Residents increasingly frustrated by falling train bridge debris

Even a not-so-close look from an untrained eye will reveal that the outward appearance of some of the train bridges in Essex and Middle River is a bit of a sorry sight, which might give some drivers pause when crossing under them.

And despite assurances that the area's bridges are safe for trains to cross, community members are increasingly concerned that the traffic underneath them is not safe from concrete and other debris falling from the bridges.

For Bob Driscoll, president of the Aero Acres Civic Improvement Association, the issue goes back several years. And he has been working in earnest to find a solution for at least the last year, albeit with little progress.

After contacting the Maryland State Highway Administration, which maintains Martin Boulevard, to find out who is responsible for the bridge over that roadway, Driscoll received a response from an SHA representative advising him that Amtrak owns, maintains and is responsible for that particular bridge.

The response also noted that, in SHA's opinion, "the bridge needs attention, which [Amtrak] acknowledged."

With still no response from Amtrak, the community got Congressman C.A. Dutch Ruppersberger involved in April 2015 to contact Amtrak on their behalf and describe their concerns.

A month later, Amtrak's vice president of governmental affairs and corporate communications, Joe McHugh, responded to Ruppersberger and the community that an inspection of the Martin Boulevard bridge revealed breaking away, or "spalling," of the concrete on the bridge, which was falling and exposing the underlying rebar.

McHugh's response also noted that a more thorough inspection had been scheduled but was postponed due to the unrest in Baltimore City in April of last year. That inspection was to be rescheduled to look at the spalling, rebar and potential for falling debris.

Having heard nothing further, Essex-Middle River Civic Council President Bob Bendler, on behalf of the broader community, sent a letter to McHugh on Sept. 2, 2015, requesting an update on how Amtrak was addressing the situ-

Again a month later, on Oct. 8, Principal Officer of Amtrak Governmental Affairs William Hollister responded on behalf of McHugh that the second inspection had occurred on Sept. 24 to look at the condition of the bridge and the spalling concrete. As a result, they determined that the concrete spalling and exposed

steel stirrups (rebar) "do not compromise the structural capacity for the bridge to safely carry its intended loads," Hollister said.

He added that local Amtrak engineering workers would spend some time in the "immediate future" scaling and removing any further loose material and "continue to monitor the situation in the future."

Following that response, Driscoll and Bendler had noticed that much more loose concrete had been removed from the bridge and some paint had appeared in the areas where concrete was removed.

However, Driscoll observed that it looked like the sections had been painted, then scraped. "But that kind of works against their stance that the bridges are structurally sound," he said.

Amtrak spokesperson Chelsea Kopta stated that they did spend time removing loose spalling and, in the process, markings were made to the bridge to identify which concrete areas were to be removed.

And while the bridge over Martin Boulevard has been the most visible and main focus, the bridge over Golden Ring Road near Orems Road in Essex and the one crossing the Gunpowder River into Harford County have also been of

EMRCC weighs in on zoning issues in their sphere of interest

At its March 2 meeting, the Essex-Middle River Civic Council sat down with staff members from the Baltimore County Office of Planning to scrutinize the requested zoning changes within their boundaries that have been raised during this year's Comprehensive Zoning Map Process.

And while the EMRCC's membership was disappointed to learn that the Planning Staff was running behind in finalizing their recommendations for the changes, they at least had the opportunity to gloss over each issue raised, find out what the petitioner is planning to do and note their support, opposition or lack of a position on the matter.

The finalized Planning Staff recommendations for the CZMP issues were anticipated to be released next week.

In observing the issues and hearing the plans, the EMRCC followed a general theme of supporting lower residential density and opposing the issues seeking to increase it.

The council is "generally in favor of downzoning," said EMRCC Vice President Tom Germroth, because so much development has begun to occur suddenly on the east side of Baltimore County in the last few years.

This new development is largely a result of projects and zoning changes that were approved before the housing market crash of 2008, but the projects only recently commenced once the market bounced back. This has brought a flood

of new school, traffic and environmental concerns to the community.

A prime showcase of the organization's stance on density came early in the discussion when looking at issue number 6-003. This issue requests a zoning change from mostly light manufacturing on an 11.7-acre property to nearly all DR 16 (16 residences per acre). This change would allow up to 187 new residences to be built on the plot, which is currently undeveloped and forested.

