



It's the end of the year, and as sports fans we know what that means: It's time to take a look back at the great plays and the players that made them, lest we forget. This week we profile the two great American pastimes and their players of the year.

Football: Cam Newton

In a pass-happy league, Cam Newton has put more smiles on more faces than any of the Research Triangle bean counters would care to count.

Newton brought a lot of promise to Count.

Whether or not the Panthers win the Super Bowl, barring an epic choke on Newton's part in the big game, it's safe to say. part in the big game, it's safe to say that 2015 was the year that Newton put it all together for the Panthers ... flirting with perfection along the

Spectacular as the double-threat quarterback has been, he's still put up the same numbers we're used to seeing out of him, and they closely mirror every statistical benchmark we like to see in a quarterback here at the A Sporting View's palatial head-quarters: Does he account for at least 30 touchdowns per season (passing plus rushing)? Pass for at least 3,000 yards? Have a completion percentage of 60 percent or more? Throw more touchdowns than interceptions? Start at least 10 games? Average more than 4 yards per carry?

Newton's answer on all accounts

has always been a resounding yes. That's your MVP, that's the player of the year — the guy you didn't want to fine.

Baseball: The Kansas City Royals

Leave it to Kansas City to enter the season as the favorite to win the World Series while simultaneously being considered the underdogs. That's Kansas City in a nutshell. It's a great town with the best steak in the country, zero traffic, pretty fountains and probably more soccer fans per capita than any other city. Fans don't throw a mean tailgate, they throw a friendly tailgate. Kansas City may not do a lot of things, but the things it does, it does right.

It's cliche to give an individual award to an entire team, but I can't ever recall a team quite like these Royals. They lost a great DH in Billy Butler in the offseason, and they signed a better one in Kend-rys Morales. In a game that stresses on-base percentage and starting pitching, these guys advanced run-ners by simply making contact, won games with the middle-relief corps and defense.

And it was a total team effort. Ned

Yost provided consistent, albeit at Yost provided consistent, albeit at times bizarre, management. None of the starters won more than 13 games. Their regular closer wasn't lights-out dominant with an ERA hovering around the 4.00 mark. Only one player had more than 100 RBIs, and nobody hit over 300 or reached and nobody hit over .300 or reached 30 home runs. Yet the same cast of characters that battled Madison Baumgardner last fall would not be denied this time around, and names like Moustakis, Morales, Cain, Perez and Hosmer join the pantheon of greats. Kansas City, you done made good.



Egg and Spinach Quiche with a Sweet Potato Crust, and stay healthy the high-tech way this year!

PALEO DIET QUICHE

sweet potatoes, peeled and sliced into thin rounds (rounds should be thin enough to bend easily)



garlic clove, minced small onion, diced cups baby spinach teaspoon ground nutmeg

teaspoon cayenne pepper large eggs, beaten

bacon slices, cooked and crumbled 1. Heat the oven to 400 F.

2. Place sweet potatoes in a 9-inch pie dish. Drizzle with 1 tablespoon of the olive oil. Season with 1/2

teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon black pepper. Toss everything together until coated. Arrange the sweet potato slices in the pie dish circular pattern to form a "crust" for the quiche. Place in oven and bake 15 to 20 minutes or until sweet potatoes are tender when pierced with a knife. Set the crust aside to cool. Lower the oven heat to 375 F.

3. Meanwhile, place 1 tablespoon of oil in a skillet over medium heat. Add garlic and onion. Cook until the onion and garlic are soft and fragrant.

4. Add the spinach, the remaining salt and pepper, nutmeg and cayenne pepper. Saute until wilted, 2-3 minutes. Set aside to cool.

In a bowl, combine beaten eggs with the spinach mixture and bacon Pour over the sweet potato crust, and place in the oven. Bake 30 to 35 minutes, or until the eggs are set; serve warm. Serves 4.

Understanding The Seriousness Of The Flu

(NAPSA)-If you or someone you care about is among the estimated 45 million Americans who are 65 years of age and older, there's an important health fact you should know: As you age, your immune system weakens. This can make influenza ("the flu") severe and even life threatening for older adults. The 2014-2015 flu season recorded the highest hospitalization rates among people 65 years of age and older in recent history, yet a new survey of more than 1,000 U.S. seniors found that many underestimate the seriousness of the flu and are largely unaware of their vaccine options.

To help educate older adults and those who care for them about the seriousness of the flu, the importance of prevention and available vaccine options, twotime Emmy and Tony awardwinning actress Judith Lightstarring in the new Broadway play Thérèse Raquin-has joined the Flu + You program for the second year in a row as the campaign ambassador

"I turned 65 last year, and even though I still feel healthy and active, I know my immune system weakens with age," said Light. "I can't afford to let the flu slow me down, and luckily my doctor gave me a flu shot specifically for my age. If you're over 65 like me, talk to your health care provider about flu prevention and your flu vaccine options, and get vaccinated early before it's too late.

