

Active shooter prevention expert Chris Grollnek speaks at Chamber Lunch and Learn event

When over 200 people gathered at the Sanderson Farms Corporate Office banquet room to listen to nationally acclaimed active shooter prevention expert Chris Grollnek speak, little did they know that less than a week later they would hear of the Stone Douglas High School massacre in Parkland, Florida where a mentally disturbed individual took the life of 17 young people. The words of Grollnek no doubt have echoed through the mind of each and every person who attended the event since hearing of the tragedy.

The Jones County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors partnered with the Jones County Sheriff's Department to bring Grollnek to Jones County to speak at the Chamber's first Lunch and Learn event, an educational seminar and networking event.

"You're in for a treat," exclaimed Sheriff Alex Hodge when introducing Grollnek.

a heart of passion. He believes in what he's doing."

Asking for two volunteers, Grollnek

had one volunteer set his phone's timer for 7 minutes and the other for 23 minutes. After being notified when the time expired, Grollneck explained that within zero to seven minutes a perpetrator will locate his target or targets, load his guns, rain carnage on his victims, and then vacate the scene. In Florida, 17 students were killed and 14 injured in six minutes, according to a report on Fox News. Grollnek added that it takes zero to 17 minutes for law enforcement to get on the scene and 17 to 23 minutes before law

"You're fixing to hear from a guy who has enforcement officers will make contact with the first victim.

> "It is up to local law enforcement to get the most training possible for an ac-

tive shooter response," exclaimed Grollnek. He added that it is also important for the community to be prepared and have a plan in place for each environment they spend time in. "We need to change the message

> to the community from response to prevention. If you see something, say something. It's not so much a gun problem as it's a people problem."

Grollnek is a retired police officer of 15 years, a former U.S. Marine with 13 years of active duty service and 11 years in the reserves, and a primetime network active shooter incident speaker. As a police officer he was involved in an active shooter incident which took place at the Public Service Building in McKenney, Texas. He is an active shooter and domestic terrorism prevention policy consultant, public speaker, author, and primetime network news guest. He travels throughout the country conducting seminars and workshops on active shooter prevention. He has authored and co-authored many policies and procedures that are used by agencies across the nation. Among the material he has produced is a short video entitled "Run, Hide, and Fight." "I hate that video," exclaimed Grollnek. He said in many situations the run, hide, fight is not the best procedure to follow. Columbine proved that. Today, Grollnek is advising to "Get Out." "If you hear it, if you see it, say something and get out," exclaimed Grollnek. He has made a new free PSA video that is 26 minutes long and can be found on his website at cgpgmg.com. Other than "G.O.," get out, the catch words now are "React.

Escape, Survive." You must do something! The video is very informative and highly recommended.

Prior to Grollnek speaking, Glen Elsberry with Hunt Southland and Hunt Refinery, who sponsored the day's event, said, "I'd like to thank the Chamber of Commerce and the Sheriff's Department for organizing this event. Unfortunately, workplace violence and active shooters have become all too common today. Law enforcement and the community have got to do a better job in educating everyone around us to be prepared for this, to know what to look for, and to speak out about it." He added that in 2016 Hunt made the decision to develop a workplace violence prevention program that they rolled out to all their affiliates and employees. "The reception was much better than I expected," said Elsberry. He said the feedback was positive and that many have taken what they've learned back to their families and teaching their children about things to be mindful of.


for 2015. He is a voting member of ASTM and a member of NASSCO. Rahaim is also a coauthor of the published NASTT Manual for CIPP Good Practices.



Saturday, February 17, Gold Horizons competed at the West Jones Show Choir Invitational, taking first place in the Middle Division and fourth runner up in the finals. The last weekend in February they will compete at the Petal Show Choir Invitational, and on

When asked how much longer he plans to teach and direct, Myers said, "I don't know, I'm still having so much fun."

The bid was denied Tuesday night by Long Beach. West Jones, who reached the MHSAA Class 5A South State Championship for the second straight year in boys soccer, was denied the opportunity to also appear in its second 5A title game in as many years.

Long Beach shut out West Jones 3-0 on the pitch Tuesday night in Soso.

West Jones head coach Josh Sullivan told his team to remember the seasons' accomplishments indeed of forcing on the night's defeat.

Tuesday night's loss was marred by missed opportunities, including an early miss on a PK attempt by senior Luis Ramirez in the first half.

Long Beach scored two goals in the second half to seal the 3-0 win over West Jones.

"You get in this kind of games where the ball takes a funny bounce, and crazy things happen," Sullivan said. "A crazy thing happened tonight. We get a PK opportunity, and a guy that has never missed one in his life hits the crossbar. Right then you felt like things were going against you.

Having to play this game less than 24 hours after our second-round game last night wasn't easy either. And we're not trying to make excuses, but its just hard and you hate it for the seniors. But what they've left behind will set a great foundation [for the future]. These guys were not just good soccer players; they were great young men."

High school soccer has long been dominated by the girls in Jones County over the past decade. Back-to-back appearances in the Class 5A South State Championship game for West Jones has raised the bar for boys soccer in Jones County.

"Our girl's program is still strong, and they're highly competitive," said Sullivan. "Now we can compete with that. When I and coach Winship decided we were going






