Gov. Mark Dayton proposes \$1.5B for Minnesota infrastructure projects

Governor Mark Dayton introduced a \$1.5 billion public works proposal on Tuesday, Jan. 16. that he believes would make urgently-needed investments to build worldclass colleges and universities for Minnesotans, and improve and repair state buildings and other critical infrastructure across the state.

Governor Dayton's proposal would invest \$542 million at the University of Minnesota and Minnesota State campuses. An additional \$998 million would be directed to improving state buildings, building affordable housing, repairing clean water infrastructure, and other urgently-needed infrastructure improvement projects across Minnesota.

Governor Dayton believe that his public works proposal would create an estimated 22,950 jobs and support statewide economic growth.



The season runs from April 18 to May 31 and is divided into six hunt periods, A through F (see table below). Hunt A and B licenses for firearms hunters age 18 and older are limited in availability and assigned via lottery drawing.

Turkey lottery applications cost \$5 and can be purchased online at mndnr.gov/licenses, by phone at 888-665-4236, or in person from a license

agent. Successful applicants will receive a postcard in the mail by mid-February and can purchase their hunting license starting March 1.

Firearms licenses for hunts C, D, E and F are not lottery-limited and will be available for purchase over-thecounter beginning March 1. All licensed turkey hunters can participate in Hunt F if they have an unused tag from one of the earlier hunt

periods. Archery and youth hunters (under 18) are exempt from the lottery and may purchase a spring turkey license valid during all hunt periods, including hunts A and B.

Surplus lottery licenses from hunts A and B, if available, will be sold overthe-counter starting in mid-March.




