The final evening sees the campers sharing what they have learned with one another in a two- to three-hour joy-filled session of music, dance and drama. The following morning, everyone heads home. It is a special time of discovery and fun. Many campers come back again and again, and newcomers are embraced with open arms.

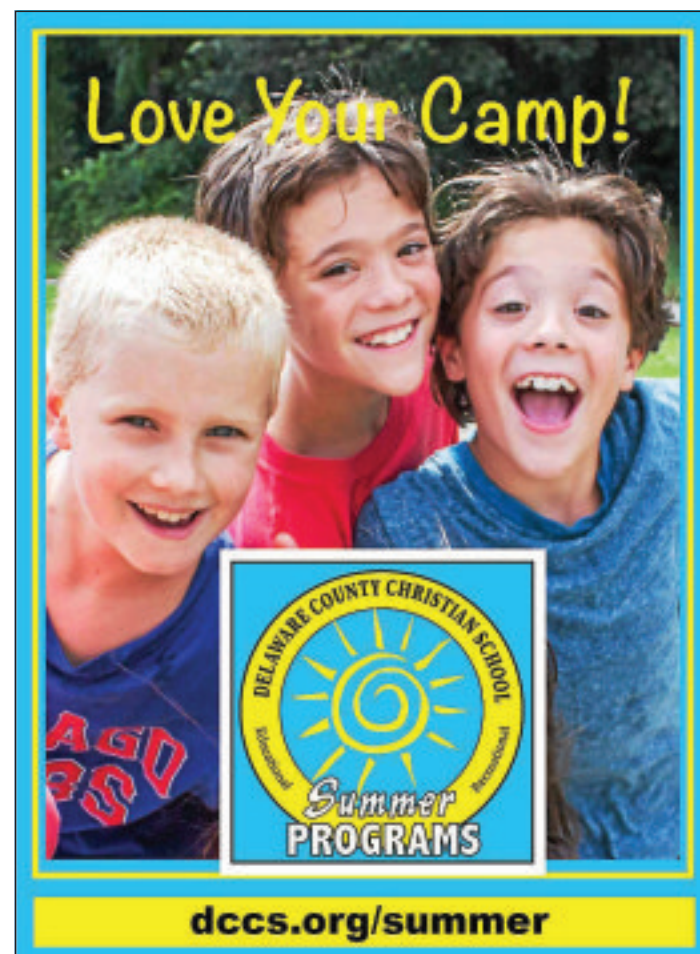

# Morning academic program meets students where they are



Students in the five-week morning academic program take three courses each day: a one-on-one tutorial in language arts, small group math and a choice between an art, music or a STEM elective.

Small group instruction in language arts is tailored to students' needs and individual goals and provided by instructors trained in DV's nationally accredited

Orton-Gillingham literacy development program. Emphasis is placed on reading and writing skills-building — and offers a great way to get those summer reading books and projects completed without the usual “last week of summer panic.”

Students also receive small group instruction in math geared toward reinforcing and maintaining

skills and concepts from their most recently completed math course.

Rounding out the morning program, students can choose between three exciting and creative electives: art, music and STEM. In the art track, students will explore ceramics, screen printing, drawing, painting and mixed media fine arts. Music is a hands-on course based on improvisation where students of varying experience and skill levels can collaborate to make great music and have a lot of fun the process. STEM is for students in grades eight to 10, and topics include coding, robotics, rocketry, 3D printing and drones.

# The perfect summer option for your young scientist

What exactly do you do when the family's young scientist puts the lights out again with a loud bang and an apology? Or fills the house with the smoke usually seen around a chemical factory? One option might be to send him to Camp Watonka, where a unique science summer program has been operating for over 50 years to rescue you from just that kind of problem.

Camp Watonka campers spend around half a day doing science in custom laboratories covering chemistry, physics, electronics, video, robotics, astronomy, earth science, nature, biology and photography.

