CAMP MEDIA THEATRE

Placing the spotlight on summer performance



Children and teens have been singing and dancing at The Media Theatre each summer for almost two decades as participants in Camp Media Theatre.

Now headed into its 17th summer, the camp first opened in June of 2001 with only 30 members. It's grown into one of Delaware County's most popular summer theatre camps with registration of over 250 youths each summer who enjoy learning more about theatre while having a good time with others who share a similar interest. It is part of the educational component

of The Media Theatre's mission.

With five two-week day camp sessions to choose from, plus a "Heathers: High School Edition" camp for teens, there are plenty of opportunities for budding thespians, singers and dancers.

Artistic Director Jesse Cline looks forward to Camp Media Theatre.

"With the growth of our New School conservatory-style music theatre education program September through April, plus the success of our youth musicals, the camp is in direct correlation to our mission defining us as a professional music theatre company," he said.

Cline added, "The philosophy of education here is based on The Meisner Technique, which states that 'acting is living as truthfully as one can under an imaginary circumstance.' Camp Media Theatre is structured so that the young people involved gain self-confidence and a strong ability to work well with peers.

"The camp is fun and upbeat, but the instructors and directors involved do enforce the idea that acting is not about pretending," Cline explained. "It's about living, it's about doing and it's about being comfortable with who you are."

Once everyone is registered for Camp Media Theatre, the youth are divided into two age groups. The age groups may fluctuate a bit, depending on how many children are in each camp session and what the median age range tends to be.

A typical camp day begins at 9:30 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m. Each age group works with the instructors on a rotating basis throughout the first part of the camp day, with all age groups working onstage together from 2 p.m. until 3:30 p.m. As a courtesy to parents and guardians, early dropoff is accepted after 8:30 a.m., although the actual camp day does not begin until 9:30 a.m. Counselors are on hand during the early hour to supervise the campers before classes start. All ages bring their own lunch, enjoy lunchtime with their friends and are able to purchase supplementary items from the theatre's concession stand.

Each two-week session has its own theme, based on the songs in the camp. This information is found at www.mediatheatre.org. After two weeks of rehearsing, and adding scenes which are created during the daily acting classes, each session has a camp performance, which is held the final

Friday evening of each session. Each child, regardless of age or experience level, becomes actively involved in the production.

In addition to the day camps for ages 5 to 14, The Media Theatre brings "Heathers: High School Edition" to the Teen Camp Experience in 2018. This is specifically for ages 12 and up and has a completely different schedule than the day camp. "Heathers: High School Edition" Camp meets during early evening hours Monday through Friday starting June 18, and the production — full scale, with directors, musicians, lighting and costumes, etc. — performs for audiences each weekend in July on stage.

Camp Media Theatre 2018 promises to be an enlightening, entertaining and enriching experience for young people who have an interest in music theatre. Participants will perform on an award-winning professional music theatre stage in an environment which promotes and cultivates each individual unique personality as the singing, acting, and dancing creates a memorable summer.

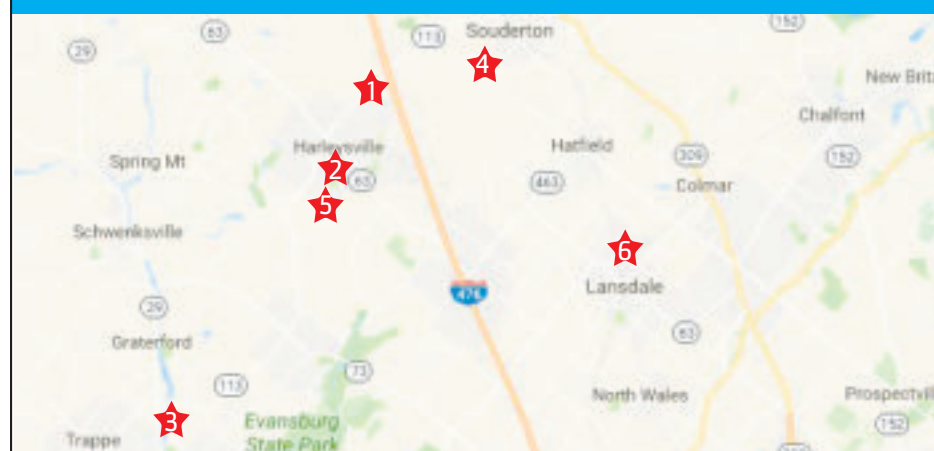

HISTORIC YELLOW SPRINGS

Dig into summer fun



Discover the world of art and archaeology at the Kids Half-Day Summer Camp in the scenic village of Historic Yellow Springs (HYS). The popular HYS week-long camps are located in the countryside of Chester Springs, Pa.

Create art and learn while having fun!

Let your child's creativity soar in HYS's Summer Art Camps as they explore weekly themes in painting, drawing, printmaking, mixed media and clay. Campers ages 6 and up develop new skills, friendships and lifelong memories. Each camp day includes pottery and two-dimensional art sessions. The lush surroundings of this historic village provide the perfect place to experience nature while creating art and pottery inspired

by the locale's natural beauty.

