# Mobile Oilfield at Kern County Schools

Hundreds of students from schools in Kern County recently participated in the Mobile Oilfield Learning Unit, where they spent 90 minutes rotating through six self-contained components with curriculum-based, hands-on learning activities about energy and the technologies and sciences involved with the oil and natural gas industry.

Although MOLU is geared to fifth-grade students, the curriculum correlates to the Next Generation National Science Standards for grades 5 through 8.



The units are wheeled from the mobile trailer for easy set-up in the school's gymnasium or common area. All units have pre-and post-visit materials to enhance students' STEM curriculum.

The MOLU reaches up to 192 students per exhibition day and each student receives a "MOLU PASS" to complete during their rotation.

# **Volunteers Wanted**

The Kern County Homeless Collaborative needs volunteers 18 years and older for its 2018 "Point in Time" count, on January 25, from 4 to 8 a.m.

Workers are needed all over Kern County to count individuals and families who are homeless. Each PIT worker must attend a two-hour training session which will be offered several times in January (dates, times and locations to be announced) with varying time slots for convenience. PIT volunteers will also be given the tools they need to conduct the count, including flashlights.

# Kids Who Play Multiple Sports Are More Likely to Remain Active

Recent research from the American Academy of Pediatrics suggests that specializing in a single sport during childhood, compared with sampling a variety of recreational youth sports, may decrease the odds a child will still participate in athletic activities during adolescence.

The five-year Canadian study, "Childhood Sports Participation and Adolescent Sport followed 756 children beginning when they were between 10 and 11 years old, asking three times each year about physical activity they participated in outside of gym class.

During the first year, 19 percent of participants were sports specializers, 67 percent were sports samplers, and 14 percent were sports non-participants. Five years later, the "samplers" were more than 50 percent more likely to still participate in sports, and they were less likely to become sports non-participants than those who specialized.



The study also found that children who didn't participate in any sports typically remained non-participants as teens. Internationally, study authors said, just 9 percent of boys and 2 percent of girls between ages 5 and 17 get the recommended 1 hour physical activity per day that is essential to healthy development. Encouraging sports sampling during childhood, they said, may be a good way to help correct this.

# Antibiotics Aren't Always the Answer

Attention parents: Antibiotics do not fight viral illnesses like colds.

In fact, taking antibiotics for colds can be harmful to your child's health.

Unnecessary antibiotics can make future infections harder to treat. Work with your child's pediatrician to find the best treatment for your sick child.

The American Academy of Pediatrics warns physician overprescribing antibiotics puts children at risk of serious adverse effects and is the leading source of pediatric Clostridium difficile infections—an inflammation of the colon caused by the bacteria Clostridium difficile.

By 2020, the U.S. aims to reduce such inappropriate use of antibiotics in outpatient settings by 50 percent. Reaching this goal requires a significant reduction in unnecessary antibiotic use for acute respiratory conditions, which account for 44% of outpatient prescriptions. Half are unnecessary prescriptions.

The AAP encourages pediatricians and families to participate in the week by implementing recommendations on antibiotic use.

# **Emotions Can Be Inherited**

A study published in the Journal of Neuroscience used MRI to show that brain patterns inherited from both parents have an impact on anxiety, autism, addiction,

dyslexia and other conditions



According to the study, research shows that babies born to moms who are depressed during pregnancy are more likely to become depressed as adolescents.

In addition, research from New York's Mount Sinai Hospital discovered that genetic changes stemming from trauma suffered by Holocaust survivors can be passed on to their children.

Dr. Bradley Nelson, author of the bestselling book "The Emotion Code," has trained more than 3,500 healing practitioners worldwide to uncover and release "trapped" negative emotions, unresolved feelings from traumatic events that contribute to mental, emotional and physical illness.

Once people have identified an inherited emotion, "we are usually able to determine the origin of the emotion, beginning with which parent this emotional energy came from," Dr. Nelson said. "Going deeper, we may inquire if the emotion came from a grandparent or great grandparent. Most often we find that inherited trapped emotions come from a mother, father or grandparents. Sometimes, however, we find the emotions go back many generations."