But if science camp sounds a little too much like school, then it's worth

considering the full range of other activities available — dirt bikes, one of the largest ropes courses in the Northeast and all the sports, crafts and waterfront. The program is fully elective with campers choosing their science options for a two-week course and filling in their non-science time with the other activities on a day-by-day basis.

One of the activities that many campers do in their non-science time is rocketry. In keeping with the unique nature of the camp, the program doesn't use any kits; instead, campers get to be creative by building and launching their own designs. This principle of creativity applies across the crafts and to the sciences where

campers are encouraged to investigate and experiment. Many school science classes have the students following a series of instructions to get a pre-planned result, but at camp, there are the facilities and staff to allow campers to ask their own questions and perform the experiments to test their own ideas under the direction and leadership of qualified instructors.

As participants in an overnight camp, campers learn to work cooperatively together. Being away from home might be a new experience, but campers learn to act on their own and make choices without continual instruction. "Should I choose the top or lower bunk? Should I go swimming or play soccer?"

Camp counselors typically don't intervene in the same way as parents, so your child will be responsible for the important life skill of making many day-to-day decisions on their own.

Campers also have an excellent opportunity to make new friends. Living with a group of like-minded kids, how could someone not make new friends, especially at a camp that offers an elective program where campers get to choose their own activities, heightening the chance of hanging out with like-minded individuals?

If you are hesitant about sending your child to overnight camp and even if your camper is upset in the moment of saying goodbye, keep in mind that they will likely be much sadder leaving camp at the end of their stay after a couple of weeks of great experiences and with an email list of new

