Here's your chance to see Santa - and maybe get a free candy cane - as he comes near your home with all the fanfare of a fire engine and its lights and sirens! Please keep in mind, however, that emergency calls are the priority during the scheduled tours, and the times are approximate.

So with out further ado, here is Santa's schedule as he is escorted by several area volunteer companies:

Ballestone to host 40th Holly Tours

Members of the Ballestone Preservation Society will see to it that Essex has a white Christmas, even if it doesn't snow.

The group will celebrate the 40th anniversary of their Holly Tours at the historic mansion with "White Christmas," the theme of this year's Christmastime open house.

The house will be open from 5 to 8 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 9, and from 2 to 8 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 10. Visitors will be able to tour the house from room to room and enjoy not only the year-round period furnishings but holiday decorations, including fresh greens and other natural items.

"And then after the tour, visitors are invited to have complimentary cider and cookies in the kitchen building," Colleen Baugher, a society volunteer, told the East County Times.

Visitors will also be able to do some unique holiday shopping in the mansion's gift shop. Baked bread fresh from the ovens will be sold, as will rose potpourri made from rose petals from the property's

Ornament marks 100 years of Old Dundalk

The Dundalk-Patapsco Neck Historical Society and Museum continues its annual edition of collectible glass Christmas balls with an ornament that pays homage to the 100th anniversary of the founding of Old Dundalk.

The green ball is marked with a white circle and gold lettering that proclaims, "Dundalk, 1917-2017," according to gardens, according to Baugher.

The recorded history of the property dates to 1659 when Walter Dickenson acquired it and named it for himself, according to the group's website. Thomas Stansbury inherited the land in 1725 and renamed it "Stansbury's Claim."

Baltimore County bought the property in 1969. The farmhouse was heavily vandalized and had been allowed to deteriorate until The Heritage Society of Essex and Middle River campaigned to save the piece of local history.

The house was adopted by the Essex-Middle River Bicentennial Committee as a restoration project to mark the country's 200th birthday. Restoration began in 1974 and was completed in 1977, according to the website.

Admission to the tours is \$5 for adults and \$1 for children 11 and younger. The house is at 1935 Back River Neck Road, near the entrance to the golf course, in Essex. In case of bad weather, call 410-887-0218 to verify the tours are on as scheduled.





Local train gardens bring back memories, build traditions

No holiday display seems to conjure childhood memories like a traditional train garden.

The intricate productions perhaps bring back memories of time spent with a parent building a display in the basement of the family home or of listening to the stories from a grandparent about the origins and history of pieces in the family's collection.

In any case, eastern Baltimore County is rife with train gardens, with three differently themed but equally popular displays offered each year. They are designed and built each year by prominent community organizations - one that fights fires and provides emergency medical service and two that are dedicated to preserving history. And there's plenty of time to visit all of them.

Martinville Train Garden

As the name suggests, Martinville is at the Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum in Middle River.

The fourth annual Martinville Christmas Train garden at Martin State Airport, 701 Wilson Point Road, is open through Jan. 13. The holiday display of miniature planes and trains will be open 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday. Access to the train garden is included in the museum admission of \$3 for adults and \$1 for children. For more information, call 410-682-6122.

Dundalk-Patapsco Neck Historical Society and Museum

Also done by volunteers, the Dundalk-Patapsco Neck Historical Society's display was born when a volunteer's personal Christmas collection grew too big for his house.

The holiday display now consumes more than 300 square feet at the museum at 4 Center Place in Dundalk.

The 18th annual holiday train garden will be open to the public from 1 to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday and from noon to 8 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays through Jan. 7. The garden will close at 5 p.m. Dec. 24 and will be closed all day Dec. 25. The garden also includes the popular scavenger hunt that encourages visitors to find specific objects and characters in the garden.

Admission is free but donations are accepted. For more information, call the museum at 410-284-2331.


Wise Avenue VFC

Santa's workshop at Oak Crest does it again!

Annual project provides 400 stockings to Baltimore-area families for distribution by Salvation Army

Seventy residents of Oak Crest filled 400 stockings with toys, games, school supplies and other items for the benefit of Baltimore-area families... in just 45 minutes!

The event took place on Nov. 21, marking the 22nd year in which residents transformed the Erickson Living retirement community into Santa's workshop for a day to support the Salvation Army of Central Maryland.
