

## Sharing our Journeys

### Coming Forward

With all the "coming forward" by dozens of women relating their sexual experiences with high profile men in the movie industry, government, politics and the business world, there have to be hundreds of women who have had similar encounters. These perhaps will never come to light because the men with whom they had these experiences are just ordinary, everyday men - not the high and mighty. Nevertheless they are suffering the same psychological traumas as those who had sexual relations with celebrities.

Well, let me tell you my situation. First of all, I grew up in a home where my brother and I were always treated equally. If my brother was given money or presented with an opportunity (like being appointed to West Point) I was always given something of equal value. So as a young girl I never felt my big male brother was superior to me nor was I treated as someone who could be dominated or discriminated against.

When I entered the academic world many years ago it was still pretty much a male dominated field—there just weren't many female PhD Professors. Granted there was discrimination because my pay was less than what a male professor received for teaching the same classes. However I did receive "pay equity" after a year or two when it was brought to the attention of those who could rectify the pay difference. Fortunately, they did listen and rectify the situation rather than ignoring it as just a "complaint from some female."

One male professor kept referring to me as a "fringe benefit" to the academic

department. He might have meant it as a compliment since it did contain the word "benefit" but in m mind I was anything but a "fringe!"

During my career I was the only female in an academic delegation that visited Saudi Arabia, a country where women were most certainly persona non-grata in any male gathering, they were mandated to remain at home, in the background and fully covered from head to toe so as not to expose any flesh.

A "majilis" was occurring that our delegation was invited to. The Crown Prince heard the complaints or requests from his subjects. No women, of course, were invited or attended. However, with this American group the Crown Prince declared the one female (me) as "An Honorary Man" and I was allowed to attend in my regular American clothing.

At the time I took all this in stride but considering the country and their centuries old traditions and customs it was truly a remarkable gesture on the part of the Crown Prince. Granted it wasn't sexual harassment but it could have represented a high degree of social discrimination (by American standards) if I had not been allowed to attend. Absolutely no discrimination toward all those Saudi females who were banned from attending—just life as usual. Ignored, forgotten and certainly not equal to any male.

I wonder how many females in this country are experiencing (or have experienced) sexual harassment and/or discrimination. Personally, I have been spared any of the agony that is a part of that behavior.

## Cote makes a photographic homecoming

What started as high school hobby has blossomed into a full-time profession for Sara Cote.

In fact, her love of photography has gone beyond a simple entry into the business world. This November, she returned to her Elkhart Lake roots, opening her own professional photography business on Rhine Street, near the Elkhart Lake town square.

Located at 111 E. Rhine, she calls her business by simplest and most effective of names—Sara Cote Photography.

Cote intends to focus on weddings an family portraits, a skillset she fashioned through her studies and work in the New England countryside of Vermont.

A member of the Halbach clan, Cote attended Elkhart Lake High School, where she learned photography and design concepts from a pair of well-known mentors—Mike McGill on the photography side, and art instructor M. K. White on the artistic side.

"I really started getting interest in photography back in high school, so I decided to pursue it after I graduated," Sara said.

Her studies lured her to the Hallmark Institute of Photography, seated in the beautiful Berkshires of western Massachusetts. There, she encountered many major names in the photographic industry, including Mary Ellen Mark and Greg Heisler.

Following her education, she moved to Vermont, where she put her trade to work on a part-time basis.

#### **Return home**

In 2015, Sara and her family moved back to the New Holstein area, and she began to ponder how to expand her photography business here.

Partially due to her high school ties, but also to the magic of Elkhart Lake, Sara decided to purse an Elkhart Lake location for her business.

"Elkhart Lake has a great sense of community. It reminds me a little bit of New England with the small shops and tourism business here," she said.

"I definitely see the need here for this business," she said.

From the day she first opened her doors, Sara has been made to feel welcome by her

#### Focus on weddings, family

Sara will focus her business on weddings and family portraits.

"I want to become your family's photographer," she said. "It's important for me to build relationships with my clients, so that

I might help capture the images of their lives. In the end, I am not just photographing clients. I like to think of it as taking keepsake images for friends and family."

She can do a simple business head shot, or work on a graduation package for seniors in high school. Actually, Sara's background carries the credentials for both studio and commercial photography.