The flu can make existing health problems worse and is especially dangerous for people with chronic health conditions. like heart disease and diabetes. which commonly affect older adults. People with these conditions are more likely to develop complications from the flu that can result in hospitalization and

account for roughly half of flurelated hospitalizations and almost all flu-related deaths, and yet the survey we conducted shows that only 8 percent of survey respondents are concerned about getting the flu," said Kathleen Cameron, MPH, Senior Director, National Council on Aging. "Furthermore, about one third of respondents are unaware that someone with chronic health conditions would be at risk for complications from the flu."

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states the single best way to prevent the flu is to get an annual vaccination. However, the survey found that more than half of seniors are unaware that there is a flu shot specifically for their age group. Older adults have flu vaccine options, including the regular flu shot and a higher-dose vaccine, both of which are widely available at a doctor's office or local pharmacy. Flu vaccination is a Medicare benefit with no copay.

Older adults and their caregivers can learn more at ncoa.org/Flu, which features more survey results, free educational materials, and a public service announcement with Judith Light.

THE HISTORY CHANNEL

• On Jan. 12, 1904, Henry Ford sets a land-speed record of 91.37 mph on the frozen surface of Michigan's Lake St. Clair. His four-wheel vehicle, dubbed the "999," had a wooden chassis but no body or hood.

- On Jan. 15, 1919, fiery hot molasses floods the streets of Boston, killing 21 people and injuring scores of others. Some 2.5 million gallons of molasses burst from a huge tank when bolts holding the bottom of the tank exploded, shooting out like bullets.
- On Jan. 11, 1949, in Washington, D.C., the cornerstone is laid at the first mosque of note in the United States. The Islamic Center was built with a 160-foot minaret from which prayers were to be announced.

- On Jan. 16, 1979, faced with an army mutiny, Mohammad Reza Shah Pahlavi, leader of Iran since 1941, is forced to flee the country. Fourteen days later, the Ayatollah Khomeini, spiritual leader of the Islamic revolution, returned after 15 years of exile and took control of Iran. In November, Islamic militants stormed the U.S. embassy and took 52 Americans hostage, holding them for 444 days.
- On **Jan. 13, 1999,** NBA superstar Michael Jordan announces his retirement from professional basketball for the second time, saying he had lost the drive and desire to continue playing. Jordan originally had announced his retirement in 1993.







More Organ Donors Key To Saving Children

(NAPSA)-There is hopeful news for the nearly 2,000 children waiting for the "Gift of Life"—a lifesaving organ transplant. To help as many of these children as possible, a national effort is being made to increase the number of available donors—the key to saving more lives. It Makes A Difference

Her story is one of hope for those still waiting. According to www.organdonor.gov, more than 123,000 individuals of all ages are on the national organ transplant waiting list, waiting for a kidney, heart, intestine, pancreas, lung or liver. About 18 people die each day because they do not receive a new organ in time.

More Donors Are Needed

Despite advances in medical technology, the ability to perform a successful organ transplant still rests on finding a matching donor. Having access to such a donor is more difficult than many realize. While millions of adults have

already registered to be donors, very few people die in circumstances that make them eligible to donate. In most cases, the individuals who actually become organ donors have suffered brain death

in a hospital. Their organs can be transplanted because machines have continued to pump oxygen into their bodies, keeping the organs healthy. However, this represents a very small percentage of all deaths and demonstrates why many more registered donors are

One "Yes" Can Save Many

There are no age restrictions on being an organ donor. People from the very young to the very old have donated organs and through their generous acts have iven others a second chance at life. One person can save up to eight lives by donating organs and improve the lives of up to 50 more by donating corneas and tissues.

To register, go to www.organ donor.gov and connect to your state's donor registry. You should also tell your family and friends about your desire to be a donor. Organdonor.gov is the website of the Department of Health and Human Services' Division of Transplantation.

Early Diagnosis, Effective Monitoring And Treatment Can Help Prevent Vision Loss From AMD

• Straight lines—such as telephone poles, the sides of buildings or streetlight poles—look wavy.

 Written text and/or type can appear blurry.

·A dark or empty spot may block the center of your vision.

If you notice any of these changes, it's recommended that you schedule a dilated eye exam as soon as possible.

When AMD progresses, it can rob people of their central vision and often the ability to read a book, recognize a face, see fine details and distinguish some colors.

Dry And Wet AMD

There are two forms of AMD: "dry" and "wet." Dry AMD is the most common form of the disease. Vision loss usually progresses slowly. In some cases, it will progress to the most advanced wet AMD.

