A. I grew up in the sticks of NW Oregon outside the town of Tillamook (best cheese in the world is made there!). I was accepted to the United States Military Academy Preparatory School followed by the Academy at West Point. I was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry in 1992 and began my career at Fort Benning, GA.


In the 25 years since graduation from West Point, I've been stationed in 12 different states, at 13 different installations and lived in 17 different dwellings. We've never been stationed in the same place twice. My family are saints to put up with the constant moves! I've served in mechanized Infantry, light Infantry, Stryker Infantry and Airborne units and been deployed to a combat theater 3 times.

Q. Is there a particular achievement or award in your storied career that you take more pride in than others?

A. No singular achievement, but in general, every time a Soldier I've worked with is promoted or recognized makes me happy to have had the privilege of working with them and having a part in their development.

Q. How did you eventually land at Camp Shelby?

A. The higher in rank, the less input we have as to where we are stationed, but I was blessed to be selected to command the 177th



Camp Shelby Operations

Q. How many troops (training) does Shelby serve annually?

A. The 177th Armored Brigade (The Spearhead Brigade) has nearly 700 partner units spread primarily over 6 states and the territories of Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands.

Q. Are soldiers stationed at Shelby primarily from Mississippi? From the South, the nation?

A. Soldiers in the 177th are from across the nation. Though we do get our fair share of Soldiers that are from the South...or have decided they will become a Southerner for life, the Army assigns us where they need us, regardless of our State of origin.

Q. When troops come in for, let's say, summer training, how long are they usually there?

A. Units usually spend between 2-4 weeks at Camp Shelby for their annual training period.

Q. What about the "host role" South Mississippi has played for Camp Shelby over the years and the importance of that to the armed forces' readiness?

A. Camp Shelby has played a crucial role for our military for 100 years. 2017 marks the 100th year anniversary for Camp Shelby serving as a mobilization platform during times of war and a training platform during peace.

Q. What part of the military primarily uses Camp Shelby to train? (I presume it's the Army, but could be all branches). Also, what type of training typically takes place there?

A. A better question is "who does not use Camp Shelby?" The installation hosts training units from the National Guard (Air Force and Army), US Army Reserve, the Air Force, the Navy as well as multi-national forces on occasion. It's a great training platform tactical units use to generate readiness.

Q. What is the general daily routine of a solider stationed on the base, from morning rise to turning out the lights at night?

A. For Soldiers in the Spearhead Brigade, we generally conduct physical training between 6:30 AM and 8:00 AM. This is considered part of the duty day as fitness is of the utmost importance to us. Soldiers then have a first work call at 9:00 AM and work throughout the day. Because our partners are in the Army National Guard and Army Reserve and train on the weekends for most of the year, as good partners, we travel to their locations and advise, assist and train them over their drill or battle assembly periods on the weekends.

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Camp Shelby's impact

Q. Talk a little about the importance of Camp Shelby's partnership with the U.S. Army reserve and the Mississippi National Guard, specifically the 155th Armored Brigade Combat Team.

A. The 177th Armored Brigade is part of First Army commanded by a 3-star Army General. First Army consists of nine brigades spread across the country with the mission, as the coordinating authority, to implement the Army Total Force Policy. In general terms, as members of the First Army Team, we are responsible for advising, assisting and training the Army National Guard and Army Reserve to enable them to achieve Department of the Army readiness requirements. This insures they are prepared to deploy and successfully support any Combatant Commander across the globe.

"The 155th"

We have a special relationship with the Mississippi National Guard as they are the home team. As an active component Army organization, we are garrisoned on a National Guard installation and are blessed to have an incredible working relationship with the MSARNG. Beginning in January, the Dixie Thunder, the 155th Armored Brigade Combat Team (MSARNG), will begin its train up for eventual deployment to the Central Command theater of operations in the Middle East.

We will be shoulder to shoulder with them here at Camp Shelby and then spend about three months with them at Fort Bliss, Texas during their final preparation for deployment.

