Seth Gecko who reasoned that the exact opposite can and should be true - that there are films out there where you can also feel the presence of real and genuine goodness throughout. "Miracles From Heaven" is one of those movies.

"Miracles From Heaven" is rated PG for thematic material, including accident and medical issues.

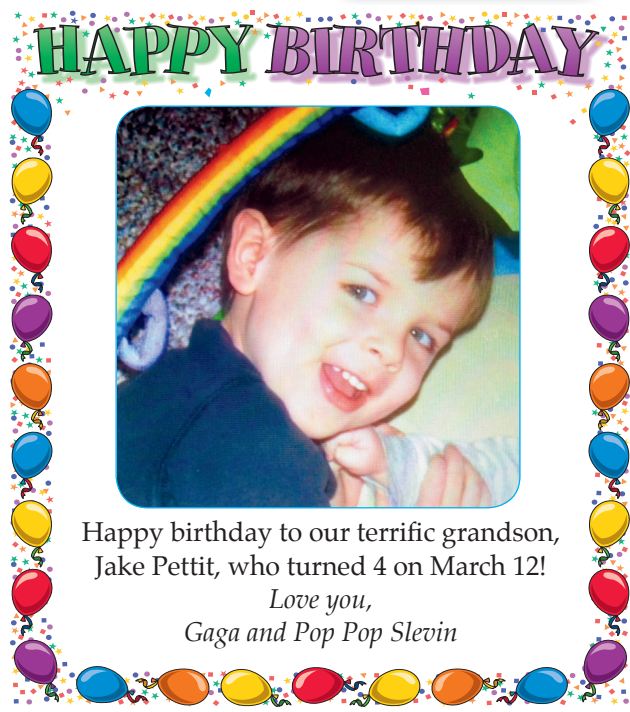