# How Clean is Your Doctor's Office?

Just in time for winter cough and cold season, the American Academy of Pediatrics

has updated its recommendations on the best ways to prevent the spread of germs during doctor visits.

The policy statement, "Infection Prevention and Control in Pediatric Ambulatory Settings,"



acknowledges that the majority of patients are seen in outpatient facilities or doctor's offices, and so infection control in these places should be just as strict as in hospitals.

The AAP recommends mandatory annual influenza immunization for staff, and documentation of immunity or immunization against other vaccine-preventable infections including pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, varicella and hepatitis B.

In the policy statement, the AAP emphasizes the importance of cough and sneeze etiquette and hand hygiene, and recommends that waiting rooms be equipped with alcohol-based sanitizers and masks.

Pediatricians should also post visual reminders to cover your nose and mouth with your elbows rather than your hands when coughing and sneezing, and to properly dispose of tissues.



Most children get all their permanent teeth by about age 13.

When teeth become loose, most children want to wiggle their teeth—that's OK, according to physicians.

If a baby tooth is only slightly loose, you should leave it alone until more of the root dissolves. If a tooth is very loose but won't come out, you can help your child pull it out. Using a tissue or a

piece of gauze, grasp the tooth firmly. As you pull, give it a quick twist. If a tooth doesn't seem to want to budge, it may be time to contact a dentist.

Keeping a healthy mouth is key to general health.

"Brush and floss every day, especially before bedtime," said Stacy, who works for a pediatric dentist. "I'm a stickler on that."





# ACT to Offer PreACT Directly to Students

ACT is expanding its ability to help students improve their college readiness by making the PreACT® available to students on an individual basis. The assessment has previously been available only through schools that contract with ACT to administer it to students.

The PreACT is an online, multiple-choice test designed to help tenth-grade students assess their current academic strengths and weaknesses and better prepare for the ACT® test and, subsequently, college and career success. It measures academic achievement in English, mathematics, reading and science, mirroring the ACT test, but without a writing test option.

"Our goal in offering the PreACT directly to students is to provide greater access to this valuable tool, which will help them better understand their current academic readiness levels and get on track for future success," said Suzana Delanghe, ACT chief commercial officer. "At ACT, we understand the value of planning and preparing early for success, and we want to provide students with the opportunity to get an earlier start."

Students may register for the PreACT online and take it at selected ACT test center locations throughout the US. The first national PreACT test date will be Saturday, Feb. 10. 2018.

All PreACT test dates coincide with the ACT national test dates, giving students the ability to experience testing at a national test center.

Students have the option of bringing their own laptop—which they can test on ACT's website to ensure that it will work—or using a computer provided at the test center to take the test.

The PreACT gives students valuable experience with early exposure to ACT test-quality questions, but in a shorter exam. PreACT scores predict future ACT scores on the familiar 1-to-36 scoring scale, providing students with an estimated ACT score range if they continue on the same educational path.

Students who take the PreACT also receive personalized learning resources in each of the four subject areas where improvement can be recommended.

In addition, guidance on college majors and careers that match students' interests is available in the PreACT registration platform, when students create a MyACT account and complete the ACT Interest Inventory. This can spark conversations and help students start thinking about and planning for career paths they may wish to pursue.

The PreACT continues ACT's history of offering solutions that are aligned to the ACT and designed to identify readiness at earlier grades. ACT pioneered such systems with ACT Explore and ACT Plan and more recently developed ACT Aspire to monitor achievement and progress toward readiness across grades 3 to 10.

The registration fee for individual students to take the PreACT is \$46. Fee waivers are available to students from low-income households, just as they are for the ACT test. Additional information about fee waivers and accommodations as well as testing sites can be found at www.act.org.

# Great Educators Never Stop Learning

Most professions require an advanced degree or certification. The education profession is no different, and a majority of educators have earned associate, undergraduate and graduate degrees, certification in specific areas, and, in many cases, doctorate degrees.

"The reports call for a new vision—a system of shared, mutual responsibility—that is founded on the premise that educators are ultimately responsible to students, to their colleagues and to their professions."


