Batter Up!

Baseball is not slow. It is untimed. This concept seems to baffle people. It is not losing popularity. It is the No. 1 spectator sport in the world in terms of attendance (yes, there are more games to watch, which pad the numbers, but a fact is a fact). It is fiscally sound. Last year Major League Baseball posted around \$8 billion in revenues (by contrast, the NFL had around \$9.5 billion), and even the worst-attended ballparks still hit the 51 percent of capacity mark.

And it'd be easy to grow the game. An official Wiffle Ball set costs about \$7. Isn't it high time that MLB made those guys manufacturing them from Connecticut whole? Enough with those knockoff versions with the plastic wrap around the flimsy plastic bat and a ball that doesn't break correctly. Nobody wants them. If MLB could negotiate a wholesale price, they should give away a set to every kid attending a game from spring training through May. That would cost something like \$30 million, and it would instantly turn 10 million backyards and vacant lots into miniature fields of dreams.

Baseball lends itself to sappiness. Sappy sports writing, sappy poetry, sappy analogies and annoying monologues. That in and unto itself is one of the great things about baseball!

Yes, when Bob Costas says a player is so old they use "Absorbine Sr., the joke is on him because nobody

outside of the Korean War generation knows what Absorbine Jr. is in the first place. It's great because Costas is like that uncle at the holiday table who always tells the same story. "I don't like inter-league play!" We know, Uncle Bob, we know ... but everybody should get to see the Yankees at least once a decade.

Baseball, unlike many sports, matters all the way through the game. Watching a starter at the top of his powers is like watching a matador. He strides confidently out to the mound, he mesmerizes the charging batters and asserts his will on the outcome. Never mind that we've never seen an actual matador or understand the allure of the bullfight. We don't know what's in the hot dogs, either. It doesn't matter.

Don't overthink it. Let the ballpark metaphors wash over you like waves. Ride it out for all nine innings. Revel in the clutch hit, in the adept way the second basemen turns two, at how the closer didn't even blink when the bases were loaded before striking out the side. Every game tells a different story

This season, go to a game. Go to a game with no agenda other than being there to watch the game. Don't complain about the prices. Save up. Bring your kid. Tell your kid stories about the baseball players you watched growing up, and while you're at the game, just watch the game. Relax, will ya?

The next morning, get a newspaper and show your kid the box score. Cut it out, paperclip it to the game program and tell him to keep it in a box. Decades later, it will be found. You thought the game was too long? The game isn't too long ... it lasts forever.


•Is the contractor willing to conduct a thorough inspection of the HVAC system prior to performing any work and disclose any problems discovered? • Will the contractor clean the

supply and return air ductwork, the airstream side of the heat exchanger and the secondary heat exchanger?

•After cleaning, are access panels properly sealed; blower blades and compartment clean and free of oil, dust and debris? Point a flashlight into the cooling coil. Does light shine through? It should if the coil is clean. Check to make sure the coil fins are straight and evenly spaced and the coil drain pan is clean and that it is draining properly. Do the filters fit properly and are they the proper efficiency recommended by the manufacturer?

Store Your Mower In Eight Easy Steps

(NAPSA)—Chances are, your lawn mower has been a faithful fair-weather companion. So at the end of the mowing season, you want to give it the attention it deserves.

Here are some tips on what you can do now to be sure your mower will start easily next mowing season.

• Make sure your operator's manual is on hand for quick ref-erence whenever you work on your mower or any such equipment.

•Remove the spark plug lead wire from the plug before doing any mower maintenance, and tape or tie it out of the way.

•Remove the battery and store it in a cool, dry place away from gas cans, the water heater or furnace

• Change the oil. Old oil has lost much of its ability to coat and protect engine components, which could lead to damage down the road. Most people avoid changing the oil in their lawn mower because they think about having to tip the mower over to drain the old oil. They worry about spills in the driveway and a mess of rags and cardboard to catch spills. Oil removal kits make the process easier and a lot less messy. For example, the Briggs & Stratton 1.6-liter oil extractor pump has a longreach hose so oil can be extracted through filler or dipstick holes. It is important to return and recycle used oil at the proper collection center in your community.

•Clean your mower. Brush or hose off leaves, grass and mud. Gently tip your walk-behind mower on its side to spray the underbody. If debris is caught on the blade, use a stick or tool to remove it—never use your hands.



Get more from your mower later: Store it right now. Proper prepping before storage can mean a happier reunion when mowing season starts up again.

• Use a fuel stabilizer. Never store your lawn equipment with a partially full fuel tank. Either run the equipment out of fuel or use fuel stabilizer in a full tank of fuel. Add Advanced Formula Fuel Treatment and Stabilizer according to the package directions.

Then—and this is important run the mower for a few minutes so the stabilizer circulates through the carburetor. The stabilizer keeps fuel fresh for up to six months. Turn off the engine and completely fill the gas tank. A full tank will help prevent moisture from condensing in the tank, which can form rust that could break away and clog the carburetor.

• Store your mower in a dry, protected place such as your garage or a garden shed. Never store it next to a furnace, water heater or appliance with a pilot light.





The 7 Things You Should Know About Cervical Cancer® (NAPS)—1. All women are at risk.

Unless you have had your cervix removed for noncancerous conditions (like fibroids), you can develop cervical cancer, which is caused by abnormal cell growth.

2. Black women with cervical cancer die at a higher rate.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, black women have more than twice the mortality rate of white women. Unfortunately, most of these deaths occur in women who have never been screened or have not been screened in the past five years. The Black Women's Health Imperative advocates that when found early, cervical cancer is highly curable.

3. Your Pap test screens for cervical cancer.

The Pap test is the most effective way to find and prevent cervical cancer. In addition to screening for cervical cancer, the Pap test looks for cell changes (precancers) that can be treated before escalating to cancer. Your health and peace of mind will more than make up for the minor effort it takes to get tested. 4. HPV is almost always the cause.

The human papillomavirus (HPV) has over 150 strains and is transmitted by skin-toskin contact-usually through sex. HPV can infect cells, causing genital warts and even cervical cancer. If you are

found to have HPV, don't panic. HPV is actually quite common-most women (and men) will have it at some point. Usually, HPV is nonthreatening and goes away on its own; however, it can cause cervical and other types of cancers. Your doctor can test for HPV during your exam.

5. There is an HPV vaccine but...

The HPV vaccine has been shown to reduce the risk of HPV in women under 27 when administered properly; however, the vaccine only protects against the two most common strains that cause HPV and genital warts. Even if you have been vaccinated, you should still see your doctor for routine Pap tests. 6. You may not have

symptoms.

Women with cervical cancer may not show any signs early on. In more advanced stages, cervical cancer can cause abnormal bleeding or discharge from the vagina, such as bleeding after sex. If you have any of these symptoms, you should see your doctor. 7. Smokers have a higher risk.

Women who smoke cigarettes are more susceptible to developing cervical cancer.