Beyond that, she takes her photography work one step further, offering consultations for how to group and place photos in her client's homes. "I use a computer program to show them how they might arrange the displays on their walls. People like being able to see how the photos can look in their living room, both from a size and color perspective," she added. She wants clients to be comfortable they are making the best of their investment in quality photography.

## EL-G schools perform well on report card

On Nov. 21, 2017 the Wisconsin Department of Instruction released report cards for all public school districts in the state. As a district and as schools individually, EL-G continues to perform extremely well. For the first two years report cards were issued (2013, 2014), both the high school and elementary/middle school rated as schools that "Exceed Expectations" and as a District, EL-G earned the same rating. Due to legislative action and changes in the state assessment, no report cards were issued in 2015. EL-GS again did well in 2016. The district was rated as "Exceeds Expectations." The elementary/ middle school received the highest fivestar rating of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations" and the high school received the rating of "Met Expectations"—missing the level of "Exceeds Expectations" by .4 percent.

For 2017, the District continued to receive the four-star rating of "Exceeds Expectations" and the high school again

moved into this same category of "Exceeds Expectations." For the second year in a row, the elementary/middle school received the highest five-star ranking of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations." All quite note-worthy achievements! While the report cards reflect only a small component of ALL that happens in the ELGS District each day. ELGS is proud of the rating received and believe it reflects the students' effort and also those put forth by the staff, parents, and community in supporting the educational experience for the District's children.

Similar to the School Report Card, the District Report Card provides valuable information on how a district is performing—identifying what is done well and where improvements can be made. It provides a broader, district-wide perspective that supplements and enriches the information found in each individual School Report Card. The School and District Report Cards are intended to help all

districts get a better picture of how they prepare graduating students for college and careers.

The District Report Cards are calculated for the district as a whole. In other words, these report cards treat the district as if it were "one big school" responsible for all students in the district. District Report Cards look very similar to the School Report Cards with one primary exception: District Report Cards include both attendance and graduation scores.

Here is how the report cards work. Each public school and district earns an overall accountability score from 0 to 100. This score is displayed in the top left corner of the School or District Report Cards. It is important to note that the 0 to 100 accountability score is not a "percent correct" measurement. The score is based on the students' 2016-2017 performance in the following four priority areas:

Student Achievement measures the

level of knowledge and skills among students in the school/district, compared to state and national standards. It includes a composite of English language arts (ELA) and mathematics performance by the "all students" group in the Wisconsin Student Assessment System (WSAS) for all tested grades in the school/district.

School/District Growth describes how much student knowledge of ELA and mathematics in the school/district changes year to year. It uses a value-added score that compares the change in a student's scores to those of observationally similar students.

Closing Gaps provides a measure that reflects the statewide goal of having all students improve, while narrowing the achievement and graduation gaps between groups of students. This measure acknowledges districts that raise the performance between specific student groups (compar-

# Hearthside dinners at the Wade House

On Saturdays, Jan. 20, Feb. 24, March 17 and April 21, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., Wade House historic site in Greenbush will be hosting Hearthside Dinners, a foodways program in which participants will have the opportunity to enjoy a delicious hearth-cooked meal, prepared with their own hands, in the historic Wade House stagecoach hotel.

Hearthside Dinner guests will experience a link to culinary history by helping to prepare 19th-century dishes on a woodburning stove and over an open-hearth fire just as Mrs. Wade did more than 150 years ago. A close gathering of up to 20 guests will be guided by costumed staff as they learn about historic food preparation, ingredients and historic cooking tools.

Authentic recipes from late-19th-century cookbooks will be referenced as guests chop and stir, season and roast, preparing their midday meal. When the dinner preparation chores are complete, guests receive a guided tour through the stately stagecoach hotel and learn about the respite, which it offered to weary travelers along the plank road between Sheboygan

and Fond du Lac in the 1850s and 1860s.

Once dinner is prepared, participants gather family style in the lovely Wade House dining room for a wonderful sitdown meal with lively conversation. The menu will feature a delectably abundant feast of squash soup, pork loin roast, red cabbage with apples, mashed turnips, glazed carrots, cranberry muffins, bread pudding, cider cake, apple cider and coffee. This satisfying encounter with central Wisconsin's past concludes with everyone pitching in to clear the table, wash dishes (19th-cenury style) and sweep the hearth.

