



PARENTAL LIABILITY

When minors are involved in wrongdoing that results in injury to another person, their parents may be held responsible, depending on the child's age. The term 'parental liability' refers to parents' obligation to compensate those who have suffered damage caused by negligent, intentional, or criminal acts committed by their child. Parental liability usually applies when the child reaches 8 to 10 years of age; it does not end until the child reaches the age of majority. Most states currently have laws relating to parental liability in various applications. Minors can be held responsible for having committed a tort because being underage does not allow one to harm other people or their property. Socalled youthful indiscretions may have consequences.

When to Use Credit and Debit Cards

The decision of whether to use a debit card or a credit card can affect consumers' credit ratings and make it easier or more difficult to manage one's personal finances. This decision often depends on the situation and understanding how each of these cards works.

Debit cards offer some protection, but it may take a little longer to get your money back, and loss responsibility amounts may be higher.

If you don't want to overspend: Debit

Staying on budget and not overspending can be challenging when using credit cards. When cash leaves your hand, it is easy to keep track of what you have left. This isn't as easy when using credit to make purchases. Some shoppers feel they are more likely to overspend when using credit than having money deducted from their bank accounts via debit cards. Bank of America says record-keeping is made simpler with debit cards and they are a great way to avoid spending more money than you have available.

If you like incentives: Credit

Credit cards are still the best way to earn rewards on purchases made, and credit card companies recognize the rewards market is more competitive than ever before. From airline miles to cash back bonuses to points toward vacations, credit card companies now offer a host of benefits that debit cards do not offer. But industry analysts at CreditCards.com say the industry is so competitive that many banks are trying to attract new customers and keep current ones happy, so debit card users may be able to earn some perks if they are not doing so already.

If you're shopping at small businesses: Debit



Score Great Deals Despite the Crowds

Many holiday shoppers can tell personal tales of navigating crowded stores on Black Friday. The unofficial beginning to the holiday shopping season, Black Friday is a day to land great deals for those shoppers who can handle the crowds.

- · Arrive early. While the idea of waking up in the middle of the night to shop is anathema to many people, doing so is a great way to land Black Friday deals. And because many retailers now offer midnight sales on Black Friday, shoppers who can stay up to midnight and beyond won't even have to drag themselves out of bed to score great deals. Shoppers should still expect crowds at midnight and overnight, but such crowds will likely be a lot smaller than they will come the morning and afternoon of Black Friday.

Stay Safe While Shopping

The holiday shopping season is the busiest, and most profitable, time of year for many retailers. According to the National Retail Federation, holiday retail sales during November and December of 2016 totaled \$658.3 billion, exceeding industry projections by \$2.5 billion.

Busy malls and retail centers can make it easy for shoppers to overlook safety and security. Lost or stolen phones can be expensive to replace, and savvy thieves can gain access to their victims' personal information, including financial and personal data.
- · Shop using plastic instead of cash. Fraudulent purchases made with a credit card are protected by the credit card company. Stolen cash, however, is likely lost for good. While shopping with credit may encourage some to overspend, shoppers must recognize that shopping with cash makes them vulnerable to thieves.

Millions of people will visit malls and other retail centers to do their holiday shopping this year. Safeguarding personal safety and security should be foremost on the minds of shoppers throughout the holiday season. ■

WHAT'S GOING ON?

As I write this week's column, the thought of the opening days of past deer seasons run through my mind and I wonder what the opening day on Sat., Nov. 18 brought. Right now the forecast is pretty dreary; 100 percent chance of rain with temperatures above freezing. Sunday



He is back!

60 percent chance of snow in the morning with temperatures down to 26 degrees. Worst part is, winds up around 18 mph both days. That makes things not so much fun to be out there and slows the deer activity. I almost always get my buck the first day, but I wonder about this year with the poor weather forecast.

I think it will be a slow start to the season, but it should improve as we go along. I have seen more and larger bucks around here this year than ever before, but my deer hunting is done down in Allegany County at my camp down there.

In the excitement of the hunt this year remember to be safe not only with your firearm, but in the use of tree stands. It may be a pain in the butt to use a safety harness while in a tree stand, but if you slip and fall, not so much! And always check the fastenings of the tree stand before climbing aboard. I once had a squirrel that was out to get me and would chew on the nylon strap that held the stand on the tree. It had to be replaced twice and it got me to carrying an extra strap in my pack on each hunt. If you climb into your tree stand in the dark use one of those small headlamps as you climb and check the platform out well. Ice could be a problem and I once had a raccoon surprise me as he woke from his nap on the platform, so much so that I almost slipped and fell! Also, never use old tree stands until they are completely checked out before the season.

