Survey: Investors Not Aware Of SEC Rule On Fund After-Tax Disclosure

Many investors are unaware of new taxes they may have to pay this year.



Pal bonds (32 percent) in a quali-fied retirement plan rather than outside such a plan, even though such tax-deferred investments are not designed to be held in quali-fied plans. Compared to last year (25 per-cent), more investors (39 percent) do not know their federal income tax bracket. More than four in 10 (42 percent) who use a broker or other financial advisor say that their advisor rarely or never dis-cusses the tax implications of their investments with them. This is actually higher than last year (36 percent). The fact that investors in equity mutual funds have surren-dered as much as a quarter of each dollar in investment returns to Uncle Sam in recent years was a driving force behind the SEC's mandating disclosure of after-tax returns in the risk/return section of each fund's prospectus. It is noteworthy that tax awareness does not seem to have increased in the past year despite the new SEC

nd After-Tax Disclosure goes fully into effect this month," observed Duncan W. Richardson, Chief Equity Investment Officer of Eaton Vance Management. "While taxpaying investors seem to have a good understanding of the importance of after-tax returns as a goal, they are still too often in the dark about how investment taxes work. Helping investors make intelligent tax choices is one of the best ways for financial advi-sors to add value for their clients." Perhaps the reason investors know so little about the tax aspects of investing is simply the degree to which taxes are dreaded. By nearly a two to one margin (57 parcent) investors think paving

And the majority (74 per-cent) thinks paying taxes on returns is worse than visiting prospective in-laws (4 percent). Investors are supportive (73 percent support) of a bill currently before Congress that would, sub-ject to annual limits, allow in-vestors to defer taxes on mutual fund capital gains distributions that are reinvested in the same fund. But this is not their first preference—more than eight in 10 investors (84 percent) would rather see a reduction in the capi-tal gains tax rate that applies to all types of investments, not just mutual funds. Following a discussion with Peter's uncle at a family picnic, who advertised his music store in a Connecticut publication, Howard got the idea to put together his own weekly mailer. At the same time, Howell reassured those in the Reminder office earlier that morning that it would be business as usual while bigger picture discussions were ongoing in the coming weeks.



This handmade 1930s card is made from store-bought paper lace and features small chromolithographed pictures of children and flowers. The printed cardboard background is made to fit in an envelope. A collector bought it for \$25 about 1980 and felt the message "To Miss Nash" on the back added to the value. It would cost about \$50 today.

In 1848, Esther Howland of Worcester, Massachusetts, started making valentines from pieces of fancy paper lace and printed pictures with handwritten messages of affection. Soon, she was selling valentines to friends, and started a business that lasted until 1880.

The style of the valentine can help tell its age. Mechanical cards with parts that could move so a pictured girl could wave her arm were the newest type in the 1890s. Embossing also was popular. 

don't have to drain their resources to improve the exterior appearance of their home. In fact, the old saying "a little goes a long way' holds true. According to Richardson, sprucing up an exterior entryway can be as simple as adding a splash of color:

• Create a dramatic welcome by painting the front door a rich accent color. Deep greens and burgundy tones continue to be popular choices.

• Highlight a home's architectural details, such as porch posts and columns, cornices, balusters and mouldings, by painting them in colors that accent the exterior paint.

• Set the stage for the home's interior by applying the same color scheme showcased in the interior of the home to the exterior entryway. This will produce a smooth transition between the two areas.

"If your foyer or living room features warm, earthy greens and golds, try using the same colors outside—only go one shade darker," suggests Richardson. "Then use the lighter tones as accents in a wreath or other outdoor decorative accessories

Sprucing up an exterior entryway can be as simple as adding a splash of paint color.

• Look up...and down! An increasingly popular way to spruce up an entryway is to paint the porch ceiling or floor a surprising, contrasting color. For an even more creative touch, consider stenciling stars or floral designs on the porch ceiling or floor to cast a unique welcome. And, try painting the stair risers in bold colors, which will help direct your guests eyes towards the front door.

• Don't forget the mailbox. Sprucing up the mailbox with paint is a quick and easy way to add visual interest to a home's exterior. Paint the post the same color as the facade or the front door, or get really creative with stencils.

When applying these decorating tips, Richardson says it is important to choose the right paint for the project. For all exterior paint projects she recommends paints with a semi-gloss or high gloss finish. This will provide a hard durable surface that will keep that freshly painted look longer and can be cleaned easily. Also, look for 100 percent acrylic latex paints. When used on siding and trims, acrylic latex paints will last for many years with little maintenance.

When painting metal, Richardson suggests lightly sanding the surface to remove any shininess The item should then be primed and painted with an oil/alkydbased paint that effectively adheres to the metal. For porch floors, it is important to use a special "porch & floor" paint.