The petitioner is proposing to build apartments on the site, located at Leland and Magnolia Avenues in Middle River. But Planning staffer Ngone Diop admitted that the site is challenged by a number of environmental constraints and poor traffic access.

"Leland Avenue cannot handle much traffic," Diop said.

And while she could not say definitively whether or not the planning staff thinks that is too much density for the site, "we'll hope the Planning Office sees it that way," said EMRCC President Bob

Other such potential changes included issue number 6-010 which requests a change from mostly Office designation to a residential and office classification on a nearly 23-acre plot.

The petitioner's proposal, Diop said, is for townhomes and medical office space. And that designation allows for residential housing up to 10.5 homes per acre. The EMRCC noted their opposition to this, as well as to the six-acre property

next to it - issue number 6-011 - which requested the same change.

Other major items on the civic council's radar were issues 6-014 and 6-013, which have to do with the site of the proposed Paragon outlet mall and the adjacent property owned by Corporate Office Properties Trust, respectively.

COPT is requesting a change on their nearly 30-acre property, fully zoned for light manufacturing, to Business Major, some of which would allow for automotive services such as a convenience store with a gas station.

Diop explained that the proposal for the site is for a such a convenience store, but that there is an approved planned unit development (PUD) in place for 250 multifamily homes there.

The EMRCC membership explained that they would support this zoning change if it were to negate the existing PUD.

However, it is difficult to say if that would be possible since a PUD is approved over an underlying zoning and is an exception to it. Zoning changes do not counteract PUDs and PUDs do not re-write or circumvent zoning.

The Paragon outlet mall property's requested change would effectively render the pending referendum for County Council Bill 53-15 moot because it would put the property under the zoning that that bill would essentially allow.

While some at the EMRCC meeting felt that it is important to let the referendum run its course and go to the voters, others expressed concern that it could go

to the voters who may be under a false impression of what the referendum is really about.

"If it goes to the voters and they are under the wrong impression that the referendum is [protecting the people's] ability to speak [on government decisions], we're going to lose," said Janet Terry, president of the Bird River Restoration Campaign, an environmental advocacy group.

Paragon negotiated with the communities to remove 1,250 homes from their approved plan for the site, as well as to abide by the most current environmental regulations and provide certain traffic infrastructure improvements, including a ramp from Philadelphia Road onto eastbound MD-43.

"We're going to get no housing if Paragon goes through; we will get only retail," Terry stressed. "This is not a bad deal," she said, adding that without the outlet mall the property would revert back to 1,250 homes with no traffic improvements and 1980s environmental standards.

EMRCC member Ed Kramer also pointed out that the White Marsh Volunteer Fire Company is eventually moving to a site across from the outlet mall site and are depending on that eastbound MD-43 ramp being constructed. It is not planned for funding or construction by the state for another 10 years, he said.

Ultimately, the EMRCC membership voted in a split decision, nine voting community associations to two, to support the zoning change and the outlet mall.

\$1 million in cash, private plane seized from Martin State Airport

The Department of Homelane Security (DHS) announced last week that they seized a private airplane and \$1 million in cash from Martin State Airport late in the evening on March. 1.


Teaming up with the Maryland State Police and Baltimore County Police, a DHS task force noticed suspicious activity from a private plane that had landed at the airport. A K-9 inspection of the baggage on board and the exterior of the plane turned up enough to get the task force a search warrant. Bundles of currency were found at the scene, totaling

"With the support of our law enforcement partners, we have inflicted a significant hit on the criminal organizations that exploit our communities for financial gain," said Special Agent Andre R. Watson in a release. "We will continue to target their illicit cash and disrupt their destructive business model."

According to a spokesperson with DHS, private airports are often used by smugglers because they present less risk. With larger airports like Baltimore Washington International and Dulles, the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) is able to keep an eye on things. But smaller airports don't have that luxury.

The spokesperson also noted that utilizing smaller


airports means that smugglers are not reliant on an inside man, with internal conspiracies most likely to take place at larger airports.

When it comes to suspicious activity, agents look for anything out of the ordinary. Among other activities, agents will look for a flight plan. FAA records list the plane as being owned by Jet Zee LLC, a company based in Newport Beach, Ca. However, the plane could not be found on <u>flighttracker.com</u>. Other suspicious activity agents look for is planes avoiding well-lit areas of airports, as well as the type and amount of baggage on the plane.

