

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

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Someone told me that it could hurt my case if I asked for unemployment compensation and didn't get it after my on-the-job injury. The company has paid me weekly since my injury which is helpful but I believe they fired me because I was hurt on the job and they have been negative towards me since my injury and I know they have let other people go who were hurt on the job. How can unemployment benefits affect my on the job injury claim?

You have to remember that for the past decade you have had a Republican Supreme Court. That typically means that its decisions will be friendly to big businesses (such as Exxon, twice). I don't care how you vote just

be aware that Democratic Supreme Courts are going to be more oriented towards decisions that benefit the working man and Republican Courts are going to be more oriented towards helping businesses.

In what is widely believed to be a poorly thought out opinion the Alabama Supreme Court decided to link unemployment hearings decided by a referee to retaliatory discharge cases that are tried by lawyers before judges and decided by juries. It is difficult to describe the difference between an unemployed, unrepresented claimant seeking unemployment benefits who is probably unaware that he even has the right to sue his employer for firing him because of his on the job injury and a fully represented litigant with an experienced attorney, full disclosure and the right to a jury trial. Sometimes Supreme Court Judges really haven't

been attorneys that represent people and it shows.

In Alabama an employer may not fire someone because they were injured on the job. Anyone who considers the matter can see how unfair it is to fire someone who is already hurt and was hurt while doing a job for the company that fired them. Not only is that a legal wrong it seems a moral wrong as well. What people don't see right away is that when a worker is fired after an on the job injury other workers who get hurt are reluctant to report their injury. If they wait too long to report their injury (5 days under certain situations) they no longer have the right to pursue their claim. Firing one employee after an on the job injury will prevent other as yet unknown claims from being filed by employees who have families to support and need their job. After they tough it out and find they don't have a claim or a job, they then find out they don't have the medical benefits of workers compensation either.

If you file your unemployment request and lose you may not file a retaliatory discharge lawsuit against your employer. That is what the Alabama Supreme Court decided. If you were hurt on the job always talk to a lawyer that will protect your rights. Those consultations are available at no charge.

But if your grandkids


are still little, please don't give them gift cards. No, grandma. No!

Dear Krista

Next time, since you obviously have a sales background, how about treating it like a sales call? If you're on a sales call, and the customer needs to perform some due diligence before deciding, a smart salesperson will ask to schedule a follow-up. Ask if debt or hurting yourselves checking back on a certain day in the next week or two will work. You don't want to be obnoxious, but you want an appointment of sorts — a time frame — so you'll know when to follow up without being pushy.

In this situation, I would sending recommend another email. You want to walk right up to that fine line that separates bold from obnoxious, because that's one of things a good sales manager should be able to do. Respectfully tell them you understand the decision-making process takes time, but you need to know when you can expect an answer.

Use the idea that you're a great sales person, and you're treating this as a professional sales call. And don't be afraid to have a little fun with it. If you're still under consideration, that means they like you. You could even hint at the fact they don't want to hire a sales manager who doesn't know how to follow up!

The winning artwork will be featured as the design of the 2019-20 Alabama Waterfowl Stamp. The Alabama stamp is required for all licensed hunters when hunting migratory waterfowl in the state. Revenue from the sale of the stamp is used to purchase, establish, or improve migratory waterfowl habitat.

The 2018 contest will take place in conjunction with the annual "Fins, Feathers and Flowers" event at Lakepoint Resort State Park in Eufaula from February 16-18. Similar to Eagle Awareness weekends at Lake Guntersville, Fins, Feathers and Flowers offers a variety of activities for wildlife watchers. The weekend is a cooperative effort of the Alabama State Parks Division and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

All eligible entries will be on display at Lakepoint State Park beginning Friday, February 16. Three judges from the fields of art, ornithology, and wildlife conservation will select the winning waterfowl art the following day at 1pm. The media and public are invited to attend.

The judging criteria will emphasize uncluttered design suitable for printing as a stamp, anatomical accuracy of the illustrated species, and artistic

rendering. Close attention must be given to tone and detail since those aspects are prerequisites for printing artwork as a stamp. Wing and feather construction must be particularly well-defined. Entries may be drawn or painted in any medium. Entries cannot exceed 9 x 12 inches (15 x 18 inches matted).