And a special shout out to the National Guard as December 13th marked their 381st birthday. Serving since 1636!

Q. Readiness is the Army's top priority. How is that cultivated at Camp Shelby?

A. Readiness starts with the individual Soldier. As part of our profession, we are required to maintain a high level of individual readiness - this is our foundation. We focus on physical, mental and spiritual readiness throughout the Army. This transcends all Army formations and includes Family readiness. Of course, based on each unit's specialty, we train to generate readiness to enable us to accomplish the mission the Army has assigned our unit and thus be prepared should we be called upon. Having a ready force does more than allow us to fight and win. Having a ready force also deters our

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adversaries. Deterrence is our chosen path, but if we must fight, we must win! Second place in this competition is not acceptable.

Q. How involved is Camp Shelby with the community here in the Pine Belt?

A. We try to stay as connected to the community as our schedule allows and give back to the Pine Belt for the hospitality that they provide our Soldiers and families. We are involved in multiple JROTC programs, the USM ROTC program, the HUB City Humane Society, schools across the Lamar and Petal school districts as well as multiple veteran's homes across the state.

Armed forces today

Q. How has technology reshaped training practices at Camp Shelby over the past decade?

A. As a brigade with the mission of advising, assisting and training our National Guard and Army Reserve partners spread across six states and two territories, simple technological advances like file sharing and video teleconferencing have exponentially increased our ability to accomplish our mission.

Simulations have also reduced overhead costs and allowed our force to gain proficiencies that would otherwise not be achievable, especially in a budget constrained environment.

Q. Battle has changed from face-toface combat, trench warfare, to today's high-tech drones. How will battles be fought in 10-20 years? Just how far can technology go in warfare?

A. I certainly don't have a glass ball, but I think regardless of the technological advances in the next 10-20 years, there will be a need for a standing Army that can operate as part of a Joint Force. We certainly cannot do it alone. That said, conflicts past, present and future will ultimately be resolved on land, hence the Army will continue to play a large role.

Our Army needs to be trained and equipped to ensure that forces are prepared to prevent conflict, shape the security environment, and win wars.

With the current exponential technology growth across the world, we no longer hold a decisive technological edge over our adversaries. Though upgraded, our main combat systems are 35 years old. To regain overmatch, we must embrace the new technologies and modernize our force. Of course modernization requires sufficient and predictable funding

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commensurate with our requirements to prepare for the future fights. I think there are a few technologies out there that have great military application such as human and cognitive sciences, new lighter materials to protect us, autonomous and semi-autonomous vehicles and of course increased weapons ranges and lethality delivered with precision.

Q. In the event of a large international conflict, how would operations at Camp Shelby change?

A. Depending on the scope of the conflict, I think Camp Shelby would perform a similar mission as it has done for the past 100 years and mobilize Soldiers for deployment.

Families, GI Bill, advice to young adults considering the military as a career

Q. Military families are often separated/apart for extended periods during tours of duty. What does that mean to you, your family? And what can you share of how military families cope during those times?

A. Our Families are the true heroes! They endure long absences not knowing whethertheirSoldierisgoingtocomehome. Our Spouses take on the responsibility of running the entire household, attending all the children's' events and taking care of other Army Spouses. I think it really takes a recognition and buy in to the fact that we are serving a higher cause, something bigger than ourselves and that sacrifice from both the Soldier and the Family are part of the job description.

Q. Is there a historical military leader you've studied and have an appreciation for?

A. We continuously study the leadership and actions of those that have gone before us so that is a hard question to answer in short order. Off the top of my head there are two famous WWII Army leaders that I try to emulate specific traits from. General Eisenhower for his innate ability to build and maintain teams with disparate opinions and General Patton for his audacity in combat.

Q. Has the GI Bill been helpful to your career?

Q. Absolutely. Although I have not used it personally, it allowed me to enroll my son in the college of his choosing and be able to afford it. It has helped countless Soldiers and family members to earn a degree without incurring an inordinate amount of debt and begin their life after service on the right path.





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
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
