



LOST STREAM MAP

The STREAM & LAKE MAP OF NEW YORK resembles another map-known to Pennsylvania anglers as the "Lost Stream Map."

It was completed in 1965 after a 30 year effort by Howard Higbee, a former Penn State Professor.

Professor Higbee painstakingly plotted by hand, the location of 45,000 miles of streams onto the map. It sold extremely well - until the printer declared bankruptcy and hauled Higbee's work to the landfill.

But reprints were impossible because the maps were printed in non-photographic blue. Higbee was even offered \$400 for one of his last maps. And state agencies were forced to keep their copies under Iock and key.

AT THE BIRD FEEDER

It is estimated that about 40 percent of the households in this country feed birds because people enjoy seeing them. Many people are doing so to help birds during the hard times of winter. Some of us also feed during the summer because we get to see a different variety of birds such as the rose-breasted grosbeak, and we enjoy seeing the young being fed at the feeder by the adults.

There is some question about this being good or bad, so let's look into this matter. First, it depends where you are located. Some places, especially in the cities, have ordinances against bird feeding because of rodent problems, so

the birds have no chance to feed, period. However, that is not a problem for us rural folks as we are not boxed in like sardines, and if we get a rodent problem we know how to take care of it!

Second, feeding birds can spread bird diseases, but there are ways to avoid this.

Third, some folks figure we are making the birds too depend on us and they will not be able to survive if we stop feeding. That, of course, is not so, as the birds have plenty of natural food and actually prefer it under good conditions. I had some pretty high concentrations of birds at my feeder during the recent cold snap, but as soon as that almost-60-degree weather moved in the bird activity was way down because they were out their getting natural food. Same in the fall when we had good weather and everyone was wondering where the birds were.


Fourth, during tough weather conditions feeding the birds can actually help them make it through those rough times. Winter feeding may also help the birds to be in better condition for reproduction in the spring.

So I feel that feeding birds has many more pluses for it, but it is more involved than just hanging up a feeder and putting some bargain basement birdseed in it and laying back and watching. Before anything is done, a spot must be picked where the feeder can be observed easily and yet not cause any problems near the house like bird droppings and birdseed residue. It must also be a spot where squirrels can not jump from a tree or the ground to the feeder. You will go broke feeding them, believe me! It would be helpful if there is some cover for the birds near by such as conifers or bushes which give them cover from predators such as sharp-shinned hawks. If you have no such cover a couple old disregarded Christmas trees staked near the feeder will work (even artificial ones).

The type of feeder you use is up to you, but I prefer the tube type with many feeding holes around it. It can be used by most birds that I enjoy seeing and discourages many I don't want. At camp my tube feeder gets swamped with blue jays and they not only make a mess sorting though the seeds, but also bully other birds. I solve this problem by putting a chicken wire cage around the feeder, which the smaller birds have no problem with, but discourages the jay. I also put a guarter-inch mesh bottom on it that extends out about six inches from the feeder to catch those seeds that get spilled. Now, how do you present this feeder to the birds? Well, as mentioned before squirrels can be a big problem and they are VERY GOOD at figuring out how to get to a feeder. I have solved the problem by putting a 1.5-inch pipe in the ground that is about seven foot high which has a "T" fitting on the top. I drove a three foot piece of pipe, the next size diameter bigger, in the ground first and then put the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pipe into that. Through that fitting I put a four foot long stick that will snugly fit halfway through. I hang my bird feeder on one end and the peanut feeder on the other. Then to finish it off I put a cone-type squirrel guard or baffle around the pole about three from the ground. This whole rig needs to be at least 12 feet away from any tree or building that a squirrel can "launch" from. There are other ways to feed the squirrels if you want to (they are quite entertaining!) without having them eat all the seeds or chew up your feeder. I put cobs of corn stuck on metal stakes stuck in the ground about three feet high and on hooks made from heavy wire and hung from the nearby tree branches. Make sure the cob is stuck on the whole length of the cob so they can't pull it off. As far as storing my birdseed, I do so near the feeder, but use a good METAL garbage can and a tight lid. The seed must be keep dry and away from those prying squirrels and mice! Hint- they eat right through plastic garbage cans! Now what do you put in that feeder, and is a suet feeder or peanut feeder a good idea? And what kind of problems can you expect? Check out next week's column and to learn some more tricks around the feeder.

Real Estate Investing for Beginners

On the heels of a recession that saw home values drop, many wouldbe investors have shied away from buying investment properties But real estate has historically remained a sound investment, boasting a long-term appreciation rate that makes it a worthwhile investment for those who can withstand temporary setbacks in housing prices and hold on to their properties over the long haul.

But investors are often nervous as they look for their first properties Uncertainty about housing prices aside, investing in real estate also is risky, and first-time investors need to be comfortable with such risk in order to make the most of their investments. 
Time

Investors must be sure they have the time to address their tenants' concerns, especially investors with no plans to hire property management firms. Potential investors who already have full plates at work and at home may not be able to devote the time necessary to make the most of their real estate investments, and therefore might be better off finding another way to invest their money.

Time also must be considered when considering profits. Real estate is not the type of investment that turns a profit overnight. Even investors who are looking to invest in an up-and-coming neighborhood must be prepared to hold onto their properties for at least a few years, if not much longer, to maximize their investments. Though real estate is a sound investment, it is not a get rich quick type of investment, so investors looking to make a quick buck should consider alternatives before buying investment properties.

