Homeless families in 10-county area may lose area shelters

During this time of year when temperatures start to drop, many people's thoughts turn to hunting, winter sports or celebrating the coming holidays.

For those who face homelessness, cold temperatures are more than a chilling thought.

According to Pamela Streed, Executive Director at New Pathways, Inc., there are many reasons people become homeless. Usually, it is a string of events and a family just doesn't have the resources to overcome the deficit. Many are the result of losing employment, which could be caused by a layoff, termination, or injury preventing them from working. There could be a separation between parents (including the result of domestic abuse) that makes one suddenly homeless. Some people come directly from substance abuse

treatment, because they have

no other place to go. "Initially, a lot of people double up," said Streed, "which means they temporarily stay with friends or family and then suddenly they have to leave, because something changes with that situation a family member doesn't want them there or they are causing

the host family to violate their lease which puts that family at risk for eviction."

New Pathways helps homeless families in the Brainerd and Cambridge area which includes Aitkin, Cass, Chisago, Crow Wing, Isanti, Kanabec, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Pine, and Todd counties

New Pathways is the only family shelter program operating in the 10-county area, and turns families away frequently due to lack of capacity. The need becomes even greater in the winter, as people find it more difficult to stay in temporary dwellings like tents or cars.

Last year, New Pathways served 192 family members at both of their locations, 110 of those were children.

In the Brainerd Lakes area alone, New Pathways helped 113 people, 65 of those were children from July 2016 to June, 2016-2017.

In Brainerd, New Pathways, can shelter six families or a total of 18 people at a time.

"They must be families," said Streed, "meaning at least one adult and one child, under the age of 18. We have 17 people in shelter in Brainerd and our maximum is 18, so we are at capacity

right now. We are typically at capacity, especially in the winter months, and regularly turn families away due to not having enough capacity."

Although New Pathways consistently averages 80 percent of their families finding stable housing, a federal housing grant will no longer be available for shelters next

New Pathways was recently informed that they will lose their Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding, effective June 2018. As the **HUD** contribution makes up half of the program budget, this is threatening the future services for homeless fam-

"If we are unable to recoup the funding,"said Streed, "we might have to decrease the number of people we serve, or we might have to decrease the amount of services we currently provide to them, [such as] case management with a licensed social worker and family education."

"We are very grateful to the communities who have supported us for over 15 years, and we are hoping they will help us continue to serve them for many years to come", said Streed.

To offset the loss of federal grant funding, New Pathways is launching Path to Home 350, an emergency fundraising campaign, immediately.

"Three hundred and fifty pledges of \$50 per month would cover our loss", said Streed. "We are hoping to find 350 generous donors in each of the counties we serve".

For those who cannot provide a monthly monetary gift, there are other ways to help.

"Any donation – monetary or other - is welcome, said

New Pathways regularly need supplies for the families that they serve and their day center as well. Items like laundry detergent, family transportation, gas cards, personal care items, toilet paper, paper plates are always needed.

"We will soon be posting a wish list on our web site,"





Harvest up by less than a percent Hunters register 70,724 deer during first weekend of season

Minnesota firearms down 5 percent and Zone 3,

hunters registered 70,724 deer during the first two days of deer season, according to the Department of Natural Resources.

Preliminary numbers from opening weekend show that the number of deer registered was essentially the same as from 2016. Of the deer harvested, 57 percent were bucks, compared to 67 percent of the first weekend harvest of 2016.

In Zone 1, in northeastern Minnesota, total firearms harvest was up 16 percent. In Zone 2, which covers the majority of the state and runs from Canada to Iowa, harvest was

in southeastern Minnesota. was down 20 percent.

"We expected to see an increased harvest this year, and that appears to be so in Zone 1. In the other zones where the first weekend harvest is off, it could be that the amount of standing corn negatively affected deer harvest," said Steve Merchant, wildlife populations and regulations manager. "If that is the case, we should see improved deer harvest as more corn is harvested."

