Browning named Ellisville's 2017 Citizen of the Year

During the annual Ellisville Mayor's Christmas Luncheon, held this year at Charlie's Catfish, Mayor Lynn Buckhaults and the Ellisville Board of Alderman named William C. (Billy) Browning as Ellisville's 2017 Citizen of the Year. Department Employees of the Year were also named during the luncheon and include Fireman of the Year – Michael Haynes, Policeman of the Year - DeReginald Williamson, and Public Works Employee of the Year – Michael Rogers.

Browning grew up in Alabama and moved to Mississippi after graduating with an M.B.A. from William Carey College. He began his career with Mississippi Power in 1984 and retired as human resources manager. Throughout his career he has worked with legislative affairs, human resources, marketing, and operations. His volunteerism and leadership skills have been seen throughout Mississippi for over 40 years.

"I moved to Ellisville ten years ago, and I love living in Ellisville," exclaimed Browning.

Browning's current community and civic activities includes serving as a member of the advisory board for the Dubard School for Language, founder of the Dubard School Foundation (currently serves as the officer of the Foundation Board), Chair of the Capital Campaign of the Dubard School (raised \$2 million), former chair and present member of the Jones County Economic Development Authority Board, member of the advisory board of Hancock Bank, member of First Baptist Church of Ellisville (serves on several church committees), chaired the committee to create a design standards ordinance for the City of Ellisville, currently serving as chairman of the City of Ellisville design standards committee, and he recently led the fund-raising

efforts to purchase body cameras for the Ellisville Police Department.

His past affiliations include past Chair and member of the William Carey University Board, former Chair of the United Way of the Pine Belt Region Board, original board member and Chair of the Mississippi Power Foundation, for 25 years served in many roles for the Girl Scouts Board of Directors,

former member of the Bancorp South Advisory Board, and former member and Chair of the Association for Excellence in Education Board.

Even with all of his accomplishments Browning said, "This is so humbling. There are so many others in the community that are so much more deserving of this honor than



football title since 2002 last season. The Tartars defeated Winona 41-26 in Oxford, Miss. on Dec. 2 in the Class 2A title game to conclude the season with a 15-1 record. The 6'1, 160-pound quarterback threw for 333 yards and three touchdowns on 18 completions in the win.

The freshman signal-called led all high school quarterbacks in the state of Mississippi with 4,562 passing yards according to MaxPreps. He finished with 53 total touchdowns (45 passing and eight rushing) and completed 67 percent of his passes. Keyes is part of the 2021 recruiting class and could

be the most highly recruited quarterback in the said class.

"I'm so happy for Ty and his family. I would also like to thank the Ole Miss coaching staff for offering Ty," said Taylorsville head coach Chuck Robertson. "Ty is a very talent QB. Of course, he has great arm talent, but he just has that 'it' factor that you can't teach. You sometimes forget he's only in 9th grade because he just doesn't get rattled and carries himself so well on and off the field. If he continues on the path that he is on, he has a chance to be very, very special. I feel like this will be the first one of many."











Jones County Sheriff's Department personnel address Kiwanis members

The Kiwanis Club of Laurel hosted members of the Jones County Sheriff's Department on Wednesday at their weekly meeting at the Laurel Country Club to learn more about the department's Victims Advocacy program.

Both Breland and Koss serve as victims advocates and assist crime victims with all aspects of navigating the criminal justice system, including attending protection hearings in court, assisting with doctor and emergency room visits, and obtaining crime victims compensation from the State of Mississippi among a host of other responsibilities. The invaluable services offered provide crime victims with a shoulder to lean on and help in managing the trauma associated with being a victim of crime. All three department members are available to speak to groups interested in learning more about the Victims Advocacy program.

Rebels down MSU in hardwood action; Lady Bulldogs set school record

Ole Miss head basketball coach Andy Kennedy won his 100th SEC game as his Rebels downed archrival Mississippi State, 64-58, last Saturday. Ole Miss was trailing State 50-39 with 10 minutes to play only to go on a 25-8 run. It was the Rebels' eighth win in their last nine games against MSU.

The Lady Bulldogs of Mississippi State scored a school SEC record 111 points in their win over Arkansas last week. The Lady Bulldogs will host national champion South Carolina on February 5.

USM baseball made the news nationally this week. Stony Brook University cancelled a three-game series with USM that was to be played in Hattiesburg in late February. The reason given was that the state of New York banned all non-essential state travel to Mississippi because of the State of Mississippi House Bill 1523. The Eagles will now travel 400 miles to Stephen F. Austin in Nacogdoches, Texas, to take part in a tournament. USM will open in Hattiesburg against Mississippi State Feb. 16-18.

BAY SPRINGS NATIVE HILL DENSON HONORED

Belhaven University baseball coach Hill Denson was inducted into the American Baseball College Association Hall of Fame last week. The Bay Springs native won 1,058 games during his 31-year college baseball career at Belhaven and USM. As head coach of the Golden Eagles for 14 seasons, Denson won 468 games and produced 35 professional players.. Denson has also been inducted into the Jones County Junior College Sports HoF, the Mississippi Semi-Pro Baseball HoF, the USM Sports HoF, the Belhaven University Sports HoF and the Mississippi Sports HoF.

BELHAVEN HIRES NEW FOOTBALL COACH

Belhaven hired a new head football coach to replace Hal Mumme. University of Delaware offensive line coach Blaine McCorkle was named head coach of the Blazers last week. He formerly played football for LSU (1995-97) where was a long snapper. The 19-year veteran of college coaching has also coached at Liberty University, Richmond University, UT-Chattanooga, Georgia Southern, UT Martin, University of the South and Tennessee Tech. He was also a student coach at LSU. His dad (Sam) is presently an assistant high school football coach at Oxford High School.

MSU'S McLaurin Recognized for Work in Taxslayer Bowl

Collins native Mark McLaurin was named the Most Valuable Player of the TaxSlayer Bowl, but that was not the only recognition McLaurin received. The Mississippi State safety earned a spot on the Associated Press All-Bowl Team as well.

GRUDEN WORTH \$100 MILLION TO RAIDERS

The Oakland Raiders were scheduled to hire Jon Gruden this week. The former Oakland and Tampa Bay head coach will sign a 10-year deal worth \$100 million. Gruden last coached in the NFL in 2008 and has been the lead analyst for ESPN's Monday Nigh Football telecast for the last nine years.

January 10, 2008: Newly hired USM football coach Larry Fedora recommended Barney Farrar, Blake Anderson, Tony Hughes and Frank Wilson to join his coaching staff.

January 12, 1978: Newly hired Ole Miss football coach Steve Sloan named Tom Goode, Romeo Crennel and John Cropp to his staff. The Saints fired Hank Stram, and Dick Nolan was named head coach. Stram was 7-21 in two seasons.

January 13, 1978: Mississippi College was placed on a four-year probation for giving too many scholarships. The Choctaws won the 1989 National Championship. The Lady Bulldogs of Bay Springs High School were ranked 14th in USA Today's basketball poll.

January 16, 1998: The Ole Miss Rebels (12-1) were ranked 11th in the nation. It was their highest ranking in school history. Mississippi State was 12-3 while USM had an 11-2 record.

January 17, 1998: USM turned down a \$250,000 payout from Ole Miss to play in Oxford this year. The Golden Eagles wanted their usual \$400,000 deal that they had with Alabama. The teams had not played since 1983.