CBS had originally reported that the money most likely came from illegal gun running, but the East

County Times has learned that it's more likely the case that the money was involved with drug sales. The DHS spokesperson stated that K-9s are primarily used to find money that has been in the presence of bulk quantities of drugs. The smell of the drugs will settle on the currency which may not be noticeable to humans, but is absolutely noticeable to a K-9.

Smuggling can result in a maximum penalty of 20 years in federal prison and the seizure of all money. According to officials, transnational criminal groups use a network of sophisticated smuggling operations and tactics to move illicit proceeds in, around and out of the United States. Targeting criminal assets is the most effective way of fighting smuggling.

Royal Farms seeks new location at Fullerton Bingo site

A new Royal Farms convenience store could replace the long-standing Fullerton Manor Bingo on Belair Road if a zoning change and delevopment plan are approved by Baltimore County.

According to Royal Farms spokes-

woman Brittany Eldridge, the proposal calls for the demolition of the current building at the site, located at 7560 Belair Road in Fullerton, and construction of a 5,300-square-foot "recon" store, which would be smaller than the current building.

The building would have seating and

a full menu of food items, Edlridge said. And the plan includes six gas pumps (12 filling spots) and a car wash as well. Completion would be expected toward the end of 2018.

The plan, presented at the Feb. 16 meeting of the Linover Improvement Association, would require a zoning change on the property from its current designation - a combination of local business and residential - to one that allows gas stations and automotive service businesses.

That zoning change has been request-- see **FULLERTON** on page 5 -

ed during the Comprehensive Zoning Map Process currently taking place in the county in the form of issue number 6-002. Under the request, the two-acre property would be uniformly designated as BL-AS (Business Local, Automotive Service).

Questions at the LIA meeting ranged from concerns about the environment, crime and loitering, the bus stop nearby and especially traffic.

LIA President Caitlin Klimm, who posted on Facebook about the meeting but declined to give direct comment to the East County Times, said that about 100

people attended the meeting expressing concerns about traffic on Belair Road as a result of the project, as well as the school bus stop that is currently located at the Bingo site. Both, she was told, would be the county's responsibility.

Royal Farms would be looking into working on the trash pickup schedule so as not to disturb the nearby residents on Glade Avenue, but representatives told the group that they believe the entrance off of Glade Avenue is warranted.

Royal Farms representatives explained at the meeting, according to the post, that they have not yet done a traffic study, however.

While Eldridge explained that Royal

Farms has not yet begun exploring the storm water management for the property - which is significant because of its proximity to Stemmers Run - or any potential waivers they might seek, she said they do not often seek waivers and usually go in under the current storm water regulations.

They will actually be seeking to increase their storm water management at the location by capturing and retaining all water that falls on the site, she said.

Additionally, all water from the car wash would be captured and filtered.

Royal Farms would also not be buying the property. Instead, they would hold a 40-year lease should the plan be approved.

But Dennis Teegardin, senior legislative aide to County Councilwoman Cathy Bevins, said the plan has not yet been submitted to the county. And the councilwoman does not make up her mind on zoning decisions until she has walked the property and understands the project, which Teegardin said she would be making appointments to do this week. The County Council will decide on the zoning change in September.

The LIA plans to take an official vote of support or opposition to the project at its March 15 meeting.



significant concern.

After hearing continued complaints about falling concrete and debris from the undersides of bridges,

Benler sent yet another letter to McHugh on Dec. 17 requesting an update on what work had been performed since their Oct. 8 correspondence and asking why the material continues to fall.

"We are pleased that Amtrak's inspection of the structure on Sept. 24 revealed that the concrete spalling and exposed steel stirrups do not compromise the structural capacity for the bridge to safely carry its intended loads," Bendler wrote in the letter, obtained by the East County Times. "However, Amtrak must also recognize its responsibility for the safety of the traffic under the bridge as well as over the bridge."

He also sent an email to Hollister with the same concerns and requests, to which Hollister replied that crews had removed the spalling concrete and their bridge inspector would be monitoring the situation as well.

As of last month, Hollister had continued to assure that the spalling concrete was being removed and monitored and that it was not creating an unsafe condition.

But following a Feb. 19 visit to the Martin Boulevard bridge, during which Bendler found the conditions to be "totally unsatisfactory," he renewed his grievances with the bridges to Hollister and stated, "Spalling continues to occur and I believe this is a very unsafe condition.