The recent rollout event, hosted by the NEA Center for Great Public Schools, included members from across the U.S., and representatives from other organizations. It was an opportunity for affiliates and education partners to come together to help transform our schools for greater student learning and staff professional growth, and to create a culture of social justice in our schools and communities.

"If we believe the quality of educators is most significant in student success, then we must do what is necessary to support the growth, development and excellence of all our educators, throughout their careers," said NEA Vice President Becky Pringle.

To produce the reports, two expert panels and task forces focused on how educators, including education support professionals can work even more effectively to help students, their families, and communities.

The panels debunked the myth of a flat profession, showing how teachers can enhance their practice and expand their influence even beyond a single classroom throughout an entire career.



There are the "see-food" shows, where one kid catches another's eye, then opens his or her mouth to show the sibling some ABC (Already Been Chewed) food; the name-calling battles ("you're stupid"; "you're stupider"; "well you're stupid, infinity!"); and the getting a sibling to laugh so hard liquid comes out of his or her nose.

Bet you're hoping for a holiday dinner invitation to my home right about now.

My children seem to think these little dinnertime shenanigans are funny...like really funny.

I, however, do not share in their sense of mirth. I look at my children and think, "These people are crazy. Like really crazy."

And because crazy people don't treat those of us who are sane very well, it's at these moments I think about how I really don't want this job of preparing food and sitting with my offspring while they consume it.

Yet I force myself to try it over and over again, because I feel guilty when I see the people in Campbell's soup commercials talking, laughing together, joined to each other over a hot meal. And the mom doesn't look like she's about to explode or throw herself through a plate-glass window.

Maybe I just need to lower my standards.

If I can change my views of what it means to "get along," our holiday family table time might just become palatable. I mean if instead of looking for the kids' demo`nstrations of affections to include things like smiles, nods, and pats on the back I can see that the tongues sticking out, air-jabbing towards each other with cutlery and mouthing of silent insults are just their way of saying, "I'm glad we're family," we might be able to become a Campbell's soup family ourselves.

The Benefits of Multigenerational Relationships

or a very long time in most cultures, intergenerational learning has been the informal vehicle within families for the transfer of family knowledge, skills, competencies and values between generations, and has occurred as long a people have gathered together.

The grandparents of the family share their wisdom and are valued for their role in perpetuating the values, culture and uniqueness of the family.

Intergenerational exchange within the family is intended to keep new generations grounded in the history of their culture and to provide a link to the family's past. Familial intergenerational learning is informal and involves interaction from all within the family, such that people in the family interact day in and day out, learning as they go.

However, in our modern and more complex society, intergenerational learning is no longer transmitted by the family alone and increasingly is occurring outside the scope of the family. While traditional families still may value the elder as the transmitter of cultural lore, passing on cultural expectations from the parent to the child, preparing younger individuals for life in the modern and complex world has become a function of wider social groups that have grown up outside of the family.

There is now a new model that is outside of the family and it has grown to involve contemporary society and it has created a new intergenerational and outside-the family learning paradigm, known as social media, and it is beginning to influence the child such that it is eclipsing the generational teaching of the family.

Recently there have also been changes in American nuclear families.

With shifts in the economy, the nature of the work force and job availability, the structure of the family has been affected. Of the families with children under 18 the number of two working parents was 17 percent in 1980 and increased to 33 percent in 2000. In families with single parents the number of working parents was 33 percent in 1980, and increased to 49 percent in 2000.

Relocation has occurred for many families often to communities 100 or more miles from the elder family members. As a result of ongoing changes, there has been a significant reduction in ongoing familial intergenerational exchange, grandparents interacting with grandchildren.

A growing geographical and thus emotional disconnect has occurred between members of many extended families causing the decrease in opportunities for consistent intergenerational learning and support.

The young and the old have become

more vulnerable as a result of this geographic separation. The young family members have become to expect limited contact with their elder family members who, historically, have been present to support their growth and learning, introduce values and offer wisdom, skills and unqualified love and understanding.

Older adults subsequently have been experiencing limited contact with younger family members who provide contemporary social insights, vitality, unqualified love, support and the offering of information regarding the burgeoning new technological skills such as computer technology and cell phones.

