Now the wheel turns to planning the next development of trails which will expand the experience on the Cuyuna Range. Fat-tire biking and mountain biking are sports that go around year-around, with groomed trails available in the winter.

The recreation area was first designated in 1993 when Chris Hasskamp, then a state representative from Crosby, worked hard on it. The abandoned mine lakes and hills and trails were already being used for hiking, camping, scuba diving, fishing and more. It started with 120 acres and now there is about 3.000 acres in the recreational unit under the ownership of the DNR. The state continues to try to acquire more land -- although some is tied up in complicated title holdings. There is an estimated total of 5,000 acres that could be part of the rec area.

Driving into the rec area one sees many new amenities – a lage picnic shelter with a party grill, new bathrooms and signage. Up on a hill in the Mahnomen Unit, by Pennington and Huntington Lakes, a new trail was constructed full of twists and turns to make mountain bikers happy and to blow off steam. That project was completed in the fall of 2017 with the first \$600,000 that was allocated by the state. A connection with Crosby was also completed in 2017, along with safety improvements at intersections.

A skills area to be used by all levels of bikers will open in the spring. Next on the planning cycle is development of the Maroco unit, named after the Marquette

Ore Company. That will be a 10- mile trail with three gravity roll trails - constructed inclines. One of these, the Sand Hog, will be 1,310 lineal feet. Maroco East will be 2,600 lineal feet and Maroco West, 3,500 feet. If all goes as planned, the Maroco unit will open in the fall of 2018

or spring of 2019.

This next expansion also includes a pedestrian trail and repairing of the Miner's Mountain Road. The Portsmouth Campground will be fixed up and expanded and connected to the trail

In 2019, plans are to build the Cuyuna Hills and Cuyuna

Connection, adding 11.5 miles of trail at 100 acres of land owned by Crow Wing County near the city of Cuvuna -- outside the boundaries of the rec area. When all the expansions are complete, there should be over 51 miles of trails.

"The state recreation area facility is really a regional asset," said Rep. Dale Lueck, Rep.-Aitkin. Lueck has been on hand to see all the different alloca-

tions come from the state now totaling \$4.1 million.

Lueck's great-grandfather was the first miner killed on the Cuyuna Range. Back in 1908, William John Lueck, a farmer, had just started working in February. The crew was wheeling dirt from a dump

pile at the mouth of the shaft that was being put down by the Rogers-Brown Ore Company near Rabbit Lake. The eight-foot tall stockpile was frozen so the men began digging underneath. Lueck was putting the last shovelful is his wheelbarrow when the top fell off, crushing his head and jaw. He died quickly.

Later, Lueck's dad Fritz was a miner in the 1960s at the Kennedy Mine, supporting his family, as many did, by a combination of mining and farming.

Most of the mining activity was over by late 1960s but then the Range rebounded with the manufacturing of Scorpion snowmobiles and other concerns. That died out, and over the last 20 years downtown Crosby was losing businesses.

Now, with the resurgence brought by people coming to bike, hike, camp, fish and swim in the old "Mine Pits" Crosby is growing and thriving.

New businesses are open on Main Street.

"It is important to say that the impact on Crosby is positive, not just the biking and trail system, but the entire community," said Crosby Mayor Bob Novak. Novak, who now owns Pinecone Antiques in Deerwood, grew up in the area. He came back after military service to operate the Hallett House Bed and Breakfast.

"The outlook of the people in our area has brightened considerably," explained Novak, noting that the trails are attracting thousands of visitors from other countries and all over the United States.

He shared that some say 15 new businesses have opened. He names three recent new businesses that he says are a direct result of tourism: the Iron Range Eatery restaurant, The Red Raven Bike Café and the Cuyuna Brewing Company.

The Red Raven is at the T-intersection of Hwys. 6 and Main Street in downtown Crosby. "I remember about 15 different businesses operating out of that building over the years," said Novak. "And it had times when it was vacant for a while."

"Crosby is certainly moving in the right direction and the majority of our citizens are positive about it, "said Novak.

Sales of homes and property area increasing, Novak said. And locals are able to rent their homes for vacation property.

The city of Crosby is showing its good faith effort to partner with the state by putting \$70,000 toward a \$650,000 state project to dig a tunnel under Hwy. 6 in the trail area. Joggers, walkers, bikers and snowmobilers all cross the busy highway now. When this project is complete it will be much safer to go under Hwy. 6 to access more trails than to travel over it.

Next week: The extensive group of volunteers that has sprung up and the huge effort it will take to maintain the trails.

Up to \$199.5 million funding wanted

Blueprint 181, the comprehensive long-range proposal to address the facility needs of Brainerd Public Schools, will be presented to voters as three ballot questions on a special election scheduled for Tuesday, April 10. Early voting begins on Friday, February 23.

The first ballot question proposals include a building a new Baxter Elementary School for \$26 million or remodeling for \$5 million; remodeling the Washington Educational Service Building for \$5 million; and remodeling and adding additions to Harrison for \$19 million, Garfield for \$11 million, Lowell for \$13 million, Nisswa for \$12 million, and Riverside for \$13 million.