Based upon the number of antlerless permits available and the number of permit areas that allow multiple deer to be taken, the DNR is projecting the 2017 total

deer harvest to be around 200,000. The 2016 total harvest was 173,213.

In much of Minnesota,

the deer season continues through Sunday, Nov. 12. Additional deer will be harvested during the northern rifle zone season, which continues through Sunday, Nov. 19; the late southeast season, which runs Saturday, Nov. 18, through Sunday, Nov. 26; and the muzzleloader season, which begins Saturday, Nov. 25, and continues through Sunday, Dec. 10. More information on deer management can be found at mndnr.gov/deer.

Minnesota DNR to allow Mille Lacs Lake winter anglers one slot walleye

Mille Lacs Lake walleye fishing will open on Friday, Dec. 1, with no bait restrictions and a limit of one walleye 20-22 inches or one longer than 28 inches.

"We're glad results of fall population survey show Mille Lacs anglers will be able to keep some walleve during the winter walleye season," said Don Pereira, fisheries section chief for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "We know this is important to resorts and businesses because the ice fishing season contributes a lot to the local economy."

The DNR selected the size regulations to protect Mille Lacs' walleye spawning population, which is largely comprised of walleyes hatched in 2013 (also known as a year class). Those fish currently range from 15 to 19 inches in length and represented about 40 percent of the walleyes sampled during this fall's population survey.

Since the 2013 year class now is nearly fully mature, the DNR determined anglers could keep older and larger fish, something some anglers

have been suggesting and requesting. In recent years, conservative regulations on Mille Lacs have protected the younger spawners to-be so they can replace the older spawners, which is necessary to sustain the population.

The DNR and members of the Mille Lacs Fisheries Advisory Committee did discuss setting the large fish limit at 26 inches. But feedback suggested that keeping those fish in the lake was preferred because the possibility of catching walleye 26 to 28 inches makes Mille Lacs an attractive destination. There also was concern that a 26-inch limit could result in a higher harvest level that would count against the 2018 allocation. Insights from annual fall surveys

Mille Lacs fall walleye population survey, known as an "assessment," showed that the 2013 year class continues to dominate the population. The catch of walleye hatched in 2014, 2015 and 2016 was below average. Fish hatched this spring were caught in good numbers but it's uncertain if those numbers will remain as

the 2017 year class progresses through its first, second and third years.

"During the past 15 years, our studies show fewer and fewer young walleye surviving to their third year," Pereira said. "Young fish not surviving has put Mille Lacs' walleye population in the unfortunate situation it is now. Whatever is causing that mortality is the root problem."

The assessment also looks at food abundance and walleye health. Perch 1-2 years old were caught in low numbers and the number of young-ofyear perch was above average. The number of young-of-year tullibee caught was near av-

Perch and tullibee are the primary food source for Mille Lacs' walleye, which are showing negative effects from a lack of adequate food. That shortage may be driving the hot walleve bite anglers have experienced on Mille Lacs.

FSA deadlines fast approaching

In order to comply with FSA program eligibility requirements, all producers are encouraged to visit the Crow Wing/Cass/Aitkin/Itasca County FSA office to file an accurate crop certification report by the applicable deadline.

The following acreage reporting dates are all applicable: November 15 - Apiculture, Perennial Forage, Fall-Seeded Small Grains for 2018; January 2, 2018- Honey; January 15, 2018 - Apples and July 15, 2018 - Beans (Black Turtle, Great Northern, Dark Red Kidney, Light Red Kidney, White Kidney, Lima, Pea, Pink, Pinto, Small White/Navy), Forage Seeding, Grass Seed, all other crops

The following exceptions apply to the above acreage reporting dates:

· If the crop has not been planted by the above acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.

· If a producer acquires additional acreage after the above acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 30 calendars days after purchase or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.

· If a perennial forage crop is reported with the intended use of "cover only," "green manure," "left standing," or "seed," then the acreage must be reported by July 15th.

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop begins.
