



ESTATE PLANNING

A "revocable trust" (also known as a "living trust") may be amended or revoked at any time and directs the manner in which its assets are to be managed during the lifetime of its creator. DEER MEMORIES

Deer season always gives you memories that you can look back on, and during this season's opening many of them flashed through my mind as the day passed along. They were not only memories of past deer hunts, but waterfowl hunts, upland game hunts, fishing expeditions and trapping adventures. Many were of the

times my Dad and I hunted together and later when my son began to join me in the great outdoors

My heart wasn't into deer hunting the opening day this year, not just because the weather was terrible, but there were issues with the landowner above me who was doing things above my camp that would drastically affect my place and my enjoyment of it. There was something else too, but l just couldn't put my finger on it.

Even though weather conditions were poor, I was pretty well set up with a ground blind that was much more comfortable than a tree stand in these conditions. Besides, it was a short distance to fall from the swivel chair in a ground blind then it was from 16 feet up in a tree stand!

I have always been lucky and usually get a buck opening day. I have gotten some nice ones to boot, but the first memory was of my son getting his first deer not too far from where I sat this opening day. At that time he wasn't old enough to deer hunt, but had waterfowl and squirrel hunted with me and had proven himself a good shot and handled a gun safely. He could lay those slugs in a tight group on a deer silhouette target very well. So a second tree stand platform was placed next to mine in a twin trunk oak tree so we could sit side by side. We had brought a small bird feeder filled with sunflower seeds with us and the chickadees entertained us as we waited for our chance at a buck. Then suddenly a fork-horn buck materialized on my son's side. I told him to grab my gun (I had not allowed him to have his own gun yet) and don't take too long to get off a shot. His shot was good and we watched as it ran out into the field and then turn in to the brush thicket where we found it shortly after we started trailing it. The emotional thing about it was that a beautiful 10-point buck that his Grandfather had shot, a few years before his death, had run quite a distance leaving a poor blood trail and ran into this same thicket where I eventually found it dead. My son's first buck had fallen in almost in the exact spot that the 10-point had! I had wet eyes as this was explained to him and he too soon had the same condition. We both figured Grandpa had been with us on his first buck hunt. That field was named "First Buck" and has given us many bucks since.

Another memory that popped up was when a nice eight-point was coming straight up a steep slope toward my tree stand. He would look up the slope then put his head down and sneak up toward my stand. My thought was to put a bullet between his shoulder blades when he put his head down, but just as I pulled the trigger he suddenly lifted his head from a low position, blocking the spot that was being aimed at. The slug hit one of the long points on his rack and he went down like a lead balloon (the shock actually momentary knocked him out), but he quickly recovered and was up on his feet. He ran a short distance, stopping at a place that only left a small spot between two trees to shoot through, but my slug hit him too high and he was off again. Getting out of the tree, the chase was on, but he only offered a couple more poor shots, the last of which dropped him, but did not kill him. As I approached him, he made an effort to get up and at that time I realized I was out of shells (I rarely carry more then five slugs and in the excitement forgot there was one more in my pants pocket). Well, when he finally got up and started running for the adjacent field I was right with him leaving my shotgun behind. He would run and fall, run and fall, and eventually the gap closed. Coming up behind him the antlers where grabbed just as he was trying to get up again and I jumped on his back and scissor locked my legs around his stomach behind the rib cage. I twisted his head like the cowboys do when taking down a steer that seemed to paralyze him and got my knife off my belt and finished the job. After he died without much of a struggle, I got up off of him and there was another hunter standing there looking at me. "Where the hell is your gun?" With a smile on my face I said "I like to run them down!" He walked away looking quite bewildered. The next tale involved a buck while duck hunting. A friend of mine and I actually lassoed a buck and then let it go during deer season. Better tune in next week to hear the rest of that story!

As long as the borrower continues to maintain residence in the home, he or she is still eligible for the monthly payments received through the reverse mortgage. 

Effective **Cover Letters**

A strong cover letter may not guarantee you land a good job, but a poor cover letter may guarantee you won't. On its own, an effective cover letter can catch the eye of hiring managers tasked with finding worthy candidates among stacks of applications, while a poor cover letter may ensure hiring managers never even glance at an applicant's resume.

An effective cover letter should be concise, conveying an applicant's work history and goals in a few paragraphs or less. The following are some additional ways men and women can craft effective cover letters.

· Address a specific person when possible. When responding to a job posting that listed a specific contact. address your cover letter to that person rather than beginning the letter with, "Dear Sir or Madam" or "To Whom It May Concern." Personalize each cover letter you write so the hiring manager does not get the feeling that you are sending out cover letters en masse. Make sure names are spelled correctly and **Visa**. job titles are accurate.

• State your purpose early on. The purpose of your letter, which is to state the job you're seeking, should be made clear early on. Hiring managers often handle the vetting process for a host of positions at their companies, so the earlier the hiring manager knows which position you're applying for the better. Hiring managers may become frustrated when applicants don't make their intentions clear or do so in the final paragraph instead of the first.

· Explain why you are a qualified candidate. While it's good to note your work history, your resume will do the bulk of that legwork. A cover letter is your opportunity to show how your work history makes you a qualified candidate for a specific position. Remember to be concise but relate a specific example that illustrates how your work history would help you thrive in the position for which you're applying.

· Exhibit some knowledge about the company to which you're applying. An effective cover letter should help you stand out among your fellow applicants, and expressing some knowledge about the organization can do just that. The goal here is to illustrate how you and the organization are a good fit, so you don't need to go overboard or be too specific. But hiring managers

• Be cordial in your closing. A DO cover letter should close with a MONEY? I buy almost anything. cordial request for an interview or a friendly way of indicating you look forward to a company's response to your application. In addition, thank the reader for his or her time and mention you would be delighted to answer any questions he or she may have.