The second ballot question proposal for the secondary schools includes \$79 million for an addition and remodel at Brainerd High School North, \$11 million for heavy remodel and partial deconstruction at the south campus, \$1 million for remodel at the Brainerd Learning Center and \$1.5 million for light remodel for Forestview Middle School.

The third ballot question proposes \$8 million of additional investment for upgrades at the Performing Arts Center ant the BHS North Campus.



State of Minnesota approves Lake Calhoun name change to Bde Maka Ska



On January 18, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources announced the State of Minnesota has approved changing the name of Lake Calhoun in Minneapolis to Bde Maka Ska, pronounced: Bah-Day-Ma-Kah-Ska.

The DNR's decision follows a Hennepin County Board resolution requesting the

"The DNR respects the role of elected county boards in determining name changes for geographic features," **DNR Commissioner Tom** Landwehr said. "In this instance, I am confident the Hennepin County Board carefully considered community values and citizen perspectives in determining that this was the right action to take. DNR's role is to ensure the county followed the proper process."

The DNR's decision means the lake name change will become official in Minnesota when the DNR's approval is officially recorded by Hennepin County and published in the State Register. Hennepin County commissioners voted to seek the name change Nov. 28.

The DNR will submit the Hennepin County resolution, along with the state approval, to the U.S. Board of Geographic Names, which will approve or deny the name change for federal use.

The DNR is the state agency that approves or denies name changes for geographic features, after Minnesota counties consider name change resolutions, gather public input and vote on proposed changes.

In considering county requests to name a geographic

name, the DNR's role is to consider 1) whether the county followed a proper public process prior to taking its action, and 2) whether the county-approved name complies with naming conventions. For example, names must avoid confusion with similarly named features, and names may not commemorate a living person.

Historical Background of **Lake Calhoun**

It is unknown precisely when Minnesota Public Water No. 27-31 was actually named Lake Calhoun, although references to said name were documented in Henry Schoolcraft's narrative journal of travels through the northwestern regions of the United States.

Schoolcraft reports: "About six miles west of the new cantonement there are several beautiful little lakes, situated in the prairies. They consist of the purest water and are surrounded with a handsome beach of yellow sand and water-worn pebbles ... The largest of these lakes is about four miles in circumference, and is called Calhoun lake exquisite flavored black bass and several other varieties of fish, and has become a fashionable resort for the officers of the garrison."

Henry Schoolcraft, Narrative of Travels: Through the Northwester Regions of the United States, Extending from Detroit through the Great Chain of American Lakes to the Sources of the Mississippi River Performed as a Member of the expedition under Governor Cass, in the Year 1820.

William Keating also references Lake Calhoun in his Narrative of an Expedition to the Sources of St. Peter's River, Lake Winnepeek, Lake of the Woods, etc., performed in the year 1823, by order of the Hon. JC Calhoun, Secretary of War, under the command of Stephen H Long, Major US.TE. (1884), in which it is reported of the region around Fort Snelling: "a body of water, which is not represented on any map that we know of, has been discovered in this vicinity within a few years, and has received the name of Lake Calhoun, in honor of the Secretary of War. Its dimensions are small." Wil-

New Mille Lacs Lake fisheries supervisor hired



Tom Heinrich, who most recently was the large lake specialist covering Lake of the Woods for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, will now supervise Mille Lacs Lake fisheries management.

"We're pleased that Tom Heinrich has accepted this new role. He brings a wealth of experience and knowledge from other large walleye lakes in Minnesota and elsewhere, strong scientific skills and an open ability to communicate with and relate to various groups in the public," said Brad Parsons, central region fisheries manager.

Heinrich begins as Mille Lacs Lake fisheries supervisor on Wednesday, Jan. 24, at the office in Garrison. He will oversee the extensive field operations that happen throughout the course of the year to assess fish populations and harvests; work with fisheries research and other partners to study walleye productivity; study the potential impacts of big fish on young walleye survival; review goals for spawning stock biomass; and coordinate other work needed to answer complex questions about the lake.

"This is an important position because Mille Lacs

always has been a vital and popular fishery and there is still a lot to learn about the lake and the changes we are seeing. Adding Tom to the team to perform the detailed, complex work needed will benefit the resource, the DNR and groups with an interest in the lake," Parsons said.

Heinrich begins his new role as the DNR continues efforts to understand and improve a walleye population in Mille Lacs Lake that has undergone a decline over the past two decades that has coincided with significant aquatic system changes including increased water clarity and decreased walleye productivity; the introduction of zebra mussels, Eurasian watermilfoil and spiny water

fleas; a changing zooplankton community that may be altering the aquatic food web; and declines in certain forage species, including tullibee.

Heinrich began his natural resources career in New York as a fisheries technician on eastern Lake Erie and worked in that role from 1984 until 1990, when he accepted a position in Baudette for the Minnesota DNR. In 1991, he became the large lake specialist for Lake of the Woods and has been in that position since.