Hearthside dinners are \$55 per person, and reservations are required. If you have any questions about the program or would like to reserve your spot at the table, please call 920-526-3271. Private Hearthside Dinners for groups of 10 to 20 may also be arranged.

## RA Walk/Run raises funds for cancer

Despite wind, rain and cold temperatures, more than 3,000 runners and walkers turned out for the 39th annual Road America Walk/Run for the American Cancer Society on Oct. 28, raising \$175,000 for cancer research, patient programs, services and education.

The non-competitive four-mile walk included 2,600 participants, while nearly 400 individuals took part in the four-mile race, which was won by defending champions Dominic Maio, 30, of West Allis, in 21:23, and Carissa Laack, of Wausau, in 26:02. Rounding out the top three male finishers were Zachary Klowkow, 20, of Sheboygan, in 22:45, and Elijah Sippel, 16,

of Windsor Heights, Iowa. Kathy Gardner, 27, of Sheboygan, finished second with a time of 26:36, with Mary Bolich, 54, of Plymouth, third in 27:19.

"It was inspirational to see people from all parts of our community come out for this great event," said Courtney Weiland, American Cancer Society Community Development Manager. "The funds raised help the American Cancer Society provide free information and support for people facing the disease today, and fund cancer research that will help protect future generations."

Of 94 fundraising teams, Kohler Co. led the way for the ninth straight year raising

a total of nearly \$17,140 (\$20,620 with the company's matching fund). Nearly 100 kids participated in the kids' fun run at the event.

## **Elkhart Lake Village Report**

## County showing strong value growth

The Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation highlighted the growth of new construction within Sheboygan County using the Department of Revenue data on new construction. The Village of Elkhart Lake saw strong growth in our commercial and manufacturing construction. Most of this development is due to the creation of the tax increment financing districts. It's a fact that municipalities, working in cooperation with local businesses, produce growth. This growth is key to expanding tax base, and the #1 way to produce sustainable schools.

Nearly 57 percent of all new residential housing took place in the Sheboygan County's townships. The "elephant in the room" is, in fact, housing. The lack of spec housing is inhibiting population/valuation growth, especially when new members of the workforce relocate here and have trouble finding housing. This in turn is hurting the local schools. The Village is working to help increase the housing available.

### Water Filter System Being Installed

We have had some issues with discoloration in some of our drinking water. This does not appear to be a widespread problem. However, we have had enough complaints that the Village is taking action to help alleviate the concerns. The Village will be installing a filtering system on Well #3, located on Arbor Drive, which will help reduce the iron in our water. We are awaiting DNR approval, after which the system will be installed. I will keep you posted as the treatment progresses. Please be assured that our water is safe to drink, even if there is discoloration.

At our Dec. 4 Village Board meeting, Terri Knowles was appointed to fill the seat vacated by the retirement of Steve Kapellen. Terri has lived in the village for

She served on the boards of The Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce serving as President. Terri also served on the Tourism Commission and ELGAA, serving as a board member and President. She also served as a Board member and Vice President of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Education Foundation. She is the longest serving member of the Community Development Authority and serves on the Village Board of Appeals. The Village Board looks forward to Terri's insights and welcomes her to this new position.

#### **Lead Pipe Update**

The Village has continued with the replacement of lead service laterals. The Village is working with two contractors on the replacement of the lead pipes. One contractor replaced nearly all his properties this fall, while the other contractor will complete his work in the spring. #### **Howards Grove Police Contract**

In 2016 the Village of Howards Grove approached Elkhart Lake about contracting for police services and after a lengthy discussion it was agreed that the Elkhart Lake Police Department would assist Howards Grove with ordinance enforcement only and not dedicate any officers specifically to their Village for patrol purposes. As 2017 started and progressed Howards Grove saw the benefit of having a police department available for various issues that they were having and again approached the Village of Elkhart Lake about the possibility of having officers assigned to Howards Grove for a specified period of time each week in order to enforce not only ordinances but all traffic and criminal violations that occur within Howards Grove. This negotiation was completed and a contract was signed by both municipalities within the last several weeks that will allow the Elkhart Lake Police Department to patrol the Village of Howards Grove for a total of 10 hours

per week

The signing of this contract in no way changes the way that the Village of Elkhart Lake is patrolled and will not reduce the number of hours or officers that are available to the residence of Elkhart Lake. Our priority is, and always will be, Elkhart Lake residents and guests. This contract with Howards Grove works mutually for both municipalities in that it provides a service that Howards Grove has never had and allows Elkhart Lake to benefit financially while doing it. If anyone has any questions I encourage you to contact Chief Meeusen at (920) 876-2244 to discuss the matter in further detail.