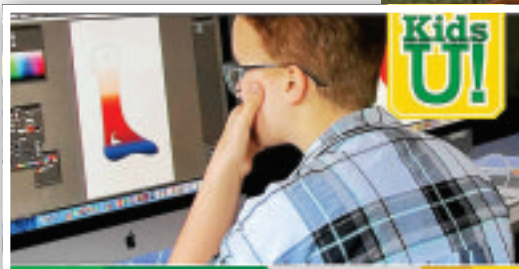

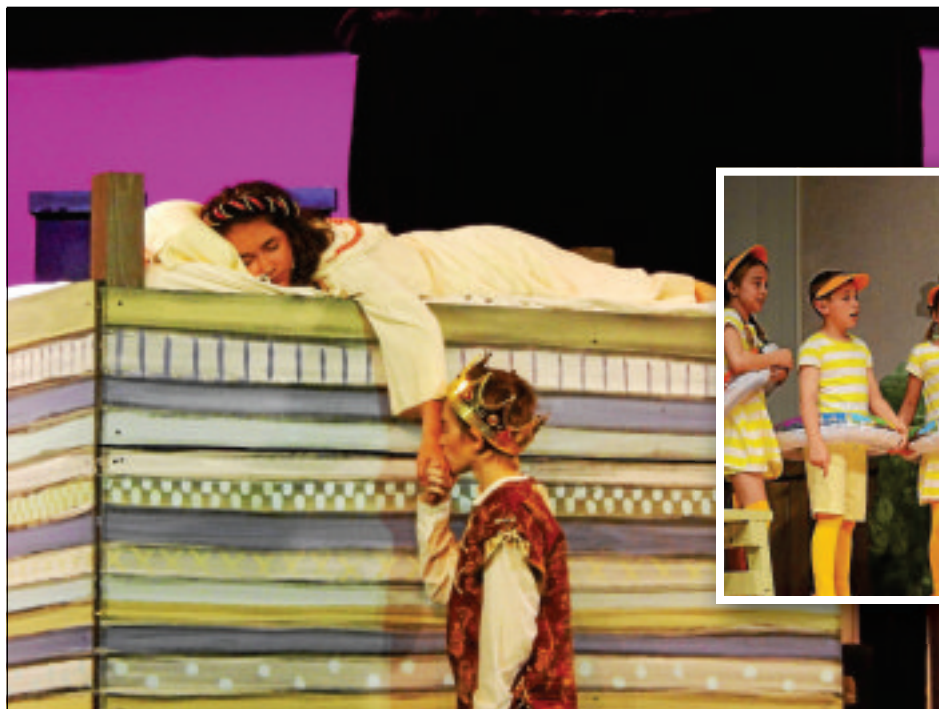

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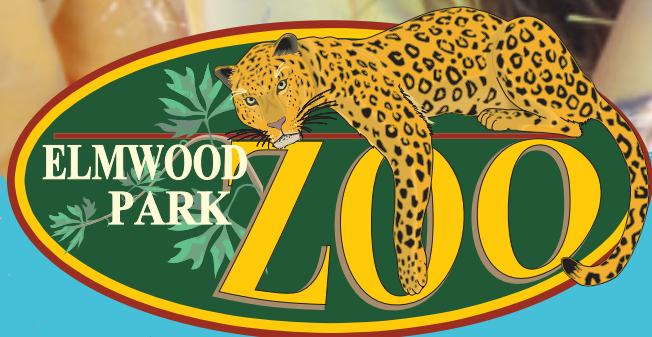

# Unplugging to connect at summer camp

As adults, when we think about summer vacation, we remember riding our bikes to the local pool. We recall the sound of the ice cream truck, and we think about the friends we made at summer camp. # PC Summer Camp celebrates 50 years

*A Q&A with Charlie Kaesshaefer, director of Penn Charter Summer Camp, who reflects on summer camps past and present.*

**Q** : Penn Charter Summer Camp is celebrating its 50th year. Tell me about your first year as a junior camp counselor 50 years ago.

**A** : When I was a sophomore at PC and interested in becoming a teacher. The director of our brand new day camp told me I could be a junior counselor, but he couldn't put me on the payroll. Forty campers and 10 counselors did tennis, archery, art, music, swimming, sports and games. Our big events were the counselor hunt,

capture the flag and the carnival. We've continued these classic activities for 50 years. At the end of the summer, I did get paid — \$25. The director wrote a note that said: "I hope you'll come back next year."

**Q** : What are some of the things you love most about Summer Camp?

**A** : I love watching the kids make new friends and try new activities that build confidence. I love watching friendships develop between kids and their counselors. Many of our campers develop an interest in working with children and later apply to be counselors. Often, this is their first job experience, and I

have the privilege of mentoring them.

**Q** : How do you keep Summer Camp fresh?

**A** : Each year we have a different summer theme, and we plan many of our activities, special events and trips around it. Our core group of counselors has been with us for decades in many cases, and yet we add new counselors each year who bring new ideas and renewed energy.

**Q** : What are some of the best summer themes over the years?

**A** : Some of the most successful have been the Great Outdoors, Winter Wonderland and

Olympic Summer. My personal favorite is Tropical Paradise. We trucked in 50 tons of sand to build a "beach" where we held most of our special events like a sand-sculpting contest, a treasure hunt and beach volleyball. During a trip to Independence Seaport Museum, the kids learned about pirates and Philadelphia seaport history.

**Q** : Fifty years ago there was only Day Camp. Today there are more than 25 camps. Why so many specialty camps?

**A** : Growing beyond the basic day camp is a national trend. Kids have more varied interests, so we offer specific camps, everything from theater to tech, science to

sports. Campers can still enroll in the traditional Day Camp but can also mix and match with some specialty camps.

**Q** : How do you come up with ideas for a new specialty camp?

**A** : PC teachers often propose — and run — specialty camps, such as Drone, Science Invention and Science Engineering camps. Innovations at PC such as the IdeaLab have helped spark new camps; Animation, MineCraft and Filmmaking make great use of the lab's technology.

**Q** : You are a longtime teacher as well as summer camp director. What does traditional Day Camp do for the develop-

ment of a child?

**A** : Kids get to interact with each other in a safe, positive and fun environment on a beautiful 47-acre campus in Philadelphia. Being outside for much of the day is important for their physical, social and emotional development. While they get to take part in some of the traditional camp activities that we have offered for 50 years, they also get to try new things and mix it up with new camps. They get to experience healthy competition between bunks and color-contest teams, as well as challenge themselves by trying to make it to the next level in archery, tennis and swimming.