This year Orleans County deer hunters can use rifles for the first time and it will be interesting to see how many hunters go for the rifle. A few folks incorrectly think rifles are more dangerous than shotguns because their bullets can travel so much farther, but that really isn't so. First, a shotgun slug is much more prone to ricocheting then a rifle bullet due to its larger size and slower speed. Second, a rifle bullet is built to greatly expand on contact with something and thus is less likely to continue onward very far, whereas a shotgun slug doesn't expand much and will then be more likely to travel on after an initial hit on an object. And yes, a rifle bullet if fired up into the air will travel farther then a shotgun slug, but deer hunters are shooting parallel or down into the ground so no matter which is being used old mother nature (gravity) is pulling that bullet down into the ground and thus is not traveling to the next side of the block. I will go as far as to say the rifle is safer than a shotgun shooting slugs.

Well some sunflower seeds were put in the bird feeder last week and the cold spell we had brought the birds in! Earlier this fall I was getting a lot of calls about there being no birds at folks' feeders. Of course that was because the warm weather had plenty of active insects available for the birds to feed on.

Speaking of birds, I had a very interesting male cardinal that began fighting himself (his reflection on one of our high living room windows) early this spring. Now that alone is not uncommon; I have had it happen before with cardinals, robins and chickadees. I have seen those same birds "attack" themselves in vehicle mirrors. This guy however was very persistent and never stopped the daily attacks all summer! Every morning we were woken up at first light with his "banging" on the window. When he was tired of fighting himself on the front windows he went around to the south side of the house and continued there. I had seen a female cardinal around on occasion, but if she was his mate and had kids he never helped raising them. He was too busy protecting his territory!

This routine continued long after the nesting season was over and close looks with the field glasses showed his beak and head feathers were still attached. I would have thought after all that time of attacking the windows he would have been pretty beat up.

Then sometime in late September he disappeared. I figured he attacked himself on a mirror of a moving vehicle and was killed. But no! Last week he showed back up beating the hell out of my windows again. Why he is so persistent over such long period of time and now way past the nesting season is beyond me. I can't say why he is so persistent, but we kind of missed him while he was on vacation.

Turkey Is Nutritious All Year Long

many people think turkey is solely for the Thanksgiving dinner table. However, turkey is much more than a holiday centerpiece. Anyone concerned about healthy eating would be wise to learn more about the health benefits of turkey and find ways to include it in their diets throughout the year.

Turkey is low in fat and high in protein, making it an important source of nutrition. One piece of turkey breast without the skin measures up at 160 calories, four grams of fat and a whopping 30 grams of protein, according to the USDA Nutrient Data Laboratory. Dark meat and turkey legs are higher in calories but boast similar amounts

The average portion of turkey is 100 grams, or 3.5 ounces of meat. This is about the size and thickness of a deck of cards. A single serving of turkey can provide around 65 percent of the recommended daily intake of protein.

But turkey is more than just a lowfat source of protein. The meat is rich in niacin (B3), which may help increase HDL cholesterol, widely known as the "good" form of cholesterol. Niacin, in addition to helping balance cholesterol levels, can lower a person's risk for cardiovascular disease by reducing atherosclerosis, which is a hardening of the arteries. The resource Healthline also says niacin may help reduce inflammation and symptoms of arthritis.

Turkey also is rich in vitamins B6 and B12. B6 helps keep red blood cells healthy and reduce fatigue. while B12 can decrease levels of homocysteine that can contribute to cognitive decline.

Turkey is also a good source of selenium, which helps to keep hair and nails healthy while serving as an immune system booster that protects against damage to cells and tissues. Around 20 percent of the recommended daily amount of selenium can be obtained from a single serving of turkey.

Turkey is lower in calories and fat and higher in protein than chicken. Those who routinely consume chicken as part of a healthy diet can substitute it for turkey for even greater nutritional benefits. Turkey is particularly low in saturated fat, which may contribute to increased levels of the LDL, or "bad," cholesterol.

Turkey also is versatile, as it can be baked, boiled, stir-fried, grilled, ground, chopped for salads, and sliced for sandwiches. Turkey can be served for breakfast, lunch or dinner. Home chefs often find they can substitute turkey for any meat in a recipe with good results because turkey's mild taste takes on the flavor of other ingredients.

Turkey is much more than a Thanksgiving staple and can be enjoyed in various ways throughout the year.