Both groups lose the special, dependable support offered by the family member from the opposite end of the life continuum. There is an absolute need for creating more opportunities in which intergenerational learning, meaningful relationships and social and emotional growth could occur between biologically connected children, youth and older adults who represented this new population concern emerging in our community.

Just how do we do this, we include everyone in the upcoming plans.


We invite others over for festivities, we invite grandparents to be the mentors they were meant to be by having them participate in the childrearing process. For example, "We are going out this weekend and we were hoping you and grandmother could take over for us while we are gone?"

By involving the grandparents when possible they are able to develop and enhance their relationship with the grandchildren. This learning and role-modeling that can take place is an effective opportunity for the children to learn about family history, interact on a intimate level with grandparents from shopping, to cooking, to board games and outside activities.

One grandfather is teaching his granddaughter to play the guitar, one grandmother is teaching her grandson to sew. Grandparents can teach anything because they often have a slight bit more time for it as mother and father are often working. One grandfather was talking with his granddaughter about molecules and a grandmother was teaching her 3-year-old granddaughter about gardening, working away pulling weeds from the garden while the granddaughter chewed on strawberries from the garden.

Relationships give a child a sense of meaning and belonging. This is something they will carry with them their whole lives in a very beneficial way, passing it all on to the next generation.



I've continued that tradition with my children and grandchildren. I love watching them be creative with sprinkles. Their cookie creations are amazing.



I'm pretty lucky, as all my grandmothers were amazing cooks. I have many recipes that have been in our family for generations. I plan to pass these recipes and a few of my own down to my children and my grand children.

My great grandma Lucille was especially amazing at baking. I remember as a

child her making these cookies. We always looked forward to her big saucer size sugar cookies. They're sweet with a slight tang to them.

I think my great grandma Lucille would be tickled that I'm sharing her sugar cookie recipe.

# Grandma Lucille's Sugar Cookies

# In a medium bowl, mix:

2 cups Flour 1/2 tsp Baking Soda 1/2 tsp Cream of Tarter 1/2 tsp salt

# In a mixing bowl mix.

1/2 cup butter

- 1 egg
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 cup of sugar
- 1/2 cup Shortening



- 1. Add flour mixture to wet mixture, mix well.
- 2. Remove dough from bowl and cut in quarters. Roll out one quarter at a time on a floured surface and cut using cookie cutters. If you aren't planning to frost these cookies you can sprinkle crystal sugar on them before you bake.
- Place cut cookies on cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. Bake at 375 degrees for about 8 minutes. Check at 5 minutes as all ovens aren't the same.

# Want a Snickerdoodle cookie?

In a small bowl mix: 1/4 cup of sugar

2 Tbsp cinnamon

Using a spoon, scoop and roll in a ball Grandma Lucille's Sugar Cookie dough then roll ball in sugar & cinnamon mix. Place on cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. I like to use a cup and flatten the balls a little before I put in the oven. Bake at 375 degrees for about 8 minutes.

My thought was that "these are big girls, many of whom lived through WWII, I am not going to treat them like kids." When they arrived, they hit the spiked eggnog like locusts. Soon it sat empty next to the nearly full bowl of non-alcohol eggnog. They left laughing and happy as their designated drivers drove them to the next house.

# Ingredients:

8 large eggs

2 cups granulated sugar

2 cups half-and-half

2 cups heavy cream

1/4 teaspoon of nutmeg, plus some for garnish

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

1/4 cup bourbon

1/4 cup brandy

6 large egg whites

# **Directions:**

- 1. In a heavy-bottomed saucepan, beat together the eggs and sugar. Sir in the half-and-half. Cook over medium-low heat, stirring constantly, until the mixture is thick enough to coat a metal spoon and in at least 160 degrees. Remove from the heat. Sir in the cream, nutmeg, vanilla, bourbon, and brandy. Cool, then cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.
- 2. Just before serving, beat the egg whites until stiff peaks form, then fold them into the eggnog. You may add a little sugar and a dash of vanilla extract to the egg whites when beating. Serve cold and sprinkle with nutmeg.


Makes 8-10 cups. Should serve within 24 hours of preparation.
