



#### Panera's Broccoli Cheddar

#### **Ingredients**

1 tablespoon butter

1/2 onion, chopped

1/4 cup melted butter

1/4 cup flour

2 cups milk

2 cups chicken stock

1 1/2 cups coarsely chopped broccoli florets

1 cup matchstick-cut carrots

1 stalk celery, thinly sliced

 $2\ 1/2\ cups\ shredded\ sharp\ Cheddar\ cheese$ 

salt and ground black pepper to taste

#### **Directions**

Melt 1 tablespoon butter in a skillet over medium-high heat. Saute onion in hot butter until translucent, about 5 minutes. Set aside.

Whisk 1/4 cup melted butter and flour together in a large saucepan over medium-low heat; cook until flour loses it's granular texture, adding 1 to 2 tablespoons of milk if necessary to keep the flour from burning, 3 to 4 minutes. Gradually pour milk into flour mixture while whisking constantly. Stir chicken stock into milk mixture. Bring to a simmer; cook until flour taste is gone and mixture is thickened, about 20 minutes. Add broccoli, carrots, sauteed onion, and celery; simmer until vegetables are tender, about 20 minutes.

Stir Cheddar cheese into vegetable mixture until cheese melts. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

#### **Applebee's Tomato Basil**

#### **Ingredients**

3 tablespoons olive oil

1 small clove garlic, minced

1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed tomato soup

1/4 cup bottled marinara sauce

1/2 (10.75 ounce) can water

1 teaspoon chopped fresh oregano, or to taste

1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil, or more to taste

6 Italian-style seasoned croutons, or as needed

2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

#### **Directions**

Heat olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Saute garlic in hot oil until tender and fragrant, 2 to 3 minutes. Stir Stir condensed tomato soup and marinara sauce into garlic; slowly add water. Mix oregano and black pepper into soup;









bring to a simmer, reduce heat to low, and cook until flavors blend, about 15 minutes. Stir basil into soup. Ladle into bowls and top with croutons and Parmesan cheese.

#### Olive Garden's Zuppa Toscana

#### **Ingredients**

1 (16 ounce) package smoked sausage

2 potatoes, cut into 1/4-inch slices

3/4 cup chopped onion

6 slices bacon

1 1/2 teaspoons minced garlic

2 cups kale - washed, dried, and shredded

2 tablespoons chicken soup base

1 quart water

1/3 cup heavy whipping cream

#### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F (150 degrees C).

Place sausage links onto a sheet pan and bake for 25 minutes, or until done. Cut links in half lengthwise, then cut at an angle into 1/2-inch slices.

Place onions and bacon slices in a large saucepan and cook over medium heat until onions are almost clear. Remove bacon and crumble. Set aside.

Add garlic to the onions and cook an additional 1 minute. Add chicken soup base, water, and potatoes, simmer 15 minutes.

Add crumbled bacon, sausage, kale, and cream. Simmer 4 minutes and serve.

#### Panera's Lemon Chicken Orzo

#### **Ingredients**

8 ounces orzo pasta

1 teaspoon olive oil

3 carrots, chopped, or more to taste

3 ribs celery, chopped

1 onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1/2 teaspoon dried thyme

1/2 teaspoon dried oregano

salt and ground black pepper to taste

1 bay leaf

3 (32 ounce) cartons fat-free, low-sodium chicken broth

1/2 cup fresh lemon juice

1 lemon, zested

8 ounces cooked chicken breast, chopped

1 (8 ounce) package baby spinach leaves


1 lemon, sliced for garnish (optional)

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese (optional)

#### **Directions**

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook orzo in the boiling water until partially cooked through but not yet soft, about 5 minutes; drain and rinse with cold water until cooled completely.

Heat olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Cook and stir carrots, celery, and onion in hot oil until the vegetables begin to soften and the onion becomes translucent, 5 to 7



Stir orzo, lemon juice, and lemon zest into the broth; add chicken. Cook until the chicken and orzo are heated through, about 5 minutes. Add baby spinach; cook until the spinach wilts into the broth and the orzo is tender, 2 to 3 minutes. Ladle soup into bowls; garnish with lemon slices and Parmesan cheese.

#### Shoney's Beef Cabbage

#### **Ingredients**

1 pound lean ground beef

½ head medium cabbage, shredded

2 ribs celery, sliced

1 small bell pepper, cut up into small pieces

1 medium diced onion

1 (16-ounce) canned kidney beans

1 (28-ounce) canned tomatoes,

chopped

1 (28-ounce) can of water

4 beef bouillon cubes

¼ teaspoon garlic powder

1/4 teaspoon garlic salt

salt and pepper, to taste

#### **Directions**

Brown ground beef and drain.

Add remaining ingredients to ground beef, adding 28 ounces of water using the 28 ounce tomato can. Bring to a boil and simmer for at least one hour or until veggies are tender.


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



Most people assume WWJD is for "What would Jesus do?" But the initials really stand for "What would Jesus drive?"