"If you have not personally visited the sites, I

request you do so," Bendler wrote. "Your Engineering Department has done little or nothing to address the ongoing safety concerns of our communities. The recent weather, with the freezing and thawing, has further exacerbated the problem," he said, adding that the water dripping through the bridge during the winter has further cracked the concrete, as well as created

icicles which themselves could create a hazard. And to illustrate the gravity of the situation, Bendler brought a three-pound hunk of concrete, which he found on the roadway under the Martin Boulevard bridge and plopped it on a table at the March 2 EMRCC meeting.

"The fear is obviously that this can fall onto a moving vehicle and cause serious personal injury or property damage," Bendler said. And community members have expressed concerns that nothing will be done to change the situation until a serious injury or death occurs from it.

Amtrak plans to further remove any loose concrete material and apply a concrete sealer to the spalled areas before next winter, according to Kopta. "Amtrak is also committed to monitoring the bridge in the future,"

"All we want is to make this a safe situation," Bendler told the Times. "And I don't think that's too much to ask."

Last second heroics lift Perry Hall past Springbrook, onto state semifinal

The Perry Hall Gators battled the Springbrook Blue Devils on Friday night in a game that came down to the wire. With four seconds left and the game tied at 60, Darrell Green put in a layup to put Perry Hall in front. Springbrook still had one opportunity, but the potential game-tying lay in rimmed out as time expired, giving Perry Hall the win and securing a trip to College Park to take place in a state semifinal matchup.

Perry Hall and Springbrook started off the game exchanging jabs, with neither team really able to take much of a lead. Springbrook's Falu Seck, coming off of a 47-point performance, looked like he was going to continue on his tear after hitting two three pointers in the first quarter and giving the Blue Devils an 11-7 lead. But the Gators stormed back with seven unanswered points to end the quarter.

The Gators took a 14-11 lead into the second quarter and stepped up their

pressure on Springbrook, utilizing a full court press to perfection. The Gators started off the second quarter with another seven-point run, extending the lead to 21-13.

The Gators, whose record now sits at 21-3, had to rely on their size and athleticism to keep Springbrook at bay.

Despite hitting their first two three point attempts, Perry Hall struggled shooting the ball. The Gators would end up missing their next ten shots from behind the arc. Perry Hall also struggled from the foul line, hitting only half of their free throw attempts.

Even with their lackluster shooting, Perry Hall managed to put points on the board. They had a very clear size advantage over the Blue Devils, and the Gators utilized that advantage to perfection, consistently feeding the ball into the post for the big men.

The Perry Hall frontcourt also did incredibly well on the boards, giving the Gators a bunch of second- and

With a 33-28 lead at the half, things were looking food for Perry Hall. Perry Hall's defense was so strong in the third quarter that they actually managed to keep Springbrook in single digits, extending their lead to nine.

From there, it came down to one final play for the Gators, with Darrell Green capitalizing and lifting Perry Hall into the state semifinal. The Blue Devils were looking for their third consecutive 4A North title and 20th appearance at College Park.

Hardnett finished as the game's top scorer, followed closely by junior Anthony Higgs. Reece Wiseman finished as the team's third leading scorer with a respectable nine points.

The Perry Hall Gators will now

travel to College Park on Thursday, March 10, to play Eleanor Roosevelt at the Xfinity Center at 7 p.m.

Roosevelt knocked off Bladensburg on Friday night by a score of 59-54 to take the 4A South title. That game was not without its dramatic moments, with the contest stretching into double overtime. A clock malfunction at the end of the first overtime gave Roosevelt an extra second to play with and allowed them to tie it up before walking away with the win in double overtime. Bladensburg is protesting the decision.



Dundalk man charged with Second Degree Rape

Baltimore County Police have charged a Dundalk man with impersonating a police officer and sexually assaulting two women.

On Feb. 22, Baltimore County Police responded to an area hospital in reference to a rape. They met with a 25-year-old woman who told them that on Feb. 21 at approximately 7 p.m., she was at Dundalk Avenue and Graceland Avenue attempting to solicit sex for money. The suspect picked her up in a car and agreed to pay her for sex. They drove to the dead end of Crafton Avenue and got out of the car. The suspect then pulled handcuffs and a badge from his pocket and told her he was with the Baltimore County Police Department. He also told her that she was going to be taken to "Precinct 12" and asked her "What would you do to stay out of jail." The suspect then had sexual intercourse with her. She did not scream because she was afraid of the suspect. The suspect then drove her back to Dundalk Avenue and Graceland Avenue where he dropped her off.