Size

more to manage bigger properties, which can eat into investors' finances. Veteran investors can handle such overhead costs, but first-timers might find themselves caught off guard upon realizing the gravity of their financial commitment. A good rule of thumb for first-time investors is to stick to smaller properties, only moving on to larger buildings once they are fully comfortable with all that comes with investing in real estate.

Costs

The cost of a real estate investment goes beyond the purchase price of the home. In addition to the mortgage on the property, investors must pay the taxes and insurance on the property, as well as any costs associated with maintaining and managing the property Certain tax breaks are available to real estate investors depending on where they live. A MATTER OF WILL

Failure to draw up a will leaves your survivors facing the prospect of having your property distributed under the state's laws, which are strict in their prescriptions. Individuals who die without wills are said to have died intestate, while those who will receive the deceased's personal property under the intestacy laws are usually referred to as intestate distributees. Each must face the fact that those who die without having wills are, in effect, granting the state the right to draw up their wills for them. State laws also specify who will be appointed as administrator of the estate. To exert complete control over the matter of how your estate will be distributed, tend to the important matter of your will.

When most of us think of settling one's estate, we think of the passing of an elderly person. However, the reality is that none of us can foresee how long our lives will be, and it is best to be prepared. Take Tea to New Heights

Tea is a versatile beverage that can be served at any time of day and has long been touted for its medicinal properties. On a cold day, a hot cup of tea can be just what people need to warm up, while few things are more refreshing than a glass of iced tea on a hot afternoon.

While tea lovers are familiar with its versatility, even the most ardent tea enthusiast might not think it can be used to make ice cream. But that's precisely the case in the following recipe for "Chai Ice Cream" from Robert Wemischner and Diana Rosen's "Cooking with Tea" (Periplus). Not overly sweet, this ice cream works great when stuffed into a sweet-ripe peach or plum.

Serves 6

2 cups heavy cream

- 1 cup whole milk
- 4 slices fresh ginger root

In a large, heavy saucepan, bring the cream and milk to a boil with the spices, sugar and honey. Add the tea and reduce mixture to a simmer. Remove from heat and infuse the tea for about 5 minutes. Sieve out solids and return liquid to saucepan.

In a small bowl, whisk the egg yolks and temper them by combining with a cup of the cream mixture. Add the whisked egg yolks to the saucepan and whisk together over medium heat until slightly thickened. The mixture should coat the back of a spoon Using an instant-read thermometer, monitor the temperature of the mixture so it does not exceed 190 F. Do not overcook or the mixture will curdle.

Pour through a fine-meshed sieve into a bowl placed over a larger bowl of ice. Stir the mixture until cool and then place in refrigerator or freezer to chill further, about 15 minutes. Add salt and vanilla to blend.

Freeze using an old-fashioned ice cream maker filled with ice and salt, or freeze in a crank-type ice cream machine using a canister that has been frozen as per the manufacturer's directions.



Frozen Foods

Frozen foods are staples in many households. Freezing foods can ensure there's always something to eat at home, and freezing leftovers can help prevent waste created when such foods spoil before they can be eaten.

Wasted food is a pressing issue across North America. A 2014 report from Value Chain Management International Inc. indicated that \$31 billion worth of food is wasted every year in Canada, and roughly 47 percent of wasted food comes from private homes. Americans throw away approximately \$165 billion worth of food each year, which translates to as much as \$2,200 per household, according to a recent study from the Natural Resources Defense Council. Freezing foods can cut back on that waste and make people feel better about their eating habits at home, especially when they push past the myths and get to the facts about frozen foods.

MYTH: Frozen food is less nutritious. FACT: Frozen foods can be even more nutritious than some fresh items available at the grocery store. That's because out-of-season produce is sometimes picked before it has ripened and then stored while shipped long distances. Nutritional content may be depleted even before the food reaches the dinner table. Frozen foods are picked at the height of ripeness and then flash frozen. Such foods will only lose some of their nutritional value during storage.

MYTH: Frozen foods are more expensive.

FACT: Very often frozen foods can be less expensive than fresh foods. That's especially true when purchasing whole foods rather than prepackaged convenience foods, such as whole meals.

MYTH: Frozen foods contain preservatives or are highly processed. FACT: There are plenty of healthy choices in the grocery store freezer that are not highly processed. Look at the ingredient list to confirm what is in a product before buying it. The freezing process often removes the need to rely on preservatives, and freezing keeps food from developing bacteria or other microbes that make people sick. These microbes cannot grow on foods stored at temperatures less than 0 F.

MYTH: All foods can be frozen. FACT: Many foods freeze under the right conditions, but there are some that should never be frozen. In certain foods, the structure may break down or taste can be affected. Delicate vegetables like lettuce will disintegrate when thawed. Creams can curdle or separate when thawed. Foods should not be frozen in cans or eggs in eggshells. Avoid freezing foods with a high water content, as they will end up a soggy mess as they defrost.

MYTH: Frozen foods last forever. FACT: Many foods can stay fresh for months, but they can begin to lose quality and taste if they are left frozen for too long. Prepared leftovers can be stored for two to three months on average. Raw meat may last anywhere from four to 12 months. Label frozen foods to remember the "use by" date.

Freezing food and relying on healthy frozen alternatives at the supermarket can be reliable and cost-effective. It also helps cut down on food waste from spoilage. ■