Building upon HYS's rich history in the arts and many decades of Kids Summer Camp, the Art Camps continue to focus on a love of the fine arts and the outdoors. Programs include learning color theory while creating beautiful paintings in watercolor and acrylics; exploring storytelling through printmaking, mosaics and puppetry; and sculpting animals while learning about the abundant wildlife in the region.

Kids love the exciting world of clay. Campers learn about hand-building, designing surfaces and glazing pottery. Children build their creative confidence while learning about pinch pots, coil building and slab-built pottery. HYS campers have created many original clay masterpieces including bird

houses and baths, frog and butterfly houses, castles and crests, musical instruments, vases, platters, sushi dishes, bowls, mugs and more.

Learn about local history while studying the process of archaeology

Unearth historic treasures with a real archaeologist in the Kids Archaeology Camp for ages 8 to 14. Campers learn how to survey the site, excavate and sift soil to uncover artifacts, track daily progress, map discoveries and record findings. Historic Yellow Springs' digs have discovered projectile points used by Native Americans, paint brushes used by artists in decades past, oyster shells from when HYS was a resort in the 1800s and marbles and a toy trolley car from when HYS

hosted a Civil War orphanage. All archaeological findings are documented and become part of the historical record at HYS.

Kids research and explore local history to identify found objects, as they follow clues left by artifacts, how they were used and by whom. Campers learn about past lifestyles and events and discover how and why they have changed. Information recovered from the digs play an important part in reconstructing local history.

Summer is a time for fun — a time when youth can take a break from the stressful life of being a student and enjoy themselves with family and friends.

But we all know that learning never stops. In most cases, the times when you are having fun are the most valuable times for learning, if people around you can help you take advantage of those opportunities.

At The Pathway School, we have team

members who do just that every day. Our team understands that every experience is an opportunity to have fun and an opportunity to learn. By providing fun and unique opportunities that do not occur as frequently during the school year, students are gaining invaluable skills that they will use throughout their life.

For over 50 years, The Pathway School has been serving students with autism and other neurological impairments, psychological disorders and serious emotional disturbance. A team of related service specialists works collaboratively with our education staff in order to maintain an "education of the whole child" concept.

The six-week summer program includes club opportunities for students in areas such as technology (robotics, coding, video game development, videography/photogra-

phy), culinary arts, creative arts (drama, visual arts, music), adventure opportunities (hiking, canoeing, camping, orienteering), sports, science (rockets, astronomy, simple machines) and job readiness opportunities, to name a few.

Campers are sure to find many things they enjoy as they participate in various clubs. Modules are tailored to the ability level of students, and activities will allow participants to gain skills not just in the activity but in problem solving, team-building, critical thinking and social skills. Imagine all you will have to talk about around the dinner table each evening!

There will be many great experiences that happen on Pathway's 11-acre campus through hands-on activities in these areas. Campers will take the skills they acquire into the world and enhance their learning through application and generalization. Field trips and excursions that provide more in-depth understanding and different ways of experiencing these topics will enrich the knowledge and increase the joy students experience as they participate.

A bright spot in your summer

For more than 25 years, Merion Mercy's Summer Programs have offered a multitude of academic and athletic opportunities for students. In recent years, the offerings have expanded, and now MMA's Summer Programs provide more than 25 academic and enrichment opportunities and sports camps for girls and boys in grades six to 12.

Whether students wish to sharpen their writing skills, earn high school credits, prepare for the various high school and scholarship exams, try a new sport or learn a new skill, there's surely a summer activity at Merion Mercy that matches their interests.

"There really is something for everyone," said Director of Summer Programs Barbara Harrison. "We are proud to have strong instructors and to utilize our facilities to offer students a productive and unique summer experience. This summer, we especially look forward to using our renovated spaces, which include a new gymnasium, art studios and gallery and an innovation lab where four recently added 'STEAM' in the Summer' courses will be held."

Close to 100 high school students take part in the Summer Programs, while elementary school students and incoming freshmen are also eager to explore MMA's six-acre campus. In addition to several co-ed options, many of the summer offerings are just for girls and allow prospective students the chance to get to know MMA's campus, meet faculty members and/or coaches and experience the school's programs firsthand.

Most notably, the all-girls academic enrichment option is a pre-eighth grade program called the Summer Academy. Summer Academy is a full-day, four-week program designed specifically for girls

entering grade eight. The Summer Academy helps students begin the transition from an elementary school to a college preparatory high school program. Students take courses, such as pre-algebra, language arts, study skills and public speaking. There is also a fitness class built in that includes options such as volleyball, dance and yoga.

As one happy Summer Academy parent noted, "My daughter loved the program, learned a lot and made great new friends. For our family, MMA's Summer Academy was a perfect mix of learning and fun."

"Our Summer Academy is a great way for young girls to spend their summer days. 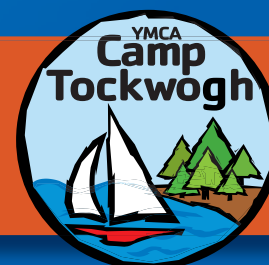

I am proud of myself and my group for stepping out of our comfort zones and traveling to another country to learn and live in another culture."



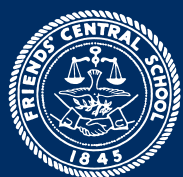