On Feb. 28 at 7:43 p.m., police responded to the dead end of Crafton Avenue for a suspicious vehicle. When they arrived, they found a car occupied by a man and a 34-year-old woman. This incident played out the same way as the Feb. 22 incident. Detectives determined that the man was responsible both incidents and had never been employed as a police officer.

The suspect has been identified as 30-year-old Brian Keith Cooper Jr. of the 2000-block of Bear Ridge Road in Dundalk. He has been charged with second-degree rape, second-degree sex offense, impersonating a police officer and related charges. He was released on \$350,000 bail. Dundalk woman arrested on drug charges

The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) police arrested a local woman and man who had marijuana and hashish with a street value of approximately \$500 and a large amount of currency in their car on March 3.

Dellis' Restaurant celebrates St. Patrick with special menu

When most people think of the Irish, the first thing that comes to mind is drinking or potatoes. For me, however, the first thing I think of is shepard's pie, or the Irish burrito bowl as I like to call it. And with March being the home of St. Patrick's Day, it makes a lot of sense for restaurants to add some Irish specialties. And when it comes to specialty menus, few restaurants can touch Dellis' Restaurant Bar & Grill in Rosedale.

Dellis' is probably most known for their Octoberfest menu, but their St. Patrick's Day menu is just as delicious. Complete with shephard's pie, Irish lamb stew, bangers & mashed and other glorious entrees, this menu has something for everyone.

My colleague and I went to Dellis' to test out the specialty menu, and we were floored. The meal started with the creamy leek and potato soup, an Irish beginner that always leaves you wanting more. The potatoes were plump and the leaks were juicy and mild. Being a cream based soup, it's filling as well.

The standout of the entrees was the shephard's pie, which came out simmering. The shephard's pie con-

sists of ground beef, lamb and pork mixed with fresh peas and carrots topped with mashed potatoes and baked like a casserole. It was cooked to perfection. Besides possessing all of the key tastes of Ireland, this is an entree you'll most likely have to split as the serving size is huge.

Big serving sizes were a staple of the day, with the corned beef and cabbage and the fish & chips each providing us with ample amounts of food. The fish was golden and crispy, and with two large cuts you'll most likely be taking home leftovers.

I would say you'll be taking home some of the Irish lamb stew as well, but there's little chance that any will be left on the plate. The stew came with golden boiled potatoes, peas and large cuts of carrot. The lamb chunks were massive and deliciously tender, and mixed with the white sauce there was plenty of flavor.

And of course, the bangers & mashed were sublime. The homemade sausage tastes a bit like a breakfast sausage, only without the maple taste. Served with mashed potatoes topped with fried onions and gravy, this is a standout dish. Much like the sheph-


ard's pie, this is a concoction meant to be mixed.

Durgin falls for new Gerard Butler actioner

"London Has Fallen" is neither a good movie nor a bad movie. Rather, it is a movie you simply have to be in the mood for. If you're in the mood for a loud, violent, mindless shoot 'em up, this is your flick. If you're in the mood for a cerebral political thriller in which America's geo-political policies and positions are thoughtfully explored and you're challenged to question whether the U.S. has been in the right or wrong on all matters terrorism and foreign policy... eh, have you seen the commercials for this thing?!

What can I say? I know this movie is getting lambasted by reviewers. But with all that's going on in politics and entertainment and the news, I was totally up for Gerard Butler's intrepid Secret Service agent, Mike Banning, dodging, like, a million bullets and shooting, stabbing, neck-snapping and exploding roughly 150 to 200 bad guys after they bombed the doo-doo out of London and killed most of the G-8 leaders. London has fallen? I might have fallen for this movie while waiting in line to get popcorn. I looked over at the poster and read the film's tagline: "Prepare for... bloody Hell!" It's been a long time since I chuckled at a poster, and this one did it.