#### Tax Collection

Tax bills were mailed on Dec. 11. You can pay these at the Village Offices at 40 Pine Street from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday. We will be closed on Dec. 25 and 26, 2017 and Jan. 1 and 2, 2018. If the Village office is closed, payments can be dropped in the Police depository, located on the outside of the building to the west of the Pine Street entrance. You can also drop your payment off at Wisconsin Bank & Trust or National Exchange Bank & Trust in Elkhart Lake. If you have any questions, please call the Clerk's office at 876-2122. Tax payments are collected by the Village until January 31, 2017.

#### Winter Rules begin Nov. 15

Winter parking regulations go into effect on Nov. 15. As a reminder, here is the ordinance.

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street or the parking lot on North East Street between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A.M. and 6:00 o'clock A.M. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

#### Snow Removal

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

#### **Snow Removal Warning**

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.

News from the MakerSpace Program



The LS bar area is where Peters Market was. I remember the white bench that as kids we sat on eating candy from PM.


Also a great view of the feed mill (now Off the Rail, Gina's, Switchgear Brewery). The white "NK" building (original train depot) is now Off the Rail.

When we heard the fire siren someone would say "fire" and we would watch the volunteer firemen run and race their cars to the fire station.


Someone, usually a policeman, would always be in the middle of the street directing traffic.

ing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of a racial or ethnic group with their peers).

On-Track and Postsecondary Readiness indicates the success of students in the school in achieving educational milestones that predict postsecondary success, such as graduation rate, attendance, and various achievement measures.

Schools and districts are also evaluated on their test participation rates, chronic absenteeism rates, and dropout rates when applicable. These are measures of student engagement. Based on these scores, the ELG District and Schools were placed into one of five categories, from Fails to Meet Expectations to Significantly Exceeds Expectations.

EL-G District's 2016-17 overall score is 82.2 and rating is Exceeds Expectations.

EL-G Elementary/Middle School's 2016-17 overall score is 83.1 and rating is Significantly Exceeds Expectations.

Our High School's 2016-17 overall score is 73.6 and our rating is Exceeds Expectations

The State plans for the School and District Report Cards to be issued every year. Individual student results on state assessments will continue to be reported separately. DPI has produced two versions of each Report Card: one labeled "School Report Card" and the other lengthier version, "School Report Card Detail," which includes extensive information about the data used in the report cards. Both versions can be accessed online at: https://dpi. wi.gov/accountability/report-cards.

The report cards are one part of a statewide accountability system for schools. The State Superintendent, Governor, legislative leaders, and DPI staff worked closely with parents, educators, and members of the business community to develop the system. The U.S. Department of Education has reviewed changes to the accountability system. Both the accountability system and the report cards will continue to improve and evolve in future years as more data becomes available. There were several changes made to the calculation methodology to improve last year's report cards (2015-16). This year, the DPI changed how scores were weighted from prior years and also used a different methodology for calculating student growth. Both of those changes could greatly impact a district, either positively or negatively. In addition, with the legislatively required assessment transitions the past years, this round of report cards is based on three different state assessments being given to our students over the past four years. While the state attempted to account for this, these changes pose a definite disruption to the continuity of the scoring system for the report cards. For these reasons, the EL-G District, along with the WI Department of Public Instruction, caution people from making comparisons from prior years or drawing too many conclusions from the overall results until new calculations that were used for the 2016 and 2017 report card have been in place for several more

However, these report cards, as well as many other changes being implemented throughout our state and the school system, will help the ELG schools/district identify their strengths and continue to address their challenges.

The district's staff, board, and administration look forward to working with the students, parents and community members to make 2017-18 another successful school year that "Exceeds Expectations" for ALL!