Wet AMD is less common, but more rapidly threatening to vision. It causes tiny blood vessels under the retina to leak or break open, distorting vision and causing scar tissue to form. Wet AMD currently affects an estimated 2.2 million Americans age 50 and older, according to the recent report "The Future of Vision: Forecasting the Prevalence and Costs of Vision Problems" prepared by Prevent Blindness. Due to the rapidly aging population, these numbers are expected to grow.

Monitoring for signs of wet AMD can be helped by using a method called the Amsler grid, or the ForeseeHome™ AMD Monitoring Program (www.foreseehome. com) for monitoring progression of dry AMD to wet AMD, from Notal Vision, Ltd.

Flip Into New Year With Swedish Pancakes

As traditional recipes poured out of family cookbooks over the holidays. I went on a quest for the "best" Swedish pancake recipe from my friends and their Swedish-American friends. I soon discovered that there are probably as many recipes as there are Swedish grandmothers — and grandfathers.



Growing up, I recall that my Grandma Ruth, a second-generation Swede, actually didn't work from a formal recipe. "A little bit of this, a lot of that," she'd say to me as I stood on a footstool by her side, carefully pouring milk into a wide bowl. A lot of "that" usually meant the melted butter that would blend smooth as silk into

I later learned the basic techniques for flipping the pancakes from my dad. (Unlike the thicker American flapjack, a Swedish pancake is more like a French crepe, so flipping can be unwieldy at first.)

Happily, my family and I have continued the tradition of making Swedish pancakes topped with bright-red lingonberry preserves and a dusting of confectioners' sugar. A satisfying, easy meal for a lazy Saturday morning breakfast, or a casual weeknight supper.

Here's my easy "best" recipe. Stir it up for your family and make it your own with a little of this ... maple syrup on top? Or that. How about some freshly sliced strawberries and a dollop of whipped cream?

SWEDISH PANCAKES

- cup flour
- teaspoon salt cups milk, or 1 1/2 cups milk and 1/2 cup half and half (optional)
- eggs
- cup butter, melted and cooled, plus butter for cooking.

1. In a medium bowl, combine all of the ingredients with a whisk until smooth. Do not overbeat.

2. For each pancake, lightly

butter griddle or large skillet; heat over medium-high heat. When quite hot, pour 1/3 cup of the batter into skillet. Swirl it around so that it forms a thin 8- to 9-inch layer on the bottom of the pan.

3. Cook until the pancake is golden brown on the bottom (lift up a corner to check the color) and small bubbles are visible on the top. This happens quickly. Flip with a narrow spatula and lightly brown on the other side.

4. Set on a plate, and fold in half or quarters, if you wish. Serve hot with traditional lingonberry, strawberry or raspberry preserves. Top with a dusting of confectioners' sugar. Makes 12 pancakes.



Three Ways Air Quality Affects Your Ability To Think

(NAPSA)-Scientific evidence shows that breathing polluted air can impair memory and reason-ing, reduce academic performance and even result in lower intelli-gence—but you don't have to put

up with it.

Here are three important ways air quality directly affects your ability to think:

1. Standardized tests

Standardized tests have become increasingly important in education. Parents and educators already debate the potential effect of family income, cultural background, gender and other influences on test results. Now, researchers also look closely at the effect of air quality on standardized test scores—and conclude that it's significant.
One study of schoolchildren in

Southern California found that exposure to higher levels of fine particulate air pollution (known as PM2.5) is linked to consistently lower scores on standardized tests in math and reading. A separate study of fifth-grade schoolchildren concluded that every increase of 2.1 cubic feet per minute (cfm) in ventilation was associated with a 2.9 percent increase in students passing a standardized math test.

2. Getting older

Evidence is growing that cognitive decline associated with aging is at least partially related to breathing air pollution. In one study, scientists administered math and memory tests to 780 people age 55 or older, then correlated scores with pollution levels where the participants lived. After adjusting the results for education, employment and other factors, the researchers still found significant differences in scores based on air quality. Participants in areas with high pollution levels had error scores that were 150 percent higher than those living in areas with low pollution.

3. Memory

Neuroscience exposed mice to high levels of par-ticulate air pollution (similar to levels in Beijing or Mexico City) for 10 months. They observed that the mice exposed to high pollution levels took longer to navigate through a maze and made more

Examining the brains of the mice exposed to pollution, the researchers found physical changes in the tips of neurons in the part of the brain responsible for memory. The researchers also found that the mice exposed to high levels of pollution showed increased levels of proinflammatory chemicals in the brain. What You Can Do

Each person can help reduce the sources of pollution, better ventilate indoor environments and

support air filtration for schools and other places as needed. Here are a few examples of positive steps that can clean the air: Get involved: Schools with better indoor air quality have bet-

ter attendance rates and test scores. You can ask the school principal, school board members or the American Lung Association what you can do to get involved in improving classroom air quality.