The film picks up a couple of years after the original, "Olympus Has Fallen," after North Korean extremists attacked the White House, took Aaron Eckhart's widowed President Asher and much of his Cabinet hostage and forced the downand-out Banning to rush in and save the day. Here, a Yemeni arms dealer Aamir Barkawi (Alon Aboutboul) and his ruthless son, Kamran (Waleed Zuaiter), have vowed revenge for a drone strike two years prior in which Aamir's daughter/Kamran's sister and her new husband were killed on their wedding day. Somehow, they have managed to replace half of London's police force and most of the Buckingham Palace guard with cutthroats sympathetic to their cause. They also bomb London Bridge, Westminster Abbey and multiple other sites in and around London during the funeral of the British Prime Minister.

But Banning is in charge of the U.S. security detail, and he manages to get Asher out and on the run throughout the British capital. Because the Barkawis have done such a good job of infiltrating all levels of British security, government and law enforcement, you can never be sure of which cop, British agent or government operative is really an ally or a turncoat. Banning pretty much just kills them all and sorts it out later. Butler is pretty great in the role, commanding, masculine and unapologetically lethal. All other name stars in the film - including Oscar winners Morgan Freeman and Melissa Leo, Oscar nominees Angela Bassett, Robert Forster and Jackie Earle Haley and talented headliners Eckhart and Radha Mitchell - are cashing nice, fat paychecks.

And with their hard-R ratings, "London Has Fallen" and its predecessor are the films the last two "Die Hard" sequels ("Live Free or Die Hard" and "A Good Day to Die Hard") wanted to be and should have been. In fact, they're in pre-production right now on a sixth "Die Hard" picture - a prequel in which some poor young actor will fail to convince as the young John McClane - that, as long as it's rated PG-13, should be titled "Please Lord, Let This Franchise Indeed Die Hard."

I do wish Butler had better one-liners to spout off as he's daggering guys in the guts and crushing their windpipes. But, again, you can't expect Tarantino or Coen brothers dialogue in something like this. The best we get here is President Asher asking Banning "Was that really necessary?" after he kills a guy slowly with a knife while airing his death cries and whimpers over a walkie-talkie to the rest of the terrorists. Banning's reply: a low growl and the simple retort, "No."

Ginnifer Goodwin voices Judy, a bunny who lives in a rural suburb of the film's titular metropolis. She grows up dreaming of being a cop in that big city. But everyone tells her to give up that dream, because she's too small, too weak, too girly. But Judy has pluck. She proves them wrong and eventually finds her way onto the Zootopia PD.

But once there, her Chief (voice of Idris Elba) has little regard for what he considers to be a token recruit and relegates her to meter maid duty. While writing parking tickets, Judy clashes with Nick (voice of Jason Bateman), a sly fox - oops, no that's not PC. He's a specially intelligent, misrepresented mammal who... yeah, is also a con artist. At any rate, the two team up to try and foil an insidious scheme in which





It's actually a fairly intricate conspiracy plot that kept me guessing throughout. The film respects intelligence, first and foremost, whether it's the kids in the audience or the adults. In fact, this is one of those animated projects like "The Simpsons" or "Inside Out" where the grown-ups will get a LOT more out of the story on first viewing, and younger viewers will be able to age with the movie and grasp more of its ideas the older they get.

I like that "Zootopia" uses a structure that allows directors Byron Howard and Rich Moore and co-director Jared Bush (yes, that's how I have been instructed to cite them) to hang a series of complicated ideas on their film and yet not weigh it down. Even a "Godfather" parody that really shouldn't have worked does. Yes, I hate that one day kids will grow up and see Francis Ford Coppolla's gangster classic and exclaim, "Oh, wow! This is just like 'Zootopia!'" But it's all part of the human distilling process, and I'm not gonna fight



it anymore. It's just too exhausting.

And I really can't stress enough how much fun this movie is! There is a sequence that's as funny as any scene I have ever seen in any animated movie. I won't spoil it. I'll just call it the "DMV Scene." I also loved the design of Zootopia itself with its almost themepark-like geography and layout.


Sometimes the messages do get a bit mixed. For instance, there's a key moment in the movie where the "good" characters need to find out a certain piece of information, so they essentially turn a suspect over to the local mob boss - in a clear violation of his civil rights - who then basically ice bucket/waterboards him after asking the criminal nicely (shocker!) doesn't work. But, hey, ignore that. There are no shades of gray in animation, right? This film is the animated version of that classic Coca-Cola commercial. It wants to teach the world to sing. And, for the most part, it succeeds in near-perfect harmony.






